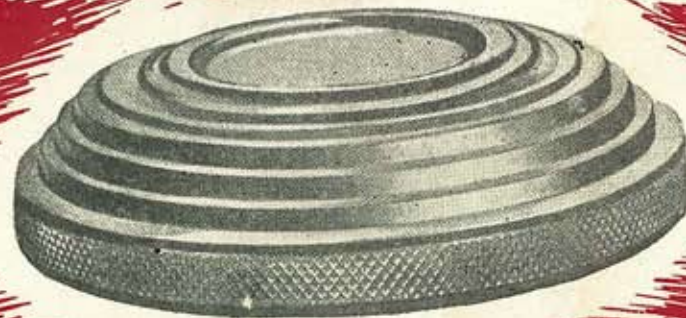

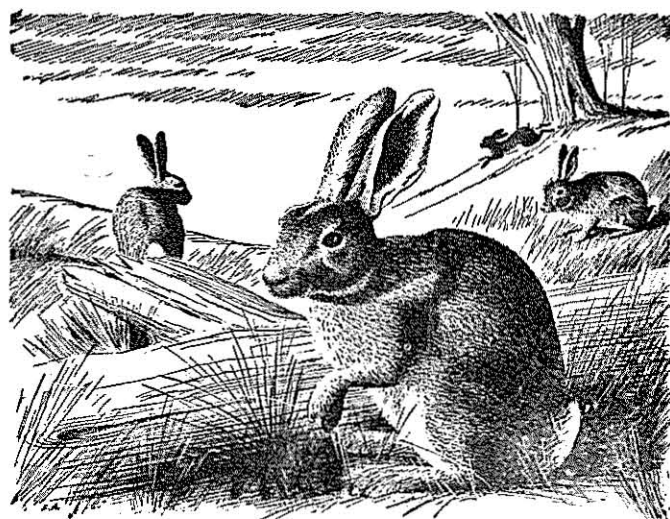

# THE EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK

The Association Annual Meeting of delegates, to be held at Scott's Hotel, 444 Collins Street, Melbourne, C.I., on Monday evening, March 12th, 1951, will commence at 7.45 p.m. The slightly earlier start has been introduced in order to provide as long a period as possible for general discussion. The new proposals concerning the constitution of the Executive Committee will doubtless arouse much interest and additional time for election of members of that body will no doubt be required. In connection with the Annual Meeting of Affiliated Club delegates, it should be noted that the meeting is reserved strictly for "Affiliated Member Club delegates" and no other person or shooter is entitled to attend, with the exception, of course, of members of the governing Executive Committee. A tendency has been observed of late years where persons (some not even known as registered shooters) have attended these meetings with a consequent crowding out of accredited member club delegates. It is not intended that this should be allowed to continue. A registered shooter is just what the title implies, he is not a member of the Association in any way. The only members of the Association are "Member Clubs," which are in turn represented at the meeting by properly appointed delegates. An individual registered shooter has no entitlement in the government of the Association, other than through his "home" club represented by its appointed delegate. The only "members" of the Association are the affiliated clubs.

Most shooters will receive this issue just prior to the opening of the big Association shooting series, extending from March 9th to 13th, inclusive. The series will be preceded by an afternoon and night shoot, conducted by the Australian Club, making altogether five days of top-class competitive shooting. The contests will



be the longest, over one period, ever staged in the Commonwealth, and those competing will know doubtless that they "have been shooting" before the final curtain is rung down. The Champion of Champions Cup (Australian National Championship) will commence at 12 noon on Friday, March 9, and continue its 60-bird course, right through to late on Saturday. No entries will be accepted for this event after 1.30 p.m. on Friday (March 9). The Association dinner to competitors and donors will take place on Saturday, commencing after the cessation of shooting. The fifth International Match will be the highlight of shooting on Monday, March 12. Australia has great hopes of wresting the International Premiership (actually the Teams' Championship of the British Empire) from England this year. The Great Britain teams (England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales) will shoot at Dublin (Ireland) about June next, and until these teams have shot, the Australian scores will be sealed.

