



The Editor's Notebook



HOLIDAYS IN 1961. At this period of the year it is now customary to advise clubs and club officials of the proclaimed dates for national holidays during the forthcoming year. The information thus provided allows for forward drawing up of dates for proposed major programmes, which, of course, are required to have the approval of the A.C.T.A. before being adopted or advertised. The information outlined hereunder has been obtained from the Chief Secretary's Department of the Victorian Government and is, therefore, official in every way.

RUNNING A CLUB. Frequently, in discussions among shooting men, is heard "only for two or three of us the club would fold up". This is not an uncommon statement. Phil Miller, the eminent American organizer, has the following to say in a recent issue of "Trap and Field":

"Very few of you have had any experience in running a gun club or the work and worry connected with the planning and running of tourna-ments. Unless a gun club is run as a commercial shooting park, the brunt of all the work and headaches fall on a handful of the club's members. The old saying, 'Everyone's business is no one's business', certainly holds good in these operations.

To the shooting public who get up at 8 a.m., start up their cars and drive gaily out to the gun clubs, the whole affair seems simple and easy. To the loyal gun club members who give their time and energy in order to have everything ready for a day of pleasure, there are a thousand things to be done. These members deserve a vote of praise, for they are the real promoters of trap shooting. Let me enumerate a few of the many duties so necessary for a successful shoot.

First, there is the compiling of all the data for the programme and its construction. Usually advertising must be solicited for this programme in addition to finding other methods of raising cash. Then there is the expense of having the programme printed and distributed to the anticipated entrants. It is no small job.

Second in importance, and that 'bugaboo' of all gun clubs, is the hiring of efficient help on the trap lines. In most cases an entire new crew must be assembled at each shoot. They must be coached in every phase of their jobs in order to keep mistakes to a minimum. Nothing will tend to ruin a shoot

as much as poor pulling and poor

Third, and by far one of the most important operations for a successful important operations for a successful tournament, is the hiring of a superefficient office force. Employees in this department must know every phase of shooting and be able to explain in detail the programme to each entry if asked. They should open the office early, and if the programme reads 'starting time 9 a.m.', be sure the first squad is called right on the dot—9 a.m. The squad sheets should be on the scoreboard as soon should be on the scoreboard as soon as the first ten squads are filled. This way each shooter will know when his squad is on the firing line and can act accordingly.

A MUST of a successful shoot is basic, but needs repeating—go by the rules of the A.C.T.A., with no deviations.

Very important is the securing of a squad marshall who will be on the job early and late. It is very essential that the programme be kept rolling so that it never drags or gets behind in its schedule.

RULES FOR CONDUCTING A TOURNAMENT

- 1. Supervise the setting of all traps, being sure that all angles and heights are the same.
- 2. Keep the optionals and all fees to a minimum. Arrange an attractive division of money which will give each entry an equal chance of win-ning where high scores are made.
- 3. By all means keep the number of targets to a maximum. Be careful not to put a financial strain on some of the shooters in the lower income brackets.
- 4. Keep the price of targets to a reasonable figure which allows not more than one hundred per cent. profit.
- 5. If shooters are allowed to bring and shoot their own shells, it is only fair that they should be charged one dollar per day ground fee to help defray the employee expense.
- 6. A gun club holding a State registered shoot should run it as a sporting event and not just for the purpose of fattening the club's bank account.

What do you say, fellow shooters: want to operate a gun club?"

INTERNATIONAL MATCH CHANGE. Information has been received from the International Match Committee in London of a slight change in conditions of the annual International Match which will take place beginning in 1961. The exact instruction states, "For 1961 and until 1965 inclusive, the shooting conditions will be teams of 30, ALL scores to count, otherwise the same as before." Previously only the top ten scores were counted, the re-mainder being counted out. The new arrangement should prove of benefit to Australia for the reason that this country usually seems to gather to-gether a bunch of shooters whose performances do not vary very greatly, inasmuch as there is usually not a big margin between the leaders and those bringing up the rear. Also the new system will provide a much greater incentive. Every shooter will now be striving his utmost to add to Australia's aggregate. If a team member began missing a few in the past some felt it was not worth the effort of continued concentration to keep in the fight. Now, no matter how a shooter is going, it will be of benefit to his team if he keeps on fighting to help in the aggregate total. The scheme certainly looks like being beneficial to this country's team.

