





THE EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK

An interesting home-coming traveller from a world tour during the past month has been the Association President, J. M. (Jock) Wilson. In the brief period which has elapsed since his return, he commented on the magnitude of the sport of clay target shooting in America. He stopped-off at Vandalia, Ohio, for the Grand American series, extending over ten days.

Among his comments, which are indeed revealing, are that in the Grand American Handicap this year there was a record entry of 1,976 shooters. The traps at Vandalia number 36 and extend over nearly a mile. Shooters are conveyed to their trap or traps by a motor conveyance, dropped off and picked up on the return journey. All traps are electrically controlled and the individual in charge does the refereeing, scoring and pulling at the one time. Being electrically controlled, the traps are released merely by the pressing of a button, the O.C. Trap then gives his decision on the shot, records it and proceeds to deal with the next competitor. The only other person connected with the trap is the boy inside who merely places the target on the releasing arm. The trap automatically returns to the re-lead position after each shot. During the recent Grand American series over 2½ million shells were fired and prize money amounted to a quarter of a million in dollars. Angles are the same as in Australia, but targets are vastly superior and each one is thrown perfectly, that is in regard to angles and height. This feature would appear to be one of the reasons for the high scores recorded by U.S.A. shooters. The American Trapshooting Association shoots only once a year at Vandalia, and after each Grand American series a special machine proceeds along the area of where the shot is known to fall. The machine is so constructed that it gathers up all the shot fired by competitors throughout the competitions.



After the recent meeting some 60 tons of shot was picked up by the machine. A brief calculation can provide some idea of the value returnable to the A.T.A. from this device. Guns used are mostly pump guns, approximately 80 per cent., then follow over and unders, side-by-sides and automatics. The President has brought back much literature and other matter which will be of great interest to the majority of shooters in Australia. He has also arranged for a case full to be forwarded by surface freight later. It is also possible that one of the special electrically controlled traps will be brought to Australia, although the question of dollar supply may be a big hurdle. The administration of the big series is conducted by a staff of over 100. More comments on the President's overseas observations will be published later.

In another section of this issue is published the "Kills to Count" score of the Australian International Team for 1953. The figures provide a surprise. When it is observed that under "Kills to Count" only, scores of 92's and below are counted out, it would seem that the 1953 Australian score is the best yet. Under the system of straight-out scoring, both barrels equal value, the performance of the Australian team would be outstanding. The International Committee will meet in London late in November, and it

intends discussing conditions for the next International. It would not be surprising to see "Kills to Count" system of scoring return.

A number of new clubs have affiliated with the Association in recent months, and several, it appears, are not certain of the fundamental rules governing the Association and the sport. This applies especially to registered shooters. It is a basic rule of the Association that all shooters must be registered — to compete unregistered is to act in opposition to Association rules. When the stipulation "all shooters" is referred to in the matter of registration, the Association has never decreed that members who take part in shooting competitions at Christmas Shoots or a special charity meeting are required to register. If, however, a shooter is taking part in competitive shooting, he is necessarily required to register. Unregistered shooters have no entitlement whatever in prize lists. Any unregistered shooter securing a trophy or prize money is not entitled to collect, also should the next man protest and he is a registered shooter, he would be entitled to the award. A protest coming before the Association would not be considered if one of the parties was unregistered — the registered man would immediately receive the verdict.

During the month a club queried as to whether it was entitled to take deductions from optional sweepstakes. Clubs may deduct from optional sweepstakes providing these are not connected with championships. All open championships have attached optional sweepstakes — no deductions are permitted by the Association from these sweepstakes — in other words, the whole of the sweepstake is returnable to the shooters. Club championships and conditions of these are entirely a matter for the club concerned.

A Man's Best Friend..

Andy Mathews of Cobar (N.S.W.), who some time back sought information as to why trapshooters in U.S.A. preferred pump guns to other types, and whose query was answered by Rex Miles, the Australian shooters' great friend in America, has come forward with more details on this question. Andy has been good enough to forward a cutting from an American journal which publishes a question on this subject. The extract is appended: "Which shotgun can be fired faster, an automatic or a pump gun?—John E. Reinert, Gold Beach, Oregon.

Answer by Rudy Etchen: Your question as to the speed with which a pump gun can be fired against an autoloader depends entirely upon the man doing the shooting. If it's in competent hands, a pump gun can be operated and fired a good deal faster than the autoloader. I can cite a couple of personal cases, since I happened to be a pump gun shooter and can remember winning several good-natured \$5 bets by shooting 5 shots out of pump gun while my adversary was getting 3 to 4 shots off in an autoloader.

It must be remembered, however, that a pump gun has been in my hands for seventeen years, and that makes a difference. But, in most cases, the autoloader shooter was also experienced.

The technical reason, of course, is the fact that you have to wait for the autoloader to function before firing and since a person controls a pump gun, a competent pump gun man can really make it throw those shells out."

Echuca Club (V.), with its grounds close to the Murray River, is very proud of its rising champion, 11-

year-old Frank Bradley. Frank has been a regular competitor at Echuca shoots for some months. At a shoot on July 25 the young marksman equalled the best break of the day by running up a string of 20 straight. Frank appears to have a bright future in the sphere of trapshooting sport.

Another extract from a U.S.A. publication gives details of U.S. Shooting Accidents. The paragraph reads: "Watch that shotgun. . . . The 1952 'Hunter Casualty Report' of the National Rifle Association shows the smooth-bore as a peerless killer or crinoller. . . . Of 1,376 investigated hunting 'accidents' during 1950 and 1951, approximately 70 per cent. were charged to people using shotguns. . . . In 278 shotgun cases, the report read: 'Victim unseen by shooter' . . . In 158 cases, it was 'Victim covered by shooter swinging on game' and in 65 instances the 'Victim moved into line of fire' . . . Incredibly, there were 63 records of 'Victim mistaken for game.'"

The recent annual meeting of the English Clay Pigeon Shooting Association re-elected Lord Burghly as President for a further term. Mr. A. E. Browning was elected Captain of the English International Team. Mr. Harry Rogers was re-elected Secretary and Mr. Peter Page, Assistant Secretary. The meeting decided to fill the first 15 places in the English International Team of 25 by selection, taking into account shooters' past performances. The remaining 10 places to be shot for over not less than 500 standard competition targets.







U.S.A. SHOOTING

GRAND AMERICAN RESULT.

Raymond A. Williams, of Eaton, Ohio, today won trapshooting's greatest prize, the Grand American handicap, from a field of 1,976, largest in the event's history.

Williams, 33-year-old gun club operator, broke 25 straight in a shoot-off today to edge out Harold E. Myers of Columbus, Ohio, and Carl L. Roberts of Wood River, Ill. The trio had tied at 98 of 100 in the regular event.

Williams, who served as an air-force sergeant for four years with service in Africa and Italy, missed a chance to wrap up the big prize without a shoot-off when he failed to hit his 100th target. Roberts was second with 24 in the extra 25 and Myers third with 22.

Myers has been shooting at the traps only six weeks, and had the 30-year-old technical sergeant at Lockbourne air base near Columbus, Ohio, triumphed, it would have been the biggest upset in Grand American history.

Williams won a guaranteed first prize of \$1500, but his take in the optional wagering system may run into several thousand dollars.

Curtis Haskins of Spokane and Dr. D. O. Neese of Seattle each broke 94 targets at 19 yards today to lead Washington trapshooters in the Grand American. Other state scores: Myrtle Wiese Winslow (Seattle), 18/86; Dr. O. T. Dean, 19/93; Arnold Rieger (Seattle), 25/89.


