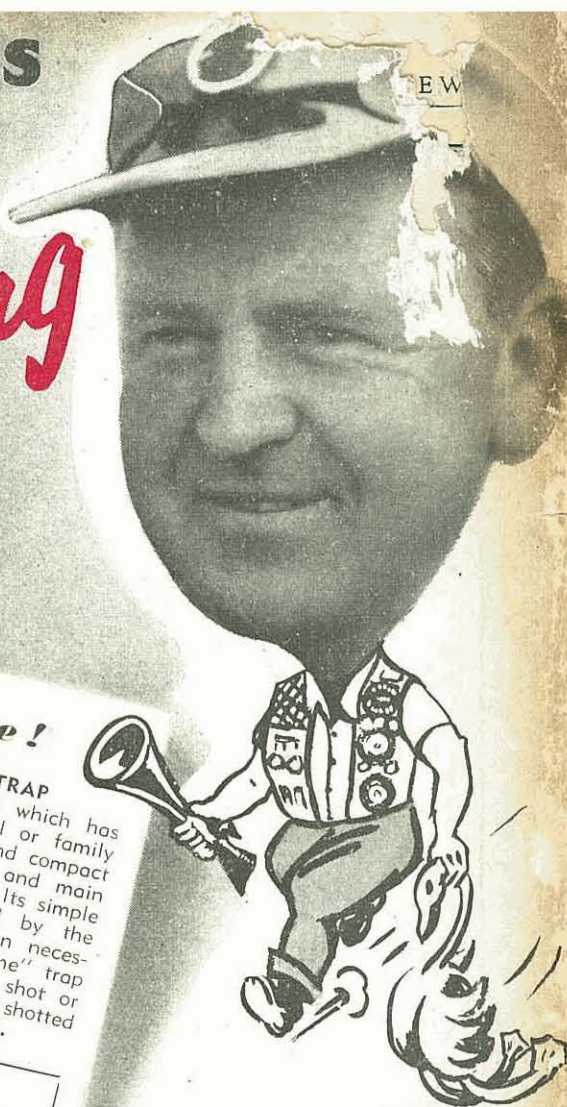

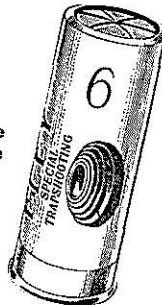

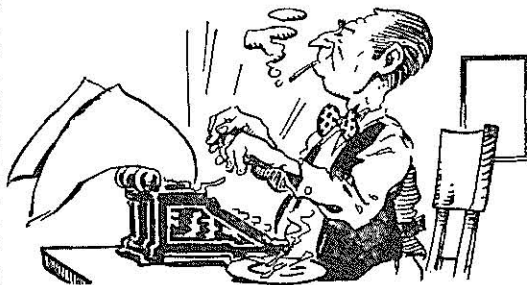

The Editor's Notebook

During the month just passed the all-Australian Executive Committee of the A.C.P.T.S.A. met at a lengthy conference in Melbourne. Many matters of great interest to clubs and individual shooters emanated from the conference. Main details are outlined in following paragraphs and all concerned are requested to study and act upon same. No additional direction of the matters referred to will be issued.



1956 CHAMPIONSHIPS. This issue contains a complete list of open championships as allocated by the Executive Committee for 1956. Clubs allotted these events are required to seek permission for the holding of same as well as securing approval of the date. No open championship may be conducted by a club without first securing this approval.

1955 INTERSTATE TEAMS' MATCH. New South Wales was heartily congratulated on the success of that State team in winning the 1955 Interstate Teams' Match, shot at Bathurst. New South Wales will now hold "The Great Britain and Ireland" Trophy until the next competition.

POINTS SCORING. In view of the long break sequences now being recorded, the Executive Committee gave considerable attention to this position. Ultimately it was decided that from 1/1/1956 "all competition shooting is to be shot under points scoring system, including championships, three (3) points for a first barrel 'kill' and two (2) points for a second barrel 'kill'." This means that from January 1 next all authorised competition under A.C.P.T.S.A. Rules must be shot under points scoring, three and two.

