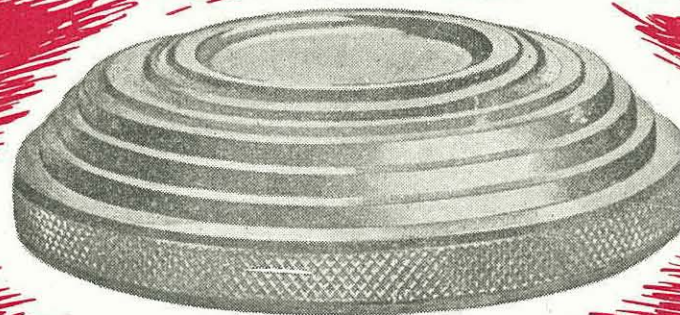

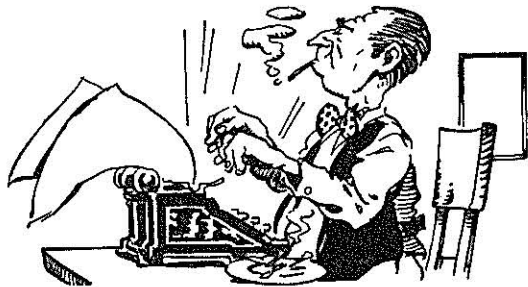

The Editor's Notebook



The oft-mentioned method of selection of the Australian International Team has again been under discussion among many who favour our present system, and also by those who are opposed.

As a matter of interest it has been decided to publish the rules governing "International" selection in the England Team. This year the Home country teams will shoot in Dublin, Ireland. The rules for selection read:

1. During the previous calendar year (1958) have shot at a minimum of 500 birds in Down-the-Line events in Great Britain, in series of 50 or 100, the scores of which shall have been received in writing or recorded by the C.P.S.A., and

2. In the year of the next International Tournament (1959) and prior to the English Open Down-the-Line Championship Meeting therein, shoot at a minimum of 400 birds in Down-the-Line events in Great Britain, in series of 50 or 100, the scores of which shall be received in writing, or recorded by the C.P.S.A., and

3. Shoot over the 200 birds of the English Open Down-the-Line Championship Meeting of 1959.

The actual selection of the team will be made by the International Team Selection Sub-Committee, which has been appointed by the Executive Committee, and their decision will be final.

The Captain and Vice-captain of the England team for 1959 have been selected as follows: Captain, E. Horlock; Vice-captain, E. Fear. (Fear is

well known in Australia as a member of the two-men English Olympic Team at Laverton in 1956.)

The members of the International Team Selection Sub-Committee for 1959 are: Messrs. A. E. Browning (chairman), T. S. Bamber, A. J. Beal, E. Fear, W. E. Harris, W. J. Sable, P. Stanbury, and E. Horlock (ex officio).

In order to qualify for a possible place in the England team of 1960, competitors will be required to shoot a minimum of 800 birds in 1959 in Down-the-Line events in Great Britain, in series of 50 or 100, the scores of which must be received in writing or recorded by the C.P.S.A. Conditions 1. and 2. above will also apply in respect of 1960.

The Single Barrel and Handicap-by-Distance Championships of the C.P.S.A. will, if necessary, be taken into account in arriving at a competitor's minimum number of birds referred to in condition 1. above.

The foregoing conditions, whilst quite satisfactory from an English viewpoint, would be completely unworkable in a country as large as Australia. The Australian conditions, which are well known, and leave no heartburnings, are very simple. The best or top thirty scorers in the Australian National Double-barrel Championship automatically become the Australian International Team for the year current. The Australian system has proved itself over the years and getting into the team is merely a matter of "being in form" in the event mentioned.

A club recently wrote the Association requesting to know whether "a break may be carried on even though there may be an interval between the shoots". A break may be shot over one day's competition only. But a break may be carried on over two days if the club conducting the shoot happens to be shooting a two-day programme. However, it should be remembered that break sequences are only recognised if shot under single or double-barrel conditions and in competition. If a shooter takes part in any other class of event or practice between single or double-barrel events, his break automatically concludes. All events other than single or double-barrel are considered, for break recognition, as being in the novelty class and are not taken into account in a break sequence.

Another point which has been noticed when break claims have been lodged, is that a shooter in a tie shoot, after his opponents have dropped out, has been allowed to shoot on until he misses and then claim a break up to the point where he misses. This is not permitted, because the shooter was actually, after his opponents had dropped out, "not shooting in competition".

