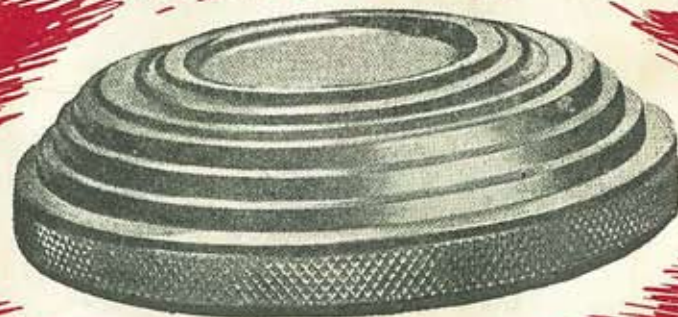

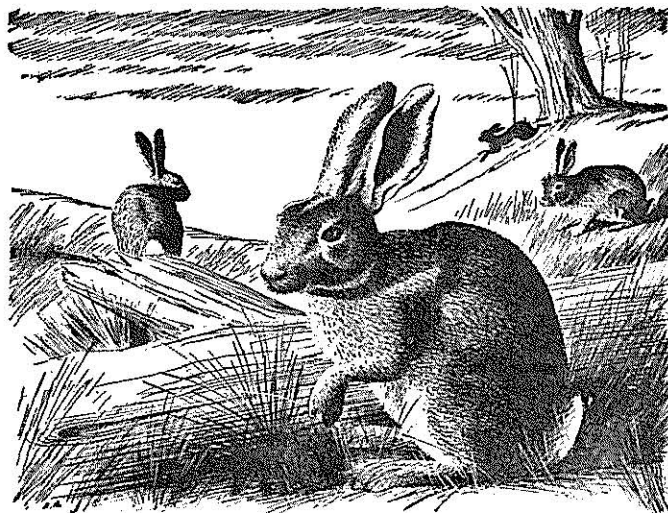

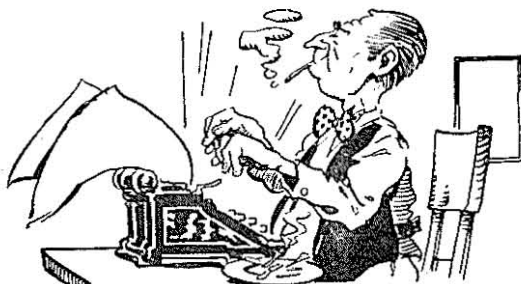

THE EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK

A very definite feeling is prevalent in England at present which suggests that future International contests may be shot under single-barrel conditions. In fact, had it not been that Australia had already shot its section of the match in March at East Burwood, there was in existence a strong desire to shoot the 1951 series at Dublin later this month under the single-barrel arrangement. If future International contests are decided at single-barrel, it will certainly bring the British Commonwealth countries into line with U.S.A. This would seem to be all for the better and do much to hasten the day when all the English-speaking countries will be enabled to shoot internationally on similar and possibly equal terms. Should the International Committee at its next conference in London in January, 1952, decide on single-barrel for future International matches, the A.C.P.T.S.A. will necessarily have to take stock of the situation and give serious consideration as to whether it should not shoot its Champion of Champions Cup (Australian National Championship) under similar conditions. Single-barrel would at least make for cheaper shooting to competitors—quite an interesting and important factor when taking into account present-day costs.

In the past the A.C.P.T.S.A. has always insisted on post entry for its major contests. The future may here again hold some possibility of a change. In England and U.S.A. pre-post entries are always accepted, it being found that administration is assisted by such acceptance. The chief objection to pre-post entries in Australia has been the fact that some shooters may enter by this means and then not be in attendance to shoot when their particular squad might be called. Possibly a penalty would overcome any drawback in this regard. There is no question that organization and administration of the Association's major shoots



would be greatly assisted by the taking of pre-post nominations. It would mean that many squads could be drawn, listed and called immediately the advertised time of starting arrived—thus there would be no delay in "getting going". The matter will have the consideration of the Association's executive committee at a later date.

The Association is indebted to shooters who put forward constructive suggestions. One or two have been received in recent weeks. One was that a prominent shooter's picture appear on the front cover of "News" each month. The idea is quite good, but departure from a standard type cover would greatly add to the costs of production, and this is something which has to be carefully watched in these days of uncertain supply and delivery. It is pointed out that paper costs have quadrupled since the original publication of "News", therefore it is incumbent on the Association management to strive for economy in production throughout—without, of course, lowering the standard. Another suggestion from the same source is that a film of some big fixtures and metropolitan grounds be prepared and hired out to country picture theatres. The idea has some merit, but again it does not appear to be a feasible one under present-day conditions. For a period of settled economy the proposition would certainly be worth trying.

