


The Editor's Notebook

Seasonal Greetings are extended to all followers of the sport of clay pigeon shooting, in Australia and abroad. The President and members of the Executive Committee extend thanks to all who have supported the sport throughout the year. With the advent of the new season it is expected the sport and the activities of the A.C.P.T.S.A. will further develop.

The recent Executive Committee meeting of the Association, held in Melbourne, reached a number of important decisions. All clubs have already been notified of rulings and decisions made. These are now promulgated for all readers.

Interstate Teams' Match. — The meeting was informed that Queensland was successful in winning the 1953 Interstate Teams' Match for the "Great Britain and Ireland" Trophy. Queensland was warmly congratulated on the prowess of its team.

1954 Association Shooting Programme. It was decided to conduct the Association's 1954 competition programme at the grounds of the Australian Club at East Burwood (Victoria). The fixture will open on March 6 and continue to March 9, inclusive. The opening day will be reserved entirely for the holding of the National Championship, at 60 targets from 16 yards. The leading twenty-five scorers in this event will become the Australian Team to contest the Eighth International Teams' Match against Great Britain, Ireland, Scotland, Wales and New Zealand, on Tuesday, March 9. On Monday, March 8, the Champion of Champions Cup, Intermediate Championship and a Handicap event (time permitting) will be held. The Sixth £200 Grand Australian Handicap, 60 targets from Association Handicaps, will be chief interest on final day, together with the International Match. In conjunction with the National Championship on March 6, the Club Teams' Championship will be decided. This will



comprise club teams' of four men, and scores will be calculated on the first thirty targets thrown in the National Championship. The Commonwealth Teams' Match, teams of any four registered shooters, will be shot in conjunction with the Grand Australian Handicap on final day. The entry fees for the entire programme of three full days shooting is £9 — quite the cheapest competition shooting for three days shooting anywhere in the Commonwealth. The two teams' match entry fees are 5/- per man; there is no charge for either shells or targets to members of the International Team.

Standard Equipment. Clubs are instructed that standard equipment in club installations must include a standard measuring stick for measuring height of targets, which are to be thrown at 9 feet, 10 yards from the trap (with a tolerance of 18 ins. above or below, providing trap is installed at ground level). Also that a concrete block be installed in position for this purpose, 10 yards from front of trap.

Standard Shells for Championships. As from January 1, 1954, shells used in all championships under Association rules are restricted to 1½ oz. of shot.

Armourer's Tent. An armourer's tent will be installed throughout the Association fixture at East Burwood next March.

Ground Fees. Clubs are informed that the Association does not favour imposition of ground fees during any club shoot and prohibits the ground

fee charge at any open or Association shoot.

Double-rise Shooting. As from January 1, 1954, all double-rise shooting (club and Association championship fixtures) is to be shot under the five track (squad) system.

Sweepstake Deductions. The permissible deduction from sweepstakes by all clubs in future is not to exceed 50 per cent. (inclusive of birds).

Championship Allocation. The 1954 Championship Allocation was published in the November issue of "News". It was decided, in future, no championships will be allocated to clubs who do not apply for titles on or before October 1 each year.

Championship Conditions. Championship Conditions have been reviewed. New Brochure is in course of printing. The new conditions are to apply as from January 1, 1954. Clubs concerned and desirous of obtaining a copy of the new Brochure should apply to the Association secretary after December 16, 1953.

Alteration to Trap. It has been approved that "any member of the Association Executive Committee or official referee attending any shoot under A.C.P.T.S.A. Rules shall have the authority to adjust any trap, should it not be throwing regulation birds, at the completion of a round. Immediately any adjustment is made to trap a bird to be thrown and shoot to continue."

Walpeup Gun Club. The Walpeup Gun Club has been reinstated as an affiliated unit of the A.C.P.T.S.A.

Definition. "Where the word competition appears in the Association hand-book of shooting rules, from page 5 onwards, this should mean to have reference to one particular event."

Amendments to Shooting Rules. Clubs are advised to note the following amendments to shooting rules:

Rule 10 (a). Rule amended by adding words "or from the wrong track".