Information has been received, in the form of a complaint, that an affiliated club recently conducted a skeet championship with "gun at shoulder." This method of shooting this type of competition is entirely wrong and obviously the club concerned has become somewhat mixed in its direction of the competition. In walk-up the "gun may be held in any position consistent with safety." Under skeet conditions, Rule 3 reads: "Shooting Position—The competitor shall not

raise his gun to his shoulder to shoot until the target is seen in the air, and when ready to shoot, he shall take his position at the firing mark with his gun in an informal field position. This position shall be defined as one in which the Referee, standing at least 10 feet directly to the side of the competitor from which he shoots, can see some part of the stock of the gun below or behind any part of the competitor's arm. The shooter will call for his bird when ready to shoot." The information is repeated for the benefit of any who may not be cognisant with the rules of skeet.



## Ten Years Ago . . .

Several events of considerable present-day interest are noted among the records of ten years ago. "Calrossie" won his 100th title on March 15, 1941. A. W. Hall, of Brunswick, won the Victorian double-rise championship at Blackburn grounds, returning a score of 10/12. Hall missed his 6th and 11th pairs. "Kim" (J. Sans) defeated J. Bryant and "Jock" (J. M. Wilson, Association President) in a tie shoot for the placings, after each had stopped 9/12 pairs. The 1941 Champion of Champions title was decided in March, 1941, and was the last of these events until the resumption of the competition in 1948.

The winner was H. R. Donnelly. The contest was then staged at 50 birds (today it is 60) and the event was conspicuous for moderate scoring. Fred Burns was the dual previous holder of the title, and he was first to complete his score with a total of 44/50. Geof. Rutledge, now I.C.I. Manager in Queensland, and Hon. Association Vice-President, was hot on Burns' trail and but for missing his 47th release, would have tied; he finished 43/50. Donnelly had to stop all five releases on his last visit to the track to equal Burns. This he did to finish also 44/50. The tie shoot went ten additional rounds. Donnelly missed his 53rd and 56th birds, while Burns failed to cover his 54th, 57th and 59th targets. The final scores were: Donnelly, 52/60; Burns, 51/60. Four additional tie shoots were necessary to decide the prize list. The remaining eight places went, in order, to the following: W. Bloomfield, G. C. Rutledge, "Duxbac", J. Bryant, "Texas" (C. Lancaster), W. R. Johns, E. G. Biggs and "Pentland" (Jim Stoddart). The interstate trophy was annexed by Ted Egans, of Storey's Creek (Tas.), who returned a score of 42/55. The Australian Teams' Championship was won by the Launceston-Bentleigh combination, comprising J. M. Tyquin (then a resident of Launceston), Ted Egan, L. Bertram and Jim Stoddart, 65/80. (The 1951 Champion of Champions title and the full Association programme of four days' shooting will commence this week, Friday, March 9, 1951, and continue to March 13 inclusive.)

## 15th Annual Report

The 15th Annual Report of the Executive Committee of the Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association, covering the period 1st October, 1950, to 31st January, 1951, is submitted for consideration and approval by affiliated club delegates attending the 16th Annual Meeting of the Association at Scott's Hotel, 444 Collins Street, Melbourne, C.I. on Monday, 12th March, 1951.

The period covered by this report extends over four months only, occasioned following the resolution passed at the 1950 Annual Meeting, whereby it was agreed that the holding of the annual meeting during the conduct of the Association's Annual Shooting series in March each year would be more advantageous to the majority of affiliated member clubs.

In view of the brief period since the submission of the previous annual report, there are few major matters available for consideration.

One item of much interest is the fact that the Australian break record, previously held by A. J. Russell of Victoria at 104 straight, has gone to Lloyd Wilson of Dubbo, N.S.W., with a sequence of 117 straight. This total now stands as the official Australian break record and was compiled at Bathurst, N.S.W.

## "Tips" and "Tails"



Petty Officer R. Blackwell, well known among Footscray Club shooters and also at Sydney clubs, writing recently, says he is now at sea attached to the destroyer "Tobruk". During a recent visit to the Hornsby Club, (N.S.W.) Blackwell had a day out, scoring three straight-out wins. He has the real sporting atmosphere in this regard, as he requested in his letter that his "handicap should be adjusted accordingly." Blackwell concludes by "hoping all is well down Melbourne way and a few breaks and misses are being recorded to the Champion State shooters. Luck to all for the 1951 year."