1956 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS. The 1956 National Championships, conducted by the Association, will be shot on the grounds of The Royal Aero Club of N.S.W. at

Bankstown, near Sydney. Details of programme items will appear in the December issue of "News". Meanwhile intending competitors who are desirous of taking advantage of the opportunity of securing accommodation at the clubhouse during the series, which will be held from March 9 to March 13, 1956 (both dates inclusive), are advised to communicate with the Secretary, Royal Aero Club of N.S.W. (Gun Society), Box 5, Bankstown, N.S.W., with as little delay as possible.

1956 ANNUAL MEETING. The 1956 Annual Meeting of the A.C.P.T.S.A. will be held in the Clubhouse at Bankstown on Sunday, March 11, 1956, commencing at 10.30 a.m.

MINIMUM AND MAXIMUM MARK. From 1/1/1956 (January 1, 1956) the minimum mark for all competition under A.C.P.T.S.A. Rules will be 16 yards. This means the complete elimination of marks in front of 16 yards, i.e. 12, 13, 14 and 15 yards. Shooters on 16 yards and beyond will come back 1 yard on present handicap. Those on 12, 13, 14, 15 yards will automatically come back to 16 yards. The maximum mark has been fixed at 27 yards.

1956 INTERNATIONAL MATCH. Conditions for the 1956 International Match, as directed by the International Committee in London, have been fixed at 100 birds per man (25 birds at a visit) from 16 yards, 1½ oz.

VENUE 1956 INTERSTATE MATCH. The venue for the shooting of the 1956 Interstate Match for "The Great Britain and Ireland Trophy" has been fixed as under:—

QUEENSLAND — South Coast Gun Club.

N.S.W. — Griffith Gun Club.

VICTORIA — Coburg Gun Club

TASMANIA — Hobart Gun Club.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA — Alexandra Gun Club (S.A.).

WESTERN AUSTRALIA — Perth Gun Club.

The 1956 Interstate Match is required to be completed in all States one month earlier than has been the case in previous years, i.e. not later than August 31, 1956. Results to be in hands of A.C.P.T.S.A. Secretary within 7 days following the shoot.

The Interstate series will in 1956 be shot, 100 birds elimination, 16 yards, nomination 60/—, points scoring 3 and 2, with 0 for a miss. The actual Interstate Match will also be shot at 100 birds from 16 yards with the same method of scoring. (See further reference under "Olympic Games" in this section.)

DEAUVILLE DOUBLE CONDITIONS. As from January 1, 1956, Deauville Double Championships are to be shot, Commonwealth from 24 yards, State from 22 yards, and District from 20 yards, kills only to count, as now.

WALK-UP CONDITIONS. Conditions for the holding of the gun in walk-up competitions and championships have been altered. In future "the butt of the gun must be held no higher than the waistline." Any previous direction on holding of the gun has been rescinded. In view of the 16 yards limit mark which applies as from 1/1/1956, walk-up conditions have been amended as from that date, to be understood that the bird is to be released between the 21 and 16 yards marks and the shooter is to start walking at 23 yards. Consequential adjustments are to be made in Mixed Birds events or in any other event in which adjustment is necessary.

INTERMEDIATE CHAMPIONSHIPS. Intermediate Championships, of all types, are to be classified and shot under the same conditions as District Championships.

MINIMUM VALUE OF TROPHIES IN OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS. In recent months a number of reports have been received at Association headquarters indicating that trivial trophies have been awarded in open championships, this particularly applying to the minor awards. From 1/1/1956 the following trophy values must be observed:

COMMONWEALTH — inclusive of sash, £40.

STATE — inclusive of sash, £30.

DISTRICT — inclusive of sash, £25.

The foregoing amounts are to be the minimum amount in value allocated.

