The Editor's Notebook

Information has come to hand, just prior to going to press, indicating that New Zealand has won the Mackintosh International Teams' Match for the second successive year. Ironically enough, Australia is again in second position, this time for the third year running. The New Zealand "A" Team returned the good score of 1462. This total included two registrations of 100 straight by individual members, followed by several 99/100's. The winning team averaged over 97 per man—a tough hurdle for any team to parry. Australia's "B" team carded 1444, followed by New Zealand "B" 1441, England "A" 1434, Australia "A" 1423, Scotland "A" 1418, England "B" 1399, Wales "A" 1398, Ireland "A" 1395, England "C" 1392, Scotland "B" 1339, Ireland "B" 1308, and Wales "B" 1229. The result is a triumph for our New Zealand kinsmen and heartiest congratulations are offered to them. The result brings forward an idea which may be tried to advantage for Australia in the next series in 1956. It will be recalled that for the first time in 1955 each country was permitted more than one team. Australia, in keeping with previous policy, permitted the teams to be made up in the order they finished in the Australian National Double-barrel Championship. Whilst this is commendable and has many features which are worth while, it would appear to be a better idea if the two Australian teams were selected in what is considered the real "A" and "B" form from among those qualifying. For instance, there were several in the 1955 Australian "B" team who were proved long-run shooters, that is those able to stand up to the rigours of a highly competitive 100-bird marathon. In fact, this theory has been proved by the recent result. The Australian "B" team outclassed the "A" combination, in that it was 19 birds better. The foregoing is an idea which may be considered by the Executive Committee at its next meeting. A number



of random discussions on this point, with uninterested shooters, has proved that the scheme would be well received.


Recently a New Zealand visiting shooter to Australia wrote the Association complaining that two New South Wales clubs had refused to allow him to enter in championships because he did not reside in Australia. The decision of these clubs is indeed surprising. Quite apart from the courtesy aspect, any New Zealand visitor to Australia has equal right to compete in our open championships, providing he presents his credentials in proper form to the clubs visited. The New Zealand Gun Club's Association is an affiliated unit of the A.C.P.T.S.A. and complete reciprocal entries by visitors to either Dominion is now permitted. In Australia, until the present case arose, the reciprocal arrangement always stood. New Zealand came into line some years ago and now entrants from either Dominion are freely admitted to open competition. In fact, some two years ago a New Zealand visitor almost won the A.C.P.T.S.A. Champion of Champions Cup. The winner had to go to a long shoot-off to shake the visiting sportsman off; he was D. P. North. Any New Zealander attempting to enter in an Australian competition should be requested to produce his New Zealand registration papers completed in every way.

Several applications have come forward in recent weeks for the

registration of shooting names; also several have been noticed taking upon themselves to acquire shooting names without reference to the Association. All shooters and club officials are advised that no shooting names are now permitted. The practice was discontinued some years ago and will not be re-introduced. Australia is the only country in the world where this practice has been permitted in clay-bird shooting. In an extensive organization like the A.C.P.T.S.A., permission of "shooting names" could get out of hand in a very short space of time.

A country club in Victoria recently wrote to the Association advising that it had several members who had not registered, and asking if their registration was essential. The only

non-essential registrations are those who merely join the club and do not shoot, or possibly an odd extra social shooter who may appear at, say, the annual Christmas shoot. The whole basis of organised control of the sport falls down if all shooters are not registered. Unregistered shooters are not permitted to compete against registered shooters and should not be entertained as competitors in any way whatsoever. They have no entitlement to prizes and should not be permitted to shoot on the tracks. Similarly, registered shooters should see to it that unregistered men do not compete against them. Once a club joins the Association it becomes part of that body and must necessarily obey its rules along with its members. It is a basic rule of the Association that all shooters must be registered.

I was most pleased to read the letter of "Front Mark Critic" last

issue of News, reference to the formation of one Central Club in the metropolitan area of Melbourne.

It has been the goal of the writer for the past two or three years to have this Central Club formed and have talked it over with many shooters. In most cases they have been all in favour.

If we look at this Central Club from a practical point of view, one will admit that its formation is overdue. It would, of course, mean the amalgamation of all Melbourne clubs. Some people will not agree with this, saying that it will kill the individual club feeling. This may be to a degree, but the advantages to be gained will far outweigh this feeling.

Space here will not permit me to point out all the advantage. However, to mention a few:

1. At least 100 or more shooters would be competing each week, making it possible to grade all competitors A, B, C.
2. Nominations would be less and pay out more because of increased attendance — result, cheaper shooting.
3. Practice and coaching tracks could be available throughout the afternoon and during the week. (This is very important if we are to attract new shooters to the sport.)
4. A worthwhile clubhouse, with all amenities for visitors and ladies, is a must if we are to stage a large shooting carnival during the Olympic Games.

At present none of our Metropolitan Club grounds measure up to very much; in fact, many country clubs leave us for dead in this regard. The sport originated in this city some 30 years ago; considering this and the money invested in the sport, we realise how low is the standard of the clubs.

I am sure the problems confronting us in the formation of this club can be overcome. The two greatest being finance and suitable location. The latter is the most difficult.

In the interest of clay target shooting in this city, I would appeal to all shooters who have this sport

at heart to contact the writer should they know of any suitable ground location.

Earl also won the Handicap from 25 yds. with 95, then he broke a 91 from 25 yds., winning a Pontiac car worth 2,800 dollars for his total on the 200 Handicap targets, 186; runner-up had 185, he was a local boy.



GUN GOSSIP

He had 185 in the handicap and a 95 on the final day to win second place. Someplace along the line there was a mistake in score keeping which gave another gunner an extra bird, but the powers that be ruled it was too late to take away that extra bird.

If it hadn't been for that, Skoglund would have really been in the chips . . . or at least tied for first for about 2,800 dollars worth.

But he didn't say a word. He appeared happy to have been on the winning three-man team in the S.R. shoot.

That's what this corner calls being a first-rate sport. Not many guys can stand to see 2,800 dollars go flying out the window and not even grumble about it."

Curving, dropping duck! Who has not met his Waterloo at such birds? There is truly all the difference between duck which rise in front of you from river or pond, and curving, dropping duck, which I have always found most puzzling shots. The man who shoots a few duck rising in front of him and then thinks he knows all the answers is destined for a true awakening later on. But then duck shooting would not be duck shooting were it not for such baffling variations.

It is hard to explain how one day you shoot far better (for no apparent reason) than you do on another. The reason is probably a psychological one. It is the brilliant shot who so seldom varies. No doubt the exceptional qualities which are required to make a super-shot are a combination of those of both brilliance and consistency. The man who is brilliant and who can keep it up becomes the super-shot. Which of us is there who has not made some brilliant shots from time to time? Everybody does it on rare occasions and calls it a "fluke". I am not so sure that it is a fluke or perhaps I should say that it is less often a fluke than is popularly supposed. What is to be noted is that we can do the right thing, but we cannot do it often enough. Thus we fail to become first-class shots. Other physical conditions being equal, the answer seems to be in the mental make-up and approach to the whole problem. I believe that many weaknesses can be overcome by sheer mental application; disadvantage would be when much walking had to be done. But his knowledge and judgment would no doubt help him out. Analysis is the first necessity—so that you may know yourself. It was to this that the ancient Greeks attached prime importance. And life does not really change!

Exceptional physical activity does not seem to be essential for good shooting. I have shot with men of marked athletic ability who were really not much good as shots. I have seen an athlete in his prime have his
