The Editor's Notebook

With the advent of the New Year, interest begins to quicken concerning events ahead, especially the National Championships and International series conducted by the Association on the grounds of the Royal Aero Club at Bankstown, N.S.W., over the dates March 9 to March 13. Full information on programme details was published in the December issue of "News".

In connection with the International Match there is a very strong possibility of a new Commonwealth country fielding a team this year for the first time. The country concerned, India, has been long negotiating with the International Committee in London seeking ways and means of joining with England, Scotland, Ireland, Wales, New Zealand and Australia in fighting out what is generally recognised as the Teams' Championship of the British Empire. It was the original intention of the donor of the Mackintosh International Trophy, the late Mr. Donald Mackintosh, that all Empire countries should eventually come into the competition. India's inclusion is another step in that direction. In a recent communication to the International Committee secretary in London, K. G. Prabhu, secretary of the National Association of India, mentioned that his organization had already placed orders for automatic traps and concluded by stating: "We will be able to participate and cable you the results by 22nd June, 1956."

Australia welcomes the inclusion of India in the field of International clay pigeon shooting and hopes are expressed that our Indian friends will do very well.

Canada is also still "nibbling" at the prospect of coming into the International, but present indications are that at least for this year no Canadian team will be taking part. It appears that Canada has always shot its National competitions early in July each year. This period is too late for inclusion in the International.



It is recalled that some years ago New Zealand was similarly placed, but New Zealand organizers decided to bring their National meeting forward to the autumn, as is done in Australia. The result for New Zealand has been most successful, as the New Zealand team has won the International series on the last two occasions, 1954 and 1955.

The Mackintosh International Cup is now in New Zealand, where it is installed in the Christchurch Gun Club's Pavilion—this club being the centre of clay target shooting in New Zealand. The New Zealand team will be shooting that Dominion's section of International at Christchurch in 1956, and the presence of the International Cup, carrying as it does shields showing the two New Zealand successes, will add great interest to the series.

Intending competitors at Bankstown for the National series who have not yet arranged their accommodation are advised to do so without delay. Application should be made to the Secretary, Royal Aero Club, Box 5, Bankstown, N.S.W.

Among a number of queries received since last publication is one which seeks information on whether "all shooting must be from 16 yards and beyond". The answer to this one is definitely in the affirmative. The Association has ruled that 16 yards is now the minimum mark and no competition whatever should be con-

ducted in front of that mark. As was pointed out in reply to this query, no mark in front of 16 yards is now valid.

It has been noticed in recent weeks that clubs claiming break badges on behalf of some shooters have lodged score sheets which do not carry sufficient information. It is pointed out that when a break is gained, the secretary of the club where the performance took place is required to claim a break badge to the Association and lodge the actual score sheets. The score sheets should be prepared in proper sequence of the break, showing the mark or marks from which the shooter's name and place on the sheets where the break was compiled. Quite a number have been returned to clubs in recent weeks and sheets will continue to be returned to clubs when insufficient detail is shown.

Although Association fees are coming to hand fairly well, clubs and shooters are reminded that all 1956 fees should be paid by January 31, in accordance with the rules. Fees are club affiliation (clubs only) £5 and shooters' registration 20/-.

In connection with the recently held written Referee Examinations it is regretted that the examiners have found it impossible to get through the full quota of answers sent in. This has been brought about largely by the holiday season. However, those interested are advised that full list and examiners' comments on each paper will be definitely published in next issue.



.. It could interest you

Each shooter must work out his easiest and most natural stance so that he has freedom of movement in any direction he may have to swing. It is impossible and was never intended that any two men should stand alike when facing the trap. He must, however, follow the accepted and proved practices and adapt them to his own style.

Proper gun fit is essential in all forms of trapshooting. Actually the stock is one of the most important parts of the shotgun. The shooter must tie his face, stock and shoulder together as one unit when he is pointing and firing; unless this is done he will never have consistent shooting. Drop at comb, and length of stock are two most important details to be observed. A Hint—fit a recoil pad, it pays dividends especially at the end of a long day's shooting.

The essentials of a good shooter are correct gun handling, fast swing, and accurate pointing. Do not at any time follow a target; if you do, you can count it as a lost bird. It is only when we disobey the first message from our eyes, and take a second look at the bird that we miss. Taking that second look slows down the gun swing.

The most suitable type of gun for trapshooting is the 12 gauge with barrel length of 30 in. or 32 in. This gives the shooter a long sighting plane which is necessary for accurate pointing on down the line shooting. A single alignment gun, either Automatic or Under and Over, is a decided advantage.

