

The Editor's Notebook

Comment is frequently given on the Australian method of team selection for the annual International Match, shot at present between England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales, New Zealand and Australia. The latest interest in this comes from London, when a query was raised as to why Australia adopts the present method of team selection.

As has often been mentioned through these columns, the Australian method of selection is far from perfect, but the Association administrators are of the opinion that, taking into account the spacious area of the country, no other method could be employed. The annual Association shoot is open to all registered shooters throughout the Commonwealth. Those who take part in the National Championship on the opening day of the series and finish among the top 25 automatically find their way into the team as Australia's representatives in the International. Team selection is always a difficult task, but by shooting their way into the team it has been found that those on the spot and in form on the day gain the honours. Only once has Australia selected a portion of the team, not with the happiest of results, both from the viewpoint of the interested parties on the side-lines or the actual shooters. As an instance of this, this year (1954) two West Australians gained places in the team and both shot brilliantly, being within a bird or two of the high-gun for the match. Had a team been selected on performances, it is quite likely that neither man would have gained a place. Both men had shot in Victoria previously and neither had shown, on that occasion, form sufficiently good to gain them consideration. However, in 1954 their form was at least twenty per cent. better than their previous visit and entitlement to a place in Australia's International combination was well warranted.



Notwithstanding its weaknesses, it seems most unlikely that any scheme will be devised which will change the method of selection of Australia's International team. At present there are no "post-mortems" necessary and it is to be hoped the position will remain as satisfactory in the future. Winning the series is admittedly a great honour, but this becomes secondary so long as competitors are happy in the team selection.

Clubs using the advertising columns of this publication are again reminded that copy closes for all matter on the thirtieth day of the month preceding issue. In recent months there has been a tendency not to observe this direction. In fact, for the August issue, copy was continuing to arrive as late as the tenth. Of course, it is impossible to assist clubs when copy matter is so late. Club officials are, therefore, requested to keep the closing date well in mind. No copy can be accepted after the 30th of each month. Also all copy matter for advertising should be forwarded through the Association and not direct to the printers.

Enquiries and queries on rules and Association policy should be directed through the Secretary of the Association and not through individual members of the Executive Committee. Only by this means will uniformity on all questions be settled satisfactorily.

A shooter from a Victorian country centre recently requested the Association to "define rule slow pull". This is a question for the referee of the contest to decide on the spot. The referee knows at once whether a shooter received a slow pull or otherwise. The referee must call "no bird" if he considers a "slow pull" occurred or that the shooter was balked.

Messrs. C. M. Barr (Mount Gambier, S.A.) and J. Woodrow (Milang, S.A.) have been appointed official referee examiners for the A.C.P.T.S.A. in South Australia. Shooters who have passed the written test in South Australia and who are desirous of becoming fully qualified are advised to contact either of the shooters named for the purpose of undergoing the practical test. If successful, the official A.C.P.T.S.A. Referee badge will be issued.

Clubs are reminded that all applications for 1955 Open Championships, that is Commonwealth, State and District, should be in the hands of

the Secretary, A.C.P.T.S.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.1, not later than October 1, 1954. Applications will be dealt with by the Executive Committee during October. A full list of the 1955 Championship Allocation will appear in the November "News" and clubs are requested to accept same as official and final.

Clubs making application for championships should prepare their application on separate note-paper and not include other Association detail in the application. Inclusion of outside matter tends to make for the application being overlooked.

Clubs writing to the Association are again requested to ensure that their mail is correctly addressed. During the past month several letters have been received at Association headquarters after more or less a "Cook's Tour" round the Commonwealth. The two latest were addressed to the Association at Brisbane and Longreach in Queensland. Incorrectly addressed mail means delayed reply.

A few weeks back, it is understood he met with a shooting accident which resulted in his death. Deepest sympathy is expressed to his relatives.

An English report reveals that the 51st English Open Down-the-Line Championship was won at Harrogate by E. Fear with 100/100, after a tie with C. R. Booth. Three shooters, each with 99, followed and the 5th man produced a 98; 97's were not

good enough. A splendid performance was registered by 11-year-old Raymond Jones of Rhosesmor in Wales. The youngster returned a creditable 76/100. In the International series the best individual effort among the Home Country teams was provided by S. T. Rimmer (England) with 98/100, after a tie with E. R. Bruce (Scotland), 98/100, and T. E. Sanders (Wales), 98/100. C. F. Gunn of New Zealand returned the best figures for the match, with 100 straight. D. Wareham of Blenheim was next to Gunn for New Zealand, with 99/100. Rimmer also won the British Open Championship with the low score of 91/100. However, the low scoring in this event is explained by the unseasonal summer which our kinsmen overseas have experienced. On British Open day a heavy gale blew throughout the whole period of shooting. On the second day Rimmer registered a 98/100. Rimmer registered high-gun for the series with 189/200, followed by W. T. Jones (Wales), 187/200.

Jack McCraith, the well-known trapshot, in a recent letter, which he heads "Safety first with the shotgun", is a self-explanatory document and one which all should heed. McCraith had an alarming experience, which could have been much more serious in final result. He writes:

"We all hear, at some time or other, stories of accidents occurring in this connection, and in most cases we pass it on with an explanation of carelessness, but until it happens to you, then you really do not know."

Recently I took my eldest boy of 13 out to put him through his pre-

liminaries in the field. When standing alongside him, I closed my gun, the latter being the best of its make procurable, when it went off in my hands, both barrels within two feet of my lad. Imagine my reactions to this, and also the lad!

When the gun was inspected, this was found to have happened; the firing pin had broken on an angle, the broken part had turned, not allowing it to go back into its place. It apparently scraped along the brass, then on to the cap. It would be a million to one chance, but this actually happened to me, so, shooters, I hope my story can be of some help in the words of "SAFETY FIRST".

If you never had a narrow escape with a shotgun, I hope you never will have one in the future."
