





The Editor's Notebook



The I.C.I. Air-Fare Award, recently announced by I.C.I.A.N.Z. Limited, to the winner of the special I.C.I. Air-Fare Handicap of 50 birds double-barrel from Association handicaps, whereby the winner of the Handicap mentioned receives a free return air-fare from the capital city of each State to Melbourne for the National and International shooting competitions, has been warmly received in all States. The event in every State created much enthusiasm and further stimulated worthwhile interest in the outcome of the big series. The Company (I.C.I. Ltd.) have advised that its intention is to make the award an annual one. On behalf of the Association and shooters generally, sincere thanks and appreciation are extended to the donors.

Due to shortage of time, Queensland was unable to advertise details of the I.C.I. award, but the South Coast Gun Club went to the trouble of circularising all Queensland clubs so that all would be familiar with the details.

A number of queries have been raised in recent weeks by clubs and shooters. One Victorian club writes, "I would like to ask if in any event the trapper was accidentally shot, who is to get the blame? Should the trapper be insured by the club?" In this case it is certainly the club's responsibility to ensure that its employees are protected under the Workers' Compensation Act. The Act

is Australia wide and clubs who may have overlooked this matter should not hesitate to arrange details forthwith. Some insurance offices may not understand the duties of club officials and would not be prepared to accept the risk. If any club experiences this difficulty, the Association would be pleased to assist and advise the name of a responsible insurance office who would undertake this type of risk. Clubs should remember that insurance under the Workers' Compensation Act is compulsory and failure to obey the clauses outlined in the Act could bring a penalty by the Court.

A club in another State recently asked for rulings on one or two points. The club asks, "A shooter has a whole bird thrown — (a) the shooter considers it a slow pull — or (b) the bird is a wobbler. Under the new rule he must accept the bird. He does so and breaks the bird. After it has been broken, the referee calls no bird or he calls no bird simultaneously with the breaking of the bird. Can the shooter claim the bird as a kill under these circumstances?" The whole of the question raised by this club revolves around the matter of efficient refereeing. If the bird was a "wobbler" it was a no bird and the referee should declare this so immediately. If the shooter beats the call, little can be done about it, other than the club management should ensure that efficient referees operate. No shooter can referee his

own target — this is one of the primary reasons why the present rule was introduced.

During the past month or so it has been brought to the notice of the Association that one or two clubs have been staging major events on public holidays without first obtaining Association approval. It is pointed out that the Association is "in control of all holidays" and clubs wishing to conduct events on these days should first obtain the formal approval of the Association before holding them.

In previous years there have been occasions when visiting shooters to the National Championships at East Burwood (V.) have found it difficult to secure suitable breakfast before leaving their respective hotels to undertake the journey to the shooting grounds. Arrangements have now been made with the caterer to supply breakfast to any shooter requiring this service. It would be of some assistance, however, if any intending to partake of this service would inform the caterer the day prior, if that is possible. At all events, the service will be available and it should prove a boon to those having to leave early in the morning without suitable breakfast.

The National Championships fixture at East Burwood (V.) will this year be graced by the attendance of two outstanding New Zealand shooters in Messrs. Allan Brown and J. McKenzie. Both have booked accommodation and arranged their transport details. Brown was runner-up in the New Zealand Double-rise Championship in 1955 and also represented his country in the International in 1956. McKenzie has won three New Zealand National titles and has been a member of the N.Z. International Team on two occasions. Australians will welcome the appearance of our New Zealand kinsmen in the National series and we extend a warm welcome to them.

It is pleasing to announce that arrangements have been made for the re-introduction of the feature "Ten Years Ago". "Ten Years Ago" was a very popular section of this

publication up to a few years ago. Due to the war intervening, it was found necessary to drop it for a period. Now with the post-war era ten years behind, we can again bring the feature back. Those interested will observe that the new feature will be titled "Out of the Past" and will include happenings in the clay pigeon shooting world both "10 years ago" and also "20 years ago". To those who took part in the sport in the long ago the "20 years ago" section will doubtless bring back some feeling of nostalgia. Nevertheless the section should prove of more than general interest.