Rule 12(c). Rule re-drafted and now to read: "(c) A reloaded cartridge or a cartridge after it has once misfired in the competition or a gun after it has twice misfired in the competition, the competitor

must thereafter abide by the result if he uses such." (See Rule 9 (b)). Rule 16, Section 7. Rule amended to read: "In the case of a magazine gun it is 'no birds' and the referee shall order another pair where there is any failure to shoot caused by a cartridge which is too thick, or too long, or any failure whatsoever caused by a reloaded cartridge or a second failure to eject."

On present indications the R.A.A.F. Station at Laverton (V.) will be the venue for the holding of the clay pigeon shooting section of the 1956 Olympic Games. Following inspections of various grounds the Olympic officials decided to approach the R.A.A.F. for permission to conduct the shoots at Laverton. Information is now to hand that the R.A.A.F. Headquarters has approved of the application. Discussion on technical arrangements for the shoot will be undertaken in the near future.

As announced in the cable section of this issue, an advice from the secretary of the English Association, Mr. Harry Rogers, instructs that the International Committee, meeting in London on November 27, decided to revert to double-barrel shooting conditions for the 1954 International Match, with "kills" only to count. Team numbers will remain the same, i.e., teams of 25 men, with the best 18 scores to count. The Association shooting series will be shot at East Burwood (V.) from 6th to 9th March, 1954.

Preliminary list of those candidates who have succeeded in passing the written test for elevation to the status of A.C.P.T.S.A. Official Referee is published in another section of this issue. The names include those who answered all questions correctly, together with those who failed in one answer only. Failure to answer two or more questions correctly does not constitute a pass. Examiner's comment is noted following names of those who failed in one answer only. A supplementary list will be published in the February issue of "News" containing the names of the remainder of the candidates who have secured passes.



On Safety—The Man and the Gun

(By G. W. SPEARING, Blandford, Dorset, England)

Last year brought its usual crop of gun accidents, major and minor, and one sometimes wonders if shooters nowadays work to quite such a rigid code of safety as did their fathers. Most people who handle a gun treat it with the respect due to a weapon which, at the touch of a finger, can kill or terribly maim someone. At the same time there are just a few who are apt to forget what a charge of shot can do and who are guilty on occasion of handling a gun in a manner that is calculated to cause the stoutest heart to quail, and which draws explosive comment from the more outspoken.

Gun accidents, as I see them, fall into three distinct classes:—

The accidental discharge—due to the man.

The accidental discharge—due to the gun.

Shooting with disregard to anything and everybody but the game. That is, just plain careless shooting.

The Accidental Discharge—Due to the Man

I have always thought that the safety-catch of a sporting gun would be superfluous if only the shooter always handled his gun according to a few simple but sound rules of conduct in the shooting field. If a man habitually handles his gun in a dangerous manner the fact that it possesses a safety-catch is not very likely to prevent him having an accidental discharge, with or without damage to himself or to someone else, at some time or other if he goes on long enough. Such a shooter is apt to put a loaded gun on "Safe" and thereafter to regard it as quite harmless. The exact degree of safety that can be expected of a loaded gun on "Safe" we will deal with in the next section.

The first rule we are, most of us, told when we start shooting, whether under the tuition of an amateur or professional instructor is: "Never let

your gun, loaded or unloaded, point at anyone."

To enlarge on this golden rule I would say: "Always hold, carry, or otherwise handle your gun so that, if by some mischance—impossible though it should be if you observe the other safety rules of shooting—your gun should be discharged, the shot would go harmlessly up into the air, or equally harmlessly, down into the ground."

One doesn't expect to go about having accidental discharges (and still have friends), but one should take precautions so that, if one does occur, the worst that comes of it is that everyone just gets startled.

The other important thing is not to have your gun loaded with the breech closed unless you are actually expecting a chance to shoot at game or clay pigeon, as the case may be.

There is no need to load your gun at all until a drive actually begins, whether you are a standing or walking gun, or, when clay shooting, until you are on the line or shooting point; and it should be unloaded again immediately the drive is over. When you are clay shooting you should get the order "Unload, please" anyway.

