





The Editor's Notebook



1959 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS.

Interested clubs are again reminded that applications for the allocation of 1959 Open Championships—that is, Commonwealth, State and District titles—must reach the Secretary A.C.T.A. within the next few days. Originally it was decided that October 1 would be dead-line for receipt of applications. However, the date has now been extended to October 7. The Official Championship Allocation, agreed upon by the Executive Committee, will be published in the December issue of this journal, and all are requested to accept same as official—no notices of the championship allocation will be posted direct to clubs. Those clubs desirous of being allocated an open championship for 1959 should waste no time in making application. It is pointed out again that clubs failing to apply will not be considered in the allocation.

The date of the Executive Committee meeting of the Association has been fixed for October 23 and 24. Any club desirous of having any matter placed on the Agenda paper for the meeting is requested to advise the Secretary, A.C.T.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.1, in writing on or before October 10.

Recently a country club sent along advertising for inclusion in "News". The advertising covered the holding of a District Championship. The club correctly stated the nomination fee, i.e. 25/-, but also added, "plus 5/- for birds". The addition of the last mentioned clause in the conditions governing the shoot is quite incorrect and same was deleted from the advertising. Clubs are advised that they are not permitted to charge an additional amount for targets. The conditions lay down that all championship nominations fixed by the Association are "inclusive of birds". Clubs should remember this when conducting open championships, Commonwealth, State and District title events.

Recently a Victorian country shooter who holds an Official Referee Badge wrote to the Association and started off by "apologising" for what he termed might be a silly question. He asked for a reply through "News". No query is "silly" if it has a bearing on the proper conduct of shooting and no correspondent should hesitate to approach the Association on any point upon which they may have some doubt. The questioner in the present instance writes, "I am an official referee and do a good lot of refereeing at different shoots in my area and sometimes further

afied. Every now and again I get a shooter wanting to shoot behind his Association mark (sometimes their mark might be up around 20 yards). I promptly refuse to allow them to do so and insist they shoot from their registered mark. Am I doing right or wrong?" The writer's query is simply answered, he is acting quite correctly. The Association has ruled for years that shooters must shoot from their correct mark, not in front or behind it, and all referees should see that shooters obey. The only exception that could be granted would be on the occasion when a shooter wanted to try a new gun, and then only for not more than five shots, and not in competition.

"Target Monthly Booklet?" It is pointed out that the full list of registered shooters' names appears every three months (or approximately that period). Those who re-register or become newly registered are published each month between the intervening period of the major list. If clubs retain all copies of "News" it is not a difficult matter to check the bona fides of a shooter's registration. Also, and a most important point, is that every shooter is issued with a current registration card. This card must be produced on request to club officials. Any shooter who is not in possession of his card and cannot indicate his name on the registration list is not registered and should not be permitted to compete against registered shooters.

In this regard, and for the information of all concerned, it is advised that the full registration list was recently checked right through. Many printer's errors were detected. These have now been adjusted and the full current list appears in this issue.

(The list, of course, does not include those registered since closing copy for the current issue.)

Are Animals Right or Left-handed?

There is left and right in nature as well as in the human world. Just why some 10 per cent. of the human race should be born with an inherited tendency to be left-handed, instead of right-handed, has never been explained; nor, indeed, has it been explained why man should be right-handed anyway. In all the higher creatures with paws, legs, or hands this right- or left-handedness predominates; and it is known that in right-handed cases the left side of the brain, which controls the opposite side of the body, is more highly developed. But there again we do not know just why this should be.

The fact remains that nature seems to have endowed all creatures with this curious pattern of left or right. Parents who feel that their babies may develop neurotic tendencies if, being naturally left-handed, they are forced by school teachers or others to use their right, may take encouragement from the known fact that dogs are always either definitely left- or right-handed. And a dog trained to do a trick, such as shaking hands, with one paw behaves normally, but when made to do the trick with both paws, it becomes a nervous case, incapable of ordinary canine intelligence and useless for any tricks at all!

Monkeys and apes noticeably use one hand more than the other, as do a number of birds which make use of their claws for feeding purposes. Parrots that are right-handed are as uncommon as human beings that are left-handed. But among wild creatures the natural tendency invariably stays to the fore, since there is no convention to change it. (Of every 10 people born naturally left-handed, it is estimated that only 7 remain so throughout their lives. Whether the other three suffer any detrimental effects has never definitely been proved.) In one zoo, out of 20 parrots under observation, all of which use their claws to hold nuts, etc., 15 were usually left-handed and 3 invariably so.

