





## The Editor's Notebook



**PUBLICATION OF FULL REGISTRATION LIST.** Publication of the full list of registered shooters, as at June 30, 1961, has been achieved in the current month, as will be noticed elsewhere in this issue. Much effort has gone into checking and perusal of the list. Club officials and individual shooters are requested to contact the A.C.T.A., advising of any instance of irregularity in name, initials or other matter. It is hoped to have the full list published at least once in every quarter, but the cost of this service ranks as an important factor in accomplishing the desired situation. The ultimate service, of course, is to have the full list published as an integral part of each issue, but funds available will not allow for this at present. It will be clearly observed how much more efficiency in registration could be brought about if a monthly full list was available.

**FASTER SHOOTING.** The advantages of faster shooting are many. The gun is moved less distance, which makes for less work. When the swing is fast, the follow-through is good and you are less apt to shoot behind your target. Fast shooters break more targets in unseasonal weather and rarely complain about traps. A few disadvantages become apparent to the fast shooter. One is the possibility that on days when reflexes and timing are not quite up to normal, the fast shooter will be more apt to

"fall apart" and lose many targets, while the slower pointer will muddle along, probably chopping and chipping, but getting together a better score in the long run.

If a shooter wants to speed up his shooting, it is necessary to hold the gun high—point at a spot over the traphouse about one third to half the rise of the target. Focus the eyes on the edge of the traphouse rather than on the gun. The instant the target leaves the trap, start the gun moving to intersect its flight path. Do not be afraid to slam into the target the instant the sight picks it up. No one can afford to be timid in this type of shooting, as it is inherently a slam bang style that requires confidence and positive movements.

**NEW ZEALAND WINS 1961 INTERNATIONAL.** Cabled advice has been received from London that the New Zealand Team has been successful in winning the Mackintosh International Trophy for 1961. The cabled report states, "Mackintosh Trophy event: New Zealand 8606, Canada 8601, South Africa 8199, Australia 7933, England 7831, Scotland 7723, Central Africa 7604, Ireland 7352, Wales 7003." Heartiest congratulations are extended to our New Zealand kinsmen on a fine win. The A.C.T.A. President (Mr. J. M. Tyquin) adds his personal congratulations to the New Zealand Team. The New Zealand Team shot at Hamilton, N.Z., during the annual New Zealand

National Championships and the performance was witnessed by most of the Australian Team which visited New Zealand during the final weeks of March last.

The Australian aggregate, taken on an average, was the lowest for some years and could be put down, very largely, to the difficult wind conditions which prevailed on the day the Australians shot. It is notable that this year South Africa finished ahead of Australia for the first time.

A picture of the Australian Team appeared in the July issue of this publication and the scores are detailed elsewhere in this issue.



## OUT OF THE PAST

### Twenty Years Ago

Squadron-Ldr. Toss Ingledew, then a test pilot of the new British aeroplane, the Hurricane, shooting at a Blackburn Club fixture, won the forward-marker's award in the Commonwealth Deauville Doubles title of 1941, partnered by club secretary, Aubrey Johnson. Ingledew is still interested in the sport, although not taking such an active interest as formerly. Johnson could be classified as an evergreen—he is still very much interested in shooting and particularly at the Australian Club at East Burwood, V. The main winners of the 1941 Commonwealth Deauville Doubles title were H. R. Donelly and "Dick" (T. R. Wightman, a former

chairman of the A.C.T.A. Committee).


George Copeland, who is quite a frequent visitor to the traps, especially in big events today, gained the gun honours at the Nobel fixture at Bentleigh on a windy day in the spring of 1941. He carded 47/50—excellent shooting in the conditions.

George Biggs and W. R. Johns had a great tussle in a miss-out event at Coburg about this period. They stuck together to the 24th round before Johns got the upper hand. Biggs had won two events outright on the same programme early in the day.

### Ten Years Ago

Brown of Dandenong from Bob Jorgenson of Portarlington. Joe Harle, a former President of the club, won the front-marker award.

I have noted your change of address and the June Gunshot has already been forwarded to you. Future issues of this magazine will be similarly addressed.