Two club handicappers in widely separated sections of the Common-

wealth have sought information as to whether they are permitted to change the handicap of a shooter, who in their respective opinions, is wrongly handicapped, either favourably or unfavourably to the particular competitor. The Association has no objection to local handicappers making such change, but it should be known to all interested that any such change must be immediately (by immediately it is meant "within three days") notified to the Association secretary. Such notification must also outline the reason why the change has been made—this being necessary to protect the interests of the competitor.



Ten Years Ago . . .

An interesting note is recorded in the June, 1941, history of clay pigeon shooting. The reference concerns "walk-up" conditions. The records of the day state that "Athol Love won the first championship at walk-up at North Balwyn on Saturday, June 4, under the recently amended rules." The amendment to the rules refers to the "holding of the gun in any position consistent with safety." Prior to this period a ruling existed whereby the gun, in walk-up, had to be kept close to the body with portion of the butt being visible to the referee. The varying interpretations placed on this ruling by different referees continually brought forth complaints from competitors. So serious were the complaints that at one stage the then Executive Committee of the Association contemplated dropping walk-up competitions (including championships) entirely. The amended condition revolutionised walk-up shooting competition and a complaint on this type of event is now a rarity.

The A.C.P.T.S.A. conducted a "Fags for Fighters" shoot at Bentleigh on King's Birthday holiday, June, 1941. The veteran patron of the Association, Mr. Donald Mackintosh, presented a gold cup for the winner of the main event. This went

U.S.A. Shooting . . .

At our State shoots a shooter has to be a bona-fide resident of the State to win any of the championships. Out of State can, however, win any of the cash purses. If we didn't have this rule, take for instance, Arnold Riegger. Last year and the year before he won ten or twelve State Championships (that is, he would have won if they were open). Of course, all other registered shoots are open to any one in the world. At our Inland Empire and the Grand American all events except the Champion of Champions at the Grand are open to all amateurs. The Vandalia Open Handicap at the Grand is open to all, pros. and

amateurs. As you know, Bill, there are 48 States in the U.S.A., and it is a nice sight to see each shooter in the Champion of Champions Race with the big badge on his or her back showing which State they represent. It is really interesting to watch. The A.T.A. furnish these "Markers" to the shooters, and insist they be tacked to their backs before the event; in this way, the spectators can tell who and the State.

There was a three-day shoot (registered) at Hayden Lake recently. The weather was perfect. Miss Joyce Vanairsdale was hitting them. She won the Handicap with 99 x 100 from 18 yards on the Saturday. On the Sunday she tied for second in the handicap with 97 x 100 from 19 yards. Her 16-yard scores are also terrific. Hope she keeps it up over the State shoot. She is shooting an over and under double now; she used to shoot with a pump gun. Her brother Jim was runner-up in the Grand American in 1947. Jim broke 98 from 18 yards to tie, then broke 75 straight in the shoot-off to win second place. Jim got around 2000 dollars for his success.

AUSTRALIAN INTERNATIONAL TEAM SCORES 1951

Appended below are the scores of the Australian International Team, 1951. The team completed the Australian section of the International contest on Monday, March 12, 1951, at East Burwood. Shooting conditions were, clear light, strong following wind, no rain.

The other competing teams are England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales. These teams will shoot at Dublin, Ireland, over the dates June 22 and June 23. Congratulations are again extended to Newton Thomas, of Sydney, N.S.W., who returned

"Tips" and "Tails"



Hobart Club's annual meeting was well attended last month. A detailed report is submitted by club correspondent, Mrs. F. Nelson. Mention of Mrs. Nelson recalls that she was again appointed Hobart Club correspondent by members

at the annual meeting for the third successive year. Mrs. Nelson's work has been of inestimable benefit to the Hobart Club, and much of its success in post-war years has been due to her untiring efforts to secure newspaper publicity on behalf of the sport and the club. She has been the recipient of two presentations by the club since she took over the publicity. Mrs. Nelson's interest in trapshooting dates back some 20 years, hence she is well equipped to publicise the sport of her own and her husband's interest. Incidentally Mrs. Nelson's husband is one of the leading shots in Tasmania. The annual meeting report is:

"The high cost and shortage of ammunition and clay targets had affected the sport of clay bird shooting, the president (Mr. J. M. Tyquin) said at the annual meeting of the Hobart Gun Club. Mr. Tyquin added that attendances at shoots during the past year had been satisfactory, but they probably would decrease next season. He said shipments of clay targets which had arrived in Hobart were seriously damaged, and the club had received only a small percentage of unbroken targets. The club had conducted almost every type of shoot known to the sport in the past season, but it would have trouble drafting programmes for the coming season."

