

The Editor's Notebook



INTERSTATE MATCH. With the opening quarter of 1957 well under way, the time has arrived for thinking again about the annual Interstate Match for "The Great Britain & Ireland" Trophy, the handsome perpetual award presented by the National Clay Pigeon Shooting Associations of England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales. It will be re-called that in 1956 Victoria gained its first success in this contest - its initial success in the five years the competition has been running.

In one State in 1956 there was some misunderstanding in regard to residential qualification of team members. This has now been ironed out and the Executive Committee of the A.C.P.T.S.A. has decided that "team members must have resided in the State for which they will shoot for at least the preceding three months." Previously this qualification was 12 months and many considered it too severe. The three months' residential qualification should be well received by all interested.

It is of prime importance to record that I.C.I.A.N.Z. Limited has again agreed to sponsor this event with a splendid donation of £150. This amount has already been received by the A.C.P.T.S.A. and it will be disbursed among the clubs conducting the event in the various States. This opportunity is taken of again expressing sincere thanks to I.C.I.A.N.Z. Limited for its generous support and long sustained interest in the sport of clay pigeon shooting. Clubs approved by the A.C.P.T.S.A.

Executive Committee for the conduct of the Interstate Teams' Match in

1957 are:-

Queensland - Dalby Gun Club. South Australia-South Australian Gun Club (Adelaide).

Western Australia - Perth Gun Club.

Tasmania - Cressy Gun Club. New South Wales - Royal Aero Club of N.S.W. (Bankstown). Victoria - Australian Gun Club (East Burwood).

Teams will comprise 10 men a side and all scores will count - there will be none counted out. Match conditions are 50 targets per man from 16 yards, double - barrel, both barrels equal value, squad system of shooting (five tracks), using only 11 oz. load

Clubs concerned with the conduct of the series should soon take steps to first have date of the competition approved by the Association and then arrange for proper publicity, including an advertisement in "News".
Results of the competition must

reach Secretary A.C.P.T.S.A. not later than first week-end in October.

REFEREE EXAMINATION. All interested are notified that the Official Referee Examination (written section), the series which has been advertised to close on March 26, has now been extended to a closing date for registration of candidates' names, to April 10. Only a limited number of registered shooters have taken advantage of this examination series and the extension in closing date has been arranged in order to allow "waverers" to lodge their names and addresses with Secretary, A.C.P.T.S.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.1. Remember, final closing date for the 1957 Referee Examination series is April 10.

ASSOCIATION FEES. Outstanding Association dues should be remitted without delay direct to the Secretary, A.C.P.T.S.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.1, with the minimum of delay. Club affiliation (clubs only) is £5 and shooters' individual registration is 20/- each. With the present high cost of printing, the Association cannot retain unfinancial clubs and unregistered shooters on its mailing list for this publication. Unfinancial shooters are advised that, commencing from beginning of this month, all those who are unregistered on the records of the Association will have their names removed from the official list of registered shooters and also their monthly copy of "News" will cease. Club officials are reminded that unregistered shooters are not permitted to compete against registered men. Officials should request production of 1957 Registration Cards until they are certain of the financial standing with the Association of all taking part in their respective shoots.

Rule 33 (a) of the Association Constitution states, "no person may enter or compete at any Association competition or event conducted by a club unless such person is registered with the Association and is not in arrear with his subscription." The Rule means "all shooters" and not those who may merely choose to register.

ACCOMMODATION BOOKINGS. Advice has been received from the South Coast Gun Club (Q.) that accommodational bookings by intending competitors in the National and International series in June next at Southport (Q.) should be made through Mr. Dolby of Rankine & Dolby, Estate Agents, Surfers Paradise (Q.), and not through the South Coast club secretary. It is undergoed to the secretary of the secretary of the secretary of the secretary. stood that the above-mentioned firm have all details in hand and will be ready to arrange any accommodation required at shortest notice. Intending

visitors should particularly note the foregoing.

INTERNATIONAL MATCH. According to reports from abroad, and particularly those from the International Committee in London, it appears unlikely that India will be represented with a team in the International Match for some time to come. It seems that India has, as yet, no automatic traps available for use in that country, and absence of this type of machine automatically debars an entry in the International. We hope to welcome India when establishment of the sport becomes more advanced in that country.

A report from the Clay Pigeon Shooting Association of Southern Africa indicates almost certain appearance in this year's International of a team representative of the Dominion of South Africa. Secretary of the Southern Africa Association at Pretoria, in a letter to London. advised that only poor quality clays were available and that exceptional scores could not be expected.