South Queensland shooters, particularly those from round St. George, will be pleased to know that a mystery has been cleared up by the re-appearance, as it were, of H. S. Smith, the club's one-time secretary at St. George, who now resides at Gayndah in the Pineapple State. "Smithy", as he was known in the sporting fields in pre-war days, was a most efficient secretary with St. George, until the upheaval which started in 1939. "Smithy" promptly joined up with an artillery unit and went overseas. He dropped in at Melbourne on his way back from the Middle East, and then the silence settled down. We understand he is now in charge of a prominent banking institution at Gayndah and is hopeful of getting a club going in that prominent dairying centre. "Smithy" shot in the 1939 Champion of Champions meeting, being one of a party of four which contained "Pee-Wee" (Jack) and Charlie Thompson, and Boyce Siddens. We hope Gayndah gets going; it will not lack efficient handling.

Cobar, considered to be an "outpost" club in far Western N.S.W.,

intends conducting a championship meeting on April 28 and 29. Details will be as advertised in this issue. Like many clubs far removed from the bigger centres, Cobar has had to struggle hard against the lack of supplies. The club has a fine ground, good lay-out, pavilion, etc., but has been restricted to one or two small shoots during the last 12 months—the result has been that a number of earlier enthusiasts have turned to other sports which do not present so many obstacles in participation. Information is to hand that resellers are not interested and will not make efforts to secure any substantial quantities. Two lots (small) of clays and one issue of cartridges has been the Cobar sports provision for 12 months. Enough to lower the enthusiasm of the most interested.

A letter from the English Clay Pigeon Shooting Association includes the following, "Thank you very much indeed for your kind thoughts in despatching parcels to some of our officials. The recipients will, we hope, acknowledge direct to you. And that brings us to the most pleasing part of this letter. As a token of appreciation of your great interest and co-operation in clay pigeon shooting matters affecting our two countries, at a meeting of our Executive Committee held in London recently, it was unanimously agreed to ask you to become an Honorary Life Vice-President of this Association (English), and we hope that you will do us the honour of accepting the position. A special badge will be forwarded to you in due course." (Many thanks, England — this is accepted as a tribute and honour to Australia and Australian shooting sportsmen.—Ed.).

The following letter, written by a Canadian from Ontario and published in the "British Shooting Times," raises an interesting point on the subject of carrying a gun. It reads:

Shooters, particularly beginners, are constantly admonished to exercise the greatest possible care in

handling their guns, so that they may not injure either themselves or others. It is very meet and right so to do, for one cannot be too careful in handling such a lethal weapon as a loaded shotgun.

Of all the numerous safety rules suggested by various authors, there has been only one with which I would disagree. This is the oft-

repeated admonition that whenever the gun is carried on the shoulder, the trigger-guard should be uppermost, the idea being that if the gun be carried in the normal position, with the trigger-guard next the shoulder, the barrels will be pointed so nearly horizontal that there is danger to a person following the one carrying the gun.

Personally, I cannot agree with this notion, and I object to carrying my gun, trigger up, for several reasons. First of all, I cannot accept that carrying my gun on my shoulder, trigger down, presents any danger whatever to anyone walking behind me. The angle of the barrel is so nearly vertical that not even the head of the most elongated of human bean-poles found on current American basketball teams could intercept a shot charge from it, should it accidentally discharge. Secondly, to me, at least, a gun carried on the shoulder upside down feels most unnatural and awkward. Thirdly, a gun carried upside down on the shoulder soon has its blueing badly chafed off, which, to me at least, is annoying.

Overshadowing these last two considerations, however, is the fact that a gun carried right side up on the shoulder does not point at a person following. Notice a company of infantrymen marching "shoulder arm"—do their rifles point at the men in the rank to the rear? They do not.

This paragraph, also printed in the "Shooting Times," will doubtless be pleasing to many who strongly favour the quality English gun. It indicates that apprenticeships have been revived in the London gun-making trade.

"One of the few of the remaining operative City Livery Companies, The Worshipful Company of Gun-makers, met on October 19 formally to elect the new Master for the ensuing year, Mr. W. R. H. Robson. The retiring Master, Mr. Stuart Hellis, the youngest to have held office, will look back on a year of activity notable for the passing of the Gun Barrel Proofing Act of 1950, the warning issued to the Gun Trade and to the Police on the sale of unproved weapons, and the regulations regarding the durionising of gun-

