

The Editor's Notebook



HANDICAPPING. All clubs are apparently not yet quite clear on what is required regarding A.C.T.A. Handicapping. Some clubs do not understand that once a shooter has secured a cut or division of any kind (or an outright win) whilst shooting from 12 yards, he is immediately no longer regarded as a novice shooter and should be moved off the 12 yard mark at once. If he secures a cut off 13 yards he is also moved at once to 14 yards. Then the regular formula operates as published in a recent issue of "News". Shooters capable of gaining divisions or wins off 12 and 13 yards can by no stretch of imagination be continued to be classified as "novice gun handlers" and the 12 and 13 yard marks are designed and accepted by the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee as for "novice gun handlers only". By a novice gun handler is meant an individual who is a complete new-comer to gun handling of any kind, either in the field or over the traps. Frequently handicap returns are received at the Association office wherein shooters gaining one and two divisions at shoots in various areas are still shown as 12 yarders, with no recommendation for backward movement against their names. The A.C.T.A. office takes particular note of these instances and moves shooters concerned accordingly, but club officials should note that a recommendation from the club is always a medium of guidance to the A.C.T.A.

Another point on which there appears to be some misunderstanding

in connection with handicapping is that some clubs have written the Association requesting that a shooter taking part in three different programmes be eligible to come forward. This is not the case. For a shooter to be brought forward, evidence must be produced, per medium of a handicap return, indicating that a shooter is a case for forward movement. The handicap return should show the shooter's recent performances and everything that is known regarding his ability and his form. In other words, a shooter only comes forward if it can be proved that he is overhandicapped. In several recent instances return forms have recommended a shooter forward - yet on the same return evidence has been shown where the shooter under review has obtained recent cuts and divisions. Recommendations such as these cannot be accepted. Also cases have recently come under notice of the Association of shooters who, having dropped out for a year or two, have been recommended forward as much as three vards on return. Here again such recommendations are unacceptable. If a shooter drops out and then returns to the sport, he comes back on the yardage at which he went out. A shooter, like a racehorse, must perform before he can be handicapped, either forward or back.

One more important point for club officials to remember is that shooters taking part in "open" shoots must shoot off the A.C.T.A. handicap allotted to them. Recently it has been noticed where shooters have

shot in major events in front of their regulation mark. To save and avoid any confusion, club officials should check the marks of all competitors.

In regard to the Sergeant System of clay target shooting, it has been found that clubs using this type of system are either loath to send in returns or do not want to do so. The Executive Committee has directed that handicap returns and results of ALL shoots must be forwarded to the Association office within seven days of the shoot being held. Clubs failing to observe this direction will be requested to explain as to the reasons why they are not observing the Committee's order. In the Sergeant System the limit mark is 16 yards, after which the A.C.T.A. Handicapping formula applies. Only "open" Championships, under the Sergeant System, approved by the A.C.T.A. may be shot.

REGISTRATION OF SHOOTERS.

In a few clubs the idea still prevails that only shooters "who prefer to register" are called upon to do so. This idea is very far from requirements of the A.C.T.A. One of the fundamental rules of the A.C.T.A. in fact, one of its Constitutional Rules—is that "all shooters must be registered". A little thought on this point will soon dissipate any ideas to the contrary. It would be quite impossible for the A.C.T.A. to be the governing body of the sport of clay target shooting in Australia unless all shooters who competed under its Rules were registered. No control would be possible without every shooter being on record at A.C.T.A. headquarters, hence the Rule. Clubs are requested to strictly adhere to the Rules as set down, at all times.

SHOOTING RULES. Some misunderstanding apparently exists in the minds of one or two clubs and shooters regarding the execution of Rule 7. Rule 7 was designed, primarily, to prohibit competitors from standing further away from the centre of their shooting track (which-

ever number it may be) than the 18 inches referred to in the Rule. Experience had shown that certain shooters - whether they gained any real advantage or not is unknown frequently stood well away from the concrete track (or earth track or whatever type of track was in use) and on occasions were likely to upset the concentration of fellow competitors or possibly, as already mentioned, possibly gain some advantage on angles. The Rule therefore, in point of fact, means that the shooter must stand "within 18 inches of the centre of his shooting track". It is hoped this explanation will clear up any doubts existing in the minds of many interested.

SKEET RULES. Skeet shooting rules have been under review for some considerable period and all are now advised that the Executive Committee has approved of the undermentioned Rules for future skeet shooting:

"I.S.U. Rules will be used with the following modifications:

Seven stations will be used. Singles to be shot from Stations 1 to 7, in that order.

Doubles to be shot from Stations 7, 6, 4, 2, and 1, in that order.

Targets to be released instantaneously upon the competitor's call of 'Pull' (for the high house) and/or 'Mark' (for the low house).

Commonwealth Skeet Championships to be shot over two rounds, each of 25, total 50 (using 7 stations as already stated), nomination for Commonwealth skeet titles has been fixed at £3.

