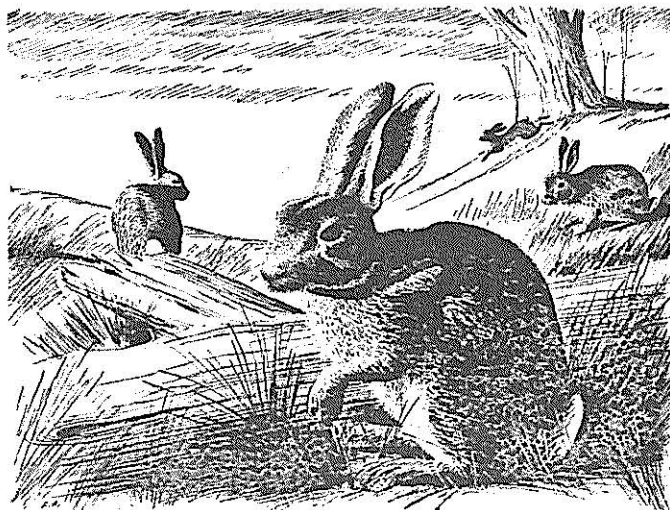

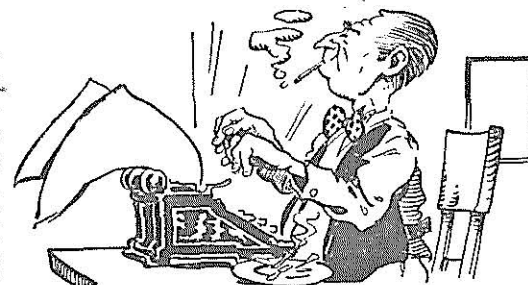

## THE ASSOCIATION

Affiliated Clubs are reminded that the 13th Annual Meeting of affiliated club delegates will be held at Scott's Hotel, Melbourne, on Wednesday, November 2. In accordance with the Association's Constitutional Rules, every affiliated member club is entitled to one delegate to represent its interests at this meeting, providing the member club has complied with the rules of the Association. The proviso chiefly concerns the registration of shooters—that is to say that the member club is entitled to a delegate if it has its shooters registered. In several known cases, clubs have merely paid affiliation and registered possibly one or two shooters, in some cases affiliation only has been paid—these clubs will not be entitled to delegate representation at the annual or any general meeting.

The name and address of the delegate must be in the hands of the Secretary, A.C.P.T.S.A., Box 2038 S., Melbourne C.I., seven clear days prior to the meeting. Clubs far distant from the Association headquarters unable to make a direct delegate appointment may apply to the Association secretary with a request that a delegate be appointed. Any such appointee under this latter arrangement must have his appointment confirmed by the member club he is to represent at least seven clear days prior to the annual meeting. Clubs desirous of holding 1950 Championships (other than club titles), should make written application to the Association secretary on or before November 1. Tentative dates should be mentioned, if possible, for the holding of the events applied for. This paragraph refers to all Commonwealth, State, and District Championships.

Future "Association News" advertising matter can only be accepted up to 30th day of the preceding month (not later than first mail on 1st of month, providing prior arrangements have been made). Featured descriptive copy cannot be accepted later than 30th of preceding month, in future. Handicap returns should reach the Association not later than 24th of preceding month—this is necessary to enable Association

officials to thoroughly peruse and investigate all recommendations submitted by club handicappers. The above variations have been found necessary in order to bring about reasonable uniformity and regularity of production by the printers. Club officials are requested to take particular notice of these instructions, because they will be necessarily rigidly adhered to.

The Association Executive Committee, commencing from 1st November, the new financial year, intends on insisting that clubs forward handicap returns regularly—not later than once in every eight weeks, so as to reach the Association not later than 24th of month concerned—clubs failing to observe this direction will be liable to a fine for each omission.