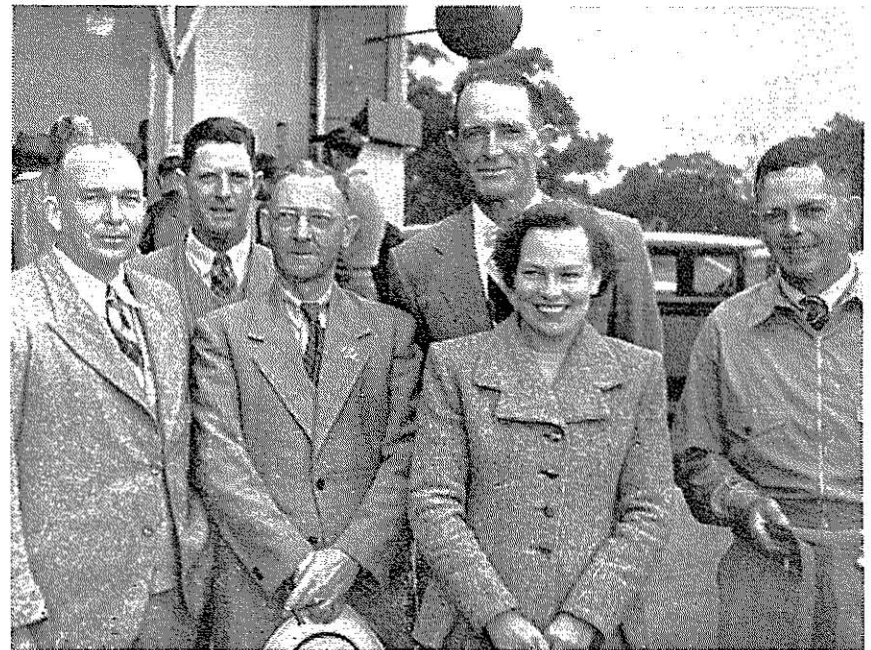

most interesting sights here, just when the freeze up really sets in, is a milling collection of every possible kind of wildfowl and seafoal. Milling round in a shouting, vociferous multitude trying to keep the last patch of water open against King Frost. They can be heard for miles across the ice, but can only be approached if their 'pond' is near shallow water which can be waded. I have never taken a gun to such a place and feel that anyone who does should have a couple of barrels himself, but once waded within thirty yards, unfortunately without a camera—the next day the ice had covered everything. The following day I skated over the spot on glistening black steel ice and only found a few feathers here and there in the ice where hundreds of birds had tried to beat the winter." The writer concludes by extending best wishes for a "Very Happy New Year—confusion to the King's enemies — and a brighter world in the near future."

An interesting judgment was given in the King's Bench Division (England) when £750 damages were awarded to a man who was accidentally shot in the foot at a fox shoot in Hertfordshire. The damages claimed were from Mr. S. P. Dormer, on whose land, but without whose knowledge or permission, the shoot took place. It seems that arrangements for the fox shoot were made

by one of Mr. Dormer's staff, without instructions from him. The judgment certainly seems a little unfair to Mr. Dormer, but it exemplifies just how involved a landholder may find himself through no fault of his own.

The Director of Fisheries and Game (Victoria) intends issuing a questionnaire to duck shooters seeking information which will be used for the sole object of improving the duck position. Last year some 8,000 were issued, but the return result was most disappointing; only 200 completed questionnaires were forwarded to the Department. Many shooters thought the information sought did not concern them, others thought there was a "catch" attached to it, others again thought the revenue officials may be interested, and as a consequence failed to interest themselves in returning the completed form. The Department is intensely interested in improving the lot of the duck shooter, and only by shooters completing and returning the questionnaire can the Department assess and collate the necessary information for future years. Addressing a dinner function at Sale on Foundation Day, Mr. R. McNally, of the Department, stated that the time was not far distant when open season for duck shooting would be a matter of fading history unless duck shooters co-operated more with the Department by supplying information required and also clamping down on out-of-season shooting. The latter has proved a growing menace in post-war years, due very largely to the fact that sufficient inspectors have not been available. This shortage is gradually being overcome and new inspectors are appearing each month. It is possible that the Department will follow the advice of the press, and when offenders are caught, ensure that guns are confiscated and not returned until full market value, at auction, has been paid. It is up to the shooting fraternity to support the Department, and all communications addressed to the Director of Fisheries & Game, 605 Flinders Street Extension, Melbourne, C.3, will receive courteous and considered attention.

