

The Editor's Notebook

The President and Executive of the Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association extend Seasonal Greetings and Best Wishes for 1955, to all affiliated clubs and registered shooters in the Association and also to the many well-wishers in distant parts of the world. All hope for better shooting in the future, and brighter times for all.



With interest quickening on events of the future, it is advised that the Association's national championship and International series, has been fixed for the period March 11 to 15, 1955. The series will extend on this occasion over four days and one night, starting off at 10 a.m. on Friday, March 11, followed by a night shoot on the same date. A new event has been decided upon for the first-day series, this to be known as the National Single-barrel Championship. Mr. W. Rainbird of Launceston, Tasmania, has presented a valuable cup, for perpetual competition, in this event. The winner will retain the cup for 12 months. The National single-barrel title will be followed by a £100 Handicap on March 11 and the night series will also be under handicap conditions. The National Double-barrel title will be the only event listed for decision on Saturday, March 12. This will be shot at 60 targets from 16 yards. The first 30 top scores in the National Double-barrel title will automatically represent Australia in the International Teams' Match against England, Ireland, New Zealand, Scotland, and Wales. It will be noted that the International Team complement this year has been raised from 25 to 30. This has been brought about by the International Committee restricting teams to fifteen, all scores to count. Australia and England, and possibly New Zealand, will now enter two teams, which is allowed under the rules of the competition. The International Teams' Match (Australian section) will be shot on Monday, March 14. This will be followed by

the Grand Australian Handicap of £200, Commonwealth Teams' Match, teams of four men from any affiliated club in Australia, will be shot in conjunction. The Club Teams' Championship, teams of four men, from any one club, will be shot in conjunction with the National D.B. event. The coveted Champion of Champions Cup and A.C.P.T.S.A. Intermediate D.B. title will be decided on the final day, Tuesday, March 15. The programme has been carefully selected and entrance fees kept at a low minimum. Shooters taking part will enjoy the best shooting possible at the lowest cost.

The series will take place on the grounds of the Australian Gun Club at East Burwood, Victoria. Competitors and their families will be entertained by the Association at a buffet dinner on the evening of March 12.

The annual meeting of affiliated club delegates will be held at Scott's Hotel, 444 Collins Street, Melbourne, C.1, commencing at 10.30 a.m. on Sunday, March 13, 1955. Only accredited delegates will be permitted to attend the meeting. Each club is permitted one delegate to represent its interests at this meeting. Name and full address of such delegate must reach the Secretary, A.C.P.T.S.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., seven clear days prior to the meeting.

Nominations for all offices in the Association close with the Secretary,

A.C.P.T.S.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.1, at 6 p.m., on December 31, 1954. Similarly all Notices of Motion, having reference to the rules, are also required to be lodged with the Secretary, A.C.P.T.S.A., not later than 6 p.m. on December 31, 1954.

During the recent meeting of the Association Executive Committee a number of important matters were discussed. Reference to matters, which are the concern of clubs and registered shooters, is made in the following paragraphs.

Registration Cards — Shooters' Handicaps. Every shooter, competing in club and open events, is required to carry his current Registration and Handicap Card, issued by the Association. This card should be presented, on all occasions, when making entries. In cases where no handicap is shown on the card, the shooter concerned should ensure that his mark is shown. Unknown shooters should be immediately placed on 16 yards. Any amendments to handicaps must be advised to the Association within three days of such amendment being made and the reason given. A shooter may be re-handicapped at any time.

Open Championship Conditions. Clubs granted open championships, that is Commonwealth, State or District, are required to obtain Association approval of the date before holding or advertising such event. The same applies in all cases where an amount of over £50 is allotted for any one event.

Standard Equipment. Some clubs are known to be not obeying the Executive Committee direction regarding the installation of standard equipment. The direction is that all clubs are required to instal concrete blocks, ten yards in front of the trap. Also, all clubs are required to have a standard measuring stick as part of their equipment, for the purpose of measuring the height of targets. A margin tolerance of not more than 18 inches, above and below, the regulation height of 9 feet, 10 yards from the trap, is permitted. Clubs concerned should immediately arrange for the foregoing installations.

Sweepstake Deduction. The permissible deduction from sweepstakes allowed to be taken out by clubs is to be not more than 50 per cent., inclusive of targets. No deduction from optional sweepstakes attached to open championships (Commonwealth, State and District) is permitted.

Double - Rise Competition. All double-rise shooting, either in championships or club events, is to be shot five track, squad system, and not single (centre) track.

