The Editor's Notebook



A.C.T.A. NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS AND INTERNATIONAL. Intending competitors in the A.C.T.A. National Championship shooting series, arranged to be held at Bankstown Aerodrome, the headquarters of the Royal Aero Gun Club, are reminded that competition will start sharp at 9.30 a.m. on Friday, March 9, with the 50-target Australian National Single-barrel Championship. At the conclusion of this match the new competition, to be known as the Australia-New Zealand Points Trophy Match, will be decided. This event, also at 50 targets, has the added attraction of bringing about the selection of the Australian Team to shoot against New Zealand later in the programme (actually on the following day). The six highest Australian scorers in the match will become the Australian Team, and will shoot against a similarly complemented team of New Zealanders for the Tom Glenn Cup—this will be decided on Saturday, March 10, following the Australian National Double-barrel Championship, which will commence at 9.0 a.m. on Saturday, March 10. If time permits, a £100 Handicap will be staged following the two events mentioned. The A.C.T.A. Annual Meeting of affiliated club delegates will be held at the Royal Aero Club Rooms at Bankstown on Sunday, March 11, commencing at 9.30 a.m. On Monday, March 12 (9.0 a.m. start), the popular A.C.T.A. Champion of Champions Cup, at 60 targets from 20 yards—the blue riband individual event of the series—will be shot, followed by

the Australian National Double-barrel Championship and the A.C.T.A. Intermediate Championship and another £100 Handicap (if time permits). The Sixteenth International Match (Australian section) will be shot at 100 targets per man, on Tuesday, March 13. The Australian team will be automatically selected from the highest scorers in the Australian National Single and Double-barrel Championships and the Australia-New Zealand Trophy match—the latter event being shot under points scoring system the same as the International Match. The Australian scores in the International Match are sealed and forwarded to London for checking and comparison with the opposing teams, England, Ireland, New Zealand, Scotland, Wales, South Africa, Central Africa, and Canada. Final results should be known late in June, 1962. The 13th Grand Australian Handicap at 45 targets will complete the listed events on the programme, and another £100 Handicap will be included, should time permit.

The Association is likely to have its shoot patronised in a truly International status for the 1962 series, for in addition to the New Zealanders, another overseas visitor expected is Mr. Nelson Dance of Hampshire (England). Mr. Dance will arrive in Sydney early in March and intends competing in all events open to him. He is a Vice-President of the English Clay Pigeon Association and a shooter of some renown. He will be a welcome addition to the overseas complement.

INTERSTATE TEAMS' MATCH.

Clubs which have been allocated the 1962 Interstate Teams' Match are advised of the conditions governing this competition. The directions for conducting the match are as laid down by the Executive Committee. The main points are outlined. Teams shall be of 15 men a side, with the best 10 scores to count. Teams members must have resided in the State for which they will shoot for at least the preceding three (3) months. Team members shoot their way into each State Team—that is, the State Team representing the State in which they reside. An elimination shoot is required, in all States, to decide the team complement. This elimination match is to be shot at not less than 30 birds per man from 18 yards, double-barrel, both barrels equal value, and nomination is to be not more than 30/-. The squad system of shooting (five tracks) is to be observed. In the event of ties to decide places, a shoot-off at a further five rounds shall be held until the place is decided. On completion of the elimination event the top 15 shooters automatically become the State Team, which will then shoot at 50 targets per man from 18 yards, using only special International load cartridges (1½ oz. of shot), double-barrel, both barrels equal value. In the event of ties for State High-gun, to be shot off at a further five rounds until finality. Only automatic angle traps may be used. Two check scorers are required and they must sign score sheet of each State Team result. The competitions may be fired at any period of the year convenient to the club conducting the series, provided the competition is completed and results are in the hands of the A.C.T.A. Secretary not later than October 7. Programme for day of the holding of the State

Teams' Match and Elimination shoot is required to be first approved by the A.C.T.A. and then advertised, at least one month prior to the holding of the competition, in the A.C.T.A. "News". No travelling expenses are allowable to any team member or member of the Executive Committee.

The A.C.T.A. will finance the actual Teams' Match to the extent of 950 clay targets and 750 cartridges in each State. Claims should be lodged for the value of the quantities stated immediately following the holding of the competition.

Clubs are instructed that souvenir trophies are required to be presented to each member of every State Team.

