The Editor's Notebook

With the festive season at hand as this issue goes to publication Seasonal Greetings are extended to all affiliated clubs, registered shooters, advertisers and to all well-wishers of the Association. The A.C.P.T.S.A. looks forward to the future with confidence and hopes the same feeling will extend to all interested in the pastime of clay pigeon shooting.



NEW PUBLICATION DATE. With the coming of the New Year and staff reorganisation the Association announces a new publication date for this journal. Commencing on February 1 the publication will be issued on or about the first of each month. The new publication date brings about, of course, a new deadline date for the closing of copy matter. Copy deadline will be the first day of the preceding month. The great advantage of the new publication date is that all matter having reference to the current calendar month will appear in "News" during the month which it most concerns. As an example, the March issue will appear on March 1 (or thereabouts), copy for March issue will close on February 1 and the same routine will be followed in all future editions.

Due to the printer's vacation period there will be no issue of "News" during the month of January. Copy for February issue will close no later than January 10.

1956 ASSOCIATION SHOOT. The Royal Aero Club's grounds at Bankstown, N.S.W., will be the scene of the 1956 Association National Championships and International Match. The dates set down for the holding of these events is March 9, 10, 12 and 13. 1956. It will be the first occasion on which the series has been held outside the State of Victoria, where the sport had its origination. That the big events should be staged in another centre is a worthwhile development

and one which should win the approval of all shooters!

Of interest to intending competitors is the fact that advice has been received that the Governor-General, Sir William Slim, will most likely attend the series on a day to be arranged. Much will depend on the commitments and already arranged programme of the Governor-General, but suffice it is to know that there is every possibility of his being present during part of the series. This fact is welcome news indeed and provides illustration of another step in the recognition of the sport of clay pigeon shooting as a major pastime worthy of the approval of the direct representative in Australia of H.M. The Queen.

With the Olympic Games late in 1956 in Melbourne there is again a distinct possibility of The Duke of Edinburgh attending during part of the proceedings at Laverton (V.) where the Olympic clay pigeon shooting events will be held.

In the forthcoming March series proceedings will open at 10 a.m. on Friday March 9, 1956 with the shooting of the Australian National Single-barrel Championship. This contest, which has only been going a couple of years, will be shot at 50 clay targets from 16 yards single-barrel. The second day, Saturday March 10, will probably be the biggest day of the carnival. Shooting will start at 8.30 a.m. with the National Double-barrel Championship, shot at 50 clay targets from 16 yards, points scoring

3 and 2. The 30 top scorers in this contest will become the Australian International Team for 1956. The added incentive of gaining International honours will doubtless attract a big field. The club team's championship will also be shot in conjunction with the National Double-barrel Championship. The complement of teams' competing in this match are required to come from one club only.

On Monday March 12 (a holiday in Victoria) the 10th International Match will take place. The 30 highest scorers in the National Double-barrel title will take their place on the International mark of 16 yards and each man will shoot at 100 targets. Scores will be sealed and forwarded to London to be opened during the International series in Great Britain and compared with the efforts of those of the representatives of England, Ireland, New Zealand, Scotland and Wales. It is also possible that Canada and India may have been able to organise in time to be included. Much correspondence has already taken place with the International Committee in London in regard to inclusion of teams from Canada and India. Should these countries be able to field teams the match will become a truly Commonwealth International contest. In the International Match points scoring of 2 and 1 will be in operation and only the best ten scores will count.

Following the International Match the Eighth Grand Australian Handicap of £200 at 40 clay targets from handicap marks will be shot. Points scoring of 3 and 2 will operate in this match. The Commonwealth Teams' Match, comprising four men from any affiliated clubs in the Commonwealth, will be shot in conjunction with the Grand Australian Handicap.

The final day and one of the most important will see the deciding of the Champion of Champions Cup, shot at 50 clay targets from 20 yards, points scoring, 3 and 2. The A.C.P.T.S.A. Intermediate Championship is also listed for this day. If time permits two £100 Handicaps will complete the programme. Shooting on final day will start at 9.30 a.m. The Royal Aero Club has accommodation available for a limited number of competitors. Those intending to make use of this

service are advised to write direct to The Secretary, Royal Aero Club (Gun Society) of N.S.W., Box 5, Bankstown, N.S.W., with as little delay as possible.

In connection with the recent Official Referee Examination (written) candidates are advised that it will be the February issue of "News" before any announcement is made regarding those who have passed this section. This may appear somewhat delayed, but it should be remembered that each paper has to be dealt with individually and as there is no publication in January no announcement can be made until the first issue in 1956.