Standard Shell for Championships. Shells used in all championships (Commonwealth, State or District) are restricted to 1½ oz. of shot, struck measure, or its equivalent. Shells marked by the manufacturer, as complying with this regulation are approved.

Break Badges. As from November 1, 1954, breaks will be recognised by the Association only if compiled on the one day, or on successive days when a club is conducting a more than one-day fixture. Shooting in other than down-the-line double or single-barrel events is not acceptable for break recognition, nor is practice allowed. All shooting must be done in actual competition. Score sheets, confirming the break, must be submitted to the Association before any break claim will be recognised.

"News". Advertising rates for Clubs will be increased by £1 per full page as from the first issue in 1955. This will make the rates £5 per full page, £3 per half page. For trading houses the rates are higher.

Shooting at Other than Targets. The Association has decreed that no shooter shall discharge a gun on any grounds whatever other than at a legitimate targets. Shooters firing at passing birds or other game on any shooting grounds will be fined £1 for the first offence and for a second offence the matter is to be reported to the Association.

Walk-up Conditions. Shooters taking part in walk-up events — that is, Club or Open Contests — are advised that these competitions are shot singly from the centre track. Squad system does not prevail in walk-up

competition. The conditions governing walk-up shooting are again outlined for the benefit of any who have any doubts on the point. They are "competitor to have gun loaded and ready to commence his walk from the 22 yards mark. The competitor advances at ordinary walking pace—to shuffle or walk slowly is a "no-bird". The clay target is released between 20 and 15 yards, the mark to be unknown to the competitor, being pre-determined by an indicator, or dice arrangement, and is determined each bird the competitor is to shoot at. The gun is to be held in any position consistent with safety provided the breech or loading mechanism is not held higher than the waistline. The waistline for this purpose to be defined as "a line with the top of the hip-bones". Club managements are requested to ensure that the above conditions prevail in all walk-up competitions.

Maximum Handicap Mark. The maximum handicap mark for any shooter registered with the Association has been fixed at 25 yards.

Affiliation and Registration Fees, 1955. Club affiliation fees (Clubs only) of £1/1/- and shooter's registration fee, 20/- each, are due and payable as from January 1st next. Individuals submitting lists should arrange same in alphabetical order, state whether new shooters or renewals, and give full address and initials. The above conditions are most important to ensure efficient recording. All fees should be paid not later than January 30th.

Annual Interstate Shoot. The venue of the annual Interstate Teams' Shoot for the Great Britain and Ireland Trophy was decided by the Executive Committee.

The venues for 1955 are: Queensland, at Townsville G.C.; New South Wales, at Bathurst G.C.; South Australia, at Mount Barker G.C.; Western Australia, at Perth G.C.; Victoria, at Australian G.C.

Referee Examiner. Mr. E. V. Cox of South Hay, N.S.W., has been appointed an official referee examiner.

Change in Championship Condition. Clubs and shooters are advised that Championship Condition No. 19,

having reference to District Double-rise Championships, has been changed. This condition should now read to be shot at "10 pairs" instead of "12 pairs" as stated in the published Brochure of Championship Conditions. All other sections of the condition remain as before.

Defaulter Club. The Stonehenge Club (N.S.W.) is reported as a defaulter club with the A.C.P.T.S.A. This club is in debt to the Association for advertising.

Shooter's Retirement from Competition. It is an Executive direction that when a shooter retires from a competition, no matter at what stage of the competition, he forfeits all rights to resume. Also, when a shooter retires during any part of the competition, tracks must be closed up. For example, if a shooter retires and is, say, the No. 3 shooter, immediately on his retirement the tracks are closed, which means that the remaining two shooters on tracks four and five move across to tracks three and four respectively, and continue shooting.

Referee Test. Candidates for official referee recognition and subsequent issue of official referee badge, are advised to make themselves available for practical test, by any of the official examiners, as soon as possible. This ruling applies to any of those who may have been rejected on an earlier occasion.

Victorian Record for BREDA AUTOMATICS

Shooting with BREDA Automatics, Fred Burns and Malcolm Fuller recorded an unfinished break of 140 pairs to win the Keilor Plains D.D. Championship.

The club is expected to affiliate with the A.C.P.T.S.A. in due course.

