



The Editor's Notebook



Attention is again drawn to the number of letters which are wrongly addressed when forwarded to the Association. In one or two cases replies have been delayed on account of wrong or insufficient address and those concerned are recommended to ensure that proper address always appears on mail matter addressed to the Association. In the past couple of months letters have been addressed to the Association in Adelaide, Brisbane, and on several occasions to Sydney. Fortunately the Association is apparently well known to the Postal authorities and letters ultimately turn up. Another source of frequent error is the marking of the envelopes with the wrong box number. Recently a Melbourne club, posting a cheque for an account (account was enclosed which showed the correct box number) to an entirely different box number. The result was the letter went to a business house, who inadvertently opened the envelope and, upon seeing the account, re-addressed the letter correctly. It does not require much concentration to ensure that Association mail matter carries the right address, and all concerned should fix in the mind's eye, Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.1, as the Association's right address.

During the past month quite a number of potential advertisers in this publication apparently have held the erroneous conception that copy matter can be accepted at any time during the month and that notwithstanding the date of lodgment, the copy will be accepted and printed. This idea of the running of a publication is not in accordance with actual fact or experience. Copy must be lodged not later than first day of each month - this copy will then be printed during the month and will appear on the first day (or possibly a day or two earlier) the following month. With the Association's limited staff and printer's requirements, the dates mentioned are the only logical periods. All copy has first to be scrutinised and checked by the Editor, then the copy has to be collated and forwarded to the printer, who in turn again goes through it, marking and . tabbing as required. Then the copy matter goes to the linotypers, who set it up and, after about 10 to 14 days, return it to the printer. The printer then has to go through it again and later return the lot to the Editor for final proofing. The printer then takes over and arranges the pages, at the same time checking to ensure no unsuitable matter has been included. The printer then gets

in touch with the firm who prepare the wrappers, checks his numbers and quantities and then sets about printing the issue. All this takes approximately 21 days. Following this procedure the printer has, after printing, to cut, staple and trim the issue and prepare to wrap and post. This takes up another five or six days. The finished issue is usually ready for posting about 25 days after copy had been lodged and checked.

Therefore, it will be seen how difficult the position becomes when late copy is received with a request that it be printed if at all possible. Both the Editor and the printer like to oblige at all times, but this is not always possible when late matter comes to hand. For instance, in the current issue advertising (from clubs) was received 12, 14 and 16 days after closing date. To endeavour to include such copy throws the whole system of production out of line and can, on occasions, make the issue late in the hands of readers. Clubs and advertisers generally are requested to remember that copy closes on first day of each month and unless the printer agrees, copy cannot be accepted any later than that period.

Several queries have been raised during the past month on the point as to whether a club can or may rehandicap a shooter in the middle of a programme. Any club (President. secretary or handicapper) may adjust a shooter's handicap on the spot and at any time if it is considered that the shooter concerned is under or over - handicapped. However, when making any such adjustment club managements should remember that any change must be notified to the Association within three days and the reason for the change outlined. In fact, any amendment to any shooter's

handicap is required to be notified to the Association within three days.

A northern club recently wrote the Association asking if "an official referee" was essential to officiate during the shooting of a District Championship. It is pointed out that whilst it is always preferable to have official referees operating, it is not absolutely essential, particularly when a club is situated in an isolated area. Frequently clubs have quite good and efficient referees available who have not taken the Referee Examination. Referees in this calibre, providing they have a complete knowledge of the rules and also know how to administer the rules, are quite satisfactory to take charge of a shoot. Such individuals should be encouraged to undertake the referee examination at the first opportunity.



It should be quite a pleasant experience shooting under night lights in the crispness of the mountain air, during the summer months especially.

The much discussed question of whether it is advisable to open both eyes or use one eye only when shooting, it is noticed, has been mentioned in an English publication. One correspondent states, "When I, myself, started to shoot, I was told at the London Shooting School to close one eye, as there seemed to be some doubt as to which was the master. Again, quite recently, at the Badminton School, my instructor told me that it was of no importance whether I closed one eye or not, and that has since proved to be the case; I shoot equally well, or equally bad, using both methods. The point is obvious, surely two men who have been teaching people how to shoot for well over a quarter of a century must know their jobs pretty thoroughly, and neither of them had any objection to the closing of one eye, so surely the practice cannot be as fatal as some imagine. I believe it is a matter purely for the individual; what suits one man may very well prove disastrous for another." So much for using both eves.

A recent report from the Upper Murray region around Renmark in South Australia reveals that hundreds of wild duck have been observed in unprecedented mobs wrecking vegetable gardens in the area. One report states that they cleaned up 10 acres of peas in one excursion, whilst in

One of my cookery books says that wild duck "can only be roasted". Nonetheless, for a special occasion, coupled with a not-so-tender bird, wild duck a la Bigarade is a good recipe.

Wild Duck a la Bigarade. Prepare the bird and truss as for roasting, but instead of this braise it in a casserole until really tender. When cooked, take it out, cut into joints and put each on a slice of fried bread. Then pour over each some bigarade sauce, decorate with small pieces of orange and glace cherries heated over hot water.

The sauce is made with 1 pint of brown stock, 1 oz. of margarine, 1 oz. of flour, a small onion, a little carrot and turnip for flavouring, 1 dessertspoon of mushroom ketchup, salt, and spices. Melt the margarine and brown it, fry the sliced onion until it is brown, add the flour, stirring well. Then put on a low heat and pour in the stock. Bring to the boil, and boil for a few minutes, then add the other ingredients and simmer for half an hour. Cut the outside. coloured peel off an orange and shred very finely. Put this into cold water and bring to the boil. Strain the sauce, add the orange peel, simmer for another 15 minutes, and finally add the juice of the orange.

Orange Sauce. Many people prefer orange sauce to orange salad with their wild duck. Here is a simpler recipe. Beat together 1 gill of salad oil with one large tablespoon of made mustard until the consistency is like thick cream. Then add, gradually, half a gill-of vinegar, 2 oz. of brown sugar and the juice and grated rind of an orange.

27,000 Wild Pigs Killed in Year

Wild pigs are so prevalent that in the past 12 months Balonne and Waggamba Shire Councils (Qld.) have paid out bonuses on more than 27,000 wild pigs killed in the two shires.

This kill represented an average of approximately 520 per week, or more than 70 per day!

A bonus of 2/- is paid on the production of the snout and tail of each pig destroyed.

In spite of this heavy toll, wild pigs show no signs of dying out. On the contrary, they have increased to such an extent that Balonne Shire Council is considering the introduction of a campaign, under which all landholders will be required to rid their properties of the pest.

The wild pigs have caused enormous damage on grazing and pastoral properties, by rooting up crops and killing young lambs and calves.

A grazier of the Meandarra district reported that in 10 months wild pigs had killed about 100 lambs and several fully-grown sheep on his property. During that period nearly 200 pigs were destroyed on the holding.

The pigs usually congregate in herds, with an old boar as herd leader. One old herd leader recently destroyed in the Goondiwindi district measured just on 6 ft. in length, stood about 3 ft. high at the shoulder, and had a six-inch-long snout, armed with a pair of razor-edged tusks, and turned the scales at 600 lb.