OLYMPIC GAMES, 1956. Australia will field a team of two men in the 1956 Olympic Games in Melbourne. The Australian Team selection has been given careful consideration. The two men to represent Australia will be selected under the following conditions: firstly, the Interstate Match high guns (kills only to count) in the various States (eligible shooters as defined by their amateur status), will be required to undertake (subject to their being able to attend), (1) Victorian elimination shoot for Olympic selection, (2) Practice for the Olympic Shoot, (3) Actual Olympic Shoot. Numbers selected on strength of competitors in each State: Queensland 8, N.S.W. 10, Victoria 10, Tasmania 4, South Australia 2, Western Australia 2. Which means that the whole team of 10 men in the Interstate Match 1956 will be eligible to take part in the elimination shoot at Laverton, Victoria, from the States of New South Wales and Victoria, with 8 from Queensland, 4 from Tasmania and 2 each from South and Western Australia. The history and details of winnings of the selected men and emergencies from each State, over the previous 20 months, must be forwarded to the Association secretary not later than September 7, 1956.

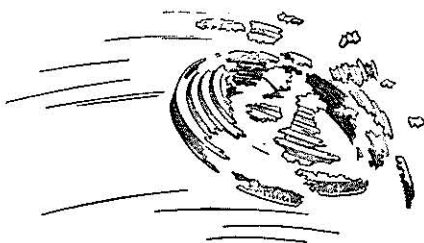
PROGRAMME AFTER OLYMPIC GAMES. Subject to the approval of

the R.A.A.F. at Laverton (V.), it has been decided to stage the Southern Hemisphere D.B. Championship at 200 birds from 16 metres (Olympic Conditions). £500 has been allocated to the event and the winner will receive a Gold Cup carrying the motifs of the Olympic Organization and the A.C.P.T.S.A.

SHOOTING AT PIECES. A report was received that a number of referees throughout the Commonwealth had been taking the advice in "News" regarding "shooting at the pieces" too literally and penalising shooters accordingly. Referees are informed that the previous direction was given as a guide and not a direction. Referees should ensure that equity of competition is maintained at all times. If a shooter chooses to shoot with his second barrel at "the pieces" after breaking his clay with his first barrel, there is nothing in the rules to prevent him. Notwithstanding this, it is a practice not to be recommended, firstly as the shooter concerned is only wasting shells

and upsetting, in many cases, the shooters of his squad. A shooter "fooling" continually should be asked for an explanation.

BREAK BADGES. From 1/12/55 break badges will be awarded only under the following conditions, "shot under competition conditions, double or single-barrel, on one day only, and only when the shooter is shooting on or behind his Association handicap mark." In other words, the many breaks recorded in championships which are shot in front of the shooters' Association handicap will not be recognised.

