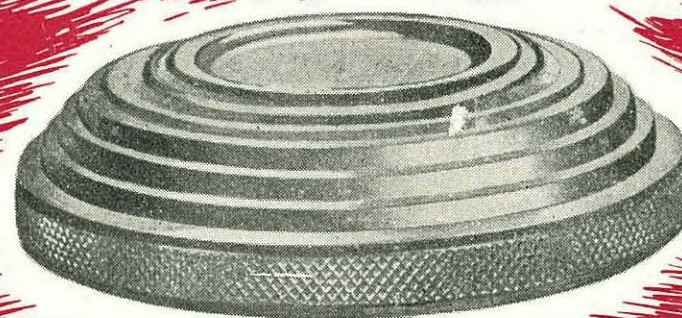

The Editor's Notebook



With the approach of the holiday season and the likelihood of many inexperienced shooters taking the field, it seems fitting that usual reminders regarding the handling of firearms should be revived.

Over the years it has been found that many accidents have occurred when shooters have been getting through fences, especially where barbed wire is concerned. All should remember that the best way of traversing barbed wire is to miss it altogether and take the time and trouble to walk until a gate is found and then proceed through the gateway. When two or more are gathered together at one spot, the negotiation of a barbed wire fence is simple. Shooter "A" pulls up the top strand of the wire and depresses the lower with his boot, with guns unloaded. Shooter "B" or "C" then pass through the gap in the wire and similarly hold the wire for shooter "A" from the other side. Another method of effectively negotiating barbed wire is to carry a small sack (hessian) and place this over the barbs. Also a piece of split rubber hosing has proved useful for this purpose.

The mechanical failure of a gun is rarely the cause of a fatal accident, always provided the weapon is looked after as it should be, the locks inspected regularly, the safety catch works, the barrels are safe and not blocked with any foreign body, the correct cartridges are used, and so on. In nine accidents out of ten the man behind the gun is to blame. He is either pointing it the wrong way

at the wrong time or at the "wrong" target or, again, has probably forgotten or perhaps never learned the simplest and most obvious of safety rules. Unless a shotgun is loaded, it is a perfectly harmless instrument, and it goes without saying that it should never be loaded unless it is being used in its correct role out of doors. Occasionally it is heard that certain country sportsmen "always keep their gun loaded in the corner" for instant use in case of emergency or appearance of vermin and game. A gun should never be left loaded. Sooner or later such a weapon will be picked up by someone, or even picked up by the owner himself, quite forgetting that there is a cartridge in the breech, with the inevitable result of a "didn't know it was loaded" accident. The foregoing reminders apply to rifles and the less offensive air-rifles as well as the shotgun.

The primary thought to keep in mind is never to have your gun loaded until you are about to use it in the open field.

Congratulations are extended to the Tasmanian Team, which was again successful in winning the 1958 Interstate Teams' Match for the second successive year. Success by Tasmania means that the representatives of the Island State will retain for another year possession of the now famous "Great Britain & Ireland" Trophy. This trophy was presented by the trapshooters of Great

Britain and Ireland in appreciation of Australian co-operation during the difficulties which operated in the United Kingdom in the immediate post-war years. In its wisdom the Association decided to institute the annual Interstate Teams' Match, with the holding of this splendid Trophy as the annual award for team supremacy. The event has now become a well-established feature of the Association's activities each year.

Tasmania returned the excellent figures of 487/500 to win the 1958 series from New South Wales 484, then Queensland 483, South Australia 480, Western Australia 474 and Victoria 473. Both Western Australia and Victoria had the misfortune to strike extremely unfavourable weather conditions for their respective shoots.

Possible scores of 50 straight were carded for Tasmania by Paul Marshall, Jack Blake and H. M. Eddington. For New South Wales only one possible was returned by W. Duddy. Queenslanders H. Nasser and A. Mace had possibles. R. C. Mules was top for South Australia with the only possible, and similarly R. M. Holtfreter returned the solitary possible for Western Australia. Victoria's best was three 49's.

