





THE EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK

When this issue reaches its readers the Association 1953 National titles programme will be close at hand. The preliminary events arranged by the Australian Gun Club, on whose grounds the Association fixtures will be held, have been so prepared that these will create interest as well as providing first-class practice for the bigger events extending over March 7 to March 10 inclusive.

Commencing on Wednesday night, March 4, the Australian Club will stage a night practice series; this will be followed on Thursday night, March 5, with the Commonwealth night double-barrel championship—the premier contest of its kind for the year. Following on this the Australian Club has arranged a £150 handicap at 40 targets, double-barrel. There are several interesting features of this match. It will be shot over the four traps which will be used throughout the Association contests, 10 targets from each, and what is also very important, the event will be shot from 16 yards. It will be divided into series of 10 birds, with £30 divided among the possibles in each ten releases. A further £5 will be awarded to the 12 yarder, not sharing in the £30, in each section. A trophy will be awarded to the shooter with the best overall score of the match. The event should attract a big entry and prove a great boon to those desirous of securing identical practice for the National Open title staged by the Association the following day. The latter event is shot at 60 targets from 16 yards, points scoring three and two. The 25 highest scorers will win the coveted honour of representing Australia against England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales and New Zealand on the Monday or Tuesday (whichever day is decided upon by the Executive Committee). Each member of the Australian Team will also win the equally coveted "International 1953" Badge—a badge greatly



sought by all who follow the pastime of clay target shooting. The Intermediate Championship (restricted to shooters whose handicap does not exceed 16 yards on Monday, March 9) and Champion of Champions Cup, 40 targets from 20 yards, double-barrel, will also be decided. The Fifth Grand Australian Handicap, a 100 birder, shot from Association handicaps, will conclude proceedings on Tuesday, March 10. This match is restricted to those shooters who have taken part in the scheduled events (for which they are eligible), as have appeared in the advertising matter of the shoot.

The Association will provide light refreshment to shooters and their friends at the conclusion of the National Open Championship on Saturday evening. Efforts are being made to secure a series of shooting and other sporting films, which, if available, will be screened in front of the pavilion trap. If these details eventuate, a most interesting evening is assured.

The Association annual meeting of affiliated club delegates will be held on Sunday, March 8, commencing at 2.30 p.m., at Scott's Hotel, 444 Collins Street, Melbourne.

Altogether the complete series promises to be the best in the Association's history. Given fine weather—usual in Melbourne during the autumn season—a bumper entry and attendance of spectators is expected. The grounds have been completely

overhauled, traps have been reconditioned, new amenities (including new concrete sewerage and washing block) have been included. Visitors and shooters should enjoy first-class competition and comfort.

A new club recently affiliated with the A.C.P.T.S.A. has asked if a shooter is registered through another club with the Association, has he to pay a further registration fee on joining another club? The Association requirements are fully met with the single payment of 20/- each by all shooters once in the calendar year. That is to say, the fee becomes due on January 1 each year and should be paid as soon after that date as is possible. A shooter may belong to a dozen clubs, but his only obligation to the Association is to ensure that his annual registration fee has been paid once only. No further financial demands are made by the Association.

Several clubs have written asking for score pads. These are not now in print, but are replaced by the official Association score and report book. This book contains approximately 400 squads (rear pages) and is a ledger and report book in addition. It is a much more economical proposition for all clubs than the previously issued score pads. Applications for these books (accompanied by 25/-, which includes postage to any centre in Australia) should be made to the A.C.P.T.S.A. Secretary.



The Lismore Club in Northern New South Wales is planning big things for the future. Tenders have already been called for the erection of a spacious clubhouse and laying down of complete tracks on the South Lismore Aerodrome. Ald.

R. Granger, Mayor of Lismore, will perform the opening ceremony on Easter Saturday, April 4. Association President, Jock Wilson, has also accepted an invitation to attend. The club's Easter programme is advertised in this issue, when shooting will take place over Easter Saturday and Monday. The North-Eastern Districts double and single-barrel titles and the Lismore Hundred are main events of the series. Club secretary is Sid Elphick, of 19 Parkes Street, Lismore, to whom all enquiries should be directed.

GUN GOSSIP

(From Rex Miles, Secty. Washington
State Trapshooters' Asscn.).

"Your good magazines came today (January 27), always of much interest.

Hope you can bring your crack team over here for the Grand, etc. Hope also that you can arrange for that visit during my lifetime.

The reason for the popularity of the 'Pump' gun is, I think, due to the fact that most trapshooters are field shooters first, and most of the field shooters start out with the weapon that costs the least, usually a cheap 'pump gun'. I think that the automatic is used mostly by the boys who shoot game. I do know this for sure, very few automatics are used at the traps; in fact, since you brought the subject up, I checked at the Spokane Gun Club yesterday (one of the biggest in U.S.A.) and there were 51 shooters out. There was one automatic with a young man who came in from the country to try his hand on the targets. This was his general utility gun, for water-fowl, pheasants, rabbits, etc. This is about my estimate of the type of guns used here at the traps — about 50 per cent. 'pumps', 30 per cent. single-barrel trap, about 20 per cent. 'over and unders' and 'side by side' doubles, less than one per cent. automatics. Of course, where a local club is formed in a locality where there are a large number of duck shooters, there may be more autos used. But I do not know of a single top-notch trap-shot who shoots an automatic. Bill, I do not know whether you will like this, as from what I read in your 'News' the automatic seems to be a favourite with Australians, and far be it for me to stand against anything they like. In shooting doubles, the pump gun, if working smoothly, is very effective. Arnold Reigger and Rudy Etchen both shoot pump guns at everything, and they are two of the best in the world at target sport. I have the averages for 1952 of the Washington State shooters. Reigger, of course,

is on top on the 16-yard targets. On handicap targets, Harvey Smith is first, Reigger second, and my boy Keith third. You have to shoot 2,000, 16 yards, 700 handicap, and 350 pairs to qualify. Keith just did shoot the 700 handicap, so qualified. I feel good about this, as he did no practice shooting, just what events he could. Keith shot at our Christmas Turkey shoot, won three. He put on the performance of the day. He and the Winchester pro. tied with ten straight from 22 yards. Then they went back to 27 yards and shot off miss-out. Keith broke another ten from 27 yards, the pro. missed his tenth. They both shot very well. Oh yes, Old Rex won three turkeys at the Thanksgiving Shoot. I won one from 18 yards, one from 20 yards and one from 22 yards. Just a lucky day for me, as most of the boys I out-shot are real trapshots, and can beat the pants off me every day of the week. Of course, I don't shoot much now and am not 'in the Groove'.

We have had the mildest winter so far, very little snow, and it has been warm, just like late spring weather.

So you have decided on double-barrel shooting for the International. It seems that is what all the Teams want, so it is best to give the boys what they want. It is a sport and they shoot for pleasure, and that's that.

If you hold the Olympics in Melbourne, just who of your top-notchers will be eligible to compete under the rules? (Can't have won over forty dollars in prize money); I feel sure that you wouldn't have one, from the shoot ads. which appear in 'News'. You award substantial prize money and the boys on top take this. Personally, I think the amateur stuff is 'bunk' pure and simple.

Wishing my Australian friends everything that's good."




