



# THE EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK

With the publication of the present issue the full list of registered shooters, with Association handicaps (where known), is included. Club officials are advised to check the list and ensure that club members' registration cards are brought upto-date in accordance with the published handicap mark. In cases where no mark is shown, club officials and shooters concerned should make the necessary

arrangements to have this rectified and card amended accordingly. It is probably that the next full list will be published again in the December issue. Meanwhile each succeeding issue of "News", following the pre-sent month, will contain names of newly registered shooters, also names of those who have renewed since the full list publication this month, together with known handi-caps. So that a handicap mark can be shown from the outset of a shooter's registration, club officials forwarding the fees and names are recommended to also include the club handicap of the shooter or shooters listed with the remittance. Inclusion of these details is an immediate guide of the ability of the shooter or shooters. Full names are also desirable, if not, full details of all initials. Frequently names are submitted with one initial, and when renewal is made, two initials, or even three are shown. When the address is not included, the added initials merely lead to a confusing situation and on occasions a duplication in registration. Another point of importance in this regard is to ensure that the initials forwarded are the correct ones. There have been occasions (quite frequent) where the initial T (for Ted) has really meant E. Similarly the initial B (for Bill) when the correct initial should be W. Another frequent offender in this class is again the initial B (for Bert), when it should read H, also F (for Fred) can often mean A for Alfred, and so on. These points may not appear important by



the senders, but when it is remembered that some 140 odd clubs are now affiliated with the Association, these small details do much to assist administration and also ensure correct records being maintained.

Affiliated clubs should pay strict attention to entrants in open championships who are unknown to the club management. A recent instance has been reported where a shooter attended and competed in open title event on the grounds of a club where he was not previously known, and had been unregistered for over two years. The registration card system was introduced by the Association to safeguard clubs and shooters, and in all cases competitors should be requested to produce their current registration card. No objection can be taken to such a request. It is an Association direction that cards should be produced on all occasions. Production of cards on open shooting days is particularly important. If a shooter is unknown, his registration card is a definite certificate of identification.

Discussing the Association registration card and the handicap which it carries, a club official recently mentioned that "no club can query the visiting shooters' Association handicap card, which often needs adjustment." The writer of the foregoing is not in complete understanding of the position in regard to the handicap mark which appears on the

registration card. If the club, which a visiting shooter attends, feels that the mark shown on the registration card is not correct, it is up to the officials of the club concerned to turn up immediate previous numbers of "News" and check if any handicap change has not been recorded on the card. If, on check-up, it is found that the mark shown is not in accordance with the published handicap of the shooter, it is then quite a simple matter to draw the competitor's attention to the matter and inform him that he is required to shoot on the handicap as published, at the same time advising him to secure the co-operation of his home club secretary in bringing the card up-to-date.

Club officials and registered shooters are advised to immediately advise the Association if the name of any shooter has been missed by the printers in the compilation of the official list of registered shooters and handicaps. It is a very simple matter for a line to be "dropped" in setting up. The co-operation of all concerned in ensuring that these details are correct is welcomed.





previously approved for the Giru Club (Nth. Qld.), has been deferred to December 26. The change has A.C.P.T.S.A. approval.







with their guns. It is seldom anything goes wrong with gun or cartridge. I have been shooting for more years than I care to remember, and beyond a very occasional misfire I can think of no technical hitch in my armament. Certainly my gun has never broken down. The worst I have had has been a little lock trouble in a wildfowl gun after an extra severe wetting. That was soon put right.

We hear only too often of shoot-

ing accidents in the field, but it is

happily a rare thing to hear of similar mishaps in other spheres. It came therefore all the more of a

shock to hear (as reported in this

paper) that the Proof Master of the Worshipful Company of Gunmakers of the City of London, Mr. R. T. Lawrence, had died on March 18 as

the result of the premature discharge

of a firearm in proof. This is indeed

had been appointed Assistant Proof

Master last October and later he

became Proof Master. Coming of a

long line of gunmakers, he was ideally suited to his job and his early death is a big loss to the trade in

It speaks well that there are so few casualties in trade circles. In

general. He can ill be spared.

But when hammerless guns first came into popular use, it must have been a different tale. An old and very senior friend told me how he refused to have anything but an under-lever hammer gun for some expedition in China. At that time he felt more secure against a breakdown in this way, when hundreds of miles from anywhere, than if he had a more modern weapon. He did not care to risk a still comparatively untried type, as he largely depended on what he shot for the pot. But he used fine-quality weapons.

Most guns give out through neglect. It is a surprise to me that far more do not break down. I think of


those cheap farmers' guns which forty or so years ago could be bought for a fiver and which have never had one proper cleaning or oiling since the first shot was fired through them. They still function and kill effectively in spite of this treatment — at least some of them do. I realise that comparatively few shots are fired through them. But consider the mechanism which never gets any oil, especially oil of the right kind. Or if it does, it will not be lock oil.


The moral of all this is that guns have many lives — too many, no doubt, in the opinion of those who make their living at them. Is it any wonder that best quality guns which do not get a great deal of use never wear out? I know of guns of the very finest make which never have more than a thousand cartridges fived through them in the course of a year. At this rate I do not see that a gun would ever wear out within reason. If these guns do give out, it will surely be from rust and neglect. Which, sad to say, is too often their fate.

