The Editor's Notebook



INTERNATIONAL MATCH. Match conditions for the next International conditions for the next International Match remain as at present, i.e. 100 targets per man from 16 yards, double-barrel, points scoring 3 and 2. The venue of the Australian section of the match will be decided at the October meeting of the Executive Committee of the Association.

Of interest in regard to the International Match is an advice from the International Committee in London that "it has been unanimously agreed that South Africa should continue to enter a team for this Trophy, despite the recent political changes, and that they should do so for many years to come." The information is heartening news and, it is felt certain, welcomed by all Australian sportsmen.

A.C.T.A. BROCHURE OF SHOOT-ING RULES. All shooters interested are advised that a brochure of the A.C.T.A. Shooting Rules is now available on application to the Secretary, A.C.T.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Mel-bourne, C.1, on payment of 2/6, plus postage 5d.

HANDICAPPING ON BREAKS. Shooters who run up breaks are re-minded regarding the handicapping formula covering breaks, as approved by the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee. The Official Handicapping Formula reads:

50 Break.

If compiled in front of regular handicap — no alteration in handicap.

4

If compiled three yards or more behind regular handicap — 2 yards back.

If compiled on or one or two yards behind regular handicap - 1 yard back.

75 Break or Over.

- If compiled in front of regular handicap - no alteration.
- If compiled three yards or more be-hind regular handicap 3 yards back.
- If compiled on or one or two yards behind regular handicap - 2 yards back.

The foregoing is reprinted following a number of requests regarding handicapping on break performances. There is no handicapping adjustment if a shooter on a mark of, say, 16 yards in a district championship or similar event registers a break, pro-viding his A.C.T.A. handicap is not 16 yards or a mark in front of 16 yards. However, should a shooter on 16 yards or a mark in front of 16 yards win an open championship, then he is handicapped back to the mark from which he won.

BREAK BADGES. Despite oftrepeated intimation, clubs are occa-sionally writing to the Association to ascertain whether a shooter registering a break of 50 or more in front of his handicap is entitled to lodge a claim for a break badge. All are informed that break may be recorded from "any mark". Which means that a shooter who may be, say, a

20 yarder can gain break recognition for a break registered in a 16-yard event. At one period, some years ago, break claims were only recognised if these were recorded on the shooter's handicap or behind his handicap. Runs of 50 or more made in front of the regulation handicap were, at that period, not acceptable for break recognition. However, as already mentioned, that situation is now changed and break claims will be recognised by the A.C.T.A. from any mark. It should always be remem-bered that breaks are only acceptable if recorded in regulation down-theline events, under double or single-barrel conditions. No break badges will be issued for recordings made at double-rise, walk-up, Deauville Doubles, mixed birds or tower, or any other novelty event conceived by a club to provide variety, such as auto and driven and the like. When a club makes a claim for a break badge on behalf of a shooter, it should be remembered that the actual score sheets on which the break was recorded should be forwarded to the A.C.T.A. office with the claim. Clubs failing to send in the score sheets only im-pede the issue of the badge, because no break badge will be issued without the score sheets in substantiation.

DEAUVILLE DOUBLES, A shooter recently wrote the Association seeking a ruling on "no birds" as applicable to Deauville Doubles. The shooter quoted the fact that he had been "no birded" by a referee when one of the targets of a pair in a Deauville Doubles competition had been thrown high. The Referee is the sole judge as to whether a "regula-tion" target is thrown, either in down-the-line, competition, Deauville Doubles, double-rise or a competition of any kind. Therefore, if the Referee considered one of the targets thrown was not a "regular" target, he is quite within the Rules to declare "no bird" and allow the competitor another pair. Some may be confused by the oft-repeated indication that "Deauville Doubles is an all in" com-petition. Reference to "all in" competition should not be understood to apply also to irregular targets - one has no bearing on the other. The reference to "all in" concerns such

happenings as a misfire or mechanical failure. For the information of all, Rule 97, which deals with this section of the sport, is quoted as follows: "Any misfire or mechanical failure does not entitle the shooters to another pair of targets and they must abide by the result."

RULE 7. Rule 7 of the A.C.T.A. Shooting Rules states, "When firing, the competitor's feet must be behind the firing mark assigned to him, and he must stand with both feet within 18 inches on either side of the centre of this mark. Should the competitor fail to observe the above Rule, a lost target' will be declared." This Rule does not seem to be quite fully understood by some shooters and also Referees. Many misinterpret the Rule to read that the "competitor should have both feet together"—the Rule makes no reference to both feet being "together". The Rule clearly indicates that a shooter must stand within "18 inches of the centre" (either side). The Rule actually had its origin

more than two decades ago when a then prominent shooter adopted the practice of standing off the concrete and altogether making his own position for shooting. The ruling Com-mittee of the day discussed this shooter's action very thoroughly and came to the conclusion that he was endeavouring to secure an advantage over the shooter who remained on his concrete track, hence the formation of the present Rule 7.

