





The Editor's Notebook



THANKS TO I.C.I.A.N.Z. LIMITED. With the success of the recent A.C.T.A. National and International shoot at Southport, Queensland, fresh in the minds of those who had the good fortune to take part, it would seem appropriate at this time to again refer to the sterling support given to shooters, through the A.C.T.A., by I.C.I.A.N.Z. Limited.

It is pointed out that shooters taking part in the National series each year enjoy the cheapest shooting competition available anywhere in the Southern Hemisphere, and this factor is entirely due to the already mentioned support given by the I.C.I. Company.

As a matter of interest it is mentioned that I.C.I.A.N.Z. Limited supply free of charge all the clay targets used in the now time-honoured Champion of Champions Cup. This year, due to the shorter hours of daylight, it was found necessary to reduce the number of targets in this contest. Nevertheless the Company's donation to this event alone would be in the region of £150. In addition to this handsome donation the Company provides, free of any charge whatever, the cartridges and clay targets used in the Australian section of the annual International Match. As each man in this event shoots at 100 targets, it will be understood that again the Company is providing a very handsome subsidy for the shooters taking part.

In recent years the Company has also sponsored the Air-Fare Handicap in each State, and this also runs into

a figure well over £300. In connection with this event much regret has been expressed that greater interest has not been displayed in the Air-Fare Handicap, so much so that it could mean that the event will be dropped from the Company's list of contributions in the future.

It is also mentioned that the Company contributes annually £150 towards the running costs of the annual A.C.T.A. Interstate Match for "The Great Britain & Ireland" Trophy. Whilst this amount does not completely cover the actual costs (the A.C.T.A. provides the balance), the £150 allocation is a substantial donation and greatly assists the A.C.T.A. in the running of the contest.

In addition to conducting shooting schools, the Company also assists the A.C.T.A. with staff personnel during the running of the National and International series. The officers supplied are highly efficient personnel and this factor adds greatly to the efficient staff work connected with the administration of the big shooting series.

From the foregoing it will be observed that the Company's backing of the A.C.T.A. with its many donations does much to keep the cost of running the National and International series within reasonable bounds and provides the competitors with the cheapest shooting possible.

It is also well known that the Company donates a handsome trophy each year to each affiliated club for club competition.

The Company's donations to the sport of clay target shooting each year run into big figures and it is desired to officially thank the Company for its support both to the A.C.T.A. affiliated clubs and shooters generally.

CANADA WINS INTERNATIONAL MATCH. Advice from London indicates that Canada has won the 1960 International Match with a total of 2955/3000 points, with Australia again in second position, 2914/3000. South Africa was third, 2850 points. Then followed England 2837, New Zealand 2804, Scotland 2778, Wales 2715, Central Africa 2688, and Ireland 2597.

The win by Canada is the first by that Dominion in the now celebrated International Match for the Donald Mackintosh Cup. As predicted in these columns last year, Canada was expected to improve, and improve rapidly, and now the Canadians are an established force, it could be that the other Empire countries could be in for a lean time. It should be remembered that Canada, like America, specializes in single-barrel shooting, hence having established themselves as first-barrel shots, the second barrel really becomes a prize winner for those who failed to cover the target with their initial barrel.

At all events Australia offers heartiest congratulations to our Canadian kinsmen on the occasion of their first win in the International contest.

Australia must surely be the unluckiest contestant ever in an International series. Australia has run second in five out of the last six International contests — the other occasion Australia won (last year). However, the great thing, so far as Australia is concerned, is to have taken part and worthily held up the name of Australia in the sporting sphere. Our shooters have surely done this.

The method of selection of the Australian team is unlikely to be changed, despite frequent barbs cast in the direction of those who administer the system of selection. Aus-

tralia has found, by the severe means of experience and possibly "trial and error", that taking the top 30 scorers in the National Double-barrel title leaves little room for quibble and disappointment. If a shooter is good enough on the day of the National Double-barrel title, well he then wins himself a place as an International to represent his country against the rest of the British Commonwealth in the field of clay target shooting.

Scores of the Australian Team in the 1960 International are published elsewhere in this issue.

NEW ZEALANDERS VISIT NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS. An official party of 16 New Zealanders attended the A.C.T.A. National Championships and International fixture at Southport early in June. The party included the Secretary of the New Zealand Gun Clubs' Association, Mr. W. H. Stewart, of Dunedin, who was accompanied by Mrs. Stewart.

The party was officially welcomed by the President of the A.C.T.A. The party was also welcomed and farewelled at a small function arranged by the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee at the Huntingdon Country Club at Southport. Speakers included the A.C.T.A. President (John Houston), Bill Rainbird of Launceston, Allan Brown, the Captain of the New Zealand Team; Jim McKenzie of Seaward Downs (N.Z.), the Champion of Champions winner, and others. A surprise gesture of goodwill at the function was the presentation of the South Coast Club's official flag to the New Zealand party by the South Coast Club President, Andy Gordon.

