



THE EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK

In a letter received from the English Association recently, mention was made of the difficulties of frequently transporting the Mackintosh International Trophy between England and Australia. The English authorities suggested that a replica be manufactured—preferably in Australia—the cost to be borne by both Associations. The replica to be of a size readily adaptable for transfer between the United Kingdom and Australia. The A.C.P.T.S.A. Executive agreed to this proposal and efforts are now being made to have a suitable replica produced in Australia. The English Association also wrote: "For some time past, clay pigeon shooters in this country particularly have felt that they would like to know that there was a trophy in Australia given by them as a tribute to their good friends 'down under' as a mark of appreciation of the friendly and sporting interest which clay pigeon shooters in Australia have always



shown them in a great variety of ways. At a recent meeting of the Association this wish was translated into fact and many private subscribers came forward and asked to join the fund. The English Association also contributed, and it was then felt that the other members of the International quartet over here might like to come in as well. The Scottish, Irish and Welsh Associations immediately agreed and forwarded their contributions. As a result it has been found possible to obtain a silver trophy, which is being

despatched to you in the very near future, and it is hoped that you will accept this for competition among shooters in Australia under conditions to be left entirely to your Association, with the best wishes of clay pigeon shooters in the old country and the clay pigeon shooting Associations of England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales."

On behalf of Australian shooters, an official letter has already been forwarded to England expressing appreciation and thanks for the generous action of our kinsmen in the Old Land. To say that Australian shooters are deeply touched by this thoughtful action is writing mildly. The Trophy will be treasured greatly in an honoured place in perpetuity of a gracious act. Shoot conditions will be formulated by the A.C.P.T.S.A. Executive later and competition will probably commence with the Association's big meeting (Champion of Champions and International) early in 1951.

The final Association shoot for the current year will be held on Monday, June 12 (King's Birthday holiday). Conditions of the Intermediate Championship and Second Grand Australian Handicap have already been advertised and appear again in this issue. Shooting will commence at 9 a.m., and intending competitors are reminded that the Executive Committee has directed that no entries will be accepted after the close of the first round of any event listed in the programme.

Clubs conducting open championships are reminded that the Association directive in regard to starting times for title contests in winter is that these events should start not later than 2.30 p.m. In recent weeks championship events have been started after the completion of a minor event, and this has brought about shooting the final rounds in fast gathering darkness. This should not be and club officials are requested to heed the Association direction and ensure that championships in the winter months (up to and including August) commence not later than 2.30 p.m. on any day.

Many clubs have been allocating sashes to championship winners with haphazard selecting of colours. The official colours to be used, by Asso-

ciation direction, when presenting sashes to title winners are: Commonwealth Championships, DARK BLUE; State Championships, RED or MAROON; District Championships, WHITE. These colours should be strictly adhered to, and dark blue and red should never be used except in the title contests as mentioned.



Ten Years Ago . . .

With the war gaining momentum, trapshooting activities were gradually dropping into the background in June, 1940, although club shoots in Melbourne were still drawing good attendances. In June, 1940, Fred Burns won the Metropolitan double-barrel championship for that year, making his 26th title win. "Kim" (Kim Sans) won the Commonwealth Mixed Birds title on the Camberwell grounds. "Kim" stopped 19/20 to win outright from H. H. Ball, 18/20. The 1950 Champion of Champions, Jack McCraith, was under notice for no less than a "front-marker" trophy success and a third placing in a ten-birder on the Nobel grounds at Bentleigh.



COBURG (V.).—Jack McCraith, club president and 1950 Champion of Champions in the A.C.P.T.S.A., confirmed his good form of recent weeks by winning the club double-rise title on May 13. Jack Bryant Senr., who has returned to his best form, ultimately gained the honours on the 40th round with 40 straight, from Stan Thompson, a newcomer in championship class, 35/36 (Stan did not shoot on after missing his 36th); then Roy Johns, 24/25, with "Mike-man", Jim McInnes, in fourth place, 21/25, and taking the 13/14 yarder trophy. In a preceding five-birder on the same programme 20 possibles were recorded, and this was followed by a compulsory division on the 8th round between John Bryant Junr., "Doncaster", F. Olver, R. A slight northerly wind tended to keep the clays flatter than usual, with the result that quite a number of shooters missed straightaways by over-shooting these birds.