ASSOCIATION INCORPORATION. Arrangements for the Incorporation of the A.C.T.A., as approved by the 1961 Annual Meeting, have been completed and the final draft will be presented to the October meeting of the Executive Committee. Meanwhile Memorandum and Articles, as approved by the Crown Law authorities, are published in this issue.

Memorandum of Association and

Articles of Association

of

Australian Clay Target Association

1. The name of the Association is the "Australian Clay Target Associa-tion". (g) To take any gift of property whether subject to any special trust or not for any one or more

2. The objects for which the Association is established are:-

- (a) To promote develop and encourage in all its forms the sport of Clay Target Trap Shooting and to establish and form and to affiliate Clay Target Trap Shoot-ing Clubs throughout the Commonwealth of Australia.
- (b) To take over the whole or any part or parts of the real and personal property belonging to and to undertake all or any of the liabilities of the unincorpor-ated association known as the "Australian Clay Target Associa-tion" whose principal office is situate in Melbourne in the State of Victoria.
- (c) To purchase take on lease or in exchange or otherwise acquire any real or personal estate which may be deemed necessary or convenient for any of the pur-poses of the Association and to sell manage lease mortgage give in exchange dispose of or otherwise deal with the same or any part thereof.
- (d) To construct maintain and alter any houses buildings or works necessary or convenient for the purposes of the Association.
- (e) To borrow and raise money in such manner as the Association may think fit.
- (f) To invest and deal with any moneys of the Association not immediately required for any of its objects in such manner as may from time to time be determined.

- (h) To take such steps by personal or written appeals public meetings or otherwise as may from time to time be deemed expedient for the purposes of procuring contributions to the funds of the Association in the shape of donations annual subscriptions or otherwise.
- (i) To print and publish any newspapers periodicals books or leaflets that the Association may think desirable for the promotion of its objects.
- (j) To promote and hold either alone or jointly with any other association club authority company or person competitions tournaments and matches and to offer give or contribute toward prizes medals and awards in respect thereof.
- (k) To hire employ remove replace or reinstate Secretaries Managers clubs servants workmen and other persons in and for the carrying out of the objects of the Association and to pay them in return for services rendered to the Association salaries wages and gratuities.
- (1) To subscribe to any charities and to grant donations for any public purpose and to provide a Super-annuation fund for the servants of the Association or otherwise to assist any such servants their widows children and dependants.
- (m) To establish and support and to aid in the establishment and support of and to subscribe to or become a member of any other

- (n) To amalgamate with any association club society institution or company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of this Association and whose Memorandum of Association prohibits the division of its income and property amongst its members at least to the same extent as is provided in paragraph 3 of this Memorandum of Association.
- (o) To purchase or otherwise acquire and undertake all or any part of the property assets liabilities and engagements of any one or more of the associations clubs societies institutions or companies with which this Association is authorised to amalgamate.
- (p) To transfer all or any part of the property assets liabilities and engagements of this Association to any one or more of the associations clubs societies institutions or companies with which this Association is authorised to amalgamate.
- (q) To do all such other lawful things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects PROVIDED that the Association shall not support with its funds or endeavour to impose on a procure to be observed by its members or others any regulation or restriction which if an object of the Association would make it a trade union within the meaning of the Trade Union Acts 1958.

3. The income and property of the Association whencesoever derived, shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the objects of the Association as set forth in this Memorandum of Association and no portion thereof shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend, bonus or otherwise howsoever, by way of profit to members of the Association:—

Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent the payment in good faith of remuneration to any officers or servants of the Association

or to any member of the Association in return for any services actually rendered to the Association nor for goods supplied in the ordinary and usual way of business, nor prevent the payment of interest at a rate not exceeding the rate for the time being fixed for the purposes of this paragraph by the Articles of Association on money borrowed from any member of the Association or reasonable and proper rent for premises demised or let by any member to the Association but so that no member of the council of management or governing body of the Association shall be appointed to any salaried office of the Association or any office of the Association paid by fees and that no remuneration or other benefit in money or money's worth shall be given by the Association to any member of such council or governing body except repayment of out-of-pocket expenses and interest at the rate aforesaid on money lent or reasonable and proper rent for premises demised or let to the Association.

4. No addition, alteration or amendment shall be made to the objects of the Association as set out in paragraph 2 or to or in the regulations contained in the Articles of Association for the time being in force unless the same shall have been previously submitted to and approved by the Attorney-General of the State of Victoria.

