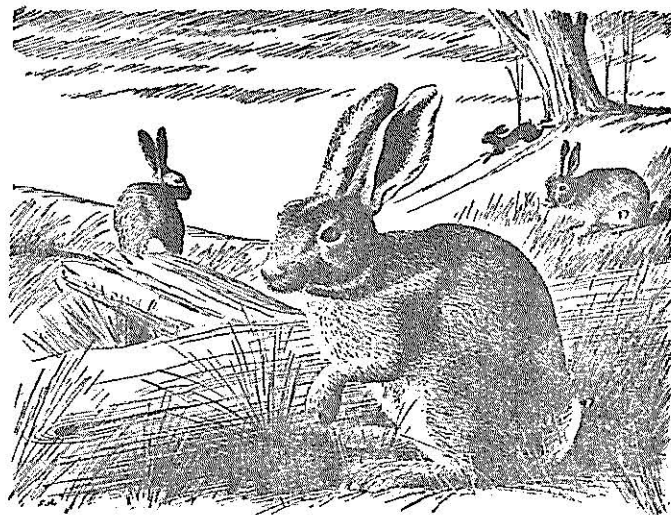

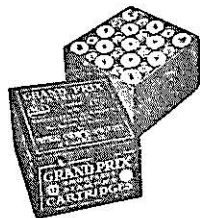

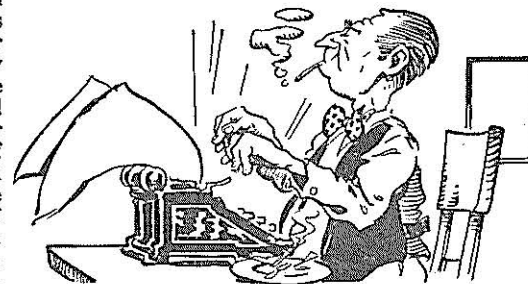

THE EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK

Despite publication from time to time of conditions governing shoots under walk-up conditions, many enquiries continue to be received on what should not be a contentious matter at all, i.e., the holding of the gun by competitors in walk-up events. Due to the many and varied ideas of referees as to just how the gun should be held, the Association investigated the matter some time back and decreed that it was almost impossible to convey, without copious directions, the then correct method of holding the gun in walk-up matches. Accordingly the Association decided that in all walk-up competitions, "the competitor may hold the gun in any position consistent with safety." This direction has been noted and accepted generally, so much so that the frequent differences of opinion on gun-holding have almost disappeared completely.

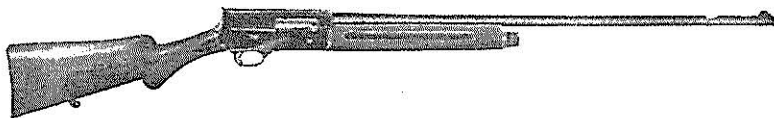


For the few who have missed the information, the matter is now made a matter of editorial comment so that shooters holding any doubts on the point may note and absorb the official direction.

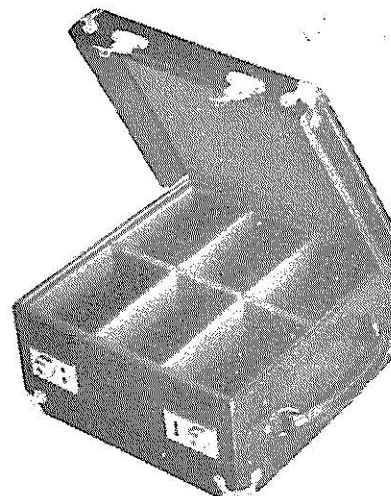
fruition and becomes an actual fact, the governing Committee at its last meeting decided to hold a conference of delegates—three representatives from each of the Australian Eastern States. These delegates will be invited personnel and will be chiefly executive officials of leading clubs. The conference will be held prior to the next annual meeting. The project has been warmly received, particularly in States outside Victoria and in Victorian country areas. The scheme will bring to Melbourne direct representatives of many good clubs and centres who have long supported the Association and the sport it governs. It would appear that nothing but good can accrue from such effort.