## ENGLISH SPORTING CHAMPIONSHIP

The English Sporting Championship, held at Greenford during late July, attracted 120 entries. Conditions for this interesting event are: 10 birds walk-up, 25 driven "grouse" (actually 5 singles and 10 pairs), 20 "pheasants" from 70 ft. tower (10 singles and 5 pairs), 20 rocketting "pheasants" from 90 ft. tower (20 singles), 25 driven "partridges" (5 singles and 10 pairs), total 100 birds. L. S. Boyland, of Bournemouth (Hampshire), was the winner with 95/100 from C. Lucas (London) 94/100, and E. Nicholls, of Spalding (Lincolnshire), third (93/100, equal with two others). Nicholls was the previous holder of the title. In the Ladies' Championship, Mrs. Ida Grosvenor, for many years woman champion of Great Britain, was in her best form to win 41/50. The performance is recorded as one of her best. In the walk-up section, Mrs. Grosvenor broke all 10 straight. Mrs. Grosvenor is the widow of the late Mr. W. P. Grosvenor, for many years regarded as the best coach in England and, during his life, a regular contributor to A.C.P.S. "News." Miss June Horsfall, of Llansinnan (Denbighshire), was runner-up to Mrs. Grosvenor 37/50. Mrs. Grosvenor's daughter, Mrs. Betty Spooner, of Hove (Sussex), was third.

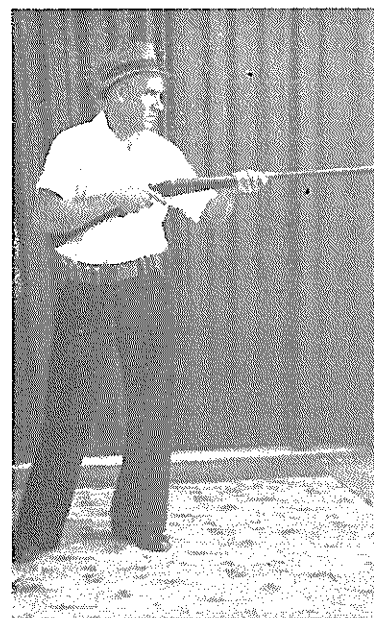

## BRITISH OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP

The 1949 British Open Championship was shot at Dundee (Scotland) following the International Match. Shot at 100 birds per man, victory again went to Percy Stanbury, who shot 99/100—made up of 25, 25, 24 and 25. Stanbury is a Devonshire farmer as well as an instructor at the London Shooting School. Six 97/100's followed—they were Paul Catterall and S. T. Rimmer (both Lancastrians—Rimmer was high-gun in the International), E. Fear, E. Bruce and the Welsh pair, F. G. Kelly and W. T. Jones. The two Scots, W. J. Grant and T. McLellan, were together next, each 96/100. Major S. C. Miles (Wales), brother of our American correspondent, Mr. Rex Miles, returned 89/100. Dr. P. Sinnott returned the best of the Irish scorers, 94/100.

## TEN YEARS AGO

The advent of the outbreak of war in September, 1939, and the uncertainty such an occasion brings about, had an immediate dimming effect on trapshooting activities of the period. One of the outstanding efforts of September, 1939, was recorded by Gordon Tilley, who used the shooting name of "Woofers." Tilley was one of the best of the rising young shots of the time. Shooting at his home club (Camberwell) at North Balwyn on September 16, 1939, he ran up a break of 61 unfinished. His form that day was so good that he looked set for a century registration. However, he failed to hold his form at the next shoot, and only added two or three to the break. Veteran Charlie Mitchell, of Lilydale (brother of the late Dame Nellie Melba), was also in form at the shoot Tilley recorded his 61 unfinished, with a break of 30 straight. Tilley later joined the A.I.F. and served throughout the war overseas—since his return he has not competed.

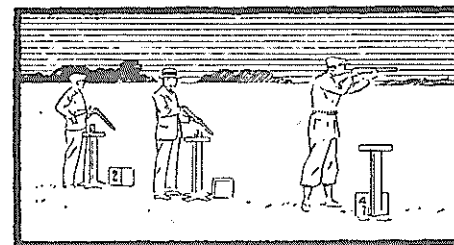

Bassett (Roma) tied for second place with 19/25, making a shoot-off necessary, and in this Bassett was successful, making the final placings, K. Cameron 1, K. Bassett 2, D. Nasser 3.

S. Ball, of Powlathanga, showed outstanding and consistent form to annex first placing in both the £30 and also the principal £50 handicap of the meeting.

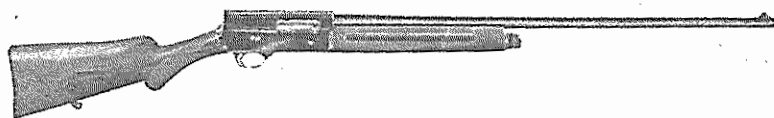

**HOBART (T.)**—International high-gun shooter R. Redpath won the Tasmanian Double-Rise Championship at Brighton on August 20. Despite boisterous conditions, his score (10/12) was only 1 point outside the State record.