Elephants always develop one tusk more than its partner. If the right tusk is used regularly for digging

and other purposes, then the left tusk, through want of wearing down in use, grows larger, yielding more ivory. This tendency, while always remaining the same in individual elephants, is not common to all the species.

All crickets are right-handed insofar as they stridulate, or chirrup, by rubbing the right wing over the left leg with its serrated comb-like edge. But all katydids, which are closely similar insects, are left-handed.

Snails are fashioned either right- or left-handed, according to the whorl design of their shells. Land snails seem to derive a fundamental origin from their eggs, which give them clockwise twists to their shells, whereas water-snails always have anti-clockwise or left-handed shells.

This definite left or right tendency is present in all kinds of creatures. Lobsters usually have a much more massive and powerful left claw than a right, as do crabs; and it is obvious that this claw is used in the same way as an ordinary man uses his right hand more than his left. Yet nature is adaptable enough in this matter, for if a crab injures its left pincer, the right will automatically grow larger and takes its place.

Flatfish like flounders, halibut, plaice and sole all begin life as symmetrical, vertical fish, but they turn over to one side when quite young and remain horizontal all their lives. They almost always turn to lie on their left sides, so that the left eye moves through the head, to face uppermost alongside the other eye. These fish are thus left-handed, since their right sides become their backs. Even oysters move to the left side in their shells, their right sides growing underneath their bodies. A right-handed oyster is quite rare.

Hatching Pheasants

Many have tried, but few appear to have succeeded in successfully hatching pheasant eggs. The following report from the I.C.I. Game Research Station of 1956 is appended for general information:

"The most reliable method we have of hatching pheasant eggs in incubators is keeping them for 20 days in a cabinet forced-draught machine,

under conditions normal for poultry eggs, and then transferring them to still-air incubators for the final hatching phase, with plenty of moisture.

Complete incubation and hatching with still-air machines is frequently successful, but is apt to vary with the conditions of the room in which they stand. The temperature of the room must be kept reasonably steady, not violently fluctuating. Incubators must stand exactly level and away from draughts. The best way of ensuring the right temperature is to fix a thermometer on a little block of wood on the floor of the egg tray, so that the bulb is $\frac{1}{4}$ in. from the tray, i.e. at the level of the centre of an average pheasant egg. Adjust the thermostat until this thermometer reads 99 $\frac{1}{2}$ deg. F. A fairly high humidity is essential. The eggs should be turned three times a day up to the 20th day, but not at all after that."

New Game Shooters' Association

Dr. H. H. Martin of Yarram, the well-known trapshot and President of the Yarram Gun Club, has been elected President of the newly formed Victorian Field and Game Association. This body was formed at Sale and Herb. Guyatt of Sale, also a well-known trapshot, is secretary of the new organisation.

It is understood that the new organisation has been formed to assist in controlling and improving duck, quail, snipe and other game shooting. In recent years the loss of many swamps and breeding grounds has tended to restrict the breeding of game, and the Association has as its main objective the formation of a Victorian Game Shooters' Council, within the Association, to assist in countering these losses.

The Committee of the Association has recommended the following points:-

1. The division of Victoria into five major game regions. This is based on information obtained through the Victorian Fisheries and Game Department.
2. Each region to form a Regional Association, containing three districts with at least 15 representatives from field and game shooters.
3. Each Region will appoint a total six delegates to the Victorian Game Shooters' Council. Many clubs already formed in various parts of Victoria have expressed the intention of affiliating with the Council. Public meetings have been held in some of the districts of each region. These are Kerang, Ballarat, Moe, Bairnsdale, Yarram, Leongatha, Wangaratta and Benalla.

The following aims and objects accepted by the Gippsland Association have been suggested as a starting point for the Council:-

1. To organise and inform field sportsmen so as to obtain a co-ordinate and representative voice in matters concerning game shooting.
2. To develop a greater public appreciation of the pleasures and values of game shooting.
3. To educate the novice shooter in the ethics and value of his sport and to inculcate a sense of responsibility generally towards wild-life and the bush.
4. To develop facilities for game shooting by the promotion of game management and breeding projects.
5. To produce and circulate information concerning game and game shooting. To establish an Advisory Centre and library on these matters for the use of members.