When everyone is standing round talking in between whiles it is considered good manners to leave the breech of your gun open. The inference being that, whether the rest of the party know you to be safe with a gun or not, if they can see that your gun is unloaded for themselves, they won't have to worry about their own safety.

A large proportion of accidental discharges happen when shooters are getting through hedges or climbing over fences. Hence the rule that calls for an unloaded gun while you scramble or climb. It doesn't take a moment to open your gun, slip out the cartridges, and re-load again on the other side.

In short, there is no need for your gun to be loaded unless you are all attention and expecting to get a shot.

The Accidental Discharge—Due to the Gun

Shotguns, other than self-loading or repeating types, that is to say, the double-barrelled variety most commonly used in this country, fall into five classes as regards the safety devices they possess:—

1. Hammerless guns having locks fitted with intercepting sears.
2. Hammerless guns with no intercepting sears.
3. Hammer guns with re-bounding locks.
4. Hammer guns with the "half-cock" type of lock.
5. Very cheap quality types of hammer gun—all imported.

1. Nearly all of the best side-lock guns, and some of the more expensive box-lock type, have locks fitted with "intercepting sears". The Intercepting sear takes the form of an extra sear or catch in the mechanism of the lock which is so situated that it will block or intercept the fall of the tumbler if the actual firing sear should be jarred out of bent without the trigger being actually pulled.

A gun so fitted cannot be fired by being let fall or by being knocked about in any way. To fire it one of the triggers must be pulled.

In nearly all hammerless guns the safety catch locks the movement of the triggers only, but, as with the intercepting sear type of gun, the locks cannot be fired unless their triggers are pulled, the gun must be completely safe when its triggers are locked.

2. The less-expensive types of hammerless gun have no such extra safety devices in the locks. It is just possible with this type of gun for the locks to be jarred off if the trigger pulls are set very light. The safety catch locks the triggers only and there is nothing to block the movement of the sears or tumblers at all. Consequently, the complete safety of the gun relies on a good positive engagement of sear and bent, and a strong sear spring to ensure it.

The reader is not to get the idea that any gun not fitted with an intercepting sear is a potential death trap. It is only so if allowed to get sadly out of adjustment, or if the

trigger pulls are made too light. I am inclined to think that the pulls of this type of gun should be kept above 3½ lb. for perfect safety.

3. All the later types of hammer guns have what are known as re-bounding locks. That is to say, when the gun is fired, the hammer, after completing its full forward stroke, returns or re-bounds till it comes to rest with its nose just clear of the striker head. When the shooter releases the trigger that he has pulled, the sear engages a bent cut in the tumbler which blocks that last bit of forward movement—the bit that does the actual firing.

Thus with the lock un-cocked, the hammer cannot be pushed forward to touch the striker by any external means unless the trigger is pulled back at the same time. The gun is thus safe, when un-cocked, from accidental discharge due to something knocking against the back of the hammer.

The chief danger with all hammer guns comes when the loaded gun has to be un-cocked. It is very easy to let the hammer slip from under one's thumb when one's hands are cold. Also, it is easy enough, when un-cocking, to make the mistake of holding the spring pressure of the right hammer and pulling the left, or rear, trigger, or vice versa. As either of these slips result in firing the gun, great care should be taken when un-cocking, and the gun pointed either at the ground immediately in front of the shooter or well up into the air.

In spite of the prejudice that some people seem to have against them, good hammer guns are perfectly safe in the shooting field if special attention is given at the moment of cocking and un-cocking.

4. The very early centre fire hammer breech-loaders were fitted with "half-cock" locks. The lock itself was exactly the same as that used in a percussion muzzle loader, or in a pinfire breech-loader. The only difference being a slight modification in the shape of the hammer itself.

There is no re-bounding action with this type of lock. When the blow is struck, the hammer stays fully forward and has to be "half-cocked" by the shooter to the safe position, which is about midway in its stroke. The

sear then engages a special undercut bent in the tumbler from which it is—or should be—impossible to disengage it by pulling the trigger. These locks make a gun much slower to re-load than one with re-bounding locks. The half-cocking has to be done before the breech can be opened after firing owing to the firing pins being held in the indentations they have made in the caps, and it being possible to open the breech with them in that position only by using considerable force, and tearing them out of place.