During a recent shoot held by the Townsville Gun Club in North Queensland, it was found that the fixture coincided with the 50th birthday of J. E. ("Brum") Melville, one of the club's senior Vice-Presidents. During the afternoon-tea break advantage was taken by the Ladies' Committee of the club to provide a celebration befitting the occasion. Lengthy advice was handed out and the "celebration" developed "really well", so-much-so that only some of the members resumed shooting. The guest of the occasion was reminded that "his second fifty is always harder than the first".

Frequently discussion arises when shooters foregather on the question of keeping both eyes open when shooting over the traps. The U.S.A. shooter, Phil. Miller, states, "I have given this quite a bit of study and come to this conclusion—some persons cannot shoot with both eyes open for physical reasons, no matter how hard they try. The chief reason for this is because one eye is stronger than the other. For example, one shooter shoots from his right shoulder and his left eye is the master eye and considerably stronger than the right one. It is only natural that this stronger left eye will try to line up the sights and gun barrel if left open—and tend to draw the shooter's face across the stock in a very uncomfortable and clumsy manner. The logical answer to such a shooter's problem is that he close his left eye when shooting, or change the gun from his right shoulder and shoot from the left one. He can then leave both eyes open and still hold the sights and barrel in perfect alignment. To an experienced shoot-

er, it is easy to ascertain a shooter's stronger eye the moment the gun is placed to the shoulder and face. I recommend that where a shooter's case is the same as that mentioned, that shooting from the right shoulder and closing the left eye, unless naturally left-handed, would be beneficial. If you are shooting with one eye closed and would like to change to 'both eyes' style of shooting, I would suggest the following: line up the sights with one eye closed, then slowly open the other. If your eyes are of nearly the same strength, you will soon be able to shoot with both open. The two-eyed shooter has quite an advantage over the one-eyed shooter in that he has a far wider vision and can more easily pick up his target. If you cannot shoot with both eyes open, do not let it discourage you, as many of the finest marksmen use only one eye. A short trip to a good oculist or optometrist might work wonders!"

In recent weeks several cases have been reported of shooters placing their cartridge type cigarette lighters in the gun, in mistake for the real thing. All shooters are reminded that every care should be taken in ensuring that proper ammunition is in the gun at all times. Frequently the cartridge type cigarette lighter is of somewhat smaller gauge than a normal shell and it is possible for a lighter to slip down a barrel and remain some distance inside the barrel, without the shooter noticing what has happened. The trouble which would result from such a happening can be well imagined. Recently a shooter on a Melbourne ground was guilty of placing his cigarette lighter in his gun on two occasions on the same day. This action calls for censure. Club officials

should assist by reminding shooters of the dangers likely to result from the enclosing of cartridge cigarette lighters in guns in mistake for genuine ammunition.

CORRECT STANCE

(By Phil. Miller, Reno, Nevada,
U.S.A.)

Over many years of shooting, I've noticed one of the great faults of some shooters in failing to improve year by year stems from their stance; hence I'm going to devote my comments to correct stance, and although I won't cover all the various ramifications, the things I have to say are basic and should help new as well as older shooters in basic fundamentals of trapshooting:

The first basic principle for the shooter who intends to enjoy the sport as well as show consistent improvement is (1) to point his left toe at the middle of the trap house; (2) drop the right foot back to such a position that the right toe is even with the left heel; (3) bend the left knee and hold the right knee rigid, leading forward. To explain this better, I can say that a shooter should adopt the same position as if he was pushing against a stalled automobile. Such a position takes up the recoil of the gun through the body and does not tend to make the shooter suffer from any soreness or muscle bruises.

In this stance the chest is facing the same way as you are shooting. This is the basic difference between trapshooting and rifle shooting, because you are not shooting over your left shoulder as with a rifle. In most rifle shooting, you can shoot straight or at right angle targets, but find yourself in a bind when attempting a left angle shot.

Try the position I have mentioned and swing your gun in an arc. (You can do this in your own living room if you want to practise the correct position.) I think you will find, after a bit of practice, that you can swing the gun in an arc that will cover left angles as easily as right angles.

Many beginners have sore shoulders and arm muscles primarily because the recoil of the gun is taken against the muscles of the right upper arm, the gun having slipped from its proper snug position against

the shoulder. This is primarily because the feet are parallel and the gun butt does not fit squarely into the shoulder.

After adopting the position outlined, there is another hint which I feel will also help, and that is—bring the right elbow in fairly close to your body. This will cause your right shoulder to hump up slightly, thus making a snug fit for the gun butt against the shoulder blade. (I hope it is understood here that I am giving these hints for a right-hand shooter, but the same will definitely apply to a left-hand shooter by a reversal of the foot positions.)