6. To co-operate with property owners and others whose interests are likely to be affected by the pursuit of game.

Even though good seasons occur, these are becoming less frequent and the overall picture in Victoria is one of decreasing game, fewer days of good shooting and smaller bags. It is considered that this decline is not due to heavy shooting only, but to the deterioration and loss of natural feeding and breeding grounds.

It is intended that one of the first moves of the Council will be to press for a game licence, say, of £1 for the shooting of game birds, i.e. duck, quail and snipe. Money thus raised could be used to ensure water supply for key duck-shooting swamps, growing of duck food in barren waters, management of breeding swamps in controlling water levels and the setting up of a Game Bird Research Station to scientifically investigate the feeding and propagation of all game birds. The Victorian Fisheries and Game Department have intimated that pilot projects could begin immediately if money were available.

On the other hand, it is felt that a game-bird licence would have the effect of organising and co-ordinating shooters into an effective voice in affairs concerning field shooting and would encourage a sense of responsibility to the wild game which all licence holders had contributed towards producing.

The Gippsland Association is hopeful of the co-operation of all game-bird shooters in Victoria so that their sport can be protected and enlarged still further.



"Tips and Tails"

Writing from Spokane, Washington, U.S.A., Association Hon. Vice-President, Rex Miles, who is secretary of the Washington State Trapshooters' Association, writes, "Hearty congratulations to the Australian Team for their outstanding performance in the 1958 International. Australia is up with the rest of the world in many kinds of sport, tennis, swimming, golf, etc., and it now looks as if trapshooting is being added to the sports that you can excell in. As I have said before, they owe a lot to you for your enthusiastic efforts, your promotion is paying off. It may interest you to know that I know Mr. Boa's dad (high-gun in the Canadian team) very well; he was a professional and sold Ithaca guns, etc. G. S. Boa of Toronto, Canada, had an average of .9406 on 1600 registered A.T.A. targets last year. Thought you would like to know. He is undoubtedly the Boa who shot in the Canadian Team. I don't think that there were any Western Canadians in the team. Although I know that there are some real competitors out our way. Don Blow of Calgarry is terrific. Sorry you had indifferent weather for your shoot this year; it makes an awful difference to the scores. We had perfect weather for our big shoots this year, and the boys were really in the "groove"; 100's straight were a dime a dozen. Our junior champion (14 years old) broke 100 straight, then a 95 from 16 yards — 195/200, so you can judge for yourself."

Cloncurry Club in central Queensland is preparing to install night lighting on its local shooting grounds. The club is anxious to start off "on the right leg" with its night lighting installations and intends to ensure that the best possible set-up is arranged.

A new club at Minimay, via Frances in South Australia, has affiliated with the Association. Secretary of the new formation is J. C. Jacob, "Corena", Minimay, via Frances, S.A.

The Upper Murray Double-barrel Championship and a £50 Handicap will be main events when the Walwa Gun Club stages an all-day shoot on its grounds (commencing at 10 a.m.) on Saturday, October 25. The Walwa Club's shooting grounds are situated right in the centre of the town and this factor has proved a boon to visitors. Good fishing is reported within a stone's throw of the shooting ground and hotel, and those intending to make a week-end visit should be well catered for. Enquiries regarding the shoot and accommodation should be directed to club secretary, J. Ferris, Walwa (Phone Walwa 27). The programme is as advertised.

A prominent New York Hotel has introduced a new item to its menu — a main course of roast beef served in one-inch thick round slices. Second helpings are on the house!