State Skeet Championships, same conditions as for Commonwealth skeet titles, nominations fixed at £2/10/0.

District Skeet Championships shall be shot at one round (25), nomination £1/10/0.

Gun position, for the competitor, when ready to shoot, to be optional."

OUT OF THE PAST

Twenty Years Ago

Bob Elliott, a trainee pilot in the R.A.A.F., about this period 20 years ago, won one of the main events at a Nobel fixture. Those who recall the event will remember that Elliott was quite a youngster, but he shot with plenty of confidence. Elliott hailed from Wellington in New South Wales. Nothing has been heard of him since those far-off days.

The late Laurie Tewksbury was in good form at a Blackburn meeting, winning outright the first three events listed on the programme.

About this time the late Donald Mackintosh instituted a Fund, which was taken up by the sporting newspapers of the day. The Fund was termed the "Fags for Fighters" Fund. At a shoot at Bentleigh for the Fund Mr. Mackintosh presented a Gold Cup for competition, and this was won outright by the Colac shooter, Eric Ball, who defeated a field of 40 and ran up a string of 41 straight for the day. Laurie Tewksbury, maintaining his good form of the period, bettered this break with 44 straight and shooting 63/64 for the day. Lance Cockett of Boronia, who has recently returned

from a trip abroad, was under notice at Blackburn, winning two events. Cockett has always shot under the nom-de-plume of "Lance". Proceeds to the Fund from this shoot totalled £50.

Shooting at Camberwell, Harold Ogg and the late Laurie Tewksbury gave a splendid display of combination shooting to win the Metropolitan Deauville Doubles Championship, dropping one pair only. Tewksbury was also again under notice with a 38/40 in another "Fags for Fighters" Fund shoot.

Jock Wilson, using his famous shooting name of "Jock", was apparently seeing them well during a Blackburn shoot late in June, 1941. He defeated a namesake in Don Wilson of Hobart (Tas.), who was then a member of the R.A.A.F., on the 30th round, with Tewksbury in third placing. The late T. J. Saville, formerly of Mentone, won a frontmarker award on the same programme.

Report on New Zealand Visit

(By D. B. MOTT, Captain Australian Team)

The President.

Australian Clay Target Association, Box 2038 S. G.P.O..

Dear Sir.

It gives me much pleasure to submit to you my official report of the Australian Team's Tour of New Zealand to compete in the Annual Teams Match, Australia versus New Zealand, for the prized Tom Glen Perpetual Trophy.

In congratulating the New Zealanders on their magnificent win, I felt I was voicing the opinion of every Australian shooter on the fine shooting and excellent sportsmanship shown by the New Zealand Team and by their shooters throughout their National Series. I now wish to thank all my team-mates and every Australian who visited New Zealand and was present at their National Series for the wonderful support which they gave me, and to those Australians I wish to say they made me feel proud to be an Australian and to be associated with them.

As you can well appreciate, there were many little courtesies to be carried out in an official capacity, and anything I asked for or any suggestion I made received immediate response and the full support of every Australian present, and I can assure these members that it gave me a great deal of comfort to know that whatever I did, they were 100 per cent. behind me, and while we may not have won the Tom Glen Trophy, nevertheless I do feel that this body of shooters and their wives have created a lot of goodwill in New Zealand.

It gives me much pleasure to report that the New Zealand Gun Club Association went out of their way to make us feel at home and to cater for our every need; also they treated

us like kings during the whole of our stay, and I can assure you that this was most appreciated by all the Australian shooters and their good wives. We received free morning and afternoon teas, and luncheon for the whole period; they put on a special Cocktail Party for us, and we cannot speak highly enough of the manner in which we were treated, and I feel that Tom Glen, their President; Bill Stewart, their General Secretary, and Ian Jack, the North Island Secretary, should be congratulated for their efforts.

Regarding trap angles and flights of birds, there is no doubt whatever that the New Zealand traps, which are Genuine American Western, are far superior to our own, and at the New Zealand International they were set to throw a genuine 45°, and I emphasise, the full 45°, and the birds were thrown 48 yards; I checked these personally, and for the National Championship match there is no doubt whatever that the birds were thrown a full 45° and a full 52 yards. I feel that we are going to have to do something about our traps to make very, very sure that we, too, are throwing the full 45° angle required for the International.

While we do not know the official scores for all International Teams, from my observations they should go very close in this year's International, as there were two of their members who put in 100 first barrels. Conditions were not bad, but a little on the rough side, and I feel it is a fantastic performance to have two members come up with the possible.

I also feel that we in Australia are going to have to alter our method of selection for the International Team, and feel the New Zealand method of arriving at their team is superior to our own. The New Zealand team is picked from 50 birds, double barrel (Single Rise Championship) and two 30-bird around score events. This gives an aggregate of

I have no doubt there are many, many queries in the minds of all Australians as to what conditions are like in New Zealand, and I say to my fellow Australian shooters that the standard of shooting in New Zealand is no different to our own. The manner in which they shoot, their stance, the speed with which they shoot their birds, are all very similar to our shooting in Australia.