5. The third fourth and ninth paragraphs of this Memorandum of Association contain conditions upon which a licence is granted by the Attorney-General of Victoria to the Association in pursuance of the provisions of Section 19 of the Comprovisions of Section 19 of the Com-panies Act 1958 of the said State. For the purpose of preventing any evasion of the provisions of the said paragraphs the Attorney-General may from time to time on the application of any member of the Association and on giving notice to the Association of his intention so to do and after affording the Association an opportunity of being heard in opposition thereto, within such time as may be specified in such notice, impose further conditions which shall be duly observed by the Association.

6. The liability of the members of the Association is limited.

7. Every member of the Association undertakes to contribute to the assets of the Association in the event of its being wound up while he is a member or within one year afterwards for payment of the debts and liabilities of the Association contracted before the time at which he ceases to be a member, and the costs, charges and expenses of winding up and for an adjustment of the rights of contributories among themselves such amount as may be required not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. If upon the winding up or dissolution of the Association there remains after satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities any property whatsoever, the same shall not be paid to or distributed amongst the members of the Association but shall be given or transferred to some institution or institutions having objects similar or in part similar to the objects of the Association and which shall prohibit the distribution of its or their income and property among its or their members to an extent at least as great as is imposed on the Association under or by virtue of the third paragraph hereof, such insti-tution or institutions to be determined by the members of the Association at or before the time of dissolution, and in default thereof by such judge of

the Supreme Court of Victoria as may have or acquire jurisdiction in the matter.

9. True accounts shall be kept of the sums of money received and expended by the Association and the matter in respect of which such receipt or expenditure takes place and of the property, credits and liabilities of the Association and subject to any reasonable restrictions as to time and manner of inspecting the same that may be imposed in accordance with the regulations of the Association for the time being shall be open to the inspection of the members. Such account shall upon the written request of the Attorney-General be made available for inspection by him or by anyone authorised in writing by him for the purpose. Once at least in every year the accounts of the Association shall be examined by one or more properly qualified auditor or auditors.

10. The place in Victoria in which the registered office of the Association is proposed to be situate is Melbourne.

Articles of Association

OF

Australian Clay Target Association

Interpretation

1. In these Articles unless the context otherwise requires:-

"The Association" shall mean the "Australian Clay Target Association".

"Club" shall mean a Clay Target Trap Shooting Club formed and established for the purposes and promotion of the sport of clay target trap shooting within the Commonwealth of Australia.

"Delegate" shall mean a delegate appointed by the members of an Unincorporated Club to be admitted as a member of the Association.

"Executive Committee" shall mean the Executive Committee of the Association.

"Incorporated Club" shall mean every Club which by the laws of the State of Victoria is recognized as a legal person.

"In writing" includes typing printing and other means of producing the written word.

"Month" means calendar month.

"Representative" shall mean a person authorized by an Incorporated Club to vote on behalf of such Club at a meeting of the Association.

"Unincorporated Club" shall mean every Club which by the laws of the State of Victoria is not recognized as a legal person.

Words importing the singular include the plural. Words importing the masculine gender include the feminine.

Construction

2. These Articles shall be construed with reference to the provisions of the Companies Act 1958 of the State of Victoria and unless the context otherwise requires terms used in these Articles shall have the same respective meanings as they have when used in such Act.

Objects

3. The Association is established for the purposes expressed in the Memorandum of Association.

Number of Members

4. For the purposes of registration the number of members is declared to consist of three hundred members but the Executive Committee may from time to time whenever it deems fit register an increase of members.

Members

5. The following shall be members of the Association:

- (a) Every Incorporated Club which at the date of the incorporation of the Association was a member of the unincorporated body known as the "Australian Clay Target Association" and which shall on or before the first day of December 1961 or such extended period as the Executive Committee may determine cause to be delivered to the Secretary of the Association notice of acceptance of membership in the Association in the form in the Schedule hereto and under the seal of such club.
- (b) Such other Incorporated Clubs as from time to time shall be admitted to membership of the Association.
- The Delegate of every Unincor-(c) porated Club which at the date of the incorporation of the Association was a Club affiliated with the unincorporated body known as the "Australian Clay Target Association" and which shall on or before the First day of December 1961 or such extended period as the Executive Committee may determine cause to be delivered to the Secretary of the Association a nomination of Delegate for membership of the Association in the form in the Schedule hereto and signed by the President or Secretary of such Club.

(d) The Delegate of every other Unincorporated Club which from time to time shall be approved by the Executive Committee as eligible to nominate a delegate for membership of the Association.