We are again indebted to the interest of veteran trapshot and prince of good sportsman, Charles Loughland, who resides in a Melbourne suburb. Loughland has recently given the writer a most interesting publication which carries the name of "Shooting Simplified" by J. D. Dougall. The preface indicates that the book is the first edition and that the book was published in Bedford Gardens, Kensington, London, in March, 1865, and much of the matter contained in the publication deals with the breech-loading versus muzzle-loading era. Some of the comments, by present-day standards, are somewhat amusing. One passage dealing with grouse shooting states, "Should the strength and nerve of the young sportsman fail him after his first exertion in climbing to an elevated point, let him at once lie down on his back for half an hour upon a clump of dry heather, taking

precautions to avoid catching cold. The climbing a steep ascent has a peculiar effect upon the nerves, making many a good shot miss every bird he fires at, and to follow up the game while in this state is a needless waste of time and ammunition. When therefore the birds are missed without any apparent cause, let the shooter lie down for at least half an hour and not grudge the time so spent." Another section advises, "Carry a gun within your strength. Have the stock as straight as a broom shank, if you can get your eye to it at all." Referring to gun dogs, the author writes, "The setter is a more lasting animal than the pointer, and besides being swifter while at his work, can also do more work; and, indeed, many setters may be hunted for several hours daily. The black and tan variety is the most beautiful. The Irish breed is coming into repute. They are uncertain, but sometimes magnificent animals, requiring a great deal of work to keep them in order. It may be said of them that they are either very good or very bad. The setter is a much

bolder dog than the pointer, and has many qualities, such as as taking to water, which render him a more companionable animal to man. The more prominent faults possessed by dogs are—running into shot, chasing game on the wing, chasing hares, pointing larks and such 'trash' and blinking. Inherent faults, such as want of a good nose cannot be remedied."

Narrandera Club in the central Riverina section of New South Wales will shoot the Central Riverina Double-barrel Championship on the local shooting grounds on Saturday, November 1. Shooting will start at 10 a.m. Several good supporting events are listed on the programme which is as advertised. Enquiries to J. R. Bushby, Box 112, Narrandera, N.S.W.

South Coast Club at Southport (Queensland) gives a preliminary outline of its annual January carnival in the advertising section of this issue. The club will shoot on January 17; Sunday, January 18; Tuesday, January 20 (night only); Thursday, January 22 (day and night), and

Sunday, January 25 (all day). The club reminds intending competitors that Southport races are listed for Wednesday, January 21. Full details will appear in later issues. Meanwhile enquiries to club secretary, Mrs. G. S. Martin, "Amaroo", Esplanade, Surfers Paradise (Phone X2184).

Hawkesbury District Club (just out of Sydney) advises that John Thatcher, 62 Lennox Street, Richmond, N.S.W., has taken over the secretaryship. Thatcher's mother was the former secretary of the club.

The latest thing in bird scaring is a design by a north of England sportsman. It is called the "Maukin". It looks like the profile of a man holding a gun, it is painted in fluorescent scarlet paint, swings in the wind, and at intervals makes a bang and puffs out smoke from a dummy barrel. One hundred per cent. success is claimed with all types of vermin birds. The designer is understood to be Roger North, Rougham, Norfolk, England.

Newcastle (N.S.W.) Club President, Dan Mott, has gone somewhat Churchillian in his efforts to publicise the car shoot to be conducted by the Newcastle Club, extending over Friday, October 17, and Saturday, October 18. Mott advises that "Never before in the history of clay shooting has a programme offered so much, to so many, for so little." Dan is anxious to clear up any misgivings that may have crossed the minds of intending competitors. He advises that "all prize monies are guaranteed, that is all prizes, i.e. cash, trophies, and motor car." Any shooter who travels to Newcastle is assured of shooting for the car regardless of the number of competitors. Seven New Zealand shooters are expected to take part, so the fixture should have quite an International atmosphere. Full details of the shoot appear in the advertising section of this issue. Enquiries to D. Mott (President) (Phones: Newcastle, MF 1639, and private, MA 3824) or to secretary, R. G. Morton, 4 Fawcett Street, Mayfield, N.S.W. The shooting grounds are situated on Burwood Beach off the Scenic Highway at Newcastle. Shooting will start at 9.30 a.m. on both days.

Another report from the Newcastle area advises that a 17-year-old youth of New Lambton in the Newcastle district was recently attacked by a shag while swimming at Newcastle Beach. The swimmer was swimming under water and thought the bird was a duck. He grabbed the bird's legs. When he surfaced, the bird attacked him, biting him on the shoulder, arm and face. He was later treated for a two-inch gash under one of his eyes. He had to dive under water to get away from the bird.