Reports have lately been received regarding shooters shooting at other than legitimate targets on the shooting ground. Offenders are reminded of the Association regulation which prohibits this action. Those committing such unsportsmanlike action are to be fined £1 for first offence and reported to the Association for succeeding offences.



Dear Bill,

Referring to your paragraph in October "News" on growth of the "News" and the sport in general in Australia, I feel that I should like to make some comment after my many years of happy association with you on the Executive.

As one of the Tasmanian executives for many years and delegate of the Hobart Gun Club, I should like to congratulate both yourself and Mr. Wilson on the great vision that has resulted in this post-war expansion and, whilst it is easy in retrospect to look back at that progress, there was much heartburning at the time of raising our registration to what I consider the meagre sum of 20/- per year, which includes the "News." If my memory serves me, to finance the original publications of "News" we approached an increase in sub. in great fear and trembling. I do recall that I was probably the most vocal advocate in supporting you to publish our "News" and, to look to the future, I would only make the comment that we must establish central executive offices, properly staffed, with possibly an association shooting ground to realise the final destiny of the sport. I hope that the incoming Executive, with the fillip of the Olympic Games, will make some positive move in this direction in the coming year.

It is also fitting that I should pay tribute to the passing faces of the Executive over the years for the sterling work practically all of them have performed unselfishly for the betterment in general of our sport. The argument has at times raged heatedly, with the President telling us to come to order, but eventually, from these deliberations, the right decision has issued forth.

I will certainly miss my friend Bill Rainbird's comments at meetings,

and call to mind the first Champion of Champions he persuaded me to go to before the war. We were all booked in at an hotel in Bourke St., where the shoot began in the saloon bar two minutes after we arrived, continuing until about 1 a.m. The big day was momentous, with Ted Egan of Launceston leading the field at one stage until we primed him too well. Things were a little grim on the early Sunday a.m. when Kay Falkiner's alarm went off and it was immediately thrown out of the window into the middle of Bourke Street. The ensuing uproar woke the entire hotel and half an hour later the proprietor gave in by presenting the keys of the bar to Bill Rainbird, who insisted on all of the lady guests in the hotel being royally entertained. We seem to have quietened down a little since then!

It is with deep feelings of regret that I leave my many friends in Tasmania, and the fun we have had over the years, and I shall leave a part of my heart with a grand Club in Hobart to whose members I should like to say thank you for the many times they have had to bear with me.



HINTS for the Trapshooter

By Geo. Biggs

1. When choosing a gun for trapshooting try to obtain the help of a friend who has a knowledge of the type of gun required. It must, above all things, be able to throw a good pattern, as a clay targets requires to be hit solidly. A very good method for the newcomer to adopt when seeking a gun to his liking is to borrow several of his friends' guns, and sooner or later he will come across the type that fits him best. It will then help him to choose the correct type for his own. I have often heard a shooter remark of another man's gun: "Gee, I could shoot with that gun." It was because he had chanced to pick on a gun that suited him best.

2. Always ask the advice of an expert shooter, particularly the top line men. They are, in the main, always glad to give all the help they can on any problem. It is also wise to watch them shooting, note their styles and methods of coping with the targets, that to you are difficult. Most important of all is to note their method of approach to each target, you will find that the gun is held in a different position for each bird.

3. A Hint — always call "Pull" in a loud voice so that the puller has no doubt as to your intentions. The result will be a fast release for each target. Keep both feet on the ground and stand upright with slightly more weight on the front foot. The left hand should be extended out on the forend, but not stiff. The right hand should grip the gun firmly, pulling it back into the shoulder, where the cheek will fit snugly down on the comb.

4. Special shooting glasses are, in my opinion, most helpful when shooting in brilliant sunlight. Not only do they kill the glare, eliminating eye strain, but they also prevent burnt powder and smoke blowing back into the eyes. Care must be taken to ensure that the glass used is not harmful to the individual person's eyes. A special shooting glass with large close eye fitting lenses has been perfected

by the Americans. They are in both green and amber but unfortunately are not available in Australia at present.

5. "Keep your eye on the target" should be the shooter's motto. Do not try to sight along the rib of the gun on to the bird. This practice slows down gun swing and will mostly mean a lost bird. Remember that the hand holding the forend will obey the message from the eyes, so always look intently where the shot is to go. Reflexes will do the rest.

6. Do not worry about the target that you have just missed — everybody misses one now and again. Let it be a lesson in concentration. Next time fix your mind on the target and a hit will be scored.

7. Accept the decision of your referee in a sporting manner. He has not a very pleasant job, do not make it harder by wingeing.

8. "Flinching" is the term applied to that temporary paralysis of certain nerves in the trigger finger. Much advice has been given on this subject and I doubt if any of it has been of much help. I think a short rest from shooting is the best remedy.

