



The Editor's Notebook



NEW ZEALAND VISIT. Those intending to take part in the forthcoming trip to New Zealand and wishing to have blazers made to order are advised to contact the A.C.T.A. Secretary with as little delay as possible, supplying correct coat measurements. Messrs. Wardrop's, makers of the 1956 Olympic blazers, have agreed to make up the garments with the minimum of delay, providing details are supplied without delay. Cost is £15/19/6. The A.C.T.A. has also ordered some 18 special ties to be worn with the blazer, and orders for these should be lodged with the A.C.T.A. Secretary also without delay. The ties have a blue background and carry a motif of the A.C.T.A. These ties are attractive and will be available to members of the visiting Australian party to New Zealand at a cost of £1 each. a win or a division of between £10 and £50, or equivalent trophy value, his mark is moved one yard back. It does not mean "part" of £10, but an amount of between £10 and £50. The same club advised that it was conducting a £200 Handicap and asked what would happen if a number of shooters divided the money. The position as indicated would apply, but if quite a number divided the proceeds and none of them received a cut of £10 or up to £50, handicapping would not apply unless the shooters concerned gained a break of 50 or more.

GUN MAL-FUNCTION OR MISFIRE. A report has reached the Association that on two occasions recently two Referee Examiners gave a verdict of "Lost Bird" when a shooter, whose gun had a misfire on the second-barrel, when on being allowed another target, broke the target with the first barrel. This decision is completely wrong. If Referee Examiners gave decisions as mentioned, then they are not aware of the Rules. The Rules are quite clear on the point and should not be departed from. The Rule states, "In the event of a misfire with the second barrel, the competitor must fire a live cartridge in the general direction of the target, and is permitted to score with the second barrel only. A com-

HANDICAPPING. A club recently wrote the Association requesting more information on the clause in the Handicapping Formula, which reads, "A cut of £10 to £50 or equivalent trophy value—1 yard." The club asked if this means a "win" or a part of the £10 to £50? The actual meaning is that if a shooter gains

petitor will not be allowed the full use of two barrels at a new target given following a misfire in his second barrel." If the shooter, in his endeavour to obey the Rules, keeps his gun lined up as near as possible to the target with his first barrel, so as to be ready to "kill" with the second barrel, and perchance breaks it with first barrel, then the decision should be "No Bird" and the shooter given another target until he either "kills" or "misses" with his second barrel.

SINGLE-BARREL SHOOTING. At a Victorian country club some time back a shooter, shooting under single-barrel conditions, fired at his target and missed; he thereupon pulled his second barrel and was promptly given a "No Bird" decision by the Referee. Here again the Referee was wrong. The Rule clearly lays down that, "In single-barrel shooting the competitor shall load only one cartridge and no competitor shall be permitted to load an empty shell or a dummy cartridge." The decision should have been "Lost". The shooter was doubly at fault in that he missed the target (if that can be classified as a fault) and also he had a second cartridge in his gun which contravened the Rule governing the competition. Any shooter may be liable to place a second shell in his gun inadvertently in single-barrel shooting, but if he continues the practice after being warned by the Referee, he should be removed from the event.

HAND - BACK TO SHOOTERS. The A.C.T.A. has ruled that a club may take up to 50% (inclusive of birds) from sweepstakes and the remainder should be divided 60% for first, 30% second and 10% third. No deductions are permitted from optional sweepstakes attached to open championships, that is Commonwealth, State or District title events. Reports have been received that some clubs are exceeding this amount. Shooters noticing this state of affairs should challenge the payment and request that a proper statement be presented.

LOCATION OF GROUND FOR NATIONAL SERIES. The location of the shooting grounds of the Melbourne Gun Club, venue of the National Championships and International Shoot between March 10 and 14, is not known to many of those who will be attending. Therefore, the following outline of best approaches to the Tottenham enclosures of the club is published. For those travelling by car from the Melbourne city area, the most direct route is by first ensuring that the car driver starts from the North Melbourne Railway bridge. This is very easy to locate, being just off the West Melbourne end of Spencer Street. Having located this bridge, the driver then proceeds to Footscray along Barkley Street. Go along Barkley Street, continuing west to the end of the street, where an Air Force Depot will be observed. Turn left at end of Barkley Street, cross through the Tottenham Railway Gates, turn right, and the Melbourne Gun Club entrance road is first turn on left. There is a short entry road which takes the driver right up to the club entrance. For those coming in off the Geelong, Ballarat or Bendigo or Sydney roads on the opposite side of Melbourne to the one already described, the driver should ascertain the whereabouts of Sunshine Road, keep on this road, and the Melbourne Gun Club entrance road is about half a mile on the Sunshine side of the Tottenham Railway Station. The Wiltshire File Company is on the immediate right just before turning.