The annual report stated that Messrs. W. R. Morgan and S. Marshall, club members, had been chosen in the Australian team of 20 shooters in the international contest held in Victoria in March. Results would

be announced after Britain had shot in June.

The secretary (Mr. D. Bridges) said nearly all of the £248/10/5 profit from shoots had been used to install a second automatic trap, but assets were considerable. The club's financial position would be sound by the end of the year. Officers elected: President, Mr. J. M. Tyquin; vice-presidents, Messrs. J. A. McKenzie, E. G. McRae, C. Reynolds; committee, Messrs. T. Cannon, E. Nelson, N. and S. Marshall, D. Love, W. Reynolds, G. Ransley; secretary, Mr. D. Bridges; treasurer, Mr. W. R. Morgan; referee, Mr. D. Love."

Love and Kindness are the names of publicans on opposite sides of the street in Blackall, Qld.

Charleville Diggers' Gun Club will hold a two-day series over the dates June 30 and July 1. The chief attraction on the opening day will be the premier Queensland championship (at double-barrel). The usual sash and handsome trophy will go to the winner. The place-getters will also receive appropriate awards. On July 1 the Warego Handicap of £100, points scoring 3 and 2, at 30 birds, will be the principal event. Minor events will be included on the programmes of both days. Shooting will start at 9.30 a.m. each day. President, Ossie Smith, who competed during the last Association meeting in March at East Burwood, is particularly desirous of securing a good attendance. He advises that the Charleville Club has been "bottling up" its supplies to ensure that all shooters will be able to take part in all events on the programme of both days—details of which are advertised in this issue. Ossie is hopeful of securing additional clays and cartridges before the meeting opens. Finally he hopes to see a good many Queenslanders in the field for the title and also a reasonable sprinkling of Southerners.

Jim McInnes, the I.C.I. official who is so well known on metropolitan grounds for his prowess at squad hustling and genial "mike manner", blossomed out in a new role at Rainbow (V.) on May 9. Jim (who is

also renowned for losing his hat) gave a first-class exhibition, according to local reports, and altogether proved of great assistance to the new Rainbow organization. We understand also that he had a couple of good stories to tell during the convivial stages of the shoot.

Colac Club continues to reveal the thoughtful planning for which its club executive is noted. During a recent fixture Eric Ball (President) was deputed to recognise the services of three officials of past years in the form of presentation of life membership badges of the Colac Club. The years of service of the three recognised in this way totalled over a quarter of a century. All three were sincerely thanked for their long sustained interest and assistance to the club. The first two honoured were Messrs. F. O. (Bob) Bilson (one would never think of Colac without recalling that name) and Harold Raymond, who occupied the positions respectively of President and Secretary during the difficult years following the 1930 depression era. Both had done much to keep the club on a level plane and had guided it through some very difficult years. Theo. Norman was the third member of the trio honoured. Theo. is very well known at most metropolitan grounds and still turns on his share of the work and organization when Colac Club is conducting its bigger shoots. The Association wishes the three sportsmen long years of good health and fortune and congratulates the Colac Club on its wise appreciation and recognition of worthy service.