Clubs providing sashes for club title events are again reminded that the colours, dark blue, red or white, are not available for club winners. These colours have been arranged since the inception of the A.C.P.T.S.A. as representing winning sashes in Commonwealth, State and District championships respect-

ively. In order to ensure uniformity this colour procedure is not to be departed from. Clubs are reminded that Messrs. W. Plattely & Son Pty. Ltd., of 301 Lonsdale Place, Melbourne, C.I., have been appointed official sash makers to the A.C.P.T.S.A. and affiliated clubs are invited to forward their sash requirements direct to this house. The firm is conversant with the needs of clubs, both for open title and club contests, and no long explanation is necessary when lodging sash orders.

Registered shooters are requested to take note of some minor amendments in the A.C.P.T.S.A. Championship Conditions Rules as published in this journal last month. The amendments have reference to Skeet Championship Rules No. 7, No. 14 and No. 21—in each case the words "Silent Rise" should be deleted. It is pointed out that under A.C.P.T.S.A. Skeet shooting rules, "the competitor calls for his bird when ready to shoot"; hence the question of "silent rise" is not applicable.

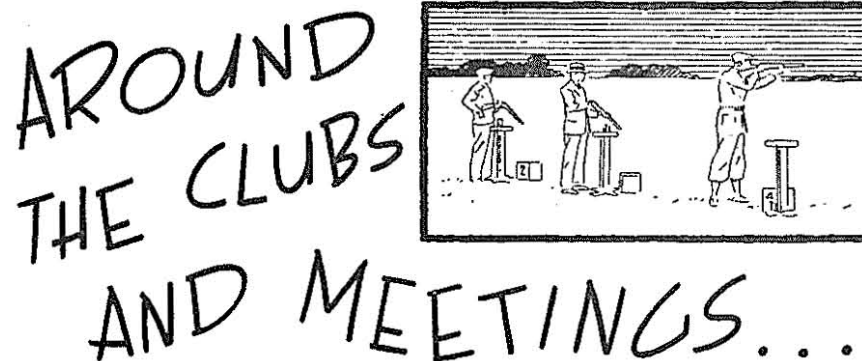

The Unsafe Gun

The following article on the handling of guns, written by no less a world authority than The Editor, "British Shooting Times" and published with his permission, should be carefully read and absorbed by all who enjoy gun sport, either in the field or over traps.

A short time ago, a member of the British Forces in Germany was out shooting in one of the forest areas. He and his party were motor-ing along a track and his gun, fully loaded, was in the car with its barrels sticking out over the side. As the car passed along a narrow section of the track, the muzzle came into contact with a tree. As a result, the gun was knocked round into the car, exploded and the charge caught its owner's leg. The leg had to be amputated. This case is quoted as being representative of what might have been called "criminal carelessness," had not the victim been the careless party.

It seems incredible that such utter carelessness and apparent indifference to the dangers involved could happen. But it did, and dire retribution followed. This is one of the worst cases we have recorded, and yet one of the saddest. It shows complete lack of danger consciousness, failure to observe any of the cardinal rules of safety, indifference to the care of a gun, and gross irresponsibility.

What shooting man who had any respect for his gun would ever place it in such a position—loaded or unloaded? Care for a gun usually goes with carefulness in handling and shooting. It is a good sign that a young shot should care for and take a pride in his gun. For on this can be built that completely responsible habit of safe gun handling which is necessary for field work. It has often been said that the man who looks after his gun will never take a risk with it. A gun placed in a car with the barrels protruding is in as unsafe a position as it pretty well could be. That it is loaded into

the bargain is an insult. In this particular case the wonder is that nobody was mortally wounded.

To see any gun pushed unceremoniously into a car is a worry. What will happen next? More carelessness is often noticed off the field than on it. A man will shoot carefully enough, but relaxes as soon as shooting is over. It is then that accidents happen. Once a gun is taken from case or cabinet, it must be treated as a potential danger until it is returned. Many accidents have happened in cars, and in dog-carts, too. Years ago a gun taken from a dog-cart in Ireland exploded in the kitchen, killing a servant. A valuable dog has been killed by jumping into a car and on to a gun left loaded. Valuable guns, too, left loose in cars may become seriously damaged. Their owners deserve that they should be. The appearance of guns treated in this fashion is bound to suffer.

What is the remedy for carelessness? Hard to say though it is, one thing is certain. The better the example set by responsible shooters, the more likely will there be improvement. Too many to-day go shooting without any background of

field conduct. To them shooting is just firing a gun. The responsible shooter must realise his greater responsibility towards all those less fortunate folk who have lacked his tradition and his training. Among the latter are many excellent sportsmen at heart who just do not know better. They have come into the world of shooting by the back door. Their education is a worthy cause.