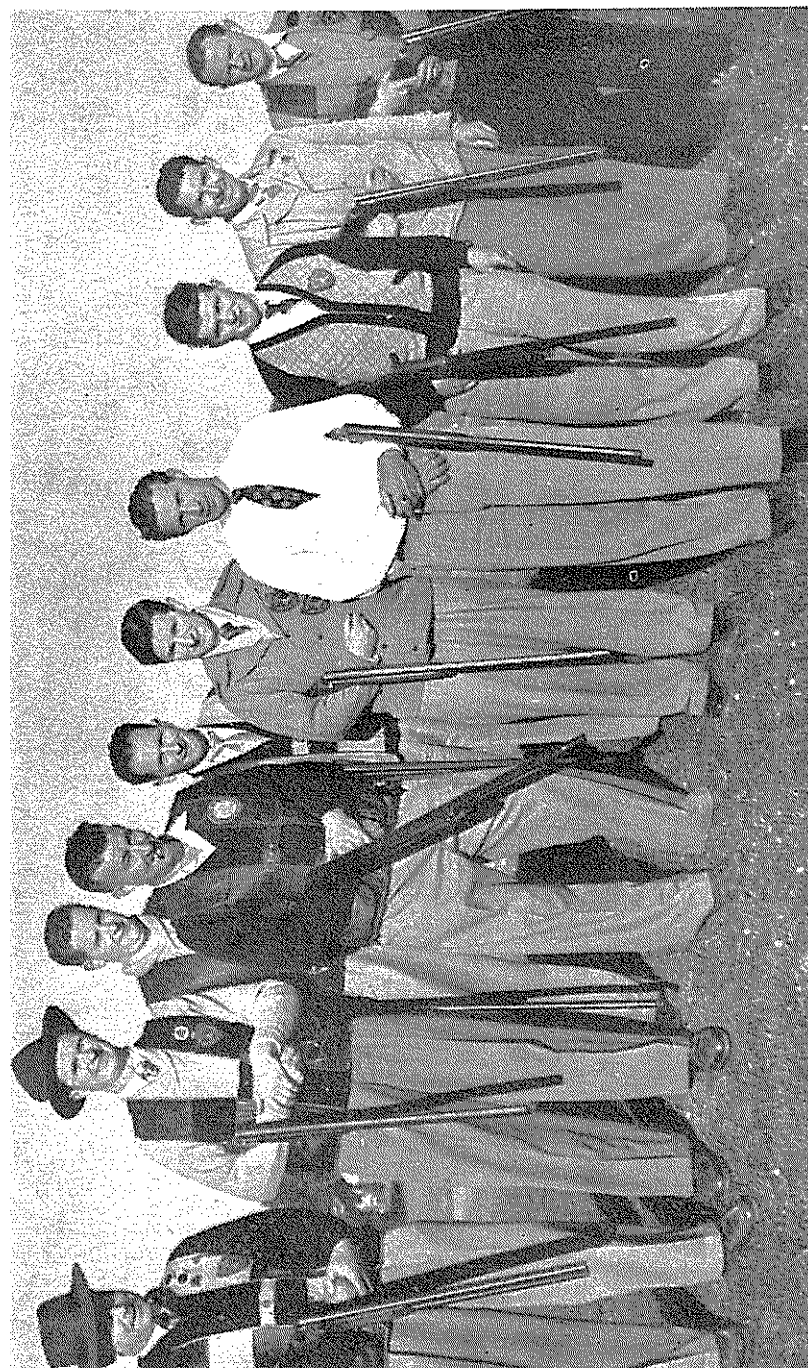

Dear Sir,

The balls mentioned in Mr. Mathews' letter (5th Sept.) were probably of resin composition. Dr. Carver held the record of 5,500 consecutive hits at glass balls, and broke 60,000 out of 60,650. It was the ambition of the young American Adolph Toepperwein to break Dr. Carver's record. He shot each day for twelve days at wooden blocks about 2½ x 2½. The first day he hit 6,500. His first miss occurred the second day when the 8000th block was tossed up. At the end of the twelfth day his record was 72,491 out of 72,500, which probably will never be equalled. He used three .22 Automatics. He was with tired at the age of 71. His wife was the Winchester Arms Co. until he realso with the Winchester Arms Co., and had never fired a shot before she was married. Ad Toepperwein started to give his wife shooting lessons, and found she was the greatest natural shooter he had ever met. Three weeks after her first lesson she was shooting pieces of chalk from between his fingers with a .22 rifle. She was always called "Plinky" because every time she scored a hit she said "plink". She was the first woman in America to break 100 consecutive clays, which she repeated 200 times, and also broke 200 fourteen times. She broke 1952 out of 2000 clay targets. Her 25-yard timed-fire record with the 38 officers-model revolver was 497 out of 500. With a .22 rifle she smashed 1400 wood blocks 2½ square without a miss. Her husband's record was 14,561 without a miss. A lot of trick shooting may be faked, and the cartridges loaded with shot instead of bullets, but even so, to see Buffalo Bill cantering along breaking glass balls thrown by a man riding behind is pretty good shooting. There was no fake about "Annie Oakley's" shooting. With a

Colt revolver in each hand, she would start, and keep a tin rolling along the ground until the twelfth shot was fired.