Application for Membership

6. Any Incorporated Club within the Commonwealth of Australia may signify in writing in the form in the Schedule hereto to the Secretary of the Association its desire to become a member of the Association and its agreement to be bound by the Memorandum and Articles of Association and by-laws of the Association and upon receipt from such club of the annual subscription the Secretary shall unless otherwise directed by that Executive Committee enter the name of such club in the register of members of the Association and upon such entry such club shall become a member.

7. The Delegate of any Unincorporated Club within the Commonwealth of Australia may signify in writing to the Secretary of the Association his desire as such Delegate to become a member of the Association and his agreement as such Delegate to be bound by the Memorandum and Articles of Association and by-laws of the Association and upon receipt from him of the annual subscription and upon receipt from the Club of which he is the Delegate of notice in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 16 hereof the Secretary shall unless otherwise directed by the Executive Committee enter the name of such Delegate in the register of members of the Association and upon such entry such Delegate shall become a member.

Termination of Membership

8. Any member of the Association wishing to resign his or its membership shall give notice in writing addressed to the Secretary of the Association and thereupon his or its name shall be removed from the register of members and it shall be deemed to have resigned.

9. Upon the removal of a Delegate from his position as such Delegate and upon receipt from the Club of which he is the Delegate of written notice in accordance with paragraph 17 hereof or upon the expiration of the period of appointment of a Delegate such Delegate shall cease to be eligible for membership of the Association and his name shall be removed from the register of members and he shall cease to be a member of the Association.

10. Any member who or which is two months in arrear with its annual subscription or with any levy made by the Executive Committee shall cease ipso facto to be a member of the Association but may be reinstated in the discretion of the Executive Committee on payment of all arrears.

, 11. If any member shall wilfully refuse or neglect to comply with or observe the provisions of the Memorandum and Articles or By-laws of the Association or be guilty of any conduct prejudicial to the welfare or interests of the Association or which the Executive Committee deems to be unsportsmanlike the Executive Committee by resolution passed by not less than two thirds of the individual members of the Executive Committee present and voting at a meeting of the Executive Committee convened to consider such non-compliance nonobservance or conduct may expel suspend fine or otherwise deal with such member in such manner as the Executive Committee may deem fit.

PROVIDED ALWAYS that such member shall be given at least 7 days notice of such meeting and of the nature of the complaint against him or it. Such member club shall be entitled to give either orally or in writing any explanation or defence he or it may think fit. A resolution of the Executive Committee for the expulsion of a member shall be confirmed by a majority of members who being entitled so to do vote at a Special General Meeting of Members of the Association held for that purpose as soon as practicable after the passing of such resolution.

12. If any Unincorporated Club a Delegate of which is a member of the Association shall wilfully refuse or neglect to comply with or observe the provisions of the Memorandum and Articles or by-laws of the Association or be guilty of any conduct prejudicial to the welfare or interests of the Association or which the Executive Committee deems to be unsportsmanlike the Executive Committee by resolution passed by not less than two thirds of the individual members of the Executive Committee present and voting at a meeting of the Executive Committee convened to consider such non-compliance nonobservance or conduct may declare such Club ineligible to nominate a Delegate to be a member of the Association and may expel suspend fine or otherwise deal with the Delegate of such Club who is a member of the Association.

13. A member club ceasing from any cause whatsoever to be a member of the Association shall forfeit all right in and claim upon the Association and its property and the name of such member club shall thereupon be removed from the register of members.

Subscriptions

14. The annual subscriptions payable by member clubs shall be such as the Association in general meeting shall from time to time prescribe provided that until otherwise resolved in General Meeting the annual subscription shall be Five pounds. All annual subscriptions shall become due and payable in advance on the first day of January in every year. Any person or Incorporated Club admitted to membership during a year shall pay the full subscription for the year in which he or it is so admitted.

Appointment of Delegates

15. The members of each and every Unincorporated Club such as is described in sub-paragraphs (c) and (d) of paragraph 5 hereof may nominate from among their members one Delegate to be a member of the Association and by virtue of such appointment such Delegate shall subject to the provisions of paragraph 12 hereof be eligible for membership of the Association until the expiration of the period of his appointment or until the majority of the members of such Club shall in general meeting pass a resolution removing him from his position as the delegate of such Club.

16. A Delegate shall not be deemed to be appointed as the Delegate of an Unincorporated Club until formal

notice in writing of such appointment in the form in the Schedule hereto and signed by the President or Secretary of such Club has been received by the Association.

17. A Delegate shall not be deemed to be removed from his position as Delegate of an Unincorporated Club until formal notice in writing of such removal signed by the President or Secretary of such Club has been received by the Association.

18. Upon the removal of a Delegate from his position as such Delegate or upon the expiration of the period of his appointment as such Delegate the Unincorporated Club of which he was previously the Delegate may appoint any member of such Club to be the Delegate of such Club from the date of such removal or of the expiration of such appointment.