INTERSTATE TEAMS' MATCH CONDITIONS. Clubs concerned are informed that definite conditions have been laid down by the Executive Committee for the conduct of the annual Interstate Teams' Match for "The Great Britain & Ireland" Trophy. This teams' match is for State Team supremacy and the winning State holds the Trophy mentioned until the following competition. Match conditions are, firstly, that an elimination match of not less than 30 targets from 18 yards is staged—preferably every shooter using the same type of shell. The 15 top scorers then become the State Team

for the year and immediately shoot off as a team at 50 targets per man from 18 yards, double-barrel, both barrels equal value. The top ten scores are counted for the team aggregate, the remaining five being counted out. Shells used in the actual Teams' contest must be 1½ oz. load and no others. Every shooter taking part must be registered with the A.C.T.A. and produce his current-year registration card on request. The competition must be completed not later than the first week-end in October and the results must reach the Secretary A.C.T.A. not later than October 9, 1961. Two check scorers are required and each must sign the score sheet. Clubs conducting the State Team shoot in each State are instructed that souvenir trophies are required to be presented to each member of the State Team. Team members must have resided in the State for which they will shoot for at least the preceding 12 months. The A.C.T.A. will finance the State Team Shoot (not the elimination

event) to the extent of 900 clay targets and 750 cartridges in each State. Claims should be lodged with the A.C.T.A. after the holding of the event. No travelling expenses are allowed for the event. Any expenses so incurred are not to be a charge against the A.C.T.A. In the event of ties for high-gun in the State Teams' Match a tie shoot at a further five rounds until finality is required. Only automatic traps may be used in the competition.

PRESENTATION OF REGISTRATION CARDS. Intending competitors at the A.C.T.A. National Championships fixture at Tottenham (V.) from March 10 to 14 are requested to present their current (1961) registration cards to officials taking entries. Those who cannot produce their cards will be requested to pay the required dues before being allowed to take part in the shooting competitions.



GUN BITES AND BOLTS

by Charles Fairley

(In "Shooting Times", Eng.)

As every shooter knows, the "bites" of his gun are the points where one or more bolts lock the action to the barrels.

The number of bites varies, or it should, with the weight of the charge a particular gun is likely to face, that is to say guns with 2-in. chambers or 2½-in. chambers can be safely made with only two bites. Anything over this length calls for three bites.

This does not mean that guns with the shorter chambers should not have three bites—the figures I give above are the minimum required for safety. Quite often I see 2-in. and 2½-in. chambered guns with treble bites, which is perfectly all right, just as I see 2½-in. and even 3-in. guns with only two bites, which is all wrong.

Almost every gun now has two slots cut into the jointing lump to take one bolt, while any additional bolt engages an extension of the barrels.

The bottom bolt is in one piece, and is slotted to pass over the top portion of the jointing lump. When pressed home, the extreme end of the bolt enters the bottom bite, and the part immediately above the slot enters the top bite.

A glance at a jointing lump will show that the lump is cut to a radius where it is "split" in the middle, while it is steeply angled, but quite flat, near to the top bite. The radius on the bottom portion of the lump is called the "ride" because the bolt end runs up and down it. When the bolt is made off to the correct length, it is bearing on the ride, and this lifts the top part of the bolt clear of the lump until the moment when the gun is closed.

In the same way, bolts working in a third bite are kept clear of the barrel extension until all three bites are entered together.

Some experience is required to time the bolts and to cut them to the

best length, for if the bottom bolt is short, the other parts will foul the barrels, and there is also a loss of strength.

When the merits of different kinds of top lever systems are discussed they all hinge on two main points: how far does the lever move the bolt(s) and is there any loss of travel caused by quickly worn bearings?

The more "travel" a lever gives to its bolt, the deeper the bolt goes into the bite slot, with greater security. (A bolt should never touch the bottom of the slot; or, for that matter, the back!) When springiness or play is present in the lever system, some loss of bite is inevitable, unless the faulty parts are replaced. Often the bolt will travel up the ride and enter the slot, but fail to leave it when the lever is fully opened. If the bolt is shortened until it will lift out of the slot, the length of bite is obviously less.

