





THE EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK

Congratulations are extended to New South Wales Interstate Team for its success in winning the inaugural contest for State Teams' (post results) which was completed recently. The winning combination returned the good score of 478/500 to win from Tasmania 473/500. The "Great Britain and Ireland Trophy", presented by the Associations of the Home countries, has been handed over to officials of the winning team.

over to officials of the winning team. The handsome trophy will be a much sought after award in the future. The Interstate Teams' contest was an undoubted success and its establishment will do much to foster the sport of clay pigeon shooting in all States of the Commonwealth. Next year's competition is already being looked forward to with absorbing interest. (Scores of all teams taking part are published in December issue.

The publication of the persent edit in, October, 1952, signals the passing of "News" into its sixth year of presentation to the clay target shooters of the Commonwealth. The popularity of "News" among the shooting fraternity assures its continued success.

During early October the Executive Committee attended in full strength in Melbourne for the usual seasonal fixture. Many important matters were discussed and disposed of. Matters as affecting clubs and individual shooters are listed in the following columns. All concerned are requested to study these fully and accept same as official directions.

Registration Cards.

The retention of registration cards, the first of which were issued in 1952, was unanimously agreed upon. However, the Committee considered that fuller use could be made of this



medium of identification and handicap. It was agreed that all club secretaries be advised (through this column) that the following were empowered to sign registration cards for handicap variation, i.e. club Presidents, club secretaries and club handicappers. Variation of handicap of any shooter, however, MUST be notified to the Association within three days of the amendment taking effect. This means that the officials named have full power to sign registration cards indicating change of handicap providing the Association is at once informed with an outline of the reasons for such amendment.

New Report and Score Book.

A new Report and Score Book has been approved and will be available to all affiliated clubs late in November. The Executive considered that the new production will do much to assist club secretaries, handicappers and publicity officers. Many instances have been noted of officials recording entries on sundry pieces of paper, following this up with a rough description of the shoot on a further paper remnant. Others again have gone to the other extreme, particularly in regard to reports; and produced long and copious detail which has little interest outside the particular area concerned. In brief, the new book is a ledger, report sheet for "News", contains a section for notification to the Association of handicap variations recommended, together with space for reasons for

any amendment forwarded, and finally the rear pages are prepared as score sheets, providing approximately 400 squads. The cost to affiliated clubs will be (including postage) approximately 20/-. One book should last the average club at least 12 months and provide a permanent record of all shoots which have taken place in the period mentioned. All sections with the exception of the "ledger" portion are detachable, easily prepared and will work out much cheaper than the score pad in use at present. Should a duplicate copy be required for club information, all that is required is the use of a piece of foolscap carbon paper. Applications for the new issue should be forwarded to the November on.

Referee Examinations and Shooting Hand-book.

The new hand-book of shooting rules is still in course of preparation by the printers. When this booklet is completed, referee examination tests will be announced and those interested may apply for inclusion in the test and if accepted, official accreditation as A.C.P.T.S.A. Referees. Notification of when this will take place will be notified through "News".

Shooting Names.

No further registration of shooting names will be accepted. Those with shooting names already registered will be permitted to continue using same, but it is preferred the shooting names be dispensed with entirely.

Break Badges.

Break badges will in future be issued once only. That is to mean that a shooter who breaks 50 straight and under 75 will receive a 50 break badge. Similarly a shooter breaking 75 and under 100 will receive a 75 badge and those breaking over 100 straight will also be issued with a badge. Repeat performances will not mean the issue of a further badge or bar. It should be understood, however, that a shooter may be issued with a badge for each section as indicated in the foregoing portion of this paragraph.

Walk-up Conditions.

Walk-up conditions have been slightly changed. The following direction has been agreed upon, "That the gun may be held in any position consistent with safety provided the breech or loading mechanism of the gun be not held higher than the waistline. The waistline for this purpose to be defined as a line with the top of the hip-bones." This direction should be quite simple to follow if the competitor keeps in mind the position which he usually holds a gun when shooting in the field. The new direction has been introduced to get away from the not very acceptable spectacle of a shooter holding the gun at the shoulder when shooting in walk-up matches.

Club and Association Handicaps.

Clubs are recommended by the Executive Committee to ensure "that no shooter's handicap be less than his Association handicap under any circumstances". Acceptance of this recommendation will remove the anomaly of competitors coming forward beyond their Association handicap in club events.

Full List of Registered Shooters.

Notwithstanding the additional expense involved, the Executive Committee has directed that the full list of all registered shooters will appear

in "News" three times each year. During the months of June, October and March. Additions will be included in "News" during the months of issue other than those mentioned.

"NEWS" - Advertising Rates.

The question of advertising rates as applicable to club advertising in "News" was given long consideration. It was pointed out that the Association loses between 25/- and 30/- on each page of advertising provided for clubs in "News". The fact that "News" is a service to clubs is the chief reason why rates have not been increased. Rates, for the present at least, will remain as before, despite the fact that costs have quadrupled since "News" was first established,