Voting

19. Every member shall be entitled to one vote on any matter arising at any General Meeting of the Association except on the election of State Members to the Executive Committee which shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of Article 25 hereof. No member shall have the right to attend a General Meeting of the Association or vote thereat unless:

- (a) Such member has paid all subscriptions and other moneys due by him or it to the Association including subscriptions from registered shooters as provided in Article 49 hereof, and
- (b) In the case of any member who is the Delegate of an Unincorporated Club, written notice of his appointment as such Delegate is in the hands of the Secretary of the Association at least seven days prior to the date of the meeting.

20. Any member Club may by resolution of its directors or other governing body authorize such person being a member of such member club as it thinks fit to act as its representative either at a particular meeting or at all meetings of the Association and a person so authorized shall in accordance with his authority until his authority is revoked by such member Club be entitled to exercise the same powers

on behalf of such member Club as such member Club could exercise if it were an individual member of the Association. A certificate under the seal of the said member Club shall be prima facie evidence of the appointment or of the revocation of the appointment (as the case may be) of a representative appointed pursuant to the provisions of this Article.

21. A representative of a member Club shall not be deemed to be appointed as the representative of such Club until formal notice of such appointment in the form in the Schedule hereto and under the seal of such member Club has been received by the Association.

22. Where a representative is appointed to represent a member Club at all meetings of the Association such representative shall not be deemed to be removed from his position as the representative of such member Club until formal notice of such removal under the seal of such member Club shall have been received by the Association.

23. Upon the removal of the representative of a member club from his position as such representative or upon the expiration of the period of his appointment as such representative the member Club of which he was previously the representative may appoint any person being a member of such member Club to be the representative of such member Club from the date of such removal or of the expiration of such appointment.

Executive Committee

24. The management and control of the Association and its property shall be in the hands of an Executive Committee consisting of a President, four members elected for the State of Victoria, four members elected for the State of New South Wales, three members for the State of Queensland, two members elected for the State of Tasmania, one member elected for the State of Western Australia, and one member elected for the State of South Australia. Provided that no member of the Executive Committee shall be elected for any State unless in such State there are six or more Clubs which are financial members of the Association or Delegates of

which are financial members of the Association.

25. The Executive Committee shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting and all members of the Association and members of the Executive Committee present and entitled to vote thereat may take part and vote in the election of the President, but only the member Clubs and Delegates representing Unincorporated Clubs situated in the State for which the members of the Executive Committee are to be elected shall take part and vote in the election of the members of the Executive Committee for that State.

26. At the Annual General Meeting half of the Executive Committee members from each State shall retire. The members to retire in every year shall be those who have been longest in office since their last election. When the Executive Committee members for a State are not two or multiple of two, then the number nearest to but greater than one half shall retire. Retiring members will be eligible for re-election.

27. Nominations for all offices in the Association and membership of the Executive Committee must be in writing signed by the Secretary of the member Club or by the Delegate member of an Unincorporated Club making the nomination and must reach the Secretary of the Association on or before the thirty-first day of December in each year prior to the Annual General Meeting.

28. Any individual member of a member Club or of a Club of which a Delegate is a member of the Association whether he is the Delegate for such Club or not may be elected to any of the offices of the Association and any such member of a member Club or of a Club of which a Delegate is a member of the Association situated in a State for which members of the Executive Committee are to be elected may be elected to the Executive Committee as one of the members for that State.

29. The Secretary shall pay from Association funds the actual fares (including plane fares) of members of the Executive Committee to and from not more than two meetings of the Executive Committee in each year and in addition shall pay such allowance for accommodation as the Association in General Meeting shall from time to time prescribe provided that until otherwise resolved in general meeting the allowance shall be $\pm 4/4/$ - per day for not more than three days for each of such members attending meetings of the Executive Committee for not more than two such meetings in each year.

30. The Executive Committee shall carry out the objects of the Association by supporting and encouraging the holding of shoots as shall seem to it desirable. It shall manage the affairs of the Association and generally deal with all matters relative to the affairs of the Association. It shall have power to make new rules or amend any existing rules of Clay Target Shooting which Rules shall remain in full force and effect until amended or repealed by the Executive Committee for the time being. It may fill vacancies which may occur amongst office-bearers of members of the Executive Committee appoint special committees or sub-committees to perform such functions as it shall consider necessary or desirable and do such other acts and things as it may consider advisable for the benefit of the Association its members and Clay Target Trap Shooting in general.

31. A person appointed to the Executive Committee to fill a casual vacancy shall retain his office only until the next Annual General Meeting.