OUT OF THE PAST

Twenty Years Ago

A mountain eagle shot in the Bairnsdale district of Victoria late in 1937 required seven direct shots from a .22 rifle to grass it. When measured, the eagle went 7 ft. 2 in. across the wings.

Ormond (V.) trapshot "Calrossie" (Jack W. Sutherland) gave followers of the sport a glimpse of his versatility in March, 1938, when he won the Commonwealth Walk-up Championship at clay pigeons on the King's Meadows grounds of the Tasmanian Gun Club at Launceston. The match was the first Commonwealth event ever held in Tasmania. "Calrossie" missed his 3rd, 15th, 18th and final birds. Two local shooters in Alf Poxon (Launceston) and Ernie Chugg (Relbia) filled the places. Holder of the title was the late Claude Abell, which he won on the old Nobel grounds at West Footscray. Among the competitors was a New Zealander, H. Gee.

G. C. Rutledge (now a Brisbane resident) was under notice at the Nobel grounds when he won one of the first "clay sparrow" events ever held, as well as being a successful partner in a Deauville Doubles event, and winning outright a 10 birder.

W. R. (Bill) Bloomfield was also prominent with a good win in the Blackburn Club's Single-barrel Championship. Shooting in a gale, Bloomfield dropped only one target in 15 under single-barrel conditions. Bloomfield was twice holder of the Commonwealth single-barrel title.

The special Sydney 150th Anniversary Shoot was advertised for the first time. £250 in prize money is noted as "being the largest amount ever offered for clay pigeon shooting in the Southern Hemisphere". This series was shot on the grounds of what was termed the "Pagewood Studios" in Sydney.

Ten Years Ago

At the Coburg Club's grounds at North Coburg, "Bendigo" (Harry Ceresa) won the Victorian Skeet title for 1948, with a score of 25/31. A preliminary three rounder at skeet was won by Roy Johns. The final event, a five birder, was won by Billy Scott with a score of 13/13.

The Club Deauville Doubles Championship at the Camberwell Club's fixture at North Balwyn went outright to John Bryant Junr., and Les Schilling, who downed the only full score of 15/15 pairs straight.

Runners-up were Frank Brown and Roy Longmore, 16/18, with Aub. Johnson and Ron James third, 15/18.

A 12/14 yarders trophy in the same contest was taken out by Frank Hockey and Vic Fraser, 14/17. Frank Hockey is the well-known Association patron and donor. Aub. Johnson was apparently shooting in top form, for he divided a miss-out match with Harry Roberts and Garson, then "off-the-fence" Johnson is again shown as one of the two receiving cuts, the other one being John Bryant Junr.

(NORTH COUNTRY
in "Shooting Times")

The speed of a bird in flight naturally is an important factor in shooting. What I find is that a bird may be too fast or too slow. Both speeds can be the cause of a couple of empty barrels and nothing to show for them. At a recent shoot birds which were "all out" seemed to defeat shooters generally—which, I suppose, is what must be expected. But I saw other birds flushed near the guns and fired at, and apparently clean missed—birds which never had a chance to reach any respectable flying spread. It seems to me that most of us do best with birds at a fairly moderate rate.

A powerful whirr of wings can be too much for some nerves. In other cases such noise is accepted as a challenge—bringing out the best in return and marshalling all you have. Much depends on your nervous make-up—as it always does. But I prefer to miss honourably than to "muff" the one which rises (it might be said) at one's feet. You feel less of a fool in front of your colleagues. And who does not like to keep up something of a reputation?

The best shot I have seen of late has been a friend who some few years ago discarded his 12-bore and took to a 16-bore. This man has always been a good game shot and I am not attempting to make out that his good shooting is due to his change from a 12 to a 16. What I do think, however, is that if a man at middle-age feels he would like to make a change, a 16 should have first refusal. A popular bore in many places abroad, I have known many a satisfied user and seen first-class shooting with it. Usually a shade over 6 lb., it handles and balances perfectly and is a "gem" of a gun.