1953 Association Shoots.

The Association shooting fixtures for 1953 will be held at the usual venue, the grounds of the Australian Club at East Burwood (V.). Ground appointments and traps are having a complete overhaul and visitors to the 1953 fixtures will find greatly improved facilities. The Association fixtures will be held over the dates March 7, 9 and 10, with the 1953 Annual Meeting of Affiliated Club Delegates on Sunday, March 8. The Champion of Champions Cup event has been separated from other con-tests and will in future be decided at 40 birds from 20 yards, double-barrel. This match will open the programme soon after 8 a.m. on Saturday, March 7 .The event carries no qualification and is open to all comers. This will be followed immediately after completion by the Australian Open Championship, 60 birds from 16 yards, double-barrel. International load shells are to be used in these events by all contestants. The Intermediate Championship under same conditions as formerly will follow. The highest 25 scorers in the Open Championship will comprise the 1953 Australian International Team. In the Open Championship event prizes will be awarded down to 15th place. No sectional awards will be made beyond 16 yards. A trophy will be allotted to the shooter from each of the six Australian States who does not win any other award. There will also be

a trophy allotted for women shooters. It is expected that the Champion of Champions, Australian Open Championship and the Intermediate Championship will take up most of Saturday and Monday, March 7 and 9. If time permits, a special handicap or series of sweepstakes will complete proceedings on Monday, March 9. The International Footch will be shot on Tuesday, Marci 10. On this day the Grand Australian Handicap will also be decided. Conditions have been made much more attractive than formerly. The contest will be staged at 100 birds from Association handicaps, double-barrel, and the sum of £250 has been allotted to the event, which will be restricted to shooters who have competed in the events of the two previous days. Prizes in the Grand Australian Handicap will be awarded down to 23rd place, the winner receiving £50 and sash. Members of International Team will be permitted to "shoot-up" if desired.

Teams' Matches.

Two teams' matches will be held in 1953 instead of the previous single event. In future the "Club Teams' Championship" will be decided at the first 30 targets thrown in the Australian Open Championship. Conditions will be similar to the former Australian Teams' Championship with the single exception that Melbourne and Sydney metropolitan shooters will be required to shoot with the club nearest their permanent place of residence. A further teams' match to be known as the ent place of residence. A further teams' match to be known as the "Commonwealth Teams' Championship" will be decided at the first 30 targets thrown in the Grand Australian Handicap. As this will be off handicap marks, it presents an attractive interest. The Commonwealth Teams' Match is open to any four shooters who belong to any affiliated club in the Commonwealth.

1953 Annual Meeting.

The 1953 Annual Meeting will be held at Scott's Hotel, 444 Collins St., Melbourne, on Sunday, March 8, 1953, commencing at 2.30 p.m. Each affiliated club with all shooters registered is entitled to one delegate to represent its interests at this meeting. It is strongly recommended,

where possible, that clubs appoint one of their own club members for this duty.

Refreshments.

Light refreshments will be provided for competitors and friends by the Association at the Pavilion on the shooting grounds at East Burwood after the conclusion of shooting on Saturday, March 7.

1953 Championship Allocation.

The 1953 Championship Allocation appears in another section of this issue. Clubs and shooters interested are requested to accept this intimation as official. No additional advice will be forwarded.

Championship Conditions.

The Commonwealth double and single-barrel championship conditions have been changed from 25 birds to 40 birds in each case. Nomination fee will be 40/-.

AROUND THE CLUBSI

HOBART (Tas.).—Approximately fifty shooters from all parts of the State were present at the September meeting, when the inaugural interstate teams' shoot was conducted by the Hobart Gun Club on its Brighton layout. The elements let loose some of the worst weather that has ever prevailed here.

The main feature of the shoot was the grand score compiled by the Tasmanian team, which returned a score of 473/500. Though defeated, Tasmania's performance will probably go down as the greatest team effort of the series - at one stage it was contemplated postponing the teams' event because of the galeforce winds, which at first brought clouds of dust, later followed by rain storms. However, it is pleasing to relate that "our boys" were determined to carry on and take things in their stride, but it was unfortun-ate that their high spirits and determination could not quite place them to the fore—at the completion of shooting we were "five" down on New South Wales.

Those who made the "team" and their individual scores were as follows: T. Cannan, 50/50; P. and S. Marshall, H. M. Eddington, 49/50; R. Redpath, A. Nelson, 48/50; E. Nelson, 46/50; J. Tyquin, A. Birchall, 45/50; M. Bale (Bothwell), 44/50. The first nine mentioned shooters were members of the Hobart Gun Club. Team high-gun honours went to T. Cannan, who registered the possible — his shooting was superb; only on three or four occasions did he have recourse to use of his second barrel. Cannan was also successful

at the Bothwell meeting the previous week, when he won the club walk-up championship. Next to Cannan's fine performance was that of A. Birchall, a comparatively new shooter to the sport - after missing his first release in the qualifying shoot he went on to break 19 straight. His 45/50 was highly commendable for a shooter who lacked experience, and who undoubtedly felt the strain when making his appearance in such a big shoot.

A faulty cartridge deprived Eddington of being with Cannan, whose score of 49 necessitated a shoot-off with the Marshall duo. Paul was the first to go, but his brother Sperry threw out a strong challenge to Eddington, who was not to be shaken; Marshall missed on the 72nd bird, but Eddington compiled the impressive tally, 71/72, 2nd. This shooter is a delight to watch when in top form. Scores were: S. Marshall, 70/72, 3rd; P. Marshall, 51/53, 4th. A shoot-off for fifth placing between R. Redpath and A. Nelson resulted in favour of Redpath, whose figures were 50/52.

The teams' shoot was as follows: P. and S. Marshall, Redpath, Tyquin, Cannan set a terrific pace in disposing of their first 125 birds, in which they registered 123/125. The second squad, Eddington, Bale. A. and E. Nelson, Birchall, missed 'out of their first 125, but at this stage the entire team were 1 up on N.S. Wales' score. The first squad missed "7" in the second bracket of 125, and the second squad dropped "ten", making 473.