9. Observe the little courtesies to your fellow shooters. These courtesies apply in all sports, and clay target shooting is no exception. They help to make the sport more pleasant for everyone.

10. Punctuality on the shooting track when your squad is called to shoot. Be sure you have gun and shells ready so that all five men can go to their positions together. Do not leave the squad until the last man has shot, then check your score as you leave.

11. Never load your gun until you are on the firing mark and ready to call for the bird.

American interest in the 1956 Olympic Games in Melbourne is quickening, and comments from that country indicate that a good number of U.S.A. sportsmen will visit Australia during the period of the Games. In regard to shooting, Bob Allen, the well known sporting columnist, writing in a local publication, mentions, "In past columns, I have purposely neglected mentioning much about the Olympics because several things concerning our participation have not been settled. The Amateur Trapshooting Association, through the efforts of President Maynard Henry, had been in contact with the International Shooting Union of Stockholm and had been authorised to select a U.S. team. At the same time, the U.S. Pigeon Shooting Federation, which is affiliated with the F.I.T.A.S.C. in Paris, had also been authorised to select a team. It now seems that there is a disagreement between the I.S.U. and the F.I.T.A.S.C. as to which organisation should control Olympic trapshooting. Members of the U.S. Federation voted to give full support to the A.T.A. and their affiliation with the I.S.U. inasmuch as the A.T.A. has always been the governing body of trapshooting in the U.S.A. The only fly in the ointment is that the U.S. Olympic Committee has not yet approved trapshooters as contestants in

the Olympics because of the "professionalism" problem. Canada and the other countries of the world have been able to get around this problem in various ways, but our U.S. Committee has not budged on their stand as yet. Several alternative suggestions have been made on how we can send a team and get around this "professionalism" claim. It has been suggested that an all military team be picked and trained from a completely new crop of shooters. The idea of having the Services recall to duty top-flight shooters on a temporary basis has also been discussed. I'd prefer the latter plan because I know that only seasoned shooters can win for us in the Olympics — we could develop a wonderful team among our Services but unless they were seasoned in big time competition, they'd be dead in Australia next year. I hope some way will be developed whereby we can send civilians as it would save a lot of red tape and end up in a better team shooting for our colours. I've heard some talk of sending the high average trapshooters of the nation and this would be absolute suicide as the Olympic style of shooting is completely foreign to our trap style and high average wouldn't mean a thing as far as success in the Olympic style is concerned. It takes a different type of temperament to shoot Olympic style just as it takes different temperaments to shoot other forms of trapshooting." Mr. Allen's comments are of worthwhile interest and leave considerable avenue for thought on the Australian set-up.

During a recent visit to Southport (Q.) it was the writer's good fortune to attend the annual meeting of the South Coast Gun Club. President G. S. Martin presided. The balance sheet of the club revealed a very healthy financial state with quite an amount on the expenditure side which is of the non-recurring type, actually expenditure on ground improvement. The club adopted the unusual procedure of holding its annual meeting in the club's pavilion, which is some miles from both Southport and Surfers Paradise. President G. S. Martin was unanimously re-elected and Mrs. G. O. Martin was similarly re-appointed secretary of the club. Both have done yeoman service and

HIGH DUCK

(By "North Country" in Shooting Times).

I have seen high duck brought down by an expert and realised that in the circumstances the shooting of a single bird alone has been a credit.

In my opinion it needs an experienced shot to appreciate good shooting. To the true layman one bird probably is very like another. I am not trying to suggest that the non-shooting man is unobservant. But experience is needed to assess the numberless little points which make the difference between an easy bird and one that is not so easy. I do not say that the "old-hand" can always explain that difference in so many words. But he will know.

High circling duck, I always think, are among the most difficult winged targets. All the same, most of us enjoy so little practice at duck — comparatively speaking, anyway — that perhaps, had we steady practice, we should be far better shots at them. But duck shooting—not enough to make good shots. I speak in general terms of course. There are always the exceptions. High duck are so dif-

ferent from the birds which rise, almost at your feet, from some ditch or drain. Some of the old sporting prints make duck shooting appear absurdly easy.

But coming back to the subject of hurry, a relative of mine who might well have been a very useful shot spoilt himself by shooting too fast. He got into the habit of blazing away at everything and at all ranges. He never seemed to judge his bird. And as time went on he became worse, gave up shooting altogether and concentrated on fishing.

Some of the best shots have that unhurried action — they are quick in that no effort or time is ever wasted, but they never seem to hurry. Judging their birds they position themselves in advance and appear just to raise their guns and fire as birds come into range. There is an effortless grace about it all which is fascinating to watch. The novice, should he have the chance, can learn a lot about shooting merely by watching good shots in action.