The second round for the Taylor trophy was the principal trophy event, and in this Russell McKimmin shot well to score 9/10 and take the honours for the round. McKimmin now holds leading place for this trophy, with one more, the final, round to go. O. Crouther, who led from the previous round, had several unaccountable misses and has now dropped his early lead and is level with Colin Melville and Frank Hose, who are all only one point in arrears, with a total of 16 points each to McKimmin's total of 17 points.

Amid much laughter Shire Councillor and Club member Jack Ireland gave it both barrels, without any damage to "Woodie". The look on Jack's face was worth seeing; he did not know that blanks had been substituted for his own shells.

A bottle of champagne donated by Col. Etherington, of the Tourist Hotel, Queanbeyan, was then opened and the future of the club toasted.

"New Chums" to trap shooting were separated from the seasoned shooters; many of the latter will soon be flat out to beat some of the Newies. The "Sec" did his new-chum status in by breaking 11/13 in

an open event; he reckons the clays must have run into his shots.

President Corcoran earned the nickname of "Bing" for the way he crooned into the "mike" all day.

Club Capt. A. Yelland did a good job in instructing new chums on the rules and refereeing the events.

If permission is granted to hold the 1950 N.S.W. Southern Districts S.B. and D.B. Championships on Sept. 30 and Oct. 2, an attempt will be made to make the prize list one of the best in N.S.W., with a dinner to wind up the week-end.

Next morning on the windscreen I noticed three or four small specs of blood just above the glass. The irony of it was that we had a gun aboard (just in case of snakes). But didn't have time to have a go at them (but, of course, it is close season here). Well, Bill, I am not a strict TT., but very close to it, and the strongest I had taken that day was tea and ginger ale. Besides, I have a witness if necessary. I admit the story is hard to believe, but it is an actual happening. My 19-year-old son is showing very good form at the clays and can put it all over me now. Still have very pleasant memories of our trip to Melbourne, and hope to see you up here some day. Best wishes for shoot on June 12." (Many thanks for good wishes and good story, Eric.—Ed.)



U.S.A. Shooting

(From REX MILES)

Hearty congratulations on the splendid tournament you conducted in March. You certainly had a good attendance—it goes to show that the shooters approve of the good work that the Association is doing in promoting big competitive trapshooting. The three-trap lay-out should work O.K. for 60 birds, but not so good for the 100. Still, I am sure shooters recognise your organization did remarkably well in running off the events as planned. I cashiered the Idaho and our Hiyu Indian, both at the same shoot in 1943 at Hayden Lake, over three traps; they were run together; this was some task, but the three traps are terrible where you have 100-bird events—you want at least four traps with so many birds.

I think it best for the present to forget "crossing guns" with the boys in Canada. The Canadians are affiliated with our A.T.A. and shoot as we do, so, due to the difference in style, it would not be an even match. In 1901 there was an International Match, English v. Americans, in London. The Americans to use one barrel only with 1½ oz. shot, and the English team two barrels with 1½ oz. shot, the best three out of five to win. The Americans won the first three matches straight, then went on to Scotland and beat them.

Our new grounds (Spokane Gun Club) are not yet in order. We have when the lawns and trees are developed and it improved as planned, then I will let you have an air photo of the largest gun club in the U.S.A.

A Close Shave

(By J.W. in *The British Shooting Times*).

It happened at one of the family reunions for September 1, and among them was a future brother-in-law, to whom I had lent a gun. A lane, ending in a padlocked gate, lay between two of the beats, and being the nearest to it, I led the way over, and had hardly started to walk on when a shot was fired close behind me, and to my utter astonishment, a cloud of feathers flew out in front. Naturally, I turned round to see what was cooking, and was at once struck by the horror on everyone's face as they looked at me.