Again, clubs are also reminded that break claims are only recognised if compiled over an automatic trap. Claims for a break shot over any trap other than one "automatically angled" cannot be recognised.

An unusual request came from an interstate claim last month, in that it requested advice as to its right to claim a nominal "entrance" fee to club shoots of 2/- per head. The club pointed out that it was customary to supply afternoon tea free to all — shooters and spectators alike. If the club was carrying out its part of what appears to be an unwritten contract, i.e. supplying refreshments free to all, then it would seem that the 2/- per head charge is quite a legitimate one, and there are few, shooters or spectators, who could cavil at what seems to be a very reasonable charge for the service provided. In fact, unless all the food supply was supplied by voluntary workers to the club, it would also appear that the club was undercharging for the service rendered.

An intending competitor at the A.C.T.A. National Championship shooting series, which starts at Bankstown, N.S.W. on May 1, has sought information on the matter of "Special Cartridges" as quoted in the conditions of the championships. It has been pointed out that these "special cartridges" have been carefully tested by the makers and they are, in fact, one of the best and also one of the fastest shells produced in Australia. In this regard the Association has always maintained that a uniform shell must be used in the National Championships in order to ensure that every competitor takes part using identical shells. Hence the reason for the stipulation of "special cartridges". The "special" shells are available from the Association office and are required to be purchased when lodging entries.

A South Australian shooter has written the Association requesting that "the rule for loading and unloading of guns on the mark be enforced or the rule deleted—I hate to see cartridges carried in guns by shooters—this is done by many of our champions".

The matter is a question of efficient refereeing. No shooter should load his gun until he is facing the trap and about to shoot. Too often one hears of rattle of cartridges being inserted in automatic weapons behind a competitor's back. This should be stopped at once by the referee. In this regard it is well to again recall the Association's laid-down "Safety Rules". These are, "The shooter must not:

(1) Load his gun until he actually steps to the firing mark in his turn.

(2) Turn away from the firing mark until he opens his gun — and removes the cartridge — if for some reason he did not shoot.

(3) Put two cartridges in his gun when shooting single-barrel only. It is strictly against the rules and very dangerous.

(4) Shoot at any "bird" when it is out of bounds.

(5) Close his gun when it is pointing toward spectators or other shooters.

Whilst discussing "Safety Rules" it is also of interest to outline details of a calendar issued by the English

gunsmithing firm of C. S. Rosson & Coy. The firm gets into poetic jargon, but nevertheless the words are worth emphasis. The calendar reads:

Never, never let your gun
Pointed be at any one;

The foregoing should be remembered by all shooters, whether in the field or on the shooting track.

... Vintage Preferred ...

Where guns and motor cars are concerned, I am one of the growing band of enthusiasts who prefer to use a "vintage" piece rather than a mass-produced modern article. The preference is quite practical. I shall never own a new Purdey or a Rolls-Bentley, so I choose what I consider is the next best thing, a vintage gun and motor car. My car is 28 years old next week, and as good as the day it was made.

At this point I must make the distinction between "vintage" and "antique". A vintage product is something made in a particular period when design and workmanship were at their best, and still capable of good service in every-day use. On the other hand, an antique implies a much older piece that is kept for beauty or rarity, more to be looked at than to be actually used. The dividing line between the two is vague, but Edwardian motor cars and muzzle-loaders are antiques, and bull-nosed Morrisies and 1905 guns are vintage. I know that veteran cars and muzzle-loaders are still used by dedicated enthusiasts, but I think we owe a duty to posterity to preserve

them, or at the most bring them out only on special occasions such as the "Brighton Run" or once a year at Bisley. In time, of course, vintage will become antique, and earn their places in museums.

An Expensive Business

Nobody but those in the film-star class can afford to order a "best" gun today at £500 plus, but we ordinary folk might manage to scrape up £5 to £50. This is barely enough to buy a factory-made double-barrel gun today, but for the same money we can get a "best" gun of yesterday, used, but by no means worn out. I do not think there is any question as to which is the better bargain, unless, of course, you like paying Tax.

I learned my lesson in guns during the war. In the R.A.F. I had six new guns of a well-known make, identical to those sold today for £55, for clay pigeon shooting. We kept careful records, and after about ten thousand rounds every gun was continually "in dock" for broken springs or tightening, etc. After another ten thousand, the guns were too shaky to be worth

further attention, although I admit the barrels were still good. I appreciate that constant daily use by raw beginners is hardly "fair wear and tear", but let us compare them with some "vintage" guns used at the same time. My staff and I used a few "best" guns, selected and bought for service use. My own Moore and Grey sidelock ejector with Damascus barrels was made in 1904, and after a recorded fifty thousand rounds, was just as tight and good as new, apart from a very natural smoothness of the chequering. This particular gun was 38 years old when it came into my hands, and neither this nor any other of the best guns needed any workshop attention in three years of hard daily use. All the guns were meticulously cleaned every day.

