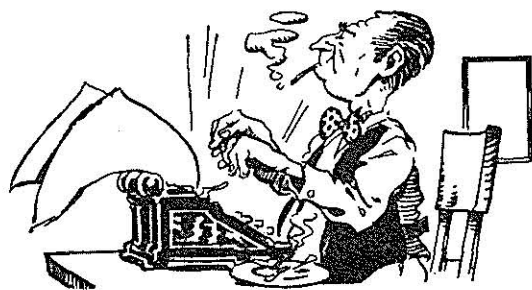

The Editor's Notebook



The annual Interstate Teams' Match will this year hold more than usual interest for all shooters because of its tie-up with the Olympic Elimination Shoot, which will decide who are to be the two representatives of Australia in forthcoming Olympic Games clay pigeon shooting contests. This year it has been decided to bring forward the dead-line date for the holding of the Interstate Match. In previous years the Interstate Match was required to be completed not later than the first week-end in October. In 1956 competitions in all States must be completed not later than the first week-end in September. This has been done in order to allow sufficient time for those eligible for the Olympic Games elimination shoot to arrange their affairs so that they may come to Melbourne if desired. The Interstate Teams' Match conditions have not been substantially altered. Teams will again comprise 10 men each, representative of the State in which they have lived for the previous 12 months. The ten men in the team are arrived at by process of elimination. That is to say, a shoot at 100 birds from 16 yards, using 2½-in. shells, loaded with 1½-oz. shot. The ten top scorers then become the State Team, which as a team shoots at a further 100 birds per man from 16 yards. Scores from all States are then forwarded to the Secretary, A.C.P.T.S.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, and must reach that destination not later than September 8. All members of each State Team are entitled to receive

a souvenir award from the club conducting the shoot. Following on this result the undermentioned are then entitled (if they so desire) to come to Melbourne and take part in a 200-bird elimination shoot to decide the two Australian representatives who will ultimately battle against overseas competitors for Olympic honours at Laverton R.A.A.F. shooting grounds (V.). Those entitled to appear in the Olympic Elimination shoot will be:—

- 10 high guns in New South Wales Team (the full team),
- 10 high guns in Victorian Team (the full team),
- 8 high guns in Queensland Team,
- 4 high guns in Tasmanian Team,
- 2 high guns in South Australian Team,
- 2 high guns in Western Australian Team.

The above-mentioned 36 men will be eligible to shoot in the Olympic Elimination Test on dates yet to be fixed, probably late in October or early in November.

After the selection of Australia's two representatives, it is expected that special arrangements will be made for the two concerned to undergo long practice shoots under Olympic conditions.

It will therefore be observed that this year's Interstate Teams' Match holds considerable interest for all shooters who may be contenders for Olympic honours.

The programme following the Olympic Games, to be conducted by the A.C.P.T.S.A., is also of great interest. On the week-end following the Games shooting, the Southern Hemisphere Championship and the World's Grand Handicap will be decided. If the Laverton area is not available for the purpose of shooting these two events, it is almost certain that one of the Melbourne metropolitan grounds will be used.

Thanks to the generous support of I.C.I.A.N.Z. Limited, the Association will be in a position to finance the actual Interstate Teams' Match again this year. It will be recalled that the Company worthily assisted last year. This year, with an elimination series double the size of 1955 and also the actual match as big again in 1956 as in former years, the Company has doubled its donation to assist in financing the Team Shoot. This will mean that members of the Interstate Team in all States will take part in the actual match at no cost to themselves. Once the State elimination shoot is decided and the ten men who have secured places are known, all shooting expense to the competitor ceases until the conclusion of the match.

From the foregoing outline of proposed proceedings, intending competitors and those who become eligible to take part in the Olympic elimination will gather that almost a week of unusually interesting shooting will be available.

The question of accommodation is one that should not be overlooked by intending visitors. As may be expected, accommodation will be at a premium over the period of the Olympics. Those in a position to secure bookings during the period of the Games should not hesitate to do so with the minimum of delay. It will be of little use waiting until near the commencement of the Games to reserve accommodation, because none will be available. In fact, there is little accommodation left now within area of greater Melbourne.

Colledge (secretary), 12 Adler Grove, Merlynston, N.14 (series to be held over week-end August 25-27); South Australia—Alexandra Gun Club, T. V. Roberts (secretary), Milang; Western Australia—Perth Gun Club, K. Gouldham (secretary), 102 Victoria Ave., Dalkeith (series July 7 and 8). Shooters in the various States desirous of obtaining any additional information on the Interstate Match should write direct to the club in their respective States.

Quite a number of clubs have not yet realised that the closing date for copy in this publication is the first of each month. For the present issue no fewer than six advertisements had to be turned down because of late arrival of copy. Circulation of "News" is now well over 6,000 and the printers cannot cope with the additional runs if advertising copy is late in arriving. Late arrival simply means that the copy cannot be accepted. Whilst this is regrettable, it is also not a really difficult matter for club officials to ensure that copy is received on time. As an example, copy for the next issue (July) closes on the first day of June. The issue is then published on 1st day of July. Advertising for the July issue should contain matter of interest from July 1 onwards.