My friend's gun (one of a pair) carries rather more choke and kills "so very dead" at a full 40 yards. After all, 15/16 oz. of No. 6 shot gives you 253 pellets to play with, and 60 per cent. of this in the 30-inch circle at 40 yards, allows a sufficiency of pellets, and to spare, to kill any

game bird at that distance. I am a great believer in No. 6 as an all-round pellet size and unless halves come into it in a big way, I see no reason to make a change. Where shooting is confined to smaller birds, No. 7 may well be adopted as the regular size. Some who specialise even use No. 8. The fact that many of us kill with No. 6 is no criterion. It is just because it happens that way.

Exceptions to the Rule.

All sorts of game, etc., are killed with odd sizes—in practice. For instance, hares with No. 8 and snipe with No. 5. At fair ranges, too, I have killed snipe a long way out with No. 5—I dare say with a single pellet, though I have never troubled to check on this. Again, this is no criterion. If such sizes were regularly used and in a big way, their disadvantages would sooner or later become apparent. Many a pattern thrown by No. 5 must be thin enough, in places, to allow a snipe to escape, for instance. For steady shooting, where you wish to make sure of your bird time after time over a long series, there is nothing to equal a well-filled pattern. Do not be put off by what others may say about smothering your birds. After all, your job is to kill them and make a bag. You will still miss often enough! Do not we all?

If it is accepted that a goodly charge of pellets is vital to shooting, the necessity still remains for a well-bored barrel to make the best of them. Cartridges and loads are not enough and yet they may be unjustly blamed. Guns vary, and some barrels do not throw good patterns. Among my guns some give better patterns than others—other things being equal. So altogether, a number of factors enter into our shooting. And when we view the culmination of all this in good, clean kills, we may well be satisfied. A lot of work goes into successful shooting.





GUN GOSSIP (cont.)

There is a considerable difference in the health, strength and general vitality of individuals. But this fact may not become sufficiently evident until later in life, when the sixties are reached. For that is a time, it seems, when bodily weaknesses and imperfections are made manifest, and the man who is not so fit (and perhaps never has been) will be unable to measure up to the stronger man or to make fair competition with him.

This has long been recognised in shooting — a sport which fortunately can be followed (in one way or another) almost as long as life lasts. So it is that much time, capital and experience have been sunk into the making of light guns for the purpose of easing the burden of the shooter who is not so young. This is a policy which deserves general approbation. But I would add one or two comments.

First of all, let it be said that many a working-man who either cannot afford a fresh gun or who does not feel justified in incurring the extra expense of one, makes do with what he already has — in spite of his rheumatics or other ailment. This may mean a handicap — no doubt it is a handicap in some cases. Yet we see these people shooting as well as ever with the same old gun — at least, many of them. Is this a case of necessity? Or would it, in some cases, be due to the fact that the countryman does not like change and prefers to keep to his original routine? I certainly believe that many a staunch shooter would rather keep what he has and would prefer the "devil" he knows to the "devil" he does not know.

I have in mind some of those good friends whom I have known for a very long time. Some of them are well blessed with this world's goods, others are less fortunate in this respect. Some are fit, others are not so fit. What do I see? Many of them who can easily afford it take to light 12-bores, 20-bores, even .410 bores — anything to save weight and consequent effort. They seem very pleased over all this and tell me their shooting has improved. Those who are less affluent stick to what they

have (in spite of "Anno Domini"). Does their shooting suffer as a result of this? My point is that it does not appear to do so.

I know a man who is actually now in the mid-eighties and who still wields the same rather heavy 12-bore which he had 40 or more years ago. Of course he is not so fit, active or strong as he used to be, but as far as I can judge, he shoots all right (though he is a bit slow, perhaps, in getting round to certain birds). This man is not, and never has been, blessed with this world's goods. He has to make the best of what he has and I doubt whether light guns would make any practical difference. Yet other friends change down as the years go on, saying that they cannot cope with full-weight weapons. I sometimes wonder how true this really is!

