



NEWS



A number of clubs continue to lodge applications for break badges without the accompanying score sheets. Those concerned are reminded that score sheets, in proper sequence of the break recorded, must be lodged with the application for a break badge on behalf of an individual shooter. No application will be recognised in future unless the score sheets, in order as indicated, are forwarded with the letter of application.

During the past few weeks a number of individual shooters have written in to the Association querying their handicap marks. These ing their handicap marks. These shooters are advised that Association handicaps are based primarily on the recommendation of clubs. The reason for this is obvious. No organization could maintain a record of performances of every shooter in the Commonwealth, hence it is to the clubs where shooters compete



that the Association expects the cooperation of handicap recommendations. In some cases it is known that clubs do not bother to forward this information. These cases result in handicap adjustment by the Association where information is available of a shooter's success. The Association prefers to act on the advice of clubs at all times. The clubs are on the spot and know fully the capabilities of shooters' competing, hence the recommendation from clubs is all important.

Several clubs have written to the Association seeking informa-tion as to whether they would be permitted to hold clay pigeon shoots on Sundays. Some claimed that "other clubs were shooting on Sundays; why can't we do the same thing?" The whole question revolves itself around whether local civic authority is favourably disposed to Sunday club competition or otherwise. If the local district Police Department has no objection and the club grounds are well away from highways and all care is taken, there is no reason at all why Sunday shooting should not take place. The sport is clean and healthy, no individual or animal is put to any inconvenience and, along with other Sunday pastimes, the sport is entitled to its place.

Club affiliation and shooters' registration fees were due and payable to the Secretary, A.C.P.T.S.A.,

Box 2038 S. G.P.O., Melbourne, C.1, on January 1. These fee payments should be completed on or before January 31. It has been noticed in the past that a number of club secretaries do not forward these fees until just prior to the annual meeting — fixed this year for March 7th at Scott's Hotel, Melbourne. It is pointed out that this procedure places considerable strain on the Association staff and it would be appreciated if club officials would keep this in mind. Early payment means early acknowledgment and efficient records. Fees are (clubs only): affiliation, 21/-: shooters' registration fees, 20/- each.

GOSSIP

by North Country

Talking of wet weather and very rough shooting and their effect on guns, it always seems to me to be a moot point whether a gun should be kept specially for such work, or whether the best and favourite weapon should be used on all occasions and for every purpose. Some fellows will say it is a pity to employ a best and valuable gun on occasions and under conditions where it can easily be ruined in appearance, if not in performance. Others will ask what is the use of having a gun if you merely coddle it or only bring it out on fine days - for use, as it were, in the shelter and comfort? Those are roughly the two points of

Of one thing I am certain as far as I am concerned - I never lend a valuable gun. If I do lend a gun, I make it one the appearance of which does not matter so much. For it is my experience that nobody takes quite the care of your gun as you do yourself. However, I am straying from the point. For myself I prefer to use a less valuable gun for really rough sport, shooting from a boat, shore shooting and other such work, when it is so easy in spite of all due care to take the fine polish off a weapon and mar its good looks. But I feel in my own case I should be

foolish to subject a best gun to the wear and tear of some of the kinds of shooting which come my way (for instance, the shooting of rabbits on a rock-strewn hillside, where there is a very good chance of seriously denting or damaging the barrels). For this I use an old hammer-gun and manage to do very nicely with it. Actually the gun has not suffered, but it might have a rough time, and if it did, it would not be so much of a tragedy as in the case of a best hammerless ejector.

It is, in my opinion, a mistake to think that a hammerless ejector is always needed. On much rough shooting and ordinary farm shooting, a non-ejector is all that is required. And I can think of nothing better for the small farmer than a plain, strong non-ejector weighing about 6# lb. It would be hammerless, as hammer actions are rarely seen today (except, of course, in second-hand weapons). But if you have more than one gun, I advise you to use the least valuable for "rough and tumble" work. This is common sense, if nothing else.

An old, well-used gun seldom seems to sustain serious damage to its appearance. It is the fine new gun which shows every mark and scratch. And I dislike to see a beautifully - figured walnut stock marked, dented and scratched. This, I know, will not affect the efficiency of the gun. But such lack of respect and indifference to a beautiful weapon is surely all wrong - whatever the circumstances.