The A.C.T.A. was officially presented with a specially made cigarette box, made from selected and rare New Zealand timber, as a memento of the New Zealand Team's visit. The box was suitably inscribed.

The actual official teams' match between Australia and New Zealand produced a most desirable and unexpected result — a tie. Conditions of the teams' match were six men a side, with best five scores to count, shooting at 20 targets per man from 16 yards, double-barrel.

As the occasion was the first Teams' contest between New Zealand and Australia, it was mutually agreed that a shoot-off would not take place and the result would remain on the records as officially a tie. All parties were happy with this decision.

The A.C.T.A. presented a silver inscribed salver for the high-gun of the New Zealand Team, and in view of the tie it was decided to obtain a result for this individual award during the following event on the programme. Ultimately the trophy went to H. C. Walker of Kurow, South Island, N.Z., with the good score of 59/60.

Now that the "isolation" between New Zealand and Australian shooters has been broken, it is expected that regular official visits will be made to the National shooting carnivals of each Dominion in alternate years. It will be Australia's turn to return the visit in 1961, and those interested in making the New Zealand trip in 1961 should advise the A.C.T.A. Secretary, in due course, of their intention so that names can be listed for preparation of an Australian Official Team.

HANDICAPPING. Quite a number of club handicappers appear to have the mistaken idea that once a shooter has competed in three programmes without a cut, he automatically goes

forward one yard. This is not so. The proper interpretation of this clause in the handicapping formula is that it should only be used where it can be proved that a shooter is over-handicapped. It would mean, under the present interpretation of some local handicappers, that shooters by "sitting back" could work in from a back mark to front markers' yardage in a very short time. Such is not the correct interpretation.

TWENTY - FOURTH ANNUAL MEETING OF A.C.T.A. The 24th Annual Meeting of affiliated club delegates was held in the R.S.L. Hall, Southport, Qld., on Sunday, June 12, 1960. The originally advertised time of starting was 10.30 a.m., but, due to a prolonged tie shoot which had to be carried over from the previous day at the shooting grounds, the starting time of the meeting was deferred until 2.15 p.m. The Chairman (John Houston) welcomed delegates and members of the Executive Committee who were present and also took the opportunity of congratulating Miss Pam Coxon, delegate for Isisford Gun Club (Q.), on being the first lady shooter to gain a place in Australia's International Team.

The minutes, annual report and financial statement, as printed, were adopted.

Appointment of Auditor. Mr. K. D. Courtney, Chartered Accountant, of Melbourne, who has been auditor to the Association for over 20 years, was re-appointed at the fee of 20 guineas.

H. G. James was elected a Life Honorary Vice-President of the A.C.T.A. Speakers commented on his pioneering work in the interests of the sport and the Association. He was the Association's first Chairman.

G. S. Martin was appointed an Honorary Vice-President of the Association. He is a former President of the South Coast Gun Club (Q.).

The proposal to increase shooters' registration fee from 20/- to 30/- was rejected after three counts and finally a division had been taken. Many speakers stressed the importance of increased fees, whilst others took the opposite view. A two thirds

majority was necessary and the voting was 36 for and 20 against raising the registration fee.

The Executive Committee of the Association was granted permission to re-write the Constitutional Rules of the Association. Same to be then submitted to an annual meeting of delegates for approval and ratification.

The proposal by the Townsville Club that skeet shooting rules be not altered and remain as in the past was rejected. International Shooting Union rules for skeet shooting now become the skeet shooting rules of the A.C.T.A.

The motion by the Croydon Club that walk-up competitions be conducted on the five-track shooting system (instead of the centre track) was not accepted. Walk-up conditions, therefore, remain unchanged.

The motion, also from Croydon Club, that the rules for Deauville Doubles be altered to read, "Should there be a misfire or any other reason for a shooter not shooting, which is not any fault of the shooter himself, another pair of birds be given," was agreed to. The motion, also from Croydon Club, regarding State selection of referee groups was not accepted.

The motion from Colac Club regarding closure of all nominations for offices in the Association two months before the advertised date of the following annual meeting, was not accepted.

Election of Office-bearers. The Chairman requested former President, Mr. J. M. Wilson, to take over the Chair during the election of office-bearers. Mr. Wilson, on assuming the Chair, arranged for Messrs. G. S. Martin and J. Schifferle to act as scrutineers. Both agreed to accept this duty.

Mr. Wilson stated that as there was only one nomination for that of President, Mr. John Houston, he would declare him elected. Mr. Houston responded.

Elections were necessary in three States, Tasmania, Victoria and Queensland, as the number of nominations exceeded positions available on the Executive Committee in the States mentioned.