32. Meetings of the Executive Committee may be called by the President or the Secretary or should either of these offices be vacant then by three members of the Executive Committee. The meeting shall be held at the usual or some other convenient place. Notices convening any meeting may be sent by letter or telegram which shall be posted or lodged for despatch at least seven days prior to the date of the meeting. Failure to send any notice shall not invalidate a meeting.

The President or Secretary shall have power if in the opinion of either of them an emergency arises as a result of which it is desirable to call a meeting of the Committee at shorter notice than seven days to call such meeting at any shorter notice which either of them shall deem sufficient having regard to the emergency which shall have arisen.

33. At all meetings of the Executive Committee the President if he is present shall preside. In his absence the members present shall appoint one of their number to preside. The Chairman shall have a casting vote in case of parity of voting as well as a personal vote. Four members of the Committee shall form a quorum. If any member of the Executive Committee is absent without leave from three consecutive meetings of the Committee the Committee may declare such member's seat vacant and he shall thereupon cease to be a member of the Committee.

34. Without detracting from the generality of the powers conferred on the Executive Committee it may:—

- (a) require any member Club or any member the Delegate of a Club to lodge with it a copy of such Club's rules;
- (b) require any member Club to make such amendments or alterations to its rules as the Executive Committee considers necessary or advisable in the interest of the sport and to protect and maintain the authority of the Association;
- (c) require any member the Delegate of an Unincorporated Club to cause to be made such amendments or alterations to the rules of such Unincorporated Club as the Executive Committee considers necessary or advisable in the interests of the sport or to protect and maintain the authority of the Association;
- suspend or disqualify from par-(d)ticipation in any clay target trap shooting competition or meeting for such period as to it shall seem proper any individual member of a member Club or of a Club of which the Delegate is a member of the Association who commits any breach of the Memorandum or Articles or by-laws of the Association or refuses to or does not obey the Executive Committee or who is in arrear for three months with his registration or who has failed to pay any fine or penalty or entrance money imposed upon him or pay-

able by him to any member Club or Club of which a Delegate is a member of the Association or under the Articles or by-laws of the Association or is guilty of unsportsmanlike conduct and any member or person so suspended or disqualified shall not be entitled to enter at any competition meeting or event held under the Articles or by-laws of the Association or to enter upon any ground or enclosure for the time being under the control of any member Club or of any Club of which a Delegate is a member of the Association or the Association while such suspension or disqualification continues and it may expel any such person from such ground or enclosure:

- (e) hold such shooting meetings competitions and events as it considers advisable;
- (f) refuse any entry at any meeting competition or event;
- (g) require to be submitted to it for its approval the rules programme and dates of all shooting meetings competitions and events (except club shoots) proposed to be held under the rules of the Association;
- (h) make a special levy from time to time upon member Clubs for the purpose of meeting the expenses of the Association;
- (i) make rescind or amend by-laws regulating the conduct of all shooting meetings competitions and events and of all member Clubs and Clubs of which a Delegate is a member of the Association and the individual members thereof and of all competitors whether members of a Club or not and providing generally for the good conduct and welfare of the sport of Clay Target Trap Shooting.

35. The Executive Committee shall be the final body to which any aggrieved person or club may appeal against the decision or actions of any club or person on any matters arising out of the affairs of any club or of Clay Target Trap Shooting generally and its decision shall be final and binding.

Honorary Vice-Presidents

36. At any Annual General Meeting the members may elect any number of Honorary Vice-Presidents provided that notice of the nomination of any person as an Honorary Vice-President has been given by the member nominating such person to the Secretary at least seven days prior to the date of the said meeting. Every such Honorary Vice-President shall hold office until the next Annual General Meeting when he shall retire but he shall be eligible for re-election. No Honorary Vice-President shall, by virtue of holding the office of Honorary Vice-President, have any right of membership of the Executive Committee or of being present at any meetings of or of taking part in the deliberations of the Executive Committee.

Secretary

37.-

- (a) The Secretary shall keep minute books in which he shall record full and accurate minutes of the proceedings and resolutions of all the meetings of the Executive Committee and of the Association. Such books shall be open at all reasonable business hours to the members of the Committee. He shall also keep a Roll Book containing the names and addresses of member Clubs and registered shooters and shall record all additions thereto changes therein and deletions therefrom. He shall also keep such other books and records as shall be necessary or which he may from time to time be directed or required to keep by the Executive Committee.
- (b) The Secretary shall be appointed upon such terms and at such salary as Executive Committee shall from time to time determine.