I do think, though, that if you intend to change to a lighter gun (whether a small-bore or some kind of specially light gun) it is best to make the change at an early enough age. This, I feel, is better than waiting until old age sets in. Such policy allows you full time in which to acclimatise yourself to another weapon. An uncle of mine, who was always a very fine shot, took to a 20-bore when he was only about 55. This became his gun for the rest of his life and he was very proficient with it. Had he waited for another ten or twelve years I am a bit doubtful as to whether matters would have proved so satisfactory. In other words, if a change is intended, it is better (or so it seems) to make it reasonably early. In this way greater benefit is derived (or shall we say more value from the investment).

The fact is it takes time to adjust oneself to the use of a small-bore — whether or no its use has become necessary owing to the advance of years or for any other reason. There is a small sacrifice of power — which calls for appreciation — but the main difference will be that of weight and balance. At first this may prove a little disconcerting to the shooter. He will miss that steady influence of the heavier weapon, and possibly he will, at first, shoot too fast. Time will be needed to get the best out of the gun.

The Ibis and "The Fool with a Gun"

in "*The Riverlander*")

Indicative as it is of the all too prevalent wanton killing of protected birds, the following paragraph from "Sunraysia Daily" last year is worthy of note:

"A large flock of Ibis that had been cleaning up pests at Irymple had been scared off by indiscriminate shooting, an Irymple grower said. They had been cleaning up snails and slugs which were doing considerable damage on local properties. He had heard shots at the week-end and found dead Ibis among his citrus trees. The flock had not come back since the shooting. The grower added that on other occasions magpies and other harmless birds had been shot in his area."

This flock of Ibis was made up of two species—the Straw-necked Ibis, "Threskiornis spinicollis", and the much less numerous White Ibis, "Threskiornis molucca". The strength of the flock was approximately 65 Straw-necked and approximately 15 White Ibis. How many people realise, when they shoot the latter species, that they are killing a bird very closely allied to the Sacred Ibis of ancient Egypt, and how dire punishment would have been a few thousand years ago?

The Sacred Ibis makes its appearance very early in Egypt's history, and it was an object of worship in pre-dynastic times. The exact reason why it first became sacred is obscure, but is probably connected with totemism. Symbols and totems almost certainly date back to the time when Egypt was inhabited by a number of partly independent tribes, and it is likely that each tribe allied itself with some particular animal or other object and used this figure as a tribal symbol, or totem. As time went on, there developed the imposing array of gods in human form, with animal heads, which played an important part in later culture—Sebek, the crocodile; Anubis, the jackal; Horus, the hawk, and the one with which we are here concerned. Thoth, the ibis. These became more idealised, and Thoth—at first probably significant as a bird totem and nothing more—became the measurer of celestial seasons. At the height of his power he was regarded as the god of magic, of knowledge and of the moon, and was expected to preside over the judgment of the souls of the dead. He was considered the inventor of numerical figures and of time-keepers—and was so sacred that in the time of the Pharaohs to kill his image—the bird itself—was a capital crime. Many mummies of the birds have been found in tombs. A certain cunning King of Persia, on mischief bent in Egypt, is said to have had a number of Ibis carried in front of his attacking warriors. The Egyptian defenders capitulated rather than risk hurting the birds.

These, then, are the birds—or their very near relatives—that are being shot so casually among the vineyards and citrus groves at Irymple. Obviously one thing the ancient Egyptians had that we haven't got was an extremely high regard for the Ibis.

Why haven't we? What prompts trigger-happy individuals periodically to "go out and kill something"? When it is an Ibis, not desire for something for the pot. They are a poor item of food; it seems inconceivable anyone would eat them from choice. Again, they were not being shot for any scientific purpose, and surely no one in his senses could imagine they were damaging or eating anything of commercial value? Their food consists largely of creatures like crickets, beetles, newts, frogs, caterpillars, cutworms, small reptiles and fresh-water crustaceans, most of which are either destructive or neutral towards the man on the land. Ibises eat vast quantities of grasshoppers—astronomical numbers—and this fact alone ought to ensure that the most thoughtless "sportsman" would leave them in peace. If, indeed, as the "Sunraysia Daily" paragraph suggests, they also include slugs and snails on their menu, surely this is just one more good reason why they should be allowed to go unmolested.

Poisoning Foxes

(By N. McD. SMITH in the
"Cane Growers' Quarterly", Qld.)

