




THE EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK

England has again claimed first place in the battle for International team supremacy in the field of clay pigeon shooting. As mentioned in a Stop Press report in the July issue, cabled advice indicated that England won the 1953 International Teams' Match at Stirling (Scotland), with a scores to count total of 5013 points. Australia was a good second, with 5008 points, then followed Scotland, 4956; Ireland, 4840; New Zealand, 4817; Wales, 4769. It will be recalled that points scoring of three points for a first barrel and two for a second was in vogue for the first time. Analysing the final figures, it will be observed that Australia failed by what may be termed the barest margin to top the total scores to count of the winning combination. Actually, Australia failed by just over one target. The result is probably the closest on record. Full details of all scores will not be to hand for some time. When these arrive, all information will be published in detail. The Australian and New Zealand figures were published in detail in the July edition of "News".

One particular point of satisfaction in the result is known and that concerns the high-gun individual total. Newton Thomas of Sydney returned top figures for the Australian team with 289/300 points. Information is available which indicates that high-gun for the Great Britain teams was E. C. Ledger (England), also 289/300 points. England and Australia, first and runners-up, therefore, hold joint individual honours.

Australian shooting sportsmen congratulate our English kinsmen on their great win in the 1953 Battle of Stirling.

The 1953 Interstate Teams' competition is creating Australia-wide



interest as the period for the completion of the series draws near. Queensland will shoot its section of the match at Roma on September 19 and 20. New South Wales has decided on the Royal Aero Club's layout at Bankstown for that State's match on September 11 and 12. Victoria's effort will be a one-day series on the Australian Club's grounds at East Burwood. The chosen date is a good one, inasmuch as it is a public holiday, September 24, the date of the annual Show Holiday. Tasmania will shoot at Launceston on October 3. Western Australia will also shoot on October 3 at Perth. The winning team will hold "The Great Britain and Ireland" Trophy for 12 months and, of course, the honour of producing the premier State team of the year.

Club secretaries are reminded that applications for 1954 open championships are required to be in the hands of the Secretary, A.C.P.T.S.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.I., not later than October 1. Consideration should be given by clubs within the next month to championships considered appropriate. All applications should be set out in a separate letter (from other administrative matter) to the Association. The Executive Committee will deal with all applications. Allocations will be published in the November issue of "News". Clubs are reminded that applications which contain merely an application for "a championship" or similarly one for "all championships" are of

no assistance to the Executive Committee and merely make a long task more onerous.

Interested registered shooters who have not already applied for inclusion in the Association's 1953 Official Referee Examination series should lodge applications on or before August 24. No further examination series will be held during the present year. Applications received later than the stated time cannot be included.

A club, recently formed, enquired during the past month if the Association "would like a report of its shoots for 'News'." Reports of shoots by all affiliated clubs was one of the fundamental reasons for the establishment of the publication. Quite apart from bringing the club concerned under the notice of all registered shooters, reports on shoots add publicity to the sport in general. A report of all shoots should be furnished to the Association for publication within seven days of the shoot taking place. "News" is for all clubs to use and publicise themselves, and every effort should be made to ensure that fullest use is made of its columns — without, of course, including a lot of unnecessary padding to reports.

A Victorian country shooter has written in requesting that some reference be made to correct supervision of shooters who have been known to have visited the tent of good cheer. The writer states that he has seen a number of instances recently where shooters have been permitted to hold up the fixture whilst a search has been instituted, and then when ultimately available, the erring ones have shown distinct evidence of uncertainty in gun handling on the mark. The writer states that at a recent shoot he had found it necessary to "bob down twice", and he claims the Association should include a rule covering such happenings. The whole question is covered in club management. If club management is lax, then a slipshod type of shoot will result. If a shooter is considered to be even remotely unfit to

handle a gun, he should not be permitted to continue taking part in the competition. His gun should be taken over by the club management until such time as it is considered appropriate to return. As an example of correct action in such cases the following may provide a lead for club management. At a shoot on a Victorian country ground some years ago the amber fluid was flowing fairly freely. As the day progressed, one or two rather overdid visits to the supply casks. Late in the day a shooter was called, and after some delay struggled to his mark and began waving his gun with wide sweeps. An A.C.P.T.S.A. official was present — the official instructed the referee to bar the shooter forthwith and take over his gun. This action was taken, not without some protest. But a quick realisation of the importance of immediate definite action possibly saved much embarrassment. The A.C.P.T.S.A. official acted rightly and club management should be strong enough to act similarly should the occasion arise.