HANDICAPPING. A further enquiry has come to hand asking, "What handicap are shooters to accept? The card issued to each registered shooter or the handicap printed in the latest 'News'?" The answer to this query is very simple, in that whichever is the actual "latest", the date on the card or the "News" is the official handicap. For instance, a shooter's handicap may be amended just after the publication of a particular edition of "News". In such cases the amendment would not appear in print until the following month, hence the shooter's card in this instance would be his official handicap. Similarly the reverse applies when a shooter's card has not been handed in for adjustment. The "News" would then become the official handicap until the card was adjusted. Finally the query raised brings to the fore the importance of a shooter always being in possession of his registration card and producing it at each shoot he attends.

SERGEANT SYSTEM. A few enquiries have been received for particulars of the Sergeant System of shooting. It is pointed out that information on the Sergeant System of clay target shooting is published in the A.C.T.A. Hand-Book of Shooting Rules and Definitions. The Sergeant System has been tried over many years and has not proved, in general terms, to be a very popular method of shooting. The A.C.T.A. Hand-Book of Shooting Rules states that the Sergeant System may be shot over "An automatic trap, or three single traps". The A.C.T.A. Executive Committee later altered this to read "Five single traps, four feet apart, constitute the Sergeant System. The targets are thrown from unknown traps, at unknown angles. Maximum throw of traps to be 55 yards, minimum 30 yards. Shoot from centre track, limit mark 16 yards".

It has been advised that a shooter recently won a substantial sum of money shooting under the Sergeant System, and a club has written in to the A.C.T.A. asking can such shooter be handicapped. The same handicapping formula applies under the

the Sergeant System as is used in ordinary down-the-line handicapping. The only difference would be that it must be remembered that the minimum mark in Sergeant System is 16 yards, and all shooters on 12 to 16 yards in down-the-line shooting would be assessed as 16 yarders in Sergeant System.

AUSTRALIAN CLAY TARGET SHOOTING NEWS

The Sergeant System is a very slow medium of shooting, and whilst possibly saving something in the number of cartridges used and in turn cartridge cost, does not provide the same equity of competition or the amount of individual shooting available in regular down-the-line shooting.



"It should always be remembered that in most gun accidents it is the second or third party is the one who suffers, seldom the man behind the gun." The foregoing are words well worth keeping in mind. Far too often, even on shooting tracks, careless actions are observed which should be pulled up at once by referees, whether official or otherwise.

The most common and obvious cause of dented barrels is the dropping or falling of the gun on to a hard surface. It is not advisable to lean an unattended weapon against a slippery surface, such as the door of a car, or, in fact, anywhere where it may easily be knocked over by a dog or a careless passer-by. For the same good reason, gun-cleaning, which can also be a slippery job, is best conducted in a room with a wooden floor. No valuable gun should be stowed away in a motor car or be stowed away in a motor car or any other form of transport — unless it is suitably protected. Should a gun barrel, by some mischance, become dented during a shoot, al-though its user may feel a little uneasy, it is generally safe to assume that he can continue firing for the remainder of the shoot. Eventually the passage of shot will wear a barrel thin where the dent protrudes internally, but this takes time and the passage of many shot loads. A dent, though it may be quite safe, is enough to put a shooter off -- if his gun does not suffer, he will, until the dent has been raised.

Frequently mention is made of the "Master Eye in Shooting". For the benefit of those in any doubt on this point, the following note from the veteran champion "Calrossie" (Jack Sutherland) is appended. "Calrossie" states, "I have heard many arguments on the subject. My experience is, if a man shoots in proper form, head well up, both eyes open, and leaves the direction of his gun to both hands, he need not trouble about which is the master eye. Look at the target only, swing with it and follow on and the target is 'dead'. Of course, if a man uses a gun as if it was a rifle and looks along the barrels, the question of the master eye is important. But, then he will never become a good, quick, or indeed a safe shot. The little silver knob at the end of a gun is useful when plating a gun, but fosters the delusion that a gun should be used like a rifle. An example: A cricketer does not look at his bat - he concentrates on the ball and his hands tell the bat what to do. So I say to all young shooters, never mind which is your master eye, but keep both wide open." There you have it, right from an authority of long years of top-notch experience.