Full scores for the match are published elsewhere in this issue.

A northern club recently wrote the Association seeking a ruling regarding "slow pulls". The club wrote, "If a shooter is ready to shoot and has called 'Pull' and a material amount of time has elapsed without the target being released, should the referee call 'No Bird' when he considers that the delay has been lengthy enough to constitute a baulk, or should he wait until the bird has been released and the shooter has fired at it and then give his decision, if the shooter appeals for a 'No Bird'?" The answer to this query is quite simple. If the pull was slow, the referee should not hesitate to call "No Bird" without delay. The referee is the arbitrator and he should be alert enough to detect a slow pull or even a fast pull instantly.

A.C.T.A. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE. The A.C.T.A. Executive Committee held its regular spring season meeting in Melbourne late in October. A very heavy Agenda was presented to the meeting. Many points of interest to the general run of shooters were discussed. This report deals with decisions reached during the meeting.

RECOGNITION OF NEW STATE. The Executive Committee decided to recognise the Northern Territory as a separate State of the Commonwealth.

1959 ASSOCIATION SHOOT. The 1959 Association National Championships and International fixtures will be held on the grounds of The Royal Aero Club of New South Wales at Bankstown Aerodrome (Sydney) over the dates, May 1, 2, 4 and 5. The annual meeting of the Association will be held on Sunday, May 3rd, 1959, in the Aero Club Pavilion.

An application to have the shoot in Queensland because of the State of Queensland Centenary was not accepted. Similarly an application from South Australia was unacceptable.

The nomination fee for the National Single-barrel Championship has been reduced to 40/- to bring it into line with the Association's policy of 1/- per bird.

The Grand Australian Handicap in 1959 has been increased in money value to £500, instead of £200 as formerly. This amount will be split £100 to the following yardage groups: 12/16, 17/18, 19/20, 21 yards and over, absorbing £400, and the remaining £100 will be divided 60%, 30%, 10%, compulsory divisions in all instances. Nomination will be £5.

In the Australian National Double-barrel Championship, points scoring has been abolished and both barrels will be equal value. The International Match conditions, i.e. points scoring, remain as before. (International conditions are fixed by the International Committee in London.)

The A.C.T.A. Intermediate Championship will continue to be shot from 16 yards, but shooters whose handicap does not exceed 18 yards on the day of the event will now be eligible to take part.

An important departure from long-established custom will be that all minor prizes will be allocated in cash instead of trophies as formerly. Only the first, second and third placemen will receive trophy awards to values as issued in previous years, and all prizes after third placing will be cash. It was considered more in keeping with present-day conditions to allocate cash awards. Those gaining such awards will retain the cash amount to assist in meeting competing expenses. Conditions for all other events not mentioned in the preceding paragraphs remain as formerly, with cash awards for the minor prizes.

CHAMPIONSHIP ALLOCATION. The 1959 Championship Allocation appears in another section of this issue. The premier title, the Commonwealth Double-barrel Championship, was allotted to the South Australian Gun Club at Adelaide.

Club officials are advised that the Executive Committee has directed that in future all applications for open championships (Commonwealth, State and District) must be in the hands of the Secretary of the Association at least 30 days prior to the Executive Meeting at which the official allocation is made. Also, in future late applications will not be considered.

The Queensland Centenary Championship, a special event as part of the Queensland Centenary Celebrations in 1959, has been allotted to the South Coast Gun Club at Southport (Q.). Conditions are 30 targets, double-barrel, from 18 yards, nomination 30/-.

ALTERATION TO SHOOTING TERM. In the section "Definition of Terms" in the Association Shooting Rules, following a request from a Victorian club, it has been decided to delete under the heading "BALK" that portion of the term which reads, "If he shoots after the balk occurs, he must abide by the result."

SHOOTING RULES. Referees are instructed by the Executive Committee that Rule 2, "The Referee — The Referee's Decision is Final, Section 1, is required to be observed fully, which means that more attention is required in the observance of the

Rule. Referees are again instructed to call clearly, 'Kill' or 'Lost' immediately a kill registered or otherwise, in all types of shooting."

