

The Editor's Notebook

CLAY

The publication of the September edition of this journal brought about the completion of six years of continuous service to the shooting fraternity of the Commonwealth. It was something of a coincidence that the edition should have been of record proportions for the anniversary. It is recalled that the September edition was of 96 pages, an all-time record size.



PIGEON SHOOTING

Congratulations are due to Mr. Newton Thomas of Sydney for his remarkable shooting in recent weeks. At Bankstown early in September he registered a break of over 200. A fortnight later, at Cootamundra (N.S.W.), he returned the amazing aggregate of 321 straight. The latter figure is the new Australian record and it would appear likely that it will be a considerable time before such figures are surmounted. Mr. S. E. Lamb of Goulburn also returned the good figures of 318 straight before missing at Cootamundra. It was only because of Mr. Lamb's "stick-on" effort that the figures of Mr. Thomas were possible. Both were very worthy efforts and warmest congratulation is extended to the two shooting sportsmen.

A complaint has been received regarding the value of trophies awarded at some country shoots. One shooter mentioned that he recently shot in an event, which he eventually won, when the trophy was indeed paltry. He added that the first three trophy values would reach not much over £5/10/-. If the facts are as stated, then clubs concerned should take heed. Shoots are run for the shooters and, whilst reasonable deduction for running costs and trophies should be allowed, excessive deduction is unreasonable and extremely unwise.

The number of occasions on which conditions of the issue of break

badges have been published is legion. However, once again a shooter has written in asking for the information. The rules are simple. A break is only recognised if performed in competition and under double or singlebarrel conditions. No other form of break is recognised. A shooter may carry on his break from one day to another, providing he does not shoot at practice or any other form of target. By this it is meant that a shooter with a break up is not permitted to shoot at, say, double-rise or Deauville doubles, or any event other than double or single-barrel competition. Practice and any other form of shooting is strictly barred. The shooter seeking the information considers that handicaps in clubs, as compared with open handicaps, may differ, and this would seemingly bring about a state of affairs which would not be quite in order. There is very little difference in the two series of handicaps (or there should be) and this factor should not play more than nominal influence on the break capabilities of any shooter.

A South Australian reader has written to the Association mentioning that he approves of "News", but would like to see more South Australian news published. This is a matter which concerns South Australians; it is up to South Australia to forward more information for publication.

The following query has come to hand from a newly registered shooter. He states that, "shooting in a trophy shoot, using an automatic gun in the first round, the first barrel was a miss and on pulling for the was a miss and on puting for the second the gun, for some unknown reason, failed to fire. The referee granted another bird, the first barrel to be used to not break the target, the second to kill. Using the same gun later on, the shooter shot in a rain squall and the shooter loaded with wet hands and apparently got rain into the breech. He missed on his first barrel and on pulling the second found the gun had failed to eject the first shell, thus leaving it in the firing chamber. This was proved on examination. The referee, without making an examination, gave his decision as "lost bird", although the shooter had in no way interfered with his gun. The referee maintained his decision of lost. Was the referee correct in calling, without inspecting the gun? The gun has no fault in the ejector, shooter claiming dampness on the shell and water in the breech was the cause." The writer asks for a reply through "News". The referee was wrong. He should have examined the gun and if the facts were as stated, allowed another

bird. (The foregoing is a reply to "Auto".)

Candidates for A.C.P.T.S.A. Referee examination are advised that it will be some time before results are known. Altogether there were some 120 odd entrants. Checking of papers is a job of considerable proportions and it may not be until December issue of "News" before announcement of successful candidates is made. That is to say, those who passed the written test. Details of oral test will be announced at same time.