My advice to the many "shooters" who now find themselves on the 16-yd. mark is not to let it bother them. Remember that most of us use a gun with 30 in. barrels and bored full choke in each, which is the direct opposite to what we want on the front marks 12 and 14 yds., etc. If we think for a moment, we realize that a gun with 30 in. barrels bored full choke is a most efficient weapon at 40 yds., giving something like 70% pattern in a 30 in. circle. If we

shoot from the 16-yd, mark and break the target before it has gone approx. 20 yds. from the trap (which is what should be done), making a total distance of 36 yds., we see that not only do we have the ideal gun for this mark, but also a good mark for our full choke gun. Also, it is much easier to point the 30 in. barrel gun more accurately over this distance than from the shorter distance of 30 yds., as is the case from 12-14 yds., etc. As a comparison, compare the patterns of a full choke gun at 20, 30, and 40 yds. We find that at 20 yds., the pattern percentage is 100%, at 30 yds. 80%, and 40 yds. 70%, resulting in the 30 in. circle being only a little more than half to three-quarters covered at the closer range.

Best shell to use from 16 yds. mark is the 2½ in. x 1½ oz. It is a soft, easy shell — with little recoil, thus making gun control much easier. It is only from the back marks that the heavy 2¾ in. x 1½ oz. is necessary.

A good example is the wonderful job done by the special 2½ x 1½ oz. Special trap cartridge as prepared by I.C.I. for clay target shooting.

Endeavour to shoot fast, try to shoot the bird before it has gone 20 vards from the trap. By doing this you will shoot the target whilst it is still rising and before it has time to float or slide.

Always be sure to note the wind conditions before going out to shoot; an incoming wind will lift the birds higher, and wind from behind will force them down. A sharp eye and a sharp mind on the job is necessary. Note also the angles, making sure the club has the trap set to throw regulation birds.

Be sure to clean the oil from the gun barrel before firing the first shot, do not shoot it out. I have seen quite a few bulged barrels as a result of this practice.

A good many shooters suffer a bruised second finger; it is often an indication that the stock is too short, also the trigger guard being incorrect shape, both details should be corrected, as flinching will surely result.

Where a shooter is using a doublebarrel gun, his trigger pulls should be adjusted at 3½ lbs. for the first and 4 lbs. for the second.

Respect the shooter next to you on the shooting track. Do not talk to him or curse when you miss a bird. Remember he is also trying to concentrate on putting a string together. I am on the Committee of one of these, and am a Life Member of the N.S.W. Gun Club. I understand that all men handicapped at 16 yards or less are to be placed on the 16-yard mark: those beyond that mark are all to go back one yard.

I respectfully suggest that such an alteration will have a very bad effect on the sport. Every club wishes to attract new members. A new shooter will not become enthusiastic unless he has some success. Few men shoot clays well at first, but by breaking some off 12 yards they get a taste of the game, and after a few wins they work back to 17 yards or better. There are many handicapped at all distances from 12 to 16 yards; is it fair to bunch them all on 16 yards? Again, most young men starting have a field gun, improved cylinder and perhaps half-choke. To shoot off 16 yards he requires a better gun. That is a heavy expense for a young man who does not know if he will ever really like the sport.

If handicaps must be lengthened to shorten competitions, which I agree with, why penalise the inexperienced shooter 4 yards, and the good shot, who wins most of the trophies anyhow, only one? Surely the reverse would be more logical.

Victorian Duck Season Reduced

The Victorian Duck Season in 1956 has been reduced from three months to nine weeks. Reports have it that the Government is not happy about the future of duck shooting. The season will open on Saturday, February 25, and close at midnight on Saturday, April 28. Opening time will be 5 a.m. instead of 6 a.m. as formerly. The bag limit will be the same, 20 birds on opening day and 10 birds on other days. The bag must not include more than the following: Grey teal 10 birds, black duck 10, mountain duck 5, hard head 5, wood duck 5.

RECULARITY OF PATTERN

Regularity of pattern in a shotgun really corresponds to close grouping in a rifle. Both shotguns and rifles are designed and made to give regularity of pattern or close grouping under conditions in which they will actually be used. These conditions entail a certain amount of fouling in the barrels. Consequently it would be useless, even if it were possible, to try to regulate shotguns to give normal patterns from an oily barrel because the barrel would have to be cleaned out and re-oiled before every shot in order to reproduce similar conditions. An oily shotgun barrel

gives a greater percentage of abnormal patterns than one which is fouled by a previous shot, just as a shot fired from an oily rifle barrel is frequently not found in the middle of a group made when the barrel is slightly fouled. Generally speaking, oil in the barrel itself results in a more open and scattered pattern, but the exact reason for this is not known. Consequently, the shooter who has money on himself will always do best to fire a cartridge through the barrel before taking his stand.