Rule 16, Section 7. The words which state "or any failure whatsoever caused by a reloaded cartridge" is now to read "or any failure whatsoever caused by a 'faulty' cartridge."

SKEET SHOOTING. As a means of increasing interest in skeet shooting, the Executive Committee has directed that the following additional condition be adopted. Skeet Rules, "A shooter shooting in competition skeet is not permitted to have a preliminary gun point, also the order of shooting 'doubles' has been reversed from stations 2, 4 and 6, to stations 6, 4 and 2." The time wasted when skeet shooters are addressing the trap-house with varied and assorted types of time-wasting gun pointing should now be eliminated.

OFFICIAL REFEREE OBLIGATION. Official referees should take particular note of the following instructions issued by the Executive Committee, which is that "any shooter wearing an official referee badge is obligated to help and assist in the refereeing if called upon."

EMPIRE GAMES 1962. Perth (W.A.) is the venue of the 1962 Empire Games and the Executive Committee has decided to support the Perth Gun Club's application to have clay target shooting included in the 1962 Games.

UNBROKEN CLAYS PROPERTY OF CLUB. The Executive Committee has decreed that all clays unbroken or otherwise are the property of the club concerned. This ruling should be of interest to many clubs where unbroken clays have been gathered by unauthorised persons. The shooter actually only pays for the privilege of shooting at the targets when he attends a shoot.

HANDICAPPING. The question of Association handicapping was given much consideration. The secretary intimated that he did not wish to continue on the handicapping panel, and the Executive Committee then decided that handicapping was of such great importance that an individual engaged on "handicapping

only" was a necessary adjunct to the Association staff. It was decided to remunerate the new handicapper at the rate of £500 per annum. (The present handicapping panel will be disbanded as from 31/12/58.) Messrs. Mott (N.S.W.), Powell (Tas.), Biggs (Vict.), with the secretary co-opted, have been appointed a sub-committee to go into the question of formulating a new handicapping system and also arrange for the appointment of the new handicapper.

It was decided that recommendations regarding handicaps received from District Association would be received and considered.

REFEREE EXAMINERS. The Executive Committee decided that in future appointments of Official Referee Examiners would be made by Executive Committee members in each State, who would also be empowered to cancel any such appointments should the occasion arise.

SHOOTING AT UNREGISTERED CLUBS. The Executive Committee has instructed that all shooters competing at unregistered or unaffiliated clubs will become liable for disqualification.

SASHES — BADGES. It was decided that the following motion be agreed to: "That it be left optional to the club conducting either Commonwealth, State or District Championships to provide a sash or badge. If a badge, this badge to be the official badge struck by the Association." (More details regarding badge costs, etc., will be available when price details have been gone into with the manufacturers.)

I.C.I. AIR - FARE HANDICAP. The special donation by I.C.I.A.N.Z. Limited, of return plane tickets from

the capital city of each State (except the capital city in which the Association shoot is being held) for the National Championships, was dealt with by the Executive Committee. The allotment for 1959 is as follows: Western Australia — Perth, Victoria — Keilor, Tasmania — Cressy, South Australia — Alexandra (Milang), Queensland — Brisbane.

REGISTERED SHOOTERS NOT MEMBERS OF AFFILIATED CLUBS. Concern was expressed by the Executive Committee at reports that a number of shooters, particularly in certain areas, whilst fully registered with the Association, have failed to renew their club membership. This action is completely contrary to Association rules, and shooters concerned should be informed to this effect. It is an established Association rule that a shooter must belong to an affiliated club before he can be registered. Some shooters have carried this out in their first year of registration and then have followed in later years by merely registering direct with the Association whilst not actually belonging to any affiliated club. This procedure will not be tolerated by the Association and registered shooters who cannot produce evidence of belonging to an affiliated club, with all current dues paid, leave themselves open to be dealt with under the rules of the Association.