NOTES ON THE PURCHASE OF SECOND-HAND SHOTGUNS

The purchase of a second-hand shotgun involves somewhat similar risks to those incurred in buying a second-hand motor-car or an expensive second-hand watch. Each to a degree is the product of skilled craftsmen and in none is it a simple matter for the layman to detect every defect or weakness. To suggest that one should go to a reputable gunmaker or gunsmith and buy the best gun one can afford may be sound advice but it is cold comfort to those who really cannot afford a good second-hand gun or to those who may be tempted to purchase a second-hand gun from an acquaintance, in the market place, at an auction or sale-room or at the local tavern. A few words of advice on the subject may be timely.

When contemplating the purchase or sale of a used gun, check must be made that the Proof Marks remain valid. Proof Marks indicate the soundness of the gun when it was proved, but the gun may have been so altered that it is unproved at law although the Proof Marks remain.

The incidence of Tax on new guns added to their already high cost placed a premium on the better class of second-hand gun, so that there are many old guns being offered for sale which in more normal times would have been considered past further ser-

vice. Where purchase is contemplated from sources other than reputable gunmakers, gunsmiths or dealers, it is suggested that the gun be submitted to a reputable gunmaker for a report on its condition prior to completion of the deal. Where difficulty is experienced in obtaining such a report, request may be made to one of the Proof Houses for advice as to whether the gun is or is not in fully proved condition. The Proof Houses should not be expected to advise as to mechanical condition, quality or value.

A report of this nature is suggested and may be invaluable because a gun may have a number of faults not apparent to the inexperienced eye.

An expert examination of the gun should determine:—

1. Whether the gun has been Nitro Proved, bears the relative Proof Marks and is suitable for use with modern cartridges.
2. Whether the bores have been enlarged since the barrels were last proved.
3. Whether the barrels are in good condition generally, that is, free from rust, pitting, dents and bulges.
4. Whether the chambers have been altered to accept a longer case since the gun was last proved.

5. Whether the action is "off the face" of the barrels, or otherwise loose.
6. Whether the action is in good safe working order.
7. Whether the gun patterns well at normal distances. This is not a matter affecting the safety of the gun or its state in Proof but is of importance to the prospective purchaser.

It is regrettably true that there are guns offered for sale by irresponsible persons which would not pass examination satisfactorily on any one of the several points enumerated above. Such a gun may well be unproved, unsafe and fit only for use as a wall ornament.

The shooting public are given protection by the Gun Barrel Proof Acts of 1868 and 1950, under which it is an offence to offer for sale an unproved arm. Every shotgun must pass the Proof test and bear Proof Marks, and where certain alterations have been effected since Proof, such as the opening out of the bore beyond defined limits to remove pitting, or the deepening of the chambers, the Proof

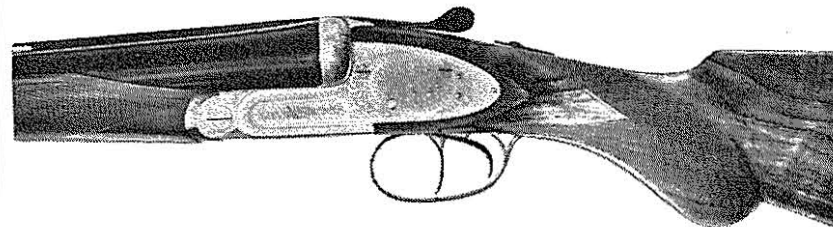
Marks are rendered invalid, the gun becomes an unproved weapon, and must be submitted to a further Proof test prior to sale. The Proof Authorities and the Proof Houses were established for public security and one of their more important functions under the Proof Acts is to institute proceedings against offenders where the necessary evidence is put before them and is considered to justify such action.

Proceedings have been instituted by one or other of the Proof Authorities on a number of occasions in recent years and in each case a substantial fine has been imposed. The offence in dealing in unproved arms is committed by the seller not by the purchaser.

Closer co-operation between the shooting public, gunmakers and the Proof Authorities must result in a reduction of the risks involved in the purchase of second-hand shotguns from chance acquaintance, unscrupulous dealers or misinformed friends.