Naturally, there is more than an element of luck in the purchase of a vintage piece, as I propose to call any gun made from, say, 1890 to 1914, but when "vintage" becomes merely "second-hand" is anybody's guess; shall we say the early "twenties"? Vintage guns in mint condition are still to be found (I bought one for £10), but they get rarer every year. My own preference is for hammer rather than hammerless, and Damascus over steel barrels. I know that Damascus is softer than steel and more likely to damage, but barrels of this make are sweeter to shoot and never give me the gun headache I get after 50 shots down a steel barrel.

I always put quality first in the choice of a gun (or car), in that I would prefer a best gun with pitted barrels rather than a second best in mint condition. Provided that the basic quality is there, and the weapon is tight and sound, a few pits in the barrels are of little account. In one respect, outside hammers and a pit or two in the barrels are a good argument for persuading the seller to part up with the gun at a reasonable price!

There is something obvious, but indefinable about a good quality vintage gun. It is a beautiful thing to look at, to handle, and to shoot. It is most unlikely that anything will go wrong with it, given a little loving attention, and it is very probable that it can be passed on to a son or grand-

son in due course. Can one say the same about any modern weapon costing less than £100?

In the last 60 years there has been unheard-of technological progress, and one might well imagine that the shotgun of today is as much in advance of a 1900 model as is a 1958 car over a horseless carriage, but such is not the case. There have been no significant improvements in shotgun design in 50 years, but only perfections of detail.

In essence, the buyer of a gun pays for the number of man-hours of human labour that have been spent in the making of it. That is why a mass-produced weapon is "cheap", and a hand-made one so fantastically "expensive" today. Compared with labour, the cost of the raw materials in a quality gun is almost negligible. This basic fact of economics explains why a good old gun is such a bargain, in the sense that one buys a great deal of old-time craftsmanship with the cheap money of the present. In 1900 the "best gun that money could buy" was about eighty golden sovereigns, or, put in another way, the price of a year's wages of a skilled craftsman. This same gun, if made today, would still cost the equivalent of a year's wages, i.e. £600 and more.

Ruined by Neglect

I suspect that it is a very special gun that is wholly hand-made nowadays, and that ordinary "best" guns contain machine work that has been hand-finished. They are none the worse for this, of course, but they are not quite the same as hand-made. It is still possible today to buy a vintage gun for the same number of pounds it cost to make 50 years ago. Naturally, it will be more or less worn (but not worn out) and I cannot think of a better bargain. It was a tradition that best guns were made to the highest possible standards of materials and workmanship, regardless of cost. We have all seen fine old guns ruined by neglect, but it is rare to find one that has been worn out by fair wear and tear.

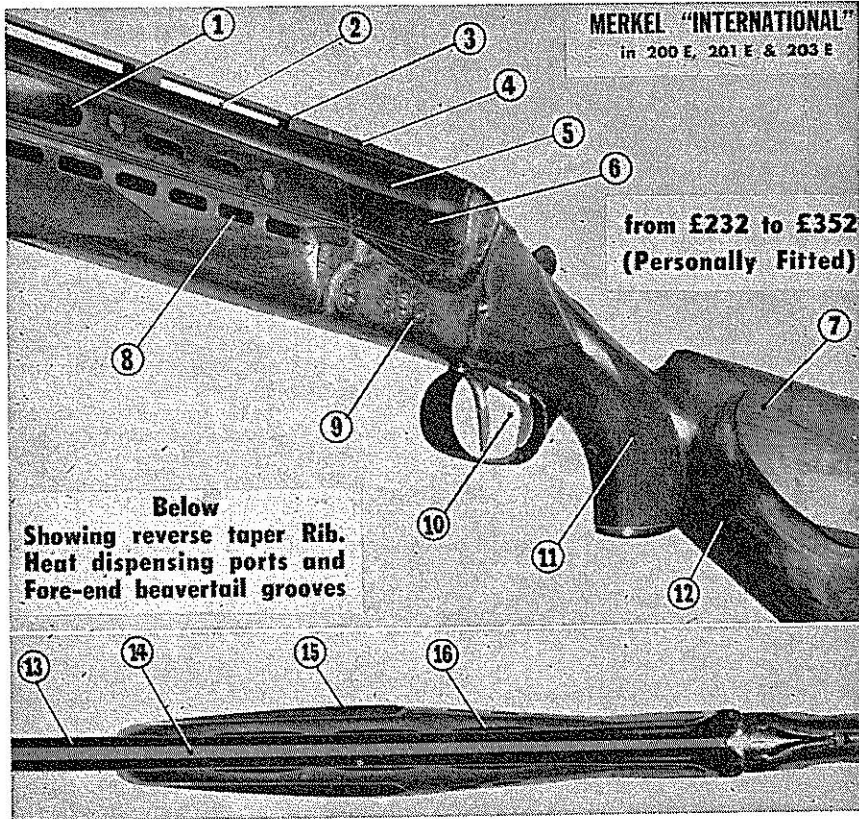
It goes without saying that any old gun, vintage or otherwise, should be nitro-proofed. Many old guns were voluntarily sent for nitro-proof after