I know there are not many guns still in use having this kind of lock, but I mention it as a definite type which, though rare, still does exist.

The same applies to them as applies to the re-bounding type. They are quite safe if care is taken when cocking and un-cocking. There is, however, one other thing to guard against. The hammers should never be let right down on to the firing pins with live cartridges in the gun. If this is done, quite a light blow on the back of one of them can fire it.

5. Before the last war very cheap foreign-made hammer guns were imported in large numbers. They did not appear for sale in the shops of reputable gunmakers. A practical gunmaker would recognise the potential danger of such a gun and leave it alone.

Although the actions usually shook loose at the breech after a very few shots, the real danger lay in the unreliability of the lockwork.

The internal parts of the locks were made of the poorest material, and very badly made at that. So, after a very small amount of use, the trigger pulls got so uncertain that a slight jar was all that was needed to fire the gun, when cocked. Also, when un-cocked, and supposedly at "Safe" it was quite liable to fire if the back of one of the hammers received a slight blow.

In short, one of these guns had the same ballistic capacity for doing damage as any other, coupled with a "hair-triggered" uncertainty when cocked and a lack of safety when un-cocked.

Luckily, there are not many of them still in use, as they usually got into such a state soon after purchase

that they were not worth repairing. However, there are a few, and the sooner these are relegated to the scrap heap, the safer for all concerned.

It cannot be too strongly stressed that, not only is it the responsibility of the shooter to take care that an accident is not caused by his own negligence, but he is also under the obligation to see that the gun he is using is in safe and serviceable condition. Most people would think twice about driving a thoroughly unroad-worthy car, but, strange as it may seem, some of the same people are not nearly so fussy about the guns they take into the shooting field.

Careless Shooting

With regard to the third class of accident. These are usually caused by the shooter being over-anxious to kill game.

Advice about them can best be summed up in a short series of "do's" and "don'ts".

DO

Act at all times with consideration for other guns.

Keep your finger right out of the trigger guard till the gun is at your shoulder and you are actually ready to fire.

Keep in line yourself, and, if there are stragglers who do not, make it your business to know where they are.

Keep firmly in your mind the direction of progress of the line.

Allow extra wide angles of safety when shooting at ground game on stony ground because of ricochets.

With regard to the odd head of game that gets up after the shoot proper is over; be very careful how you shoot at that. It is very easy to hit someone who may have moved off to look for a fallen bird, or for some other reason.

DON'T

Shoot at ground game and low birds against a background of cover unless you are absolutely certain that the cover does not hide a man.

Handicaps have been declared with the limit mark shooters commencing at 12 yards in accordance with the rules of the Association. Clubs are requested to conform to this rule and begin handicaps at 12 yards. Unknown shooters should commence no nearer than 16 yards.

In order to ensure satisfactory Association handicapping, Club officials are requested to show each shooter's full surname and initials (shooting name, if any, in addition) when forwarding handicap returns to the Association office.

Shoot at ground game and low birds when they are crossing the line of guns.

Shoot forward at ground game and low birds when it involves putting shot anywhere in the area occupied by walking guns, however far away you think they are.

Use your gun as a walking-stick, crutch, or a stick for beating out cover—or, in fact, for anything but just a gun.

It will be noticed that I have only mentioned ground game and low-flying birds. It is obvious that, except in very rare conditions, such as when the shooter is standing at the foot of a cliff, for instance, there is little enough chance of injuring anyone when taking a good high bird. The only possibility is that someone may be hit by the falling shot. Unless that someone happens to be

looking up and gets one of these directly in the eye, they can do no damage.

Regarding the use of the safety-catch of a gun, I know that there are some people who demand that it should be slipped to the "Fire" position only as the gun actually comes to the shoulder to shoot. Others put a gun on "Fire" when they expect to get a chance at game, and stand or walk with it in this position, slipping it back to "Safe" as soon as they have to take their full attention off the job in hand.

I think there are more people who do the latter than the former. However, it doesn't matter which you school yourself to do so long as you handle the gun safely and unload it when you are not actually expecting to get a shot and especially if you are going to let it out of your hands, if only for a moment.