Are responsible shooters always so responsible? Among others of similar standing, they probably are. But when among those who have lacked field training, they, too, may be tempted to take petty risks and generally to slack off. It is a great pity, and it is a danger. If politeness campaigns are now considered necessary—and indeed they are—gun-safety campaigns—if such they can be called—are essential. For too many fatal accidents are occurring and valuable lives are being sacrificed. It is a duty of all who have been trained to let others benefit by their training.

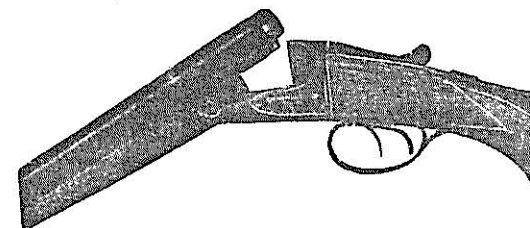

1950 International Teams' Scores

The 16th Annual International Tournament was held on Friday and Saturday, June 23 and 24, at Northolt, Middlesex, under the auspices of the English C.P.S.A. The weather was cloudy, with bright intervals, and there was some heavy rain on Friday morning. Conditions for the match between England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales were: teams of 20, 100 birds per team member, kills to count, the 18 highest scorers in each team to count. Australia again competed by post for the Mackintosh trophy, under similar conditions.

At the end of the first stage, England (443/500) were leading Scotland (442) by one bird, but they were level at 405, counting the 18 highest scores. Similarly, Wales (426) were leading Ireland (423) over the gross totals, but Ireland were ahead by one bird at 392 over the net totals. After 50 birds, the position was as follows: England (905 gross, 821 net); Scotland (879 and 805); Wales (845 and 773); Ireland (833 and 769). After the third stage: England (1,368 and 1,244); Scotland (1,329 and 1,211); Ireland (1,248 and 1,149); Wales (1,254 and 1,149).

The final results were: 1st, England, 1,824, less 167 = 1,657; 2nd, Scotland, 1,764, less 161 = 1,603; 3rd, Wales, 1,682, less 141 = 1,541; 4th, Ireland, 1,664, less 135 = 1,529.

E. R. Bruce (Scotland) was High Gun of the Match, with 97/100. The High Guns of the four teams were: England—1st, R. D. Browning, 96; 2nd (after tie), A. Poskitt, 96; 3rd (after tie), F. T. Those who remain boys at heart need no reminder from any shooting diary to recall the exhilaration that follows a first successful shot at any fresh bird or beast.

At the age of fifteen I was still considered too young for any weapon but an ancient single muzzle-loader that Experience had chosen for me, but on that particular September day his pet 12-bore lay on the gun-room table instead of under lock and key. Naturally, I fell, as any normal boy would, and was soon among some roots where a covey or two harboured in hot weather. Unfortunately for my plans for a most enjoyable morning, that field lay next to our hop-garden which was being picked, and where, unknown to me, my father was busy. A covey rose and two birds fell, while the rest of the pellets pattered down among the villagers. This brought the Guv'nor into immediate action, and I was lugged along by the ear to apologise to those astonished patrons, and worse still, no more shooting for me, and I was used as a beater until school started again. It is not easy to forget such things.

Another lad, equally keen, was bent on bagging his first snipe, although their marshes were ill-provided in that respect barring a jack, and, being a town-bred

youth, his natural history was a bit too shaky to discern any differences between the two Gallinagos, nor were his seniors any better informed—apparently. At any rate, accompanied by a sedate retriever, he banged his way round the edges of flets and flood-water for some weeks before success appeared. The sequel was rather amusing, for when the owner took the dog with him for a really good day among the longtails, he was horrified to see his hitherto non-slip favourite legging it flat out for the first bird when it fell far behind the line of guns. Not only once, but again and again, until a borrowed lead was snapped on; all of which did nothing to improve either his shooting or his temper, and on returning home explanations were demanded in double-quick time. It appeared that the boy, to whom all snipe were one, had seen one or two drop to the ground soon after his shot, and being that keen, had run in, on the expectation of handling a dead bird, and, as evil companions corrupt good manners, Sambo soon followed suit, until it became a race, with no prize at the far end except a further flush and another wild shot, and so on, *ad infinitum*.