In a number of instances recently club officials have been sending in reports on shoots which have been culled from newspapers. This type of report is not satisfactory and in future will not be accepted. The usual course in this procedure of report is to cut out from the local paper (or tear it out with the aid of a pin) and then post it to the Association. Most of this type of report contains much side-issue matter of local interest only, and its removal takes up much time. Furthermore, such reports are usually not

accompanied by recommendations on handicaps. Tearing a strip out of a newspaper is not a means of reporting a shoot.

Shooters who have failed to renew their registrations for 1956 will be struck off the mailing list of this publication and also off the official

registration list as from July 1, when the full list of registered shooters will be again published. Reminder notices have been, in recent weeks, forwarded to many of those who have failed to renew and this has brought in satisfactory responses. Fees are due on January 1 and should be paid not later than January 31.

Watching the Pieces

by BOB ALLEN (U.S.A.)

Where did I shoot on that target? If this question has popped into your mind a few times in the past few shoots you've attended, then there is something you have missed in your shooting training. One of the most important factors in improving your shooting is being able to diagnose your own errors. Too many shooters are prone to listen to the guy sitting on the clubhouse porch who, without devoting any serious thought to his remark, says, "You shot over that one, Bob." I believe that I can safely say that unless you are a complete rank beginner, you'd best not listen to anyone when remarks of this nature are being thrown around unless the speaker was standing directly behind you and was looking right down your gun barrel with you—then once in a while it will be possible for a "coach" behind you to call your shot correctly.

During the war, when I was a skeet and trap instructor at Kingman, Arizona A.A.F. gunnery school, I observed so many shooters each day and worked so closely with them, after a while I actually learned to see the shot charge go through the air. This may sound like fantasy, but if you stand directly behind a shooter and concentrate on looking for a "shadow" out the end of the barrel, you can clearly see the shot charge through part of its flight. This enabled me and many other instructors to call shots almost perfectly for our students. The Air Force tried using "tracer" loads for a while, but finally rejected them as unsuccessful. These loads had a special wad with some tracer compound in them that was ignited by the powder charge and burned for several seconds as the wad went through the air. The idea behind this theory was fine, but everyone knows the ballistics of a wad are very poor and, of course, the wad ends up in an entirely different spot than the shot charge after it has gone thirty feet or more.

Ralph Jenkins of Orleans, Indiana, ex-A.T.A. president and one of our

most experienced shooters, tipped me off on a sure-fire way of telling where you are shooting on clay targets. Ralph's rule is simply "watch the big piece." Ninety times out of a hundred, the biggest piece from a broken target will sail off in opposite direction from the side of the target that your shot charge hit the hardest. Thus, making a rule of thumb to go by, you can safely assume that if the biggest piece from a right angle drops off behind the target, you are shooting ahead. If the biggest piece falls off in front and proceeds on ahead of the rest of the pieces, you can assume you were shooting behind.

Next time you go shooting, think about this simple rule and watch not only your own targets, but also those of your fellow squad members—you'll find that this rule of thumb works every time and you can use it to gauge your own shooting. This is a tip that every shooter can use, as the only other way you can learn to diagnose your own shooting is after many years of practice. I had just about mastered learning where I was shooting when Ralph gave me this secret, but if someone could have told me this simple rule years ago, it would have saved me endless confusion. If it will help you win a shoot, cut me in on your winnings for about 10 per cent., will you?

If you don't know where you shot on any particular target, then you are really in trouble. The rule cited above works fine if you were able to knock a piece or a few pieces off, but what do you do if you don't even nick the bird? When this happens to me, I usually know what I did wrong because it is pretty evident to me when I short-shoot or over-shoot a bird. If it wasn't a case of under-leading, short, or over-shooting I then apply another rule of thumb that usually works pretty well.

I first assume that possibly I might have eased up off my gun stock—this is the cause of ninety per cent.

of the misses made by experienced shooters. Then, because I have learned that concentration is the key to good shooting, I also assume that possibly the bird has surprised me and caused me to jump at it instead of swinging smoothly. These are the two causes for most of my lost birds — believe you'll find that if you diagnose your own ails, you'll find two or three basic reasons for most of your own misses, and once you learn these, you can be on guard to prevent further mistakes.

Sometimes you cannot control the factor that causes you to miss. For instance, once in a shoot-off for the Iowa State Championship, I lost the first bird out in the fifth twenty-five to end a run of 300 straight because just as I called "pull", I saw something move to the left of the trap-house and bobbled my gun in that direction a fraction of a second before the target came out as a straight-away. The trap boy had thrown a box top out of the house just at that precise moment — a "tough break" that will throw any

shooter off. When you miss a target in this fashion, you shouldn't let it bother you, for you have actually not made a mistake in shooting form. This is not a case of poor concentration, for had I not been concentrating, I might not even have seen the box top move and therefore wouldn't have missed the easy straight-away shot that finally was thrown to me.

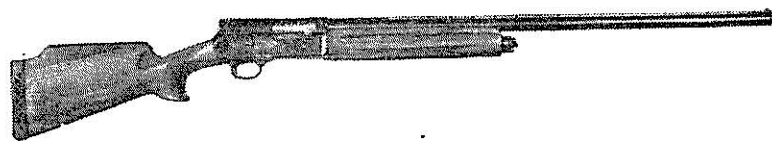