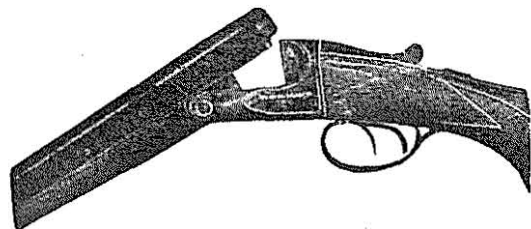

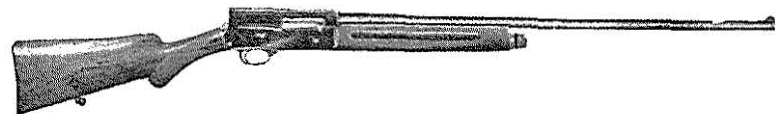

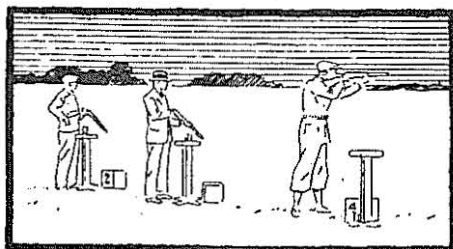

**GRIFFITH (N.S.W.).**—Under ideal lighting and weather conditions 50 shooters took their stations to contest the first Commonwealth Night Skeet Championship, which was conducted by the Griffith Gun Club on Monday, January 29th, 1951 (Australia Day). The shoot commenced at 8.30 p.m., and with the exception of one slight hold-up owing to a trap fault, the programme ran through smoothly with the shoot-off concluding at 1.30 a.m. on Tuesday. More than 250 visitors and spectators witnessed this unique event, and among local personalities were the Wade Shire President, Councillor Percy Hamilton, and many others.

The outright winner of this first Commonwealth Championship for

night skeet took the title under what would have appeared rather adverse conditions. When the squad in which he shot was called to their stations, this shooter could not locate his gun and was obliged to borrow one similar from another competitor. An incident of this nature in competition shooting of any kind is sufficient to throw the shooter completely off balance. However, Reg McNamara, of Griffith, proved that such obstacles can be overcome when he killed 18 of the 20 skeet with 16 straight, losing the 17th, killing the 18th and 19th and losing the 20th; both lost skeet were well dusted. This spectacular effort gained for the Reg McNamara the Commonwealth title with sash and a magnificent trophy clock. The shoot-off was for a round of 11 skeet, commencing with singles from the high tower, with low tower alternate skeet over seven stations and high and low tower skeet from stations 2 and 6. Shooters in the order of Don Muir, followed by Carl Schneider and Tom Gibson, completed this first round in the shoot-off which gave Don Muir, of Griffith, second place with 25 kills from 31 skeet. Both Schneider and Gibson killed an even number of skeet in this round, and another round was shot to determine the third place. The 11th skeet of this round found Carl Schneider, of Narrandera, with 33 kills from his 42 skeet, and Tom Gibson, of Griffith, who appeared the most natural shooter at skeet for the event, took fourth place with 32 kills from his 42 releases.

At the conclusion of trophy presentations, the visiting shooter, Carl Schneider, of Narrandera, paid high tribute to the Griffith Gun Club for the outstanding improvements, the great advantage of having three clay pigeon traps and the manner in which the Skeet Championship and Afternoon Trophy Shoots had been conducted.

The afternoon programme was of two events: Event 1 was shot from the centre trap for a 5-bird Double-barrel Optional Sweepstake, where 8 squads of 5 shooters faced the trap as a preliminary to the main afternoon event, thus giving delayed visitors the opportunity to arrive in time to nominate for the trophy shoot. Ten shooters divided the

honours for this event by killing the possible 5 birds. The shooters in the order of shooting were as follows: Lloyd Bowditch (Griffith), Jack Headon (Hay), Des Coughlan (Griffith), Ern Cox (Hay), Claude Carnell (Griffith), Joe Pocock (Hay), Bill "Dinky" Catling (Hay), Andrew Mills (Hay), Emil Albert (Barellan), Bruce Gordon (Barellan).