Successful poisoning of foxes over a long period depends on frequent changes in the method of baiting, and the type of material used for bait.

At Bundaberg (Q.) damage to canefields from the pest fluctuates considerably, depending on the season. Some farms, however, receive regular attention from foxes, and losses of economic amounts occur in fields of Q.50, which is the variety most favoured for attack. Trapping has never been tried to any extent, but in 1953 an interesting protective measure, using an electric fence, gave excellent results. Three strands of plain wire were rigged at intervals up to two feet from the ground and an electric impulse outfit, similar to the usual electric fence set up, provided "live wires". The enclosed field was satisfactorily protected and a pad around the fence was easily seen where the animals had scouted the barrier, seeking a break. However, this method offered only individual protection and resulted in greater damage to other fields. Therefore, baiting with strychnine offered the best chances of eliminating damage.

A change in bait is all important, and fish was found to be more enticing than partly cooked pork, raw sheep's tongues, raw kidney and fowl.

The method of preparing the fish was to obtain bodies from which fillets had been removed and cut each into three sections—head, middle and tail. The pieces were then placed in the freezing chamber of a domestic refrigerator until frozen solid. On removal the pieces were separated and one small cut made in a fleshy part of each bait. Three to four grains of the crystal form of strychnine were placed in the cut and the baits distributed partly buried in the ground while they were still in the frozen state. The advantage claimed for the freezing was that thawing removed much of the smell

of human handling and rendered the fox less suspicious.

The take of baits will decrease after a short while and a change of material will be necessary. Fowl carcasses are rated next to fish, according to local experience, and the three to four grains of strychnine are introduced into an incision at the head and at the tail. There appears to be a better killing effect if the body is warm at the time of poisoning. However, a check on kill is difficult to assess using fowl bodies, for the fox often removes a large food piece to a harbourage where it is eaten at a later date.

Concerning other attractive bait material, there are many variants, and trials will establish something which will be temporarily satisfactory. A case comes to mind of an animal which avoided all classes of bait, but eventually succumbed to rotten eggs which were buried with very little cover near the regular track into the canefield.

Placing of baits involves a knowledge of animal tracks into the farm and can be determined by an inspection of headlands, etc., for paw marks and lining up damaged cane patches with likely harbourages. The number of baits laid must be counted for safety's sake and also to learn when to change to something different when the take drops off and damage still occurs. The number laid over an area depends on variable factors, but the distance apart for fish baits is every three to four paces in an area of damaged cane.

Where poisoning is being carried out, it would be advisable to display a notice to this effect in conspicuous places on the farms concerned, and as an act of courtesy, neighbouring farmers should be advised to chain up their dogs. The strictest precautions should also be observed in storing the poisons and baits away from the reach of children.



How do Pigeons get Home?

By D. H. DAY

The age-old mystery of how pigeons find their way home is still unsolved, but most racing men are more concerned with improving the speed with which a bird homes rather than how it does it.

The late Mr. Jack Kilpatrick, of Ireland, wrote of the homing faculty: "It may seem absurd to suggest that pigeons find their way home by navigating by the sun, when we know that the sun is never over the same spot on the earth more than a few minutes each day."

"Yet we must admit," he said, "that the sun and its position in relation to the earth have an influence on pigeons' lives."

Mr. Kilpatrick supported his theory by saying that on a bright day birds cleared the race point in a few minutes on the correct line for home, but on a dull day, with a heavy, overcast sky, they hesitated, flew about for some time, and then made off, probably in the wrong direction, and went back to the liberation point.

Colin Osman, in his new book, correctly states that a pigeon homes to its loft, and not to a geographical position.

This was proved during the war in the training of pigeons to fly to mobile lofts. If the lofts were moved, the birds would search for them until they found them.

Other theories about homing are that pigeons have extra-sensory perception, or that a pigeon loft transmits a beam, like radar, on which the birds fly home. (Some pigeons must have very poor radar sets!)

Rotation of the earth and the earth's magnetism are other theories.

Very little scientific work has been done on any theory, and what has been undertaken has been just as quickly upset by other scientific experiments.
