## The Editor's Notebook



**SHOOTERS' HANDICAPS ON REGISTRATION.** The question of the right handicap for a shooter when he is registered by his club is one that comes in for frequent discussion. In many instances clubs submit names of shooters, but frequently fail to give the Association a guide as to the respective shooters' ability or trapshooting experience. This has happened so often this year that the Association has experienced no end of queries from new shooters as to "why their marks are so and so".

It should be remembered by those submitting lists of registrations, and also individuals, that it is most essential to give the Association some inkling of each shooter's gun handling ability and also indicate whether he has had some trapshooting experience or field shooting knowledge. As an example, it is nothing short of absurdity for shooter to be placed on the front-mark when he has had previous experience, possibly at live targets or field practice. Also the same angle applies when a definite novice shooter is registered by his club and the Association office, having no knowledge of the particular shooter's right handicap, places him on 16 yards. If he happens to be a complete novice, he immediately writes down to the Association demanding to know why he has been placed on 16 yards. In the case instanced the Association, having no knowledge of the shooter's ability, placed him on 16 yards in accordance with the regulations. However, due to lack of knowledge, the Association office has no option but to ensure that

such an individual is not a "dark horse" and accordingly has to protect the other registered shooters, hence a 16-yard mark. In order to bring about uniformity in this matter, club secretaries are asked, when registering shooters, to indicate whether those being registered are (1) complete novices and indifferent gun handlers, (2) have had some experience in the field and gun handling, (3) have had some experience over the traps, (4) indicate what, in the secretary/handicapper's knowledge, would be a reasonable handicap for the shooter concerned. By carrying out these simple items of co-operation much time would be saved and also much more efficiency would eventuate and also, above all other features, shooters would be better pleased with the initial handicap.

**BREAK RECOGNITION.** As is generally known, the Association makes available break badges in recognition of sequences of 50, 75, 100, 150 and 200 made by shooters from time to time provided, and this is very important, the breaks are compiled in legitimate competition. Recently a claim was lodged with the Association for a 75-break badge. The necessary score sheets were forwarded covering a 50 run by the shooter. Later a further sheet was received by the Association showing where the shooter had continued on in the company of two others and registered altogether a 75 break unfinished. On investigation by the

Association it was found that the shooter concerned had compiled 50 in regular competition. After the presentation of trophies and to all intents and purposes when the regulation shoot was finished, the shooter got two of his friends (making a squad of three in all) and shot on in order to endeavour to secure a 75-break badge. This the shooter accomplished, but, of course, the last section of the break could not be allowed, as the run between 50 and 75 was not made in regular "competition". It should be noted by all interested that breaks can only be recognised by the A.C.T.A. when made in competition, and then only under double and single-barrel conditions. Also when a break is compiled, the actual score sheets must be forwarded to the Association for perusal and confirmation. If these directions are carried out, the appropriate badge will be on the way to the shooter concerned within 24 hours.

**MIXED BIRDS (WALK-UP SECTION).** A query reached the Association recently seeking information as to the correct method of shooting targets in the walk-up section of a mixed birds title event. The questioner stated that he considered the shooter should stand on the 22-yard mark and commence walking, the target being released between the 20 and 15-yard mark. The questioner was perfectly correct. The other opinion forwarded indicated that the shooter stand on the 23-yard mark with the target released between the 21 and 16 yard. This latter view was accepted by the club concerned despite the fact that the shooter who forwarded the query produced a copy of the A.C.T.A. Championship Conditions Brochure. It should be borne in mind that the A.C.T.A. Championship Conditions Brochure has been prepared expressly for the use of clubs conducting open championships, Commonwealth, State and District titles, and the rules laid down in the Brochure, should be observed to the full. The only difference in shooting conditions existing from those laid down in the official Brochure concern Deauville Doubles, where now there are four men on

the track instead of two. Details of actual Deauville Doubles conditions were published in previous issues.

**SHOOTING BEHIND HANDICAP.** Clubs and shooters are advised that the Executive Committee has instructed that all shooters must shoot off their regular handicap at all times. A report from a Victorian country club indicated that certain shooters were taking it upon themselves to shoot behind their mark at any time they felt so inclined. This practice is not permitted and a shooter continuing to shoot behind his proper mark, after being duly warned, should be disqualified from the competition. If by any chance a shooter should be shooting from behind his mark and win from the mark he has chosen, he thereupon must accept the new mark as his regular handicap.