Event No. 2, 15-bird Double-barrel Trophy from Association Handicaps (optional sweepstake): This event was shot from the three automatic traps with 53 shooters contesting the event, each shooter having 5 birds from each trap. Conditions of shooting were good and the 265 birds were put through without incident. 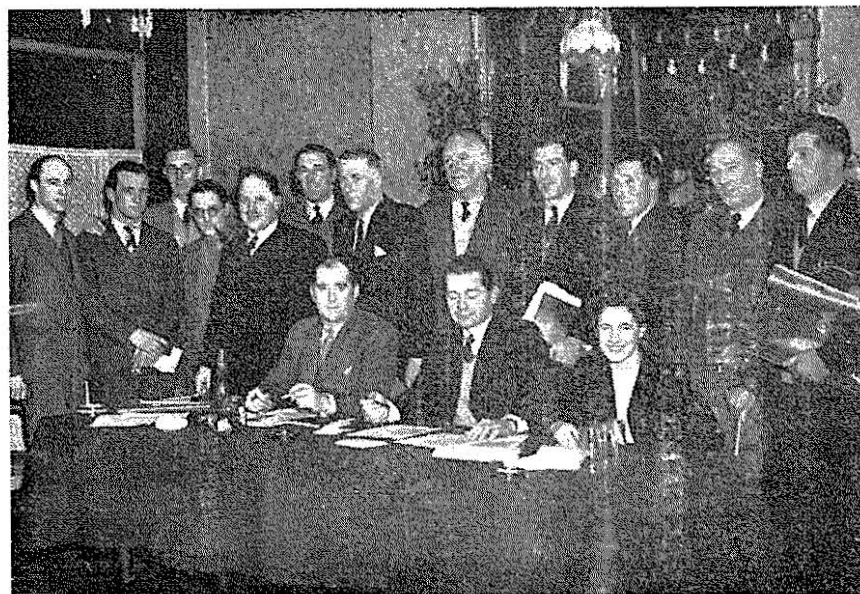

## The Sporting Gun in England Its History and Development

By Colonel W. Le HARDY, M.C., F.S.A.

The normal rations supplied to both armies were meagre and scarcely sufficient to sustain men constantly taking part in strenuous battles or on lengthy marches. It was with fiendish delight that commanders billeted their troops in houses of their known opponents, and presumably no active steps were taken to discourage the troopers from supplementing their rations at the expense of the large landowner.

There is much evidence to show that the improvement in all classes of weapons during the civil wars continued after the Restoration, when the flint lock fowling piece was first introduced and remained fashionable for nearly two centuries.

During the commonwealth the Royalist landlord had either fled abroad or had been compelled to sell his estates to pay the large fines imposed upon him by Parliament; their forests became common to all, their falconers had been killed or gunmakers, encouraged by improved

turned to other trades, and game of all sorts had been destroyed. Vermin and rabbits, on the other hand, had increased in vast numbers. The result of all this was that on the Restoration, few landlords were able to re-stock their parks or reform their team of falconers. Somewhat naturally, therefore, they diverted their activities to hunting the fox and the hare in lieu of the stag, with the aid of hounds.

Another circumstance which tended to popularise the sport of shooting and to the improvement of the sporting gun, was the knowledge and experience which many landowners had gained during their exile abroad, of the new art established on the Continent of "Shooting upon the wing." The Continental gun was more adapted to this skilful operation, but it was not long before the English gunsmith manufactured good substitutes while many foreign conditions in England, accompanied their patrons and set up their trade in this country.

The Charter of 1637, which embodied the Gunmakers' Company, granted to them the right to prove guns only within a radius of ten miles around the city of London, but in 1672 a new and amplified Charter was granted to the company by which it was made responsible for proofing guns all over England so that guns not so proofed could not be offered for sale. The site of the company's proof house was then, as now, in Commercial Road, closely adjoining the Minories which long remained the centre of the gun-making industry in London. It is interesting to note that the company is one of the few City Guilds which continues to carry out the functions for which it was originally established, and it is still necessary for all guns to bear the company's proof mark before being offered for sale in this country.

By 1680 the first double-barrelled gun had been introduced, to be followed by many freak guns having anything up to a maximum of seven barrels.

The turn of the 18th century marked the opening of a new era in the sporting gun, wherein the English gunmaker, whether he worked in London or the Provinces, gained the supremacy over all competitors.

### Social and Economic Conditions

The social and economic conditions pertaining to England at this date were such as to make possible the building up of big estates and thereby large game reserves were created. The widespread introduction of enclosures of land, previously held in common, tended especially to create this condition. Although the first half of the 18th century was not notable for any outstanding new invention, the increased business which resulted from the introduction of the Queen Anne Musket, commonly known as Brown Bess, with which the British Army was then armed, allowed the gunmaker to accumulate capital and train skilled craftsmen for the development of the already existing sporting gun.