The ever important matter of handicapping has brought forth its quota of queries during the past month. One club, writing to the Association, asked, "Shooters performing well enough to warrant an extra yard away from their own club ground. The club does nothing about it should the shooter's home club amend the handicap? We have always held the view that (without interfering unnecessarily with another club) we should watch the handicaps of shooters generally (and particularly our own club members), irrespective of where they perform." The club con-cerned in the above has the right angle to handicapping. Where shooters attend outside fixtures and perform well, if the club visited does not act, then the shooters' home club should take the matter up. Otherwise indifferent handicapping results, to the detriment of all, including the local club. Attention is particularly important when a club is operating on Association handicaps. Failure to cover all aspects of a shooter's performance can lead to gross irregularity in handicapping.

GUN GOSSIP

By NORTH COUNTRY

Gun headache can be a very troublesome and distressing ailment. And, like most maladies, it has degrees of severity. There have been cases where a man has had to give up shooting for a while and thereafter confine himself to very light loads - where I suppose the whole nervous system has been badly affected. I myself have been lucky in that I only on one occasion suffered from this kind of headache. It was the day I first shot with a 12-bore (after a 28-bore). That night I had a bad headache. But it passed and it never came back.

The idea of using a magnum with the ordinary cartridge is a good one, if you do not mind the weight. For this means that the recoil is largely smothered before it upsets the shooter. When using 21-in. cases from 3-in. 12 I have noticed how smooth and pleasant is the shooting. If you happen to be waiting for a duck and so more or less static, a bit of extra gun weight does not matter. It is when you are walking up game, especially in hot weather and keeping on all day that you find the advan-tages of a light gun. Unless, of course, you are temporarily unfit and unable to handle substantial weight. I have known a convalescent to find a light 12 too much.

There is a lot in the contention that a 12-bore is often too good for the average shooter. But I think perhaps I would say that it is too good for the indifferent shot. Forty yards is a long way in shooting. How many of us really know how far it is? Since, of course, most game is killed under rather than over 40 yards in the ordinary way of shooting, if a gun commands this range, it should be good enough for anyone—irrespective of shooting skill.

There is no question but that a fully loaded and heavily choked 12bore is a very powerful weapon — so long as it is properly bored and provided with good cartridges. At times I have found myself killing at distances which have surprised me and about which it is probably better not to speak. It is easy to get exaggerated ideas and it is for wise. ated ideas and it is far wiser to confine oneself to what one surely knows. I do not suppose the eternal question of ranging power will ever really be

If you do not kill at certain killing range, you at least know how you stand. But if you fail to bring off that rather long shot, you are never quite sure whether it is due to your own fault, or to the fact that the range is a bit too much. It is an unsatisfactory situation to be in.

LAMENT

by A SHOOTING WIDOW

(in "Shooting Times")

With one accord they raised their mugs of foaming ale: "To the Season," was the general cry. One and all cheered and downed their drink in a long, unanimous gulp. All except me. I groaned aloud.

I have been groaning for the past two seasons, but then I am a woman and the shoot is, for me, forbidden territory.

Not for many moons now can I sit back, relax, put my feet up, and sigh; the summer lies behind me . . . a long avenue of week-ends when he tried to give me his undivided attention, when I was no longer one with the birds and the beasts of the field. Now the season is well under way.

I am now accused of giving away shooting secrets (which are to the sportsman what state secrets are to the politician) to everyone who calls
. . . the butcher, the baker, the
candlestick maker. No one believes that I am innocent, that the secrets, if any, were spilt with the beer in the local.

When it first began - with those early autumnal frosts that I have come to dread - I considered it quite differently. A nice interesting hobby, something for him to do while I was otherwise engaged. I should have realised then that the loving caress, and the flattering comment were only meant to curry favour. And for what? The cutting of endless sandwiches! The Saturday afternoon excursion in the popular of the left. excursion—just popping out for half an hour—became the Saturday dawn-to-dusk expedition, lasting sometimes from Friday till Monday morning. Sometimes I didn't see him at all for a week. The weather didn't help then. and it doesn't help now. I can never rely on it, for whatever it is, it is right.