Then someone in a very shaky voice said: "By heavens, are you all right? Look at your coat." It was now my turn to feel rather sick, for where, but a moment ago, had been a perfectly good poacher's pocket with a brace of birds in it, nothing

remained but a torn, jagged lining and a ragged hole in the bulge of my nicely-cut breeches.

This is what happened. My friend had followed me over the gate, but without unloading, and with his gun at the trail and one hand round the action. As he landed, an involuntary jar caused his grip to tighten round the triggers—with the result mentioned. Had I not been within a foot of the business-end of the bundook, the solid cone of shot would have begun to spread, and what would have followed would not have been a matter for calm consideration.

My father, wise in his generation, insisted on an immediate resumption of shooting, and such is human nature that the incident made but little difference to the day's bag, which was about on a par with other firsts, but it might have been rather heavier to carry home, and the Various column in the game-book would have had an unusual entry had Lady Luck been looking the other way.

Quiet Bulls

(By H. MANLEY)

Never trust a bull. Every year good men are killed by "quiet" bulls. Recently a Service trainee was cornered by the Friesian that he had gone to feed, and only the lad's extreme agility saved him. Twelve months ago there was a double tragedy at our home farm; the result of trusting the "quiet" bull.

These are farmyard instances: what more concerns the rough shooter and the angler is the bull at pasture. Wandering trout fishermen are frequently menaced by bellowing bulls. To them I would say: "There is no sense in staying in the neighbourhood of such a beast—get right out of his ken. If his temper really rises, he may follow you almost anywhere. A hedge is no bar to a bull. Barbed wire is even less, for he will put his head under a strand, raise it, and the wire will part like packthread. He will wade

a deep stream after you, or swim it. Up a good tree you are safe, but no one wishes to spend a fishing holiday up a tree."

The lone shooter also suffers from bulls, and a sound axiom is "the wilder the spot, the wilder the bull." But a good dog will turn the brute and so also, in the last resort, will a shotgun.

I am reminded of an eccentric acquaintance, who shoots when and where he wishes and by no man's leave. Setting out before dawn on some dubious excursion, he was challenged in the half-light by a bull, far from the nearest refuge. He cocked his gun and thus addressed the animal: "If you go for me, I'll kill you." The bull let him pass, much to his relief, for, as he afterwards somewhat enigmatically asked: "What should I have done with all that beef at four o'clock in the morning?"

Oncoming Rabbits

By NORTH COUNTRY

Is it easy to shoot rabbits coming towards you? This question has been asked by a reader who, while he admits that he is fairly new to shooting, says that it should be, since less allowance is needed. A more experienced man would know that the amount of allowance is not necessarily the biggest problem in shooting. To think of a rabbit coming at you as easy because it should "run into the shot" is not altogether sound reasoning. It will run into the shot if you hold right. But it is not that easy to hold right. What you may do is to shoot over the rabbit or sufficiently above it to catch it in the back. By shooting over it you are, in this case, shooting behind. And to wound an oncoming rabbit in this way is even more unsatisfactory than to "leg" the common crossing one. At least this is how I feel about

it, having had many experiences of both. To be a bit late on the crosser is surely not so bad as to catch the oncomer at the wrong end. Besides, allowance may be required on quite a generous scale if the rabbit is a long way out. That allowance has to be made in a special way does not alter the fact that it still is essential.

This oncoming rabbit is a "hardy annual." It keeps coming on, and it always returns. All said and done, it is not much of a shot when you do bring it off. But it is a shot that should be mastered, as it has to be dealt with on occasions. You need to bring your gun up to it, not down from it. Bring it up with a swinging motion and fire as the stock comes right into the shoulder. For the near shots you just fire as the barrels come up to the head. For the longer ones you need to fire sooner, so as to make more allowance for time over range. I have never seen much shooting at oncomers, or done much, as rabbits usually turn or are induced to turn and in so doing become crossers. I have seen shooters deliberately wave their guns so as to attract the attention of oncomers and cause them to alter course.