The fowling piece of the early 18th century was modelled on "Brown Bess", but was of lighter construction with the muzzle flared. While this type of gun was exclusively used by the genuine sports-

the guards of coaches were armed, and a slightly larger weapon known as the musketoon, were constantly used by the poacher or casual traveller when a target presented itself at close range. In fact, when the government armed the guards on the London to Bath coaches, they were closely rationed in powder and shot to discourage their habit of taking a pot shot at game as the coach was passing along the country roads.

Further improvements in the flint lock construction and a tendency to reduce the length of the barrel, were the main features of the fowling piece constructed in the latter half of the 18th century. Apart from these improvements, the pattern remained much the same.

During the first half of the 19th century, the only art in gunmaking in which the English gunmaker did not hold supremacy was the forging of the barrel. The exceptionally high quality of the iron mined in Biscay enabled the Spaniards to forge a twisted barrel which was undoubtedly superior to those produced in England and many English-made guns were provided with such barrels, but by the latter part of the century the English maker had learnt this art and improved upon it.

By this date the double-barrelled gun had become the standard pattern.

### Most Important Development

The most important development which occurred during the last quarter of the 18th century was Henry Nock's "Patent Breeching." By this invention a far more rapid ignition was effected so that the delay between pressing the trigger and the discharge of the shot from the barrel was negligible. Furthermore, the force by which the shot was discharged was greatly increased owing to the simultaneous combustion of the whole charge. This allowed the barrel to be shortened by 6 to 10 inches, whereby the balance of the gun was improved and the weight considerably reduced. The flaring of the barrels was rendered unnecessary, so that before the opening of the 19th century, nearly every English gunmaker had adopted some breeching similar to Nock's.

## Dangers in Old-time Barrels

(By J. W. Houlden)

Look at the next Damascus steel shotgun you see hanging over a fireplace or in a collection of old guns. Admire the beauty of its lace-like patterns cut on the shiny, steel barrel, but don't try to shoot it. It might be fatal.

The attractive appearance of the Damascus shotgun is too often the cause of misplaced confidence, although it was once a useful and popular hunting weapon. Damascus metal first came to us from the early sword makers of Damascus in eastern Europe; growing in popularity, it was almost universally adopted for shotgun barrel metal throughout continental Europe in the latter part of the 19th century.

If the above statements were purely historical, there would be no further cause for concern. Unfortunately, a considerable number of these old shotguns have survived the march of time and are being used today by our present generation of sportsmen. If shot shells were still made of the same old black powder, soft shot and corrosive primer of 50 years ago, we would have no problem. But they, like almost everything else, have been improved, and therein lies the crux of the problem. In short, the modern shotgun shell is too powerful for these old shotgun barrels.

Sportsmen frequently ask the reason why.

The first gun barrels were rough, crude affairs made of cast iron or brass. Then came a built-up barrel forged from small strips or plates of iron welded into short cylinders. The cylinders were, in turn, welded into a barrel of the required length.

Barrels made by twisting and welding long strips of metal around a mandrel or rod to form a tube gradually replaced the older type. The wrapping gave a "twist" appearance to the metal. Some of the barrel tubes were twisted even further after the welding was completed. Such twisting was thought

to impart added strength to the metal.

The metal-working industry firmly adopted the twisting theory and began to evolve the type of barrel which is known as a Damascus steel barrel. This barrel was made by taking alternate strips of iron and steel. Each strip was twisted from end to end, then heated and forged into a solid bar, consisting of two iron and one steel strips. By varying the number of strips and the amount of twist, the design in the finished barrel could be varied to suit the gunsmith's artistic ideas.

The twisted and forged bar was next coiled and welded around a mandrel or rod corresponding to the diameter of the gun bore. This resulted in a tube or two tubes for a double barrel. The gunsmith then welded additional metal on to the breech for lugs and locks. Lastly, before being assembled, the barrel was smoothed down and finished to remove all hammer marks and irregularities from the welding.

The Damascus barrel has several weak points. The metal itself consists of a mixture of part steel and part iron which has been hand-welded together. In the twisting and forging, a considerable amount of scale and slag is incorporated into the body of the metal. These impurities weaken the iron, often to the point of danger.

In a Damascus barrel of poorer quality, the imperfections are larger and more scattered.

To add to this dangerous condition of imperfections in the body of the metal, another serious defect is caused by uneven welding or overheating of the metal during welding. Overheating makes the iron coarse grained and soft, changing the characteristics of the steel to weaken it below its original strength.