The owner dies, the heir is not very keen on shooting, but keen enough to retain the guns and uses them from time to time. The guns are kept on for this reason, but never receive the former care bestowed upon them. They gradually deteriorate by rust and pitting and in half a dozen years the barrels are badly marked. They may shoot wellenough, but their value is ruined. I have seen this happen many a time, but have been powerless to do anything in the matter.

Other guns are just kept on for sentimental reasons. They may look well enough in a cabinet and receive a fairly regular rub-over. But what of their insides? The owners are content that they are in a dry place and comparatively safe from dust and dirt. But best guns need more attention than that. If the bores are not greased, they need regular cleaning and inspection. And an unversed layman is scarcely up to this.

# XVth OLYMPIAD

### HELSINKI - (FINLAND) - 1952

The Olympic Games are held every four years and are open to amateurs of all nations. There is no discrimination against any country or person on grounds of colour, religion or politics, and no age limit. The honour of holding the Games is entrusted to a city and not to a country, and the programme must include certain specified sports. Only nationals of a country may compete for that country, and the profits are held by the National Olympic Committee of the country holding the Games, for the furtherance of amateur sport. These are the fundamental principles, and the International Olympic Committee, with its Executive Committee, is the governing body responsible for their application. An Organising Committee is appointed in the coun-try in which the Games are to be held, to make all the arrangements, starting with the sending out of the invitations to other countries to take part, and finishing with a complete, printed report.

The sport of Clay Pigeon Shooting is to be included in the official programme this year, the first time since 1924 (Paris). The Hungarian shooter, Halasy, won the individual event that year, with a score of 98 ex 100, and the U.S.A. won the team event. E. Jenkins was the best of the British competitors, tying for 11th place, with 94, out of 31 entries. However, London was the first venue of an Olympic Clay Pigeon Shoot, in 1908, when it was held at Uxendon, under the auspices of the Clay Bird Shooting Association (now the C.P.S.A.) and Great Britain distinguished themselves by winning the "first ever" team event, beating Canada by two kills — 407 to 405, out of a possible 630.

An amateur is defined as "one who participates and always has participated in sport solely for pleasure and for the physical, mental or social benefits he derives therefrom, and to whom participation in sport is nothing more than recreation without material gain of any kind, direct or indirect, and in accordance with the rules of the International Federation concerned."

The governing body for Clay Pigeon Shooting is the International Shooting Union, and their special rules state:

"1. The principles of amateurism, laid down in the declaration of the International Olympic Committee at its congress 1947, should be valid for the members of the International Shooting Union.

### 2. Money Prizes.

Money prizes up to 10 dollars or its equivalent are considered as a compensation for costs. If there is a meeting covering several days, money prizes totalling 40 dollars or its equivalent, within the same week, are also considered a compensation for costs without detailed specification from the competitors. Money prizes exceeding the above-mentioned sums should be given over to the club to which the competitor belongs. The competitor may receive from his club only a sum corresponding to his actual costs, which may include:

- (a) entrance fees,
- (b) ammunition,
- (c) travelling expenses and cost of living according to the rules of the International Amateur Athletic Federation.

This article applies to all categories of shooting supervised by the International Shooting Union.

3. As an amateur should not be considered:

- (a) anyone who gives an exhibition in marksmanship and is paid for it,
- (b) anyone whose principal profession is test-shooting of guns or ammunition. The operator of a test-shooting machine is not included in this category,

(d) anyone who accepts money prizes in excess of those allowed according to Art. 2.

To (b) and (c) categories does not belong a member of the armed forces who acts as an instructor.


4. The competitor should fulfil the qualifications of amateurism laid down by the National Olympic Committee of his country.

5. In judging the status as an amateur according to Art. 3, the activities of the competitor during the last two years should be considered."

Each competitor must sign the following statement: "I, the undersigned, declare on my honour that I am an amateur and fulfil the conditions stipulated by the Olympic rules."

The shooting rules are those laid down by the I.S.U. They have recently been revised, but are not available at the time of going to press. They are expected to follow the same general lines of the "Continental" or 15-trap system.

The maximum number of competitors is 2 per nation, and each competitor will shoot 200 birds — 100 on each of two days, July 25 and 26 in 25 bird stages, in squads of six (the "waiting man" system). The maximum calibre for guns is 12bore, and two cartridges may be loaded at one time. Maximum shot charge: 36 grammes (approximately  $1\frac{1}{2}$  oz.). Largest shot size allowed: No. 6 (British).

And the coveted prizes: 1st, silvergilt Olympic medal and diploma; 2nd, silver Olympic medal and diploma; and 3rd, bronze Olympic medal and diploma.

### A.C.P.T.S.A. HANDICAPS

The following are the Association Handicaps for all registered shooters competing in OPEN events. Where no handicap has been declared, insufficient record of performances are known.

Handicaps have been declared with the limit mark shooters commencing at 12 yards in accordance with the rules of the Association. Clubs are requested to conform to this rule and begin handicaps at 12 yards. Unknown shooters should commence no nearer than 16 yards.

In order to ensure satisfactory Association handicapping, Club officials are requested to show each shooter's full surname and initials (shooting name, if any, in addition) when forwarding handicap returns to the Association office.
