## The Editor's Notebook



**OFFICIAL REFEREES.** Those shooters who have successfully completed the written Referee Examination test and have not yet arranged to complete their practical test so that Official Referee Badge may be issued, are advised to finalise this detail without further delay. Quite a number are still outstanding as not having completed their test. Candidates are reminded that those who have failed to complete their Official Referee test, both written and practical, will be struck off the list of registered Official Referees on December 31, 1960, by order of the Executive Committee.

**EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING.** Affiliated clubs are advised that the next meeting of the Executive Committee of the A.C.T.A. will be held on Thursday and Friday, October 27 and 28, 1960. Any club desirous of having matter listed on the Agenda for the meeting is advised to lodge such matter with the Secretary, A.C.T.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.1, not later than October 17.

**BREAK RECOGNITION.** Several enquiries have been received lately asking if a shooter can continue a break over more than one day. The by-law governing break sequences directs that a break can only be recognised if shot over one day, in competition, under double or single-barrel conditions. However, if a club is conducting a shooting series which

happens to extend over more than one day, providing the shooting days are successive, then the shooter may continue his break and have same recognised. Many years ago continuation of a break run until the shooter eventually missed was permitted. However, this was found to be unworkable. It was found that some competitors would have lengthy practice in between the shooting days or would compete at some other centre and miss, but would then return to the original ground where the break was started, and carry on. In a big-area country like Australia it would be found to be impossible to properly supervise such performances and the practice of restricting the break to one shooting day was introduced, and it is unlikely to be changed after so many years of satisfactory working. Those interested should remember that the actual score sheets must be forwarded in substantiation of any break claim, and break can only be recognised if made in competition under double or single-barrel conditions in unbroken down-the-line events. No break-off in the sequence is permitted, such as shooting in any other type of event.

**HANDICAPPING.** On two occasions recently shooters who have been out of the sport for some time, as much as twelve months, have enquired from the Association regarding what they termed would be their "new" handicap. One shooter wrote the Association advising that he would "not be registering this year,

but what would be my handicap when I re-register again next year?" The obvious reply to such enquiries is that their handicap will be same as when they dropped out. The handicap does not change or alter because a shooter drops out. The handicap can be likened to that of weight given to a racehorse—when such an animal is spelled, it rarely comes back handicapped under the weight at which it was turned out! A shooter, like a racehorse, has to perform to be handicapped. If it is found that a shooter is not shooting well after, say, three to five shoots, his local handicapper should recommend to the Association that he be brought forward. Such recommendation should be forwarded on a regulation Handicap Return and the reasons given for any recommendation. If the recommendation is accepted by the Association the amended mark will appear in the following issue of "News", or if the adjustment just happens to miss the dead-line for the following "News", then it will appear in the subsequent issue.

**SHOOT REPORTS.** Many clubs, when reporting details of a shoot, prepare the report in the form of a letter—this is not necessary or required. A report should be prepared as a report only and in no other form. Club officials who write these reports in letter form only impede the office work of the Association, for the reason that all the preliminary introduction section of the letter-report has to be struck out for printing purposes and similarly the final section has to be similarly treated. Club officials are requested to observe this advice when preparing shoot reports—this recommendation, of course, applying only to those who are at present submitting their shoot reports in letter form. Whilst on the subject of shoot reports, club officials are reminded that a report on each shoot should be posted to the A.C.T.A. within seven days of the shoot being held. Recently some reports were received which dated back as long as five months.

**LUCKY DUCK SHOOTERS.** Nine lucky duck shooters have each received a case of I.C.I.A.N.Z. ammuni-

tion, valued in the vicinity of £26 in each instance, for having returned to The Fisheries & Game Department bands bearing "lucky numbers" from the legs of birds which they bagged during the past duck season. The lucky numbers were selected by the Department before the season opened. The Department requested shooters to return any bands taken from legs of birds which they shot, to assist Departmental officials in gathering information concerning the migratory, breeding and feeding habits of wild duck. This information is vital to the Department in order to help control shooting and preserve the birds in their natural habitats. I.C.I.A.N.Z. has helped shooters and the Department over a number of years by donating cases of ammunition as prizes. Some 35,000 ducks have been banded, and this year's collection contained some from previous bandings.

**RECORD SPEED.** The record speed for any bird or animal is held by a bird—the frigate bird. The frigate bird has a speed estimated to be over 100 miles per hour and has been credited with an almost unbelievable record of over twice this speed!