First let me congratulate you on your election as President of the Australian Clay Target Association. I offer you best wishes for an enjoyable term of office. I was advised of your appointment by your fellow men who attended our 1961 Championships, and it was my intention to write to you on my return from Hamilton. However, I delayed doing so until such time as I could advise the dates of the 1962 New Zealand Championships. It has now been decided that this tournament will be held at Timaru from the 4th - 11th April, 1962, inclusive. Originally it was considered that we should conduct this shoot from the 11th - 18th April. Albert expresses the opinion that the standard of skeet shooting he saw in New Zealand is higher and that conditions are more difficult than in Australia, as the pairs are released simultaneously.

However, under the I.S.U. rules which were adopted by the A.C.T.A. last year this is the only way in which they may be released.

Although disconcerting to a shooter seeing, for the first time, a pair of birds released simultaneously flying in opposite directions, this type of release is no more difficult than the old style of the second bird being

released on the report of the gun, once one learns to concentrate on one bird at a time.

Having seen a team of N.Z. shooters in action at my own club (Australian), I doubt very much whether the standard is higher over there than here. The standard of skeet shooting has improved tremendously in Australia over the last two years, and in Victoria scratch men have little hope of winning handicaps unless they can shoot 24 or 25 out of 25.

Should Mr. Albert be in Melbourne any time I would invite him to the Australian Club, East Burwood, to see for himself what standards have been reached in Australia.



Thirteen shooters will soon receive prizes, each of a case of I.C.I.A.N.Z. sporting ammunition. The shooters concerned returned to the Fisheries and Wildlife Department "lucky number" bands from the legs of ducks they shot during the season. The winners are from four States, Tasmania, South Australia, New South Wales and Victoria. This is the fourth year that the Company has offered prizes for these bands. Those returned assist the Fisheries and Wildlife Department measure the shooting pressure on birds as well as giving indication on feeding, breeding and migratory habits. In addition to these prizes I.C.I. Ltd. made a grant to the Department in 1960, which enabled it to buy and equip a mobile laboratory and a four-wheel-drive vehicle to pull it and in addition provided a substantial sum towards the running costs of research. Banding of ducks began in Victoria in 1952 and will now be extended to South Australia for the first time. In all, some 46,000 ducks have been banded and about 5,500 bands have been returned — this year 1,400 bands were returned, the most since a total of 2,500 were returned in 1958 — the first year I.C.I. offered prizes.

Lance Cockett of Boronia (V.), who has long used the shooting nom-de-plume of "Lance", recently returned from a 22 months' trip abroad. He has written giving an outline of his activities and, as might be expected, refers to his visit to Monte Carlo. He states that he stayed some three weeks in Monte Carlo and, of course, visited the famous shooting grounds on several occasions and shot against some of the world's most outstanding and famous shots. He considers the Italian shooters have the "game sewn up"; many of them shoot every day (or very nearly) of the year, in France, Italy, Spain or Monte Carlo. 



The shooting club at Monte Carlo has been operating for 84 years. Double whiskies at the bar cost 14/- each. Writing of clay target shooting in England, Cockett states that the A.C.T.A. is doing a wonderful job for the Australian shooters. He considers Australian prizes and trophies generally are far in advance of those provided in England. Cockett is all in favour of points scoring, as is largely used in Great Britain. Nowhere in the world, other than Australia and possibly New Zealand, are two barrels used. He has his facts very clear on this point, having checked with the systems in America, France, Italy, Belgium and Russia. Cockett continues and mentions that at an organized shoot of 10 guns in England the party bagged 498 pheasants in a wood of some 27 acres. He concludes by stating, "In brief, Australian shooters are well looked after, good prizes, fair handicapping and a good monthly journal to tell them exactly what's doing, and that is more than shooters abroad get."

A report from the Newcastle Club (N.S.W.) provides a suggestion that might well be followed by some of the larger clubs. It appears that the Newcastle Club committee decided to allot one of its traps for "practice shooting only". The shooters buy a certain number of targets and go along to the practice trap and shoot out their complement. The procedure allows the raw novice to get the feel of his gun before entering into competitive events and also permits the experienced shooter to visit the practice trap as often as he thinks he needs the practice and in addition gives the shooters who may be waiting to shoot in an event a run-through before facing up to competition. The scheme has produced splendid results at Newcastle. 