38. The Secretary shall receive and issue receipts for all moneys received by him on behalf of the Association and shall keep proper and accurate books of account which shall at all times be open for inspection by the Executive Committee or any member thereof. An auditor who shall be a qualified accountant and who shall not be a member of the Executive Committee or of a member Club or of an Unincorporated Club of which a Delegate is a member of the Association shall be elected at each annual meeting and shall hold office until the next annual meeting. He shall from time to time examine the accounts of the Association and audit the annual Balance Sheet and accounts and submit his report thereon in writing to the annual meeting.

Registered Office

41. The Registered Office of the Association shall at all times be situated within the City of Melbourne.

Resignation of Office-bearer or Removal from Office

 (a) No Office-bearer or other office of the Association shall be deemed to have resigned his office until his resignation in writing shall have been accepted by the Executive Committee.
- (b) Any Office-bearer or other officer of the Association may be re-

Quorum at General Meeting

Proceedings at General Meetings

- (b) Votes except on the election of the Office-bearers and members of the Executive Committee may be taken at all meetings on the voices, by show of hands, by division (if the Chairman shall so decide) or by ballot, upon request of one-third of the members present. Votes on the election of Office-bearers and members of the Executive Committee shall be by secret ballot.

By-Laws

Registered Shooters

- (a) The Association shall keep a register of shooters and no person may enter or compete at any Association competition or event or at any competition or event conducted by a member Club by a Club of which a Delegate is a member of the Association unless such person is registered with the Association and is not in arrear with his subscription. The Association shall have the right of refusing to register any person as a registered shooter without giving any reason for such refusal. The subscription payable by a registered shooter shall be determined by the Annual Meeting from time to time. The Association shall have the right to de-register any registered shooter for conduct which the Executive Committee decides is unsportsmanlike or for any breach of the rules or By-Laws of the Association or for failing to observe the decisions of the Association.
- (b) Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an Unincorporated Club shall before the thirty-first day of January in each year supply the Secretary with a full and accurate list of all members and shooters registered with such club for the year commencing on the first day of January of such year and shall at the same time remit to the Secretary the subscriptions of such Club members and shooters. Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an Unincorporated Club shall also promptly forward to the Secretary of the Association the names and subscriptions of any persons joining such club or registering

as shooters after the thirty-first day of January in any year.

Borrowing Powers

- (a) The Executive Committee may exercise all the powers of the Association to borrow money and to issue debentures stock bonds or obligations of the Association at any time in any form or manner and for any amount for the purposes of the Association.
- (b) For the purposes of paragraph 3 of the Memorandum of Association the rate of interest to be paid by the Association on moneys borrowed from any member of the Association shall not exceed eight per centum per annum.

Notices

51. A notice may be given by the Association to any member either by delivering the same personally to such member or by sending it by post to such member at his registered address and in the case of a member Club either by delivering the same personally to the President or Secretary of such member Club or by sending it by post to such member Club at its registered address. Where a notice is sent by post service of the notice shall be deemed to be effected by properly addressing prepaying and posting a letter envelope a wrapping containing the notice and shall be deemed to have been effected at the time at which the such letter envelope a wrapping would be delivered in the ordinary course of post.

Seal

52. The seal of the Association shall not be affixed to any document except by authority of a resolution of the Executive Committee and in the presence of the Secretary and a member of the Executive Committee.



For the shooter who wishes to speed up his shooting, one of the first things to remember is to hold the gun a little higher — point it at a spot over the traphouse about one third to a half rise of the target. third to a half rise of the target. Focus the eyes on the edge of the traphouse rather than on your gun, and the instant the target leaves the traphouse, start the gun moving to intersect its flight path. Sweep through the target and as you go through, touch off the trigger. Your first point is generally the best one, so do not be afraid to shem into the so do not be afraid to slam into the target the instant your sights pick it up. No shooter can afford to be timid in this style of shooting, as it is inherently a "slam bang" style that requires positive movement and confidence.

The Royal Aero Gun Club at Bankstown Aerodrome, just outside Sydney, is installing night lighting and expects to run big night shoots in future. The club has also already installed two electric traps which, it is understood, are giving great satisfaction.

Hurricane winds circulate clockwise in the southern hemisphere and hemisphere.

A few tips for those who re-load shells. Remember that your trapshooting efforts are controlled by the quality of your re-loads. Insist on quality and constant inspection. All empty shells should be thoroughly inspected before loading. Watch for any cracks in the paper around the powder pocket section and at the edge of the brass. Wad pressure can cause ruptures. Inspect the interior base wad and make certain it is intact. Remove all foreign matter, grass, flecks of paper and the like which may lodge inside the tube. Keep the primer opening in the base wad clear of any paper flecks which might cover the cap hole in the primer and thus cause faulty ignition. Inspect the loaded shells before boxing. Look again for cracks and bulges around the wad and powder areas. The the wad and powder areas. Ine "hulls" sometimes separate from the brass when fired and cracks will be visible, if inspected before firing. Re-move the barrels from your gun and use them to check the head space for size on your loaded shells. The shells size on your loaded shells. Ine snells which do not drop freely into the chambers should be set aside for practice shooting only. Inspect the primer to ensure that it is flush with the base and seated in the counterbore in the brass. Always load in good light and never try to load shells in the dark.