Clay pigeon shooting is developing along the right lines in Western Australia. The three main clubs have all been fortunate in securing first-class officials and committee members. The Perth Club's official opening of its new grounds at lay-out took place at Clontarf over three days, June 2, 3 and 4. The Perth Club will probably stage the State titles allocated to it on October 6 and 7—this being the period of the Royal Agricultural Show in that capital. Bridgetown Club has not functioned as yet, but a number of Perth members are interested in seeing Bridgetown get going, and it is almost certain assistance will be forthcoming from some capital club members to ensure Bridgetown's establishment on a good basis. Bridgetown is a lovely spot in the south-west, where I remember enjoying the hospitality of Dave Jack, a sporting Englishman who, proved a very congenial "host" during my visit to the Golden West last year. Possibly Dave may be induced to take an active interest in the new club. Cairns Club in North Queensland is a recent affiliation with the Association. Cairns officials are: President, G. R. Kelly; Vice-President, J. H. Izatt; Hon. Secretary, H. K. Mazlin; Hon. Treasurer, W. C. Balzer, and Club Captain is A. E. Gerrand. Advice is to hand that Cairns is going into the sport of clay pigeon shooting in a most up-to-date way. A first class lay-out is already established at Redlynch, adjacent to the town. A special "shed" has already been erected to accommodate the "Bar" and the secretary's office. An extension will be added to this structure for the purpose of including a refreshment stall. The club is anxious to secure the interest of any visitors during the winter months and the secretary has requested that any tourists who are shooters and who may be going North in the next few months should contact him at Box 858, Cairns. Tourists are invited to bring their own guns, but if this is not possible, Cairns club will arrange for visitors to have the loan of "shooting irons". With two clubs, Atherton and Cairns, now set-up in the far north, it would seem to be opportune for a visitor or two to try his prowess against the Northerners during the coming winter. J. H. (Jock) Izatt, the club's Vice-President, is known to many Southerners, he having attended a number of shoots at Burwood during the Christmas vacation period.

D. Bedford has taken over the secretarial duties of the St. George Club in Southern Queensland. S. J. O'Shea, the previous official in that capacity, is now a resident of Toowoomba. St. George Club is one of the earliest among the affiliated clubs of the Association being inside the first ten to join up its forces with the A.C.P.T.S.A.

A new club is likely to be formed at Chinchilla in Queensland. The sponsor is Mr. Graham Macdonnell.