the turn of the century, but it was not obligatory as it is today. Sending a fine old gun for proof is a gamble at which you win . . . whatever happens. If the gun successfully passes proof, its value is enhanced in that it can be sold or used without any misgivings. On the other, if it

fails proof, then you may have saved yourself (or a fellow shooting man) a lot of grief. If you are a nervous type, then persuade the seller to have it nitro-proved at his risk. This will either save you the loss of a gun, or cost you about double the price you might have paid for unproved.

OUT OF THE PAST Twenty Years Ago

Early in May 1939 the Nobel Clay Pigeon Shooting Club—the pioneer club of inanimate target shooting in Australia—wrote "Finis" to its old home and shooting grounds at West Footscray (Victoria). The area was taken over for factory premises.

It was fitting that one of the Nobel Club's pioneer members, the late Charles Corbett, should gain chief honours for the day on the occasion of the club's farewell shoot at West Footscray. Many of the "original few" made a special effort to be present on the final day and a big field of 54 shooters faced up to the traps. Corbett registered a break of 36 straight, which was the best of the day and gained him the I.C.I. spoon. Corbett also won the first event of the day, finished second to Athol Love, 24/25, in the second contest. As a matter of historical interest the full results of the final day at Nobel's follows: No. 1, 5 targets D.B., nine possibles, tie shoot, C. Corbett 12/12, D. B. O'Callaghan 11/12, Frank Landells 8/9, Harry Parsons 7/8, A. J. Byers, the late Jack Cattanaach, J. Weir 6/7, "Wang" (Eric Wangeman) and George Cope-

land 5/6. No. 2 (same), eight possibles, tie shoot, Athol Love 25/25, the late C. Corbett 24/25, "Blackie" (Roy Blackwood) 12/13, the late Harry McIntosh (Seymour) 11/12, the late Bill Reid (Seymour) 16/17, R. W. Delaney 9/10, Reg Oakley 6/7, "Duxbac" (Horrie James) 5/6. No. 3 (same), ten possibles, tie shoot, R. J. Baxter (Casterton) 12/12, Reg Oakley 14/15, the late Ted Parow 13/15, "Duxbac" (Horrie James) 8/9, the late Jack Reid (Seymour) 7/8, the late Bert Anquetil, W. Olsen, Trevor Bruhn 6/7, "Jock" (Jock Wilson) and "Wang" 5/6. No. 4 (same), ten possibles, tie shoot, late Harry McIntosh 13/14, George Taylor 8/9. No. 5 (same), divided R. J. Baxter, D. B. O'Callaghan, Harry Parsons and late Harry McIntosh 5/5. An attached trophy was divided by O'Callaghan and Parsons. The day was a gala day, but there were many regrets that the old ground was passing.

The first International Match was reported as being fixed for June 12, with the competing teams, England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales and Australia.

Ten Years Ago

In May 1949 Jack Bryant Senr. of Blackburn gained his 50th trapshooting title when he shot 19/20 to win the Coburg Club's Single-barrel Championship of that year. Lance Small, who recently left Victoria, was reported as "creating a surprise" when he won the Metropolitan Single-barrel Championship on the 35th round (score 32/35), outstaying none

other than Jack Bryant Senr. A £100 Handicap conducted by the Goulburn Club (N.S.W.) was won by Arnold Bennett, formerly of St. George, Q. He gained main honours with the moderate score of 18/20. W.