Of interest in an American shooting publication is the reference in that publication to a glossary of terms as used by the general body October, 1961

of those in use in the Australian gun shooting world. A few examples follow: "Peeking" — lifting the head off the stock to see where the target is going. Usually results in the offender watching the flight of an un-broken target. "Short Yardage"---handicap yardages in the low-mark section, or below 20 yds. "Lots of grass" -an expression meaning that the shooter has a lot of handicap, i.e. a lot of grass between his post or shooting mark and the traphouse. "Wild target"-a target which fails to fly in the prescribed area. "Straight-away"—a target going away from the shooter in a straight line. Best example -- a target flying at right angle from the traphouse when the shooter is on station three. "Extreme Angle"-a target thrown to the maximum right or left with the shooter on tracks one or five. "Slow pull" — an unusual delay experienced between a call for the target and its between a call for the target and its emergence from the traphouse. "Fast pull"—a target thrown quickly, either before the shooter calls for it or is ready to fire. "Puller flinched"—the puller involuntarily freezes for a short period before reacting to the shooter's call. "Lead-off man"—the shooter who begins shooting on No. 1 track "Anchor man" the shocter 1 track. "Anchor man" — the shooter firing the last shot of a squad. "Across the board" — entering every possible event and sweepstake — this is also called "playing it all." From the foregoing it will be observed that our American friends speak almost the same language and the same expressions as Australian shooters when it comes to trapshooting.





Dear Sir, May I have space to reply to Mr. Roy Fallshaw regarding the standard of Skeet shooting in New Zealand. I can only form my opinion on what skeet shooting I have seen in Australia and on scores published in A.C.T. "Shooting News".

Scores in the N.Z. Skeet Championship shot at Hamilton, March 1961, were as follows: 1st 49 x 50; 2nd (2) 48 x 50, after shoot-off 141 x 150, 3rd 139 x 150, then six on 47 x 50, six 46 x 50, seven 45 x 50.

I will be very agreeably surprised if at the next Commonwealth Skeet Championships twenty-two of the top scores return cards of 45×50 and upwards.

The June 1961 issue of "Gunshot", which is the equivalent of our "Shooters' News", gives the "long run" awards for Skeet from June 1959 to March 1961 as follows: 50 - 73 - 50 - 58 - 108. The same issue of "Gunshot" also shows that there have been awarded to N.Z. Skeet shooters the following "long run" awards: 32 bronze badges, 50 x 50 or over; nine gold badges, 100 x 100 and over.





OUT OF THE PAST Twenty Years Ago

At Blackburn in October 1941 Fred Burns made an attempt to better and lower the break record of 80 straight held by Athol Love. Burns shot 44 without blemish, but faced up too hurriedly to his 45th and missed, and the record still remained with Love. The Australian record break was later gained by Newton Thomas when shooting in New South Wales.

Over 40 shooters attended a Red Cross Shoot conducted by the Coburg Club about this period in 1941. P. H. Lawson, one-time Secretary of the South Australian Gun Club in Ade-


laide, gained high-gun figures for the day with 30 straight. Main winners for the day were the late Ted Parow, two outright wins and a string of 36 straight in the process, and P. H. Lawson (S.A.). Another interesting result on the day was a run of 18/18 pairs under double-rise conditions by Athol Love. Love's success was gained in what was a scheduled 3 prs. double-rise event, yet he was pushed to the 18th round before winning from Frank Unmack, a one-time secretary of the Coburg Club. Later Love and Unmack paired and won a Deauville Doubles event outright.

Ten Years Ago

Much discussion was in vogue a decade ago regarding the holding of the gun by the shooter in walk-up competition. Happily, this controversy is no longer necessary, for the reason that the rules have now been changed to permit the shooter to hold the gun in an optional position in walk-up events, or in other words, "in any position consistent with safety".

In late September 1951 John Bryant Junr. ran up a string of 105 straight at the Coburg grounds. E. G. Biggs, who was also in fine form, had a break of 99, just missing out on the century recording. The breaks were compiled (chiefly) in the Coburg Club's 1951 club double-barrel championship. Eight had tied and young Bryant and Biggs shot it out to the 95th round before reaching a decision. Fred Burns filled third placing with 75/76. Burns won the Australian Club's premier title for 1951 (doublebarrel), 29/30.