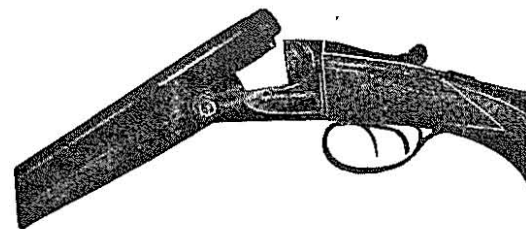

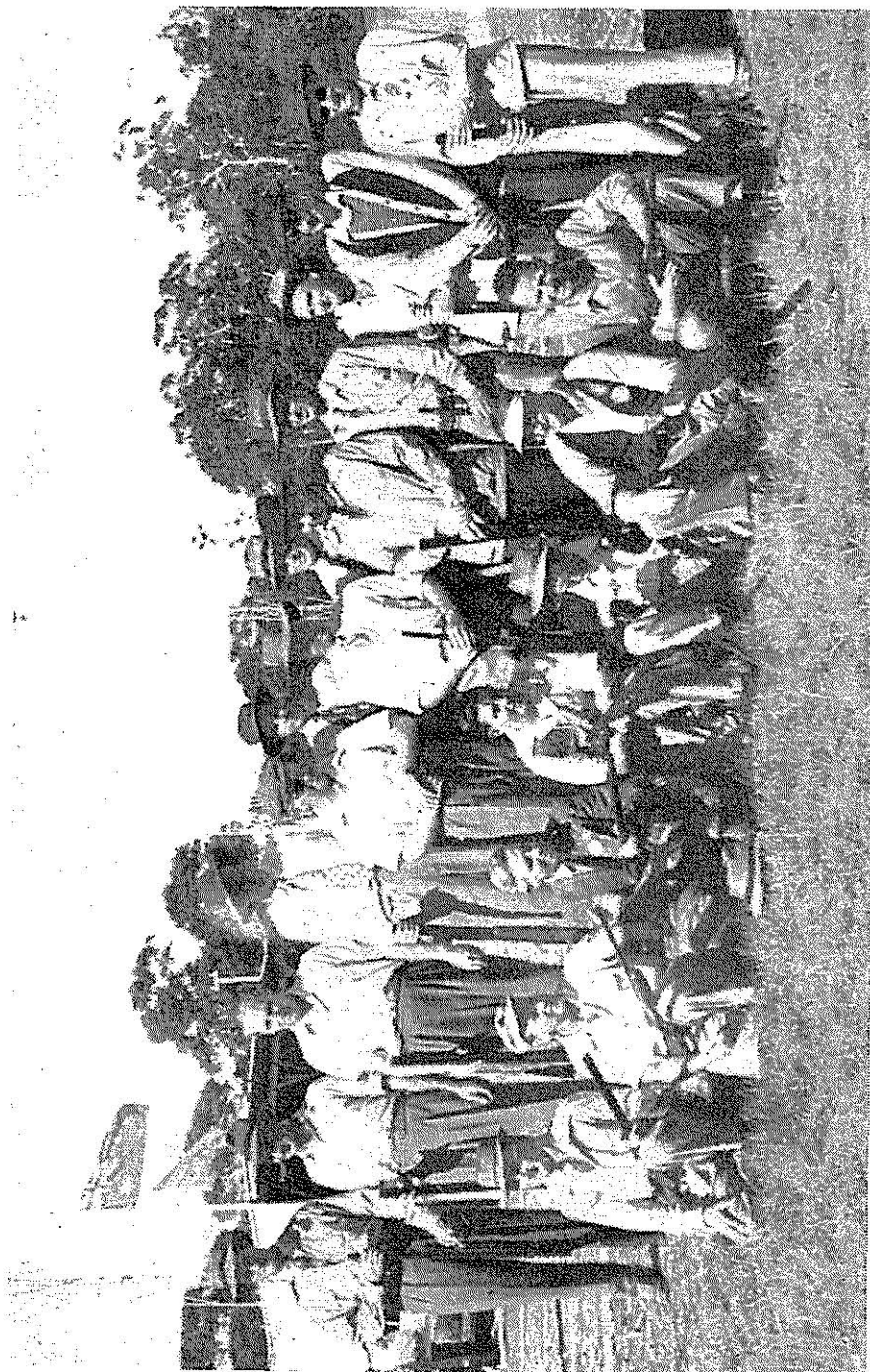

Bothwell Club (Tas.) will hold the official opening of its automatic trap with a special programme on Saturday, June 23. A \$50 handicap will be the main event. Shooting will commence at 12.30. Details are as advertised.

However, destruction of grain crops by hordes of wood ducks in the southern portion of the Northern State has brought about the decision of an earlier opening. Present indications are that a good duck season is assured. Townsville Club has already arranged the major portion of its new installation of a second trap. This includes reinforced concrete trap-house, concrete tracks, pull stand and base and underground pipe line. Fred adds that the north has had "no winter yet—still having mild warm weather." 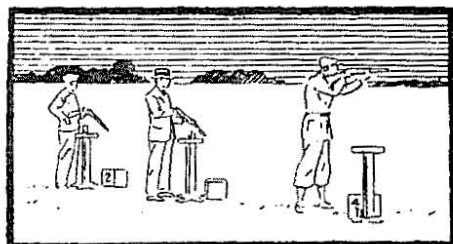

GUN GOSSIP

By NORTH COUNTRY.

It is always easier to knock out a bird in flight than when sitting. With wings outstretched and body fully exposed, it becomes a bigger and more vital target. I refer just to the killing, of course. Other things being equal, you can be sure of a yard or two more in range at a moving mark. This particularly applies to rabbits. A choke bore will enable you to kill a running (crossing) rabbit at 45 yards each time. But I should not care to say it would kill clean dead a rabbit sitting at this distance each time. It needs a very good gun and cart-

ridge to kill a sitter each time at 42 or 43 yards.

Certainly a choke is useful at times for these long sitters. The old service charge of 1½ oz. of No. 5 took some beating for this work. I have killed countless sitters or crouchers with it at this distance. But aiming was almost as with a rifle. I would even practise the shot by placing narrow bits of boxwood or cardboard 40 good yards out on the ground and see how many pellets I could put into them. There is a bit of an art in this sitting shot, unspectacular though it may be. It is really worth some practice.

A.C.P.T.S.A. HANDICAPS

The following are the Association Handicaps for all registered shooters competing in OPEN events. Where no handicap has been declared, insufficient record of performances are known.

Handicaps have been declared with the limit mark shooters commencing at 12 yards in accordance with the rules of the Association. Clubs are requested to conform to this rule and begin handicaps at 12 yards. Unknown shooters should commence no nearer than 16 yards.

In order to ensure satisfactory Association handicapping, Club officials are requested to show each shooter's full surname and initials (shooting name if any in addition) when forwarding handicap returns to the Association office

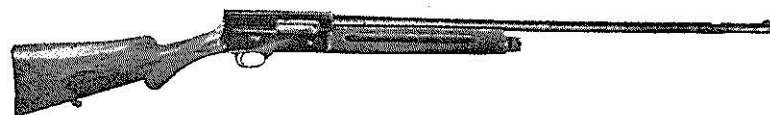