**FORWARD MOVEMENT.** A shooter recently wrote the Association asking "how many years does a shooter have to remain unregistered before he loses his handicap mark and comes forward"? The answer is very simple. A shooter once having attained a handicap and then retiring and later coming back into the sport, should resume on the mark he held when he dropped out. Just because he has dropped out is no reason whatever for expecting a better mark on returning. A shooter can be likened to a racehorse—he must perform to be handicapped. If a racehorse is turned out for a period, he does not necessarily come back weighted at pounds under the weight he was running with when he dropped out of active racing. Shooters can only be brought forward on the recommendation of a club, and then only if the club concerned outlines his performances on an Official Handicap Return Form. Forms are available from the Association if none happen to be on hand.

# Longevity of Animals

The oldest dog whose claim seems allowable was 34, but one of over 20 is exceptional, and 18 a remarkably good age for the average pet. Cats, however, do live rather longer and specimens known to be 39, 31 and 27 are recorded, and many over 20 are known. The longest reliably accurate span for a whale is 37 years, but it is generally thought that the larger whales normally reach 30 or over—if the whalers let them. At the other end of the size scale insects have notoriously short lives, although a tapeworm once lived inside a man for 35 years.

### Longer Lived in Captivity

In all these cases the records of creatures kept in artificial captivity are longer than they would be for wild creatures. The hazards of nature are such that real old age is comparatively rare and is achieved only by fluke or good fortune. Loss of vigour, failing eyesight, and above all, deteriorating teeth, take their swift toll in the wild, leaving only a tiny proportion of the original population to enjoy a lengthy span. In a cage things are different: food is always plentiful without the need for hunting, there is permanent shelter and freedom from enemies. Even accidents are seldom met with. The 25-year-old fox in captivity is really abnormal, for its opposite number in the wild of about 14 or 15 is ancient, with broken teeth, scarred muzzle and grizzled, emaciated body. There is a good record of a wild tiger of 17, but among the smaller hunters the weasel is decrepit at only 8. Badgers may live to be 16 or so, and they are closely followed, surprisingly enough, by toads, which do live much longer than either frogs or what people imagine. Generally speaking, the smaller and more prolific the creature, the shorter its average expectation of life.

The oldest known bird is always said to be the mute swan shot in Derbyshire in 1887, bearing a ring

on one leg dated either 1717 or 1711, which seems to indicate that it was at least 170 years old at the time of its death. An eagle shot in France in 1845 was found to be wearing a metal collar with a Latin inscription indicating that the bird had been used for falconry in the Caucasus in 1750, over 90 years before. Both these cases, if true, are quite exceptional. The raven is probably the commonest bird Methuselah: records to 69 are known. Others surviving for over half a century include pelicans and condors, 52; eagle-owl, 68; golden eagle, 56. Amongst captive birds the parrots achieve the greatest age; 140 is about the record here, but a number of parrots have lived well over the century, including one of 125. Cockatoos also enjoy long life, several reaching their nineties without loss of perkiness, although baldness and loss of memory are usual.

Really old age amongst truly wild birds is difficult to prove, but is undoubtedly infrequent. A magpie at 30, an Arctic skua at 25, a chaffinch at 17 and several duck at 14 are all probably maximum ages. Indeed, to reach 10 is a feat for most small birds, and larger birds of 20 or so are quite uncommon.

All in all, man with his three-score years and ten, fares better than most of his fellow creatures. Only the silent, immutable trees make him look a mere baby.









## OUT OF THE PAST Twenty Years Ago


Although this section indicates reference to happenings of 20 years ago, it would seem that a little digression from the hard and fast "20 years ago" would not be out of place.

Delving through the archives and finding records of the early years of the Association, the writer discovered the Roll Book for the first Official Referee examination held in May, 1939. It is interesting to recall the "students" who attended the two personal lectures on refereeing delivered by Horrie James. The Roll shows the following names: the late T. J. Saville, S. F. Dunster, K. G. Rice, E. A. Nicholl, R. W. Delaney, A. J. Byers, the late C. Corbett, Tom Almond, C. Wignell, Gordon Tilly, R. A. Blackwood, W. A. Howe, D. Dihm, E. Wangeman, the late Harry Watts, D. Watson, Percy Dennis, A. Snow, T. R. Wightman, Harry Burrows, W. Twyerould, W. McCullough and W. J. Hanran of Townsville (Q.), who underwent the Referee test by post—the first man in Australia to do this. All succeeded in passing the Referee test except W. A. Howe and D. Dihm, neither of whom are now connected with the sport. It is of

interest to note that Tom Almond was a member of the original class. He is today still an Official Referee as well as a Referee Examiner, and refereed during the recent A.C.T.A. National Championships and International Match at Southport (Q.) in June.