Regarding the cost of travel to New Zealand and shooting in their National Series, it would cost no National Series, it would cost no more than travelling from Sydney to Perth by plane; fares are approximately £100 return; hotel expenses, etc., when converted to Australian currency, are very similar to our own, possibly slightly cheaper. Shooting expenses at the National Series just completed in New Zealand, I would consider the nominations would be approximately 50 per cent more be approximately 50 per cent. more than they would be at our International: it just goes to show how cheaply we run our Series. Cartridge cheaply we run our Series. Cartridge costs again, when converted in Australian currency, would be slightly cheaper. Any shooters who are thinking of going to New Zealand to shoot in the New Zealand National Series, I would say they could budget to do the trip for approximately £250.

Handicapping in New Zealand is based on a yard back for every £10 you win over and above your nominations, and a yard forward for every \$8 you spend in nominations over your wins. This winning or losing is progressively carried on over the whole 12 months, with the result that there are a great number of New Zealanders who, by our standards, are greatly under-handicapped. This handicapping system only applies to Open shoots and also only applies to Handicap events, and as there are many, many New Zealand shooters who only shoot at the National Series, you will find shooters in New Zealand who may have a Club hanSeries Bill Stewart and his Co-Secretary, Ian Jack, worked until 1.00 o'clock in the morning to adjust the handicap for the next day's shooting.

This now brings us to a very interesting point, the psychological one of yardage. In Australia if you are a 18, 19 or 20 yarder, you are given by all and sundry a good chance of winning handicap events, but if you happen to be 22, 23, 24 or back, the general feeling seems to be that you general feeling seems to be that you have not much hope, and many shooters in Australia that I have spoken to have confirmed this opinion. Now in New Zealand, unless you are a 14, 15 or 16 yarder, you are not given much hope in handicap events, and should you happen to be 18, 19 or 20 yards, again the New Zealanders feel you have not a great deal ers feel you have not a great deal of hope. This is purely my own opinion, based on talks with as many New Zealanders as possible. We see here again the mental aspect, mentally we are conditioned for 19, 20 yards, and most of our shooters put up good scores from this yardage, whilst the New Zealanders are mentally conditioned around the 16-yard mark and gained remarkable scores at this yardage, but consider 20 yards a long, long way back.

One point I noticed in New Zealand which I feel we could well emulate in Australia, and that is, when an 11-yard—I emphasise 11 yards—shooter shoots 100 straight in New Zealand, if you mingle amongst the onlookers you will hear many of them say, "Isn't Jack shooting well; he has only two to go to make his 100," and when that 11 yarder comes off the shooting track he is cheered and congratulated by all and sundry on a magnificent effort. The same scene in Australia would bring forth the unsavoury remarks of "Look at this b-; how does he manage to be a 12 yarder?", what is the handicapper doing?" etc., etc. In New Zealand, if you are shooting well, nobody begrudges you winning, as they feel that you have not to be an 11 yarder dicap of 22 yards and an Open han-dicap of 15 yards. To work this system a great deal of time and effort has to be put in by the Club Secre-taries; for instance, at the National grudges you winning, as they feel that you have not to be an 11 yarder, before you can possibly be a 24 yarder. Incidentally, an 11 yarder, for shooting his 100 straight, receives no alteration to his handicap.

SHOOTING

POSITIONING YOUR GUN

With head erect, bring the gun up to where the stock touches your cheek, and your eye lines up with your sight. Then slide your stock rearward and push your shoulder forward. The stock is always brought to the face - never the face to the stock.

When mounting the gun in this manner your line-of-sight is always directly over the centre of the gun barrel, and the stock comes to the same position on your shoulder every time.

POSITIONING YOUR BODY

the left foot a short step in front of the right (if you are a righthanded shooter). The left hand is well out on the fore-end to support the barrel, but is not strained or stiff. importance.

Lean or bend forward slightly with Your feet never move after you get into position. Swing the body from the ankles and hips. Be relaxed. Development of an easy position for the shooting stance is of the utmost

POINTING YOUR GUN

In trapshooting you do not aim at the target. You point or swing the muzzle of your gun through and ahead of the target, pull the trigger and follow-through with your swing. This follow-through is as important in trapshooting as in golf.

Every target presents a different situation which tends to make trapshooting a fast game, appealing to folks who want action. Only through practice and experience can you know what you should do in the split second when you swing in the direction of the flying target and pull the trigger.

CHOOSING YOUR GUN

For consistently good scores the gun must fit the shooter. The main points of correct gun-fit are: weight; balance: stock length; drop at heel and comb; thickness of stock at comb; pitch of barrels; and trigger pull.

Standard dimension trap guns with ventilated ribs are designed to fit the shooter of average build, and a slight change in stock length will adjust the gun to the non-average.