Now, assuming that the new position has been mastered, here is a series of hints which should help you greatly in cracking trap targets. One of the basic essentials in good trapshooting is to mentally divide the trap house in fifths. When you're shooting on Peg 1, point your gun barrel directly over the back corner of the trap house and just above it. On Peg 2, you cover another fifth by pointing directly over the space half the distance from the corner and half the distance from centre. On Peg 3, you are then pointing directly over the centre; on Peg 4, just the opposite of Peg 2, one half the distance between the centre and the other corner; and naturally, on Peg 5, over the far corner opposite the corner from your Peg 1 stance. By so pointing, you shorten the angle of shooting, and thus have to make the least movement in starting with the target.

Letters to the Editor . . .

The Editor,
A.C.P.T.S.A. Shooters' News.

Sir,

May I, through the columns of "News", draw the attention of Club handicappers and officials to a motion that was carried at the Annual A.C.P.T.S.A. Executive Meeting on Nov. 5th and 6th, 1953. The motion read as follows: "That no shooter's Club handicap can be less than his Association handicap under any circumstances."

A direction to Clubs on this motion was printed in the issue of "News" following that meeting. Handicapping is one of the Association's biggest problems and I brought the motion before the Executive in order to prevent anomalies which were not in the best interests of the sport or the shooters.

I quote two outstanding examples of events that I witnessed and which prompted me to act in the interests of shooters generally. A Club "Tyro" Championship, restricted to Club 12/13 yarders, was won by a shooter whose Association handicap was 16 yards. On another occasion two shooters whose Association handicaps were 18 yards and 16 yards respectively shot to the 48th round to decide the winner of a Club 12/14 yd. award. Needless to say, legitimate front-

mark shooters who stood by and watched these shoots took a dim view of the handicapping system—and rightly so.

When a shooter, by his own ability, has won an open company Association handicap, there can be absolutely no reason why he should be brought forward of that handicap for restricted Club events. It has come under my notice that such practice is again being indulged in by some Clubs, and only recently in the Metropolitan area a 17 yd. Association shooter won a 15 yd. Club sectional trophy.

Perhaps the passing of time, or the election by Clubs of new handicappers who do not know of the Executive direction on the matter, is responsible for the situation arising again. In the interests of young shooters particularly and in order to further the interests and harmony of our sport, I appeal to all Clubs to observe the direction and make it one of their main rules: "That no shooter's Club handicap shall be less than his Association handicap under any circumstances."

U.S.A. SHOOTING

(From Rex Miles)

Arnold Riegger, right after the Grand, shot in Ohio and broke all the targets on the programme, won another automobile and a lot of cash. Then he came back to Elko, Nevada. The enclosed clipping will give you an idea:

"There might be some doubt in the minds of many trapshooters in the country as to who is the top gunner in the nation. But make no mistake about it. There are 150 shooters who know the answer. To a man they'll say 'Arnold Riegger.'

The red-hot scattergunner from the Pacific North-west carted off top money in the recent Nevada Open Trap Shoot in Elko, Nevada, when he out-shot virtually everyone in the field.

Riegger displayed his wares during his quest for the lion's share of \$15,000 added cash money riding on the six-day shooting programme and came off with three world records in the process. The all-American shooter from Seattle, Washington, blasted his way into the trapshooting record books by:

1. Splattering 879 x 900 for the highest mark ever attained in a performance for a high-over-all title;
2. Breaking 1078 x 1100 for the highest mark ever shot on one programme; and
3. Racking up the almost unbelievable 400 x 400 in singles, handicap, and doubles shooting on the same programme.

Riegger's fabulous final feat came with 200 singles, 100 handicap, and 100 doubles targets. The doubles 'perfect' was shot on the preliminary day of firing, but was counted in the record since it had been on the same shooting programme.

In addition to the car load of trophies carted home by the short, squatly dead-eye, followers of the trapshooting sport who were on hand in Elko estimated that Riegger's shooting prowess netted him upwards

of \$2,500 — mighty fine return for his week's work."

Guess that the spill off the bike was not serious and didn't hurt his shooting.

A new Rule on yardage is in effect now; the limit has been set at 27 yards instead of 25. This, I feel sure, to try to keep Riegger under control. I think, though, that Arnold will master the additional yards, and he will be up in the high money; you can't stop that guy. As far as I am concerned, I like to see him take the laurels; he deserves it. He never complains, always shoots at any kind of targets, a cheerful personality with a smile for everyone, a grand guy.