Another look at the radius of the bottom lump will reveal that the ride is not a true circle with the hinge of the gun. The purpose is to give an easy start to the bolt without fully opening the lever. As the gun is closed, the shape of the ride pushes the bolt up and this in turn opens the lever. At the last moment a spring sends lever and bolt home.

When a gun is opened for reloading, the bolt travels a short way down the ride and the lever will be seen partly closed. The lever need not be touched when shutting the gun again, for the bolt will do the work.

The Most Important

The most important bite on a gun, whether there are two or three, is undoubtedly the top one in the jointing lump. This one is nearest to the spot where the faces of action and barrels meet and can hold the force of explosion at its source.

The bottom bite does little more than guide the others in, while third

bites should be more of a reserve, a final safeguard if the others fail. It is important to remember how difficult it is to ensure that each of three bites shall be exactly equal. The tiniest bit of extra pressure on one will hold the pressure off the others. So it is far better to choose the main one and concentrate the full pressure on it.

To increase the difficulty, finished guns, by tradition, must have the top levers nicely centred along the strap. Easing the bites that final bit to let the lever home is quite a tricky job.

Gun actions when sent to Proof never have the levers more than half-home, for the Proof charge always blows the bolts a little deeper into the bites by removing some of the pressure.

I sometimes think it would be a good thing to leave some pressure to be blown out in the field. If levers were left just short of centre, a few hundred rounds would be enough to bring the bolts home and the bites would stay tight much longer.

This does not mean that the lever would be hard to open if not right home—the angle of the bolt as it enters the slot can be altered to allow easy opening. Actions at Proof, in contrast, are left with some real bite in the bolts, and require a strong thumb to pull them out with the lever. There is a reason for this, as a little thought will show. The bolts are only half-way into the bites, and it is essential to ensure that they do not blow out when the charges are fired.

A well-jointed gun, with good bites, blows on to the barrels, not off.



"Calrossie" (Jack Sutherland) of Ormond, Victoria, achieved the mecca of all trapshots by winning his 100th championship in March, 1941. At that time his record was unequalled in Australian trapshooting records. In commemoration of his success, "Calrossie" was presented by the Melbourne Gun Club with a pair of life-size silver-plated pigeons. The trophy still adorns his living room today.

Shooting for the first time over traps, the late L. E. Tewksbury won two front-marker trophies on the one day at a Nobel meeting. Later Tewksbury developed into a first-class shot at all targets.

A. W. Hall, now of Berriwillock, won the Victorian Double-rise Championship at the Blackburn grounds. G. L. Bragg, now of Bethanga, who rarely competes these days, divided a handicap event with the late Albert Rickards of Echuca and Dick Wight-

man (a former Chairman of the A.C.T.A.) on the same enclosure. Bragg later won a double-rise event outright.

Athol Love, who gained high-gun in the first International Match, shooting in the Victorian Tower Championship on the Coburg grounds, won the event outright with the only possible. Love was then a fireman attached to Eastern Hill Station, Melbourne. He has since retired from trapshooting.

Horrie Donelly won the Champion of Champions Cup of 1941, defeating the previous dual holder of the title, Fred Burns. The pair tied over the 50 rounds of the event, Donelly running out winner on the 60th round, 52/60 to Burns 51/60. A Launceston-Bentleigh combination won the Australian Teams' Championship. The team comprised Jack Tyquin, the late Ted Egan, the late Lew Bertram and Jim Stoddart.

Ten Years Ago

Four shared the lead after the first day's shooting in the 1951 Champion of Champions Cup when the event was held at the East Burwood shooting grounds. They were, M. Gibson (Hay, N.S.W.), Nev. Bassett (Roma, Q.), E. G. Biggs (Burwood) and the late Lionel Byrne (Vermont, V.). The field at this stage had shot 20 rounds and the four mentioned held clean scores. A big swag of shooters followed, each with 19/20—this bunch included "Calrossie". Over the final rounds of the contest Nev. Bassett (Q.) and E. G. Biggs tied over the scheduled 60 rounds of the event. Each had scored the maximum.

The tie shoot went only ten rounds. Biggs missed his 65th release and Bassett, who had been shooting brilliantly, apparently took things too easily and also missed his 65th. Bassett then seemed uneasy and again failed on his final release, the 70th, leaving Biggs the winner 69/70, Bassett 68/70. Newton Thomas gained third place after a tie shoot with Bill Wager. Thomas registered 76/77 and Wager 75/77. A feature of the shooting in the 1951 Champion of Champions Cup was the performance of young Harry Roberts, then 15 years of age, who returned a 56/60 and gained himself a place in the International Team of that year.