OUT OF THE PAST

Twenty Years Ago

In mid-1938 Alf Poxon of Launceston, who is still a prominent member of the Tasmanian Gun Club, which shoots at St. Leonards in the Apple Isle, won his first championship. Poxon's performance culminated a run of coincidental happenings. The late Claude Abell, who had been secretary of the Northern Gun Club at Launceston, which was later to become the Tasmanian Gun Club, was moved in his official every-day job down to Hobart. Poxon took over the office from Abell, and on his very first day in office as secretary he recorded his first championship success, the Tasmanian Single-barrel title of 1938. Poxon failed to stop his 10th, 15th and 22nd targets and tied with Bill Rainbird, who had missed on rounds 4, 10 and 23. Poxon broke all five targets in the shoot-off round, while Rainbird missed his first two. Third placing went to H. Munnings of Kempton, who is rarely sighted on a shooting track these days.

Several successes were gained by shooters about this period who are never heard of today. Included among these were Trevor Bruhn of Coburg and Max Carter, who used to shoot

at Blackburn. Both gained "best performance" records for the day at Coburg and Blackburn. Another who was under notice at Blackburn was Joe Malcolm, whilst at the Victorian Club fixture at Bentleigh the late Lew Bertram and the late E. B. Turner (one-time President of the Melbourne Clay Target Club—now long forgotten) were among the winners. At a Camberwell fixture R. W. (Fatty) Lamb, the champion cyclist and great rival of Hubert Opperman (now M.H.R. for Corio) won a "novice" prize. This seems remarkable, for Lamb could hardly be classified as a novice at any period of his shooting career. At a Nobel fixture Frank R. Hockey, present Association Patron, divided a ten birder with Athol Love and the late Ted Parow. Frank is still a "regular" at most Camberwell Club fixtures today. Victor Fankhauser is reported as winning the Southern Hemisphere Double-rise Championship at the Field Shooters' grounds at East Oakleigh, with the remarkably low score of 6/12 pairs! Conditions on the day were reported as being very difficult with the "worst powder blow-back for years".

Ten Years Ago

Shooting at Coburg the Roy Johns-Fred Burns combination won the club Deauville Doubles Championship. At the Australian Club's grounds Fred Burns was again in evidence when he won 1948 Commonwealth Single-barrel title. The event was then shot at 25 targets and Burns won outright, 24/25, from Pampas (Bert Haynes), 23/30.

Full details of the 1948 Champion of Champions Cup were published about this period in that year. The Cup, now a time-honoured contest, was won by H. R. Donelly, then a resident of Bruthen. The event was shot at 50 targets from 18 yards,

and Donelly's aggregate was 49/50, having missed his 41st target. Runner-up was Jack McCraith of Essendon with 48/50, and third placing went to W. R. Johns, 47/50. Nine others with 46/50 were next, and the tie shoot to decide the order was G. Bell (Young, N.S.W.), 67/71 (4); Jim Smith (Townsville, Q.), 66/71 (5); A. F. Burns, 63/68 (6); E. G. Biggs, 59/64 (7); F. E. Brown (Dandenong), 50/55 (8); H. Ceresa, 48/53; D. B. O'Callaghan, 48/53, and J. Bryant Senr., 47/52, then followed a succession of scores with the lowest aggregate of 18/50 by a N.S.W. shooter.

A point of interest announced in September, 1948, when the Blackburn Club held its annual meeting (8th), is that the Blackburn and Nobel Clubs had decided to amalgamate and the club would in future be known as The Australian Clay Target Club. Veteran Dave Watson was President of Blackburn at that time and he was unanimously appointed first President of the Australian Club.

Snipe Shooting

The easiest way to shoot snipe is to fire a snap shot with the first barrel the instant the birds rise, and then reserve the second charge till they have concluded curving and twisting about, which they will do after flying twenty or thirty yards.

Snipe shooting is a most delightful and fascinating sport, but the shooter must make up his mind to go through quagmires, swamps, and marshes "ab initio ad finem", for he may often sink up to his body in thick, slimy

mud or have to wade through several feet of water and snow. If, however, he is really keen, these little difficulties will be looked upon as mere trifles, and will in no way deter him from participating in that capital and exciting sport.

After all, sport would be nothing without its accompanying hardships, and if a man merely cares for the actual shooting, and dreads undergoing the least difficulty or inconvenience, he had better confine himself solely to battle shooting and driving, and leave the rest to those who really enjoy it.