After the elections had taken place, the following results were announced by the Chairman: **Tasmania**, Messrs. Rex Powell and W. E. H. Rainbird; **Victoria**, Messrs. E. G. Biggs, C. R. Fletcher, A. Pedersen and J. H. Headland; **Queensland**, Messrs. R. H. Moyse, L. S. R. Stewart and J. M. Tyquin. The retiring members, Messrs. Hudson, Soames, Moore and Mott, were re-elected for the N.S.W. section of the Executive Committee. Mr. Frank Bailey was elected to represent Western Australia and Mr. J. Woodrow for South Australia.

The meeting closed on a vote of thanks to the Chair.

A.C.T.A. National Shoot

The A.C.T.A. 1960 National Championships and International Match were held on the grounds of the South Coast Gun Club at Southport, Queensland, for only the second time (the first being in 1957), when the opening shots were fired on June 10 last. The attendance was the smallest for many years. Fewer than 200 Australian shooters competed. The proceedings were enriched by the attendance of a party of sixteen New Zealanders who made the trip across

the Tasman especially to take part, as well as providing a New Zealand official team of six men.

Fine weather prevailed throughout the four days of competition shooting — in fact, the days could be described at near perfection for shooting.

Proceedings opened on Friday morning, June 10, with the National Single-barrel Championship, 40 targets from 16 yards, single-barrel. Four secured possibles. The tie shoot only went 10 rounds, with R. Middle-

The National Double-barrel Cham-pionship on Saturday, June 11, drew an entry of 203, about 35 to 40 down on normal numbers. Match conditions were 60 targets from 16 yards, double-barrel, both barrels equal value. Twenty secured possibles and a similar number scored 59/60's. The top 30 became the Australian Inter-

national Team for 1960. Tie shoots of long duration were necessary to bring about winners and positions in the big team. Ultimately the placings were: K. Patterson (Foster, V.) 130/130 (first), Newton Thomas (Mel-bourne) second 129/130, R. Middleton (Texas, Q.) third 114/115, then followed Doug. Smith (Q.) 104/105, C. Ferguson (Q.) 99/100, N. Pitta-way (South Coast, Q.) 99/100, F. Hudson (N.S.W.) 95/95, H. S. Smith (Brisbane, Q.) 89/90, W. N. Rodda (Melbourne, V.) 89/90; Leo Haseler (Clara Creek, Q.) 89/90, Jack Blake (Cressy, Tas.) 89/90, W. Charlton (N.S.W.) 79/80, C. Heath (Bairns-dale, V.) 79/80, D. D. A notable performance during the series was the effort of Miss Pam Coxon of Isisford, Q., who shot brilliantly in the National Double-barrel Championship to gain herself a place in the Australian Interna-tional Team for 1960. Miss Coxon is the first lady shooter to achieve this honour. To commemorate her success she was presented with a suitably mounted picture of the Australian International Team of 1960 by the A.C.T.A. President, John Houston.

Alf Hall, now of Berriwillock, was very successful in single-barrel events about this time and he culminated these successes with a win in the

Victorian Single-barrel Championship at a Coburg shoot. He also won the title in 1938. Hall won outright 21/25 from Fred Burns 27/35 and D. Watson 26/35. Fred Burns at a Blackburn shoot grassed 63 straight, to be 15 short of the then record break of Jack Bryant's 78 straight. Records from interstate sources at this time were becoming few and far between.

Ten Years Ago

H. S. (Snowy) Godfrey, reported as a newcomer to trapshooting in 1950, returned the best figures of the day on Melbourne tracks with 31 straight. Godfrey was later President of the Croydon Club, but is seldom seen shooting these days. In the Club Double-barrel title of the Australian Club at East Burwood four registered possibles. The winner turned up in W. Wager (rarely shoots today) 40/40 from Dick Wightman 39/40 and the late Tom Connor 24/25. The 13/14 yarder award went to Harry Roberts Junr. 19/20. Young Roberts later gained a place in an International Team.

Two country shoots were abandoned about this period, namely at Hay and Sale. Both grounds were under water. At Echuca the club staged a sweepstake series, and among the winners were L. Gibson, H. Gibson, T. Roch (Elmore), E. Keogh (Gunbower), S. Holschier and A. Holmberg. A new club was formed at Cobram, but it did not function very long.

At Bathurst Jim Ryan, Lou and Hec. Lupp were under notice. Best figures for the day were recorded by H. Jaques, 15/18. Rex Powell was an outright winner at his club (Cressy, Tas.) in a £20 Handicap. Reg McNamara of Griffith won the Barellan (N.S.W.) Club's Double-barrel Championship with the only score of 20/20. At Charters Towers Club (Q.) W. Carrington won a 20 birder, shooting in continuous rain, 18/20 from P. McDonald 17/20.

John Houston, the present A.C.T.A. President, was under notice with a

brilliant outright win in a 15 birder at Narrandera, N.S.W. Shooting at a Charleville fixture, D. A. McLean of Clara Creek won the main event, 19/20. The 12 yarders award at this shoot went to none other than Leo Haseler. Leo has since gained high-gun for Australia in an International.