With every new, harrowing tale that comes my way of the average dangers confronting the average wildfowler, my hair stands on end. From

dusk till dark I hang on the end of the telephone, waiting, watching, fearing the worst. It has not come, of course, but how do I know that it never will? The thick, black, gurgling mud; the bulls, snorting and pawing at the ground, frenzied and excited, with rolling eyes and fiery breath; the icy roads and narrow, muddy tracks where lurk a thousand dangers; the blizzards and the storms; the fog and those stray pellets—hadn't I—haven't I—every right to be a living bundle of nerves?

My life now stretches before me, for I am very young (the typical week-end shooting widow), while he escapes unto the marshes and the hills with his friends (no females allowed), returning home tired, dirty, and ravenous, actually daring to con-template sleep on a Saturday evening, while I, rested and by now relaxed, am itching to dance.

Fate Took a Hand.

So fate took a hand. He suggested that I went along, just to try it out for myself. Willing to accept any challenge, I obliged.

We climbed mountains, our guns under our arms, we strode o'er hill and dale, through bush and briar and field and ditch to the woods. Only I was wearing a white duffle coat which in those days really was white and thus the cause of some concern.

Nothing stirred save an occasional crow, and perhaps once or twice a pigeon - only much too high and out of range. And when we did chance upon a bird and it rose in high dudgeon to the skies, it was always my fault — the white coat. He grumbled. I sulked. We did not see so much as a hare — just three horses which galloped after us and scared me nearly stiff.

What with an icy wind, gumboots that leaked, frost-bitten toes, cotton jeans, and the heavy gun, after a very few miles I, personally, was

fell down a fox hole and had to be worn out and anxious to hurry home to hot tea and muffins. Eventually I hauled out by the belt round my trousers. This was all dreadfully undignified and humiliated me beyond words, so that I decided it was quite enough for one day and it would take me a long, long time to recover from the cold, the leaking boots, and the realisation that shooting is definitely a man's sport.

Next time, however (whatever else a woman lacks, she certainly has plenty of persistence), we were more ambitious. We headed for the marshes where fly the wild duck, the wigeon. the curlew, and all those other fascinating creatures. This time I had to sacrifice glamour. He was taking no chances, but immersed me in two pairs of water-proofed wadingtrousers which trailed happily along behind me and out like balloons, a voluminous Norwegian ski-ing jacket which reached down to my knees, someone else's gigantic gumboots, into which went three pairs of equally gigantic socks to keep them on, and a balaclava helmet. I looked like a "thing" from another world.

Enthusiasm Won the Day.

We waded five miles or so through the mud. Horrid, deep, black, slushy mud which clutched at my every step; it seemed like twenty miles. Despite the cold wind, I was soon near boiling and bursting point and the helmet tickled. He wouldn't let me take it off.

What with one thing and another and being pushed quite suddenly and unexpectedly into a ditch because of "duck", I used up an awful lot of energy, but the two duck we shot were so beautiful and promised such a tasty meal that enthusiasm won the day, and I managed to pretend my aching ankles and blistered feet weren't mine at all, but someone else's. Besides, I carried the kill.

We stayed for the evening flight and sat down on the mud-flats while the birds flew in all round ushundreds of them, their wings whistling - and it was most exciting. I hardly noticed my frozen end. I couldn't stay awake at all after that.

and it was he who, that evening, had to drag me out to dance, filled himself with energy and high spirits, assuring me I hadn't walked any distance at all and just wait until I had.

I don't think I shall ever be a very. good shot. I lose heart half-way; whereas I am anxious to try, at seeing those birds flying so happily along up there, I feel compassionate. But let someone else bring them home and I'm perfectly willing to pluck, gut, and prepare them for the eating, all the time admiring their great

Shooting is a wonderful sport - I cannot deny that - but I must confess that I am pleased when it is over, because he devotes his time to me. That is, he did. Imagine my horror, therefore, when towards the end of last summer he mentioned an inclination towards fishing. Up at dawn, gone till dusk, leaving me safely behind once more. If it isn't fishing, then it's cars, and if it isn't cars, then he always manages to find something.

Yet could I spoil his pleasure? Hardly. But what with the chairs and tables littered with shooting magazines, the walls strewn with cartridge belts and guns, the kitchen adorned with carcasses, the house a-flutter with feathers, I feel I have the right to moan.

But his face when he arises to shine in the early hours; his delight in the wild life; his joy and pride when he returns at night with birds in the bag and the odd feather in his cap, all make up for everything.

Yet who would be a shooting widow?

And what would mon do not be a shooting widow?

widow? And what would men do without their sport? I dare not answer.