**CARE BEFORE YOU SHOOT.** Whether in the field or on the shooting track, **ALWAYS BE CAREFUL**. Never ever point your gun, loaded or unloaded, toward anybody at any time. Never fire at anything in the field until you are certain it is game or a pest. Keep your safety catch ON until you start to aim. Never shoot game out of season, and remember that song birds are harmless—protect them from marauders by shooting crows and other bigger birds that rob nests and kill young song birds.

fixture for late applications. It is pointed out that applications mentioned refer only to Commonwealth, State and District Championships and have no reference to club titles. The A.C.T.A. Executive Committee will arrange the official allocation of 1961 open championships at its meeting on October 27 and 28. The allocation will then appear in the first available

issue of "News" following — in this instance in the December edition. Clubs are requested to accept the publication of titles as allocated as official and to act thereon. It should also be noted that the event and the date for the holding of any open championship must be approved by the Association before same can be held or in any way advertised.

## How to improve your shooting

Here is a further collection of hints which will help the novice and remind the veteran of basic rules which are sometimes overlooked in the stress of competition — or immediately after lunch or afternoon tea!

Do not squeeze the trigger of a shotgun in trapshooting — slap or pull it sharply. Some of the best shots are trigger-slappers. Any method of releasing the trigger which does not stop or cant the gun is the proper method for shotgun shooting. The orthodox trigger squeeze employed by rifle and pistol shooters is too slow for the shotgun.

Wind in the face of the shooter means high targets. Mount the gun with the butt low on the shoulder, to further raise the point of impact. Wind from behind the shooter means low targets. Mount the gun with the butt high on the shoulder, to lower the point of impact.

Wind from the left usually means high left angles, low right angles. Face the shot farther to the left because of the possible greater stretch upward for an extreme left angle. Reverse is true with wind from the right.

Don't make quick, disturbing motions with body or gun in taking your position. Do your dipsy-doodling somewhere else.

Don't bounce into the call of "Pull!" Some day your recovery from the bounce will be so out of time that you'll miss them all.

Note that most good shots stand with feet close together — not sprawled out. Many good shots stand perfectly erect.

Obey the safety rules implicitly. Always have the action of your gun open except on the firing line. Never point a gun from behind the firing line.

Call "Pull!" in a clear, loud voice. Don't expect the trap-puller to be a mind-reader. Give him a chance to throw perfectly timed targets.

Don't shoot too much. Your own endurance will determine when you have had enough. Tired muscles refuse to react properly to mental commands, timing suffers—and your scores go blooey. Unless you are capable of shooting through an entire tournament programme, enter only those events which will not over-tax your strength.

Be sure to consult an oculist if your eyes are not perfect. A rating of 20/20 for the master eye may be classed as perfect for shooting, even if the other eye is weaker. Then there never is any argument between the eyes as to which is master.



Miss Coxon is the first and only woman shooter to have achieved this outstanding honour.

Many will be surprised to learn that veteran Dave Watson, whose shooting non-de-plume of "Doch-en-Doris" is known throughout Australia, has been indisposed for some weeks. Dave, who is known as the "Sprightly Scotchman", served for many years in various theatres of active service and, despite his sprightly manner, has had frequent periods of inactivity as a result of his service to his country. He retains the brogue of his mother-land and no one could ever mistake him for anyone other than a Scot. Dave won everlasting distinction by winning the Champion of Champions Cup—the blue riband event of A.C.T.A. competition—when the event was shot at Coburg (V.) in shocking conditions in a howling gale and rain in 1947. It is recalled that he had 40 straight on the board and then had to face up for his final ten with the best shooters in the country right on "his wheel". Coming up for his final ten, Dave was a bit too quick on his 41st, and aided by the gale, the target danced in furtive fashion and he missed with both barrels. To most it seemed like curtains for the redoubtable Scot, but gritting his teeth more than usual, he stuck out and grinded the remaining targets in brilliant style to win convincingly. ## Ten Years Ago

Trap shooting was enjoying a boom period in 1950. The late Lionel Byrne, who was tragically killed in a car accident later, was under notice with a win in the Metropolitan Double-rise title at Camberwell Club. Byrne won the event with 8/12 pairs outright. The late Bob Ferris, who was founder of the now extinct Jerilderie Club in southern New South Wales, also won an event at Coburg.

At Moree in New South Wales the Boolooroo Club, which later merged into the Moree Club, reported having difficulty in arranging shoots owing to the severe floods being experienced in the area. D. Livingston was an outstanding winner at Boolooroo.

Shooting at Townsville (Q.), J. Gerber ran out a clear winner in the Commonwealth Double-rise Championship from Mal Johnson of Yarwun.

E. E. Albert added the South-Western Districts of N.S.W. Single-barrel Championship to his list of