Another interesting item discovered recently was a copy of the First Annual Report and Statement of Receipts and Expenditure, which was placed before delegates at the annual meeting on December 2, 1937, at Tattersalls Buildings, Melbourne. Office-bearers of 1937 were: President, H. G. James; Vice-Presidents, Messrs. J. M. Wilson, F. R. Hockey, L. L. Schilling, Lt. Colonel W. Bridgeford (now Major-General, retired); Executive Committee, Messrs. the late A. P. Cooke, R. W. Delaney, E. E. Simpson, the late B. Anquetil, E. S. Lyons; Treasurer, Reg. W. Hawke; Hon. Secretary, W. McCullough. The Association then had a panel of handicappers (but no formula), and this panel comprised the late E. J. Parow, the late Lew Bertram and E. S. Lyons. The Association's credit balance at end of 1937 was the minute sum of £51/8/0.

berwell C.T.C. at North Balwyn. The report of the period states that Bryant also won this same title at Seymour in 1939.

**Ten Years Ago**

Peter Wray, then a 12-year-old, was fast coming under notice at this period. He has since developed into one of the best all-round trapshots in the Commonwealth.

A report of this period included a mention of Keith Cameron of Roma, being "brought up shooting butterflies on the wing with a pea rifle". This has not been confirmed.

The 1950 Club Mixed Birds title of the Coburg Club went to Jack McCraith with a score 16/20. Runner-up was the now seldom heard of shooter "Peters" with 15/20; Clem Mudford was third, 19/25.

Bill O'Brien and Ted Matthews, still stalwarts of the Holbrook Club in the Riverina, were under notice

with equal top scores in a £25 Handicap. They cut.

An interesting contest, about this time, is reported from Townsville, where the rifle club members and gun club members did battle in a teams' contest. Conditions were that 24 men from each organisation would shoot with the opposite weapons, i.e. gun shooters shooting on the rifle range with .303's, and rifle shooters later facing up to the traps with 12 gauge. After a really strenuous encounter the gun club team was declared the winner by 1 point. This type of contest could be encouraged in other centres.

M. Colbeck, T. Cannon and Neil Frith divided a \$50 Handicap at Cressy, Tasmania, in July 1950.

**A MAN AND HIS GUN.**

At the Geraldton Gun Club's Handicap Skeet event, conducted at the club grounds on Sunday, 22nd May, something of interest to all shooters throughout the Commonwealth climaxed one of the best day's shooting of this club.

A shoot-off was witnessed for the B Grade event between Sam Zorino and Bill Heath, popular Treasurer of the club and ardent worker for the local R.S.L. Branch. Zorino proved on the day too good for his opponent, but the satisfaction shown on the face of Bill was worth going miles to see.

For some time past, Bill's gun has been the subject of discussion among members, due to the fact that his care of his "blunderbus" has been rather disconcerting to them whilst shooting; it has been stated that his "side-by-side" has been wrongly constructed and that the mirror finish on the outside of his barrels should have naturally been inside; it has been argued that at the completion of each shoot Bill has most carefully sand-papered the outside of his barrels to prevent rust; all shooters will agree how easy it would be on a bright summer's day to be on the next trap to Bill, whose gun gives off the appearance of a bushfire.

In conversation with Bill after the event it was learnt that 50 years ago, at the age of 16 years, he won his present gun, which he has used consistently ever since, as a first prize in a clay bird event in England. The trophy at that time was valued at £15/15/0. A field of 96 shooters faced the traps on that day. Five automatic traps were used and only one shooter was allowed on the track at the one time. The trapper sat behind a steel shield and controlled the five traps with five strings, the shooter having no idea at any time which trap would be fired; the event was also conducted on the miss-and-out basis, and eventually only Bill and another were left in the competition. Bill's opponent dropped one and, to Bill's delight, his next bird was, as he says, a "sitter", a left swinger high up, and silhouetted against a large fir tree covered with snow, he said, "Even I couldn't miss it. When asked if it was his intention to trade his firearm for the more modern type, his reply was, "This hasn't done too bad a job so far, and I think it will do me for quite some time yet."