SEASONAL GREETINGS. The President and Executive Committee of the Association extend Seasonal Greetings for the Christmas Season and good wishes for a successful year in 1959 to all member clubs, registered shooters, advertisers and well-wishers of the Association.

they've got a hard-hitting gun I look
around for cover. It's the sort of
phrase professionals use, and some
rough shooters who should know
better. Usually it concerns a weapon
that will, sooner or later, give either
the game or the sportsman an equal
chance—of being hard hit.

The really appalling thing about
owners of hard-hitting guns is that
they have no conception of the forces
involved. Guns can't hard hit; cart-
ridges can. Guns can simply contain
and channel the explosion—up to the
limits prescribed for them. After
which they may and do sometimes
burst.

So for owners of hard-hitters and ordinary shotguns, and without any desire to teach those concerned to suck eggs, I append the following notes about burst barrels and how to prevent them.

To begin with, the fact that a gun hasn't burst so far is no proof that it won't yet, at least if it is worn, old, or overloaded. I have seen a man slipping Alphamax heavy-loaded cartridges into a Damascus barrelled 12-bore. Unwise? I asked.

He looked at me strangely. They really made barrels in those days, he told me. So they did; out of soft iron and the heads of horseshoe nails. I moved away quickly.

The first and obvious provision against trouble is to see that your gun carries recent proof marks. If you buy a gun that you're at all uncertain about, send it for proof.

True, it may blow up, in which case you've nothing to come except the bits. But think yourself lucky: they're not bits of you, and they could have been.

Of course, it's no absolute guarantee that if an old gun stands proof, it will be reliable thenceforward. Proof may have strained it. Metal fatigue may be about to set in. But the chances are strongly against this happening.

The highly professional inspection that the Proofmaster gives the barrel after firing a proof charge is likely to reveal any flaws. This is, incidentally, the soundest argument against trying to prove guns yourself by firing heavy loads through them after tying them down to a garden seat. You can't make the necessary inspection afterwards.

Since 1954, proof marks show the service pressure in tons per square inch that your barrels will take. Cartridge makers obligingly put these pressures on the side of their boxes, so don't try to go one better.

If your gun won't safely fire modern nitro cartridges, the Proofmaster will stamp it either Not Nitro or Black Powder. To push the latest products through such a weapon is to ask to be hard-hit. After proof the barrels will also be stamped with their normal diameter. When continual shooting has increased this by

one hundredth of an inch, the Proofhouse considers the weapon to be unproved.

You may not be able to judge one hundredth of an inch by squinting down the barrel, but if you've been using the same gun for 20 years, or someone else has—it's an even bet that you've bored her out sufficiently for it to be disconcerting. Answer again: send it to proof or leave it on the wall.

There are, of course, other causes of bursts. Repairs by welding can hardly be held to be safe: the Proofhouse certainly doesn't approve of them. Pitting, if allowed to take charge, eventually weakens the barrel to a critical point. Once started, pitting is hard to stop, so the lesson is obvious. Dents left in barrels—they're easily removed by gunsmiths—quickly become holes or weak spots.

Then there are the good old obstructions. The 20-bore cartridge loaded by mistake into a 12 bore is such a chestnut that you'd think it couldn't happen. But it does. The minimum penalty for the inevitable burst is a couple of missing fingers. The maximum, death. The 20-bore case disappears so neatly through the chamber that you push the 12-bore cartridge in behind it without a second's thought. Many sensible people won't have 20's and 12's together in the same gun cupboard for just this reason.

Obstructions picked up in the field can be equally dangerous. A slip climbing a bank and a muzzle full of mud can do the trick, though with any luck the burst will come high up the barrel.

Even a snowflake can set up pressures that at the very least bulge your barrels.

Is it worth going shooting at all? Of course it is. But for heaven's sake have your gun overhauled once a year; unload and check that your barrels are clear if you do have a fall on muddy ground; put only the approved service load into them. And, if you must buy an obvious hard-hitter, let the Proofmaster take all the chances. Better still, insist on proof before you buy the thing.