Scoring generally was far from impressive, shooters finding difficulty in breaking their right-hand birds because of the strong wind chopping down in that direction.

Fourteen shooters participated in the five-bird novice event, which was won by the juvenile sportman, S. Marshall, after a shoot-off with two other competitors.

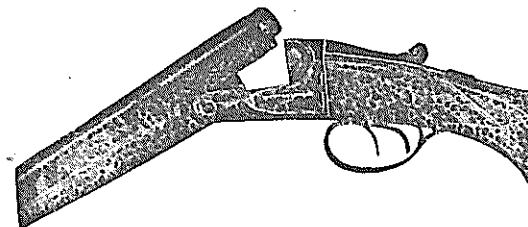

## "Tips" and "Tails"



Going through the scores recorded by members of the English International Team when they shot in the British Open (individual) Championship the day following the International event, it would appear that Australia might have been a little lucky to win this year's International series. Or perhaps the Englishmen did not team well, or possibly needed the day's practice. A comparison of the scores makes very interesting reading. These are as detailed: S. T. Rimmer (high-gun 1949 for England) 99 (British Open, championship, 1949—97), T. Horlock 98—95, E. Lucas (Captain) 93—93, E. Fear 90—97, J. Harris 90—94, E. C. Ledger 90—88, J. Wheeler 90—95, L. S. Boyland 89—83, P. Stanbury 88—99, C. R. Booth 87—94, Paul Catterall 86—97, W. J. Sable 86—93, S. Bamber 84—94, R. D. Browning 84—92, F. T. Moore 82—95 (these were the fifteen scores to count, totalling 1,406—or four less than England's winning International score in 1949). The five count-out scores were: C. H. Champion 81—90, L. T. Field 79—93, Major H. R. Northover 79—95, A. E. Browning 78—91, A. G. Clark 78—92, an aggregate total of 1,731—1,867. It will therefore be observed that the individual scores for the British Open Championship were very much higher than the team performance on the previous day.

Visiting shooters to the Townsville Club's big championship meeting last month were enthusiastic in their praise of the club's grounds, lay-out

and management. In fact, several described the club's organisation as equal to any in the Commonwealth. Townsville Club has apparently lived up to its reputation of being one of the leading clay pigeon shooting clubs of the Commonwealth. The usual "bucks' party," held on the Saturday night following the championship, was well supplied with yarns (vivid and not so vivid), songs, amber fluid, and really solid refreshment. A recitation or two enlivened the later hours, a halt being called about 1.0 a.m. As a result of the duck shoot during the week following, a Tasmanian competitor booked "excess" luggage for the plane trip home. The club president/referee, "Willo" Hanran, carried out his dual role with his usual efficiency.

Charters Towers Club will shoot the North Queensland single-barrel championship on September 16. The date has had A.C.P.T.S.A. approval. A further shoot will be held on September 17.

G. E. J. Lynn, of Townsville, writing prior to the Townsville Club's holding of the Commonwealth single-barrel title, says, "In my opinion A.C.P. News is just the 'shot,' and I can assure that I certainly look forward to my issue arriving monthly. We are enjoying our open season right now, and the 'blackies' are getting a bad time, but, as the season goes on, things should get even better. My selection for the big event (Commonwealth S.B. title) is none other than the Roma lad, Keith Cameron. I think the time is not far distant when Keith will win the Champion of Champions, even though you Victorians may be good shots." (We cut this screed a little short—Mr. Lynn was not in very complimentary mood about Melbourne's weather. However, we appreciate his interest—we seem to have heard comments about Melbourne weather before.—Editor.)

Shooters throughout the Commonwealth extend to this grand veteran sportsman heartiest congratulations on his success, coupled with the hope that he will live to enjoy many more years of pleasant shooting.

An unusual private challenge match has been listed for decision on the Footscray Club's grounds at No. 2 Tottenham, on September 28, commencing at 11.00 a.m., when J. A. McCraith and Jack Bryant (Senr.) will shoot to decide the best over 100 clay pigeons from 16 yards. We are informed that this is a definite "blood" affair for high stakes. Information is that the side wagers are £125 aside, £50 for the best break at any stage during the challenge, the winner to take £200.