The bus, due to some unaccountable mishap, toppled over the mountainside and, but for two massive trees in its path, would have careered on another 2,000 feet down the mountain instead of the mere 100 feet where the trees stopped it. The bus was crushed, and to end this story Sweeney came out without a scratch. He reckons he will never finish his days in a car smash! He now carries the name of "Lucky Harold" — what do you reckon?

With deep regret is announced the passing of Harry (H. H.) Ball, correspondent and long-time Executive member of the Australian Gun Club, and previously the Blackburn Club.

OUT OF THE PAST Twenty Years Ago

What is described as an effort by a "tough bunch of marksmen" in the old "Referee" newspaper about this period 20 years ago, is a report published from the St. George Club in western Queensland — incidentally, St. George was one of the first clubs outside Victoria to be affiliated with the Association. The report states that Rolly Mace, Aubrey Mace, H. S. Smith and D. C. Loxton tied in the club championship, each with scores of 21/25. The tie shoot went to the 45th round before Rolly Mace gained the verdict, 40/45. This performance would now be looked upon in light vein, but 20 years ago it was a really outstanding effort for country trap-shots.

The Fay Shield (never heard of these days), a donation by a member of the now extinct Korumburra Club (V.), was shot for at the grounds of the Victorian Clay Target Club at East Bentleigh. The team representing Korumburra Club proved too good and took the shield back home, apparently for good, because it has not been heard of officially since. One of the best performers for the winning team on that occasion was Bob Makeham, a one-time leading Collingwood (Australian Rules) football ruckman, who was then President at Korumburra.

At the Nobel Grounds at West Footscray the late Charlie Corbett, one of the most gentlemanly sportsmen who ever toed the line, is recorded as having been unlucky in a £50 Handicap. He shot 27 straight and then missed his final release. Corbett was then 64 years of age. Jock Wilson is recorded as winning a 10 birder, under points scoring, 20/20 points. Bill Adair, one-time president at Camberwell Club, won a 10 birder outright about this period. Keith Kaye, who has disappeared from the shooting world since the war period, was under notice at the old Field Shooters' grounds at East Oakleigh.

Ballarat Club, one of the oldest clubs in the Commonwealth, opened its clay target shooting club about this period 20 years. The opening was performed by Horrie James and the first shot was fired by I. Abrahams, President of the Ballarat Club. The Ballarat Club at that time had just celebrated its 77th year of unbroken shooting at Alfredton, just outside Ballarat.

In the spring of 1938 the Perth Gun Club (W.A.) is reported as having staged its "first clay pigeon championship". The winner was Perth sportsman, K. Knapp.

Ten Years Ago

Ten years ago Norman C. Bott of Yarrawonga won outright the Victorian Walk-up Championship when the contest was conducted by the Wangaratta Club on the local grounds. Bott returned the good score under walk-up conditions of 22/25. Runner-up was Keith Veall (Pahran) with 21/25. Local Wangaratta shooter C. Cook defeated the late Tom Savill in a tie shoot for third placing, 22/30 to 21/30.

Shooting at the Australian Club, Bill Finnegan, still a prominent Melbourne shooter, won the Duke of Gloucester Cup after a tie shoot with

"Peters", "Doncaster" and "Bruino". Finnegan won 24/24, "Bruino" 23/24, "Peters" 17/18 and "Doncaster" 15/16. O. Kurre won the 14 yarder attached trophy 18/19, whilst the late Lionel Byrne won the 12 yarder award 11/15.

Fred Burns won the 1948 Commonwealth Single-barrel Championship 24/25 from "Pampas" 28/30, W. R. Bloomfield 39/43, "Dubbs" 39/45. Jack McCraith was the previous holder of the title.

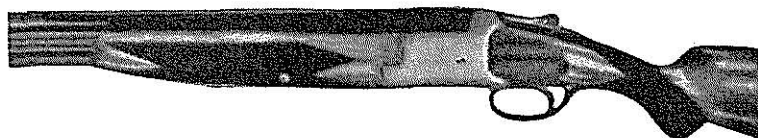