The winning Team will be announced following review of the score sheets from each State immediately following the October Executive Committee meeting of the A.C.T.A., and the successful Team will hold "The Great Britain & Ireland Trophy" for 12 months or until the next competition.

Clubs conducting the competition are reminded that all taking part, both in the elimination contest and the actual Teams' shoot, must be registered with the A.C.T.A. Fees are required to be paid prior to the start of the competition. Registration cards must be produced.

INCORPORATION OF A.C.T.A.

Several clubs have queried the conditions as enumerated in the Articles of Association of the A.C.T.A. as published in the October issue of "News". It is desired to point out that the Articles of Association are almost identical with the same Constitutional Rules of the A.C.T.A. as clubs have been shooting under for the past 25 years. One or two clubs have hesitated to complete the forms

of membership of the Association on account of the inclusion of Article 34. Here again it is mentioned that Article 34 is no different to what has been in existence in the Association Rules always, with the possible exception of Clause (C) of Article 34, which has been slightly re-written — practically the whole of Article 34 was included in Rule 15 of the previous A.C.T.A. Constitutional Rules.

HOLIDAY SHOTS. Despite many intimations through these columns, some clubs still do not realise that "all holidays" are under the Association jurisdiction and no club should attempt to conduct a holiday shoot

without first applying to the Association. The recent Australia Day holiday brought to light several complaints from clubs finding that they had listed a holiday shoot and then found that a nearby club was also holding a shoot on the same day. One club went so far as to state that had the nearby club not held a shoot, then it would have had a successful meeting. As it turned out, neither club had really satisfactory attendances, the one more than the other. Clubs are again reminded that no holiday shoot may be advertised or held without the approval of the A.C.T.A. The fixing of holiday shoot dates is one of the most important functions of the Association.

In the event of any selected shooter being unable to take his place in the team, his place will be filled by another shooter agreed upon by the Executive Committee.

CONDITIONS:

100 birds per member from 16 yards, five track shooting system, in four stages of 25 each over four traps. Automatic angle traps, double-barrel, points scoring 3 and 2, cartridges loaded with not more than 1½ oz. of shot, No. 6 size, or smaller. All scores will count in the competition.

Highest scorer in the Australian Team will hold the special International High-Gun Cup, valued at £75 (presented by J. M. Bauman, Esq., of Brisbane) for 12 months (or until the next International Match) and will be awarded a special trophy valued at £5/5/-, and the International High-Gun Sash and I.C.I. Sterling Silver Commemoration Badge. In the event of ties, to be shot off in batches of ten clay targets until finality.

Every member of the Australian Team will receive the special "International 1962" Badge.

ENTRANCE FEES.—There will be no entrance fee for members of the team. Targets and cartridges free.

Optional Sweepstake of 10/- will be conducted in conjunction. Sweepstake money divided 60, 30, and 10 per cent. without deduction.

PRACTICE.—Members of the International Team will be permitted ten practice targets before the competition, in accordance with the International conditions.

"Tips and Tails"

The 38th World Championship shooting series will be held in Cairo (Egypt) by the Federation de Tir de la Republique Arabe Unie, under the auspices of the International Shooting Union, from October 11 to October 20, 1962.

The programme will include clay pigeon shooting (Olympic Trench and Skeet). As in Moscow in 1958, the number of entries from each nation for each event will be strictly limited. According to the provisional programme, practice shooting will start on October 6, the opening ceremony being on October 11 and the closing ceremony on October 20. The competitions listed are: October 13-15, Olympic Trench, 300 birds for individual Championship of the World (first 200 to count for the Team Championship, for teams of four; also ladies' individual championship. October 18-19, Skeet: 200 birds for the Individual Championship of the World (first 100 to count for Team Championship for teams of four; also ladies' individual championship. Maximum number of competitors for the two events (Olympic Trench and Skeet) — between 7 and 9 per nation, plus two ladies (numbers subject to confirmation by the I.S.U.). Contrary to arrangements made in Moscow, accommodation in Cairo will have to be paid for — in Moscow, competitors were accommodated without charge.

Townsville Club (Q.) has relinquished its entitlement to the Commonwealth Double-rise Sparrow and the State (Queensland) Double-rise Sparrow title. These two titles are, therefore, now open and available to be allocated to other clubs by the A.C.T.A. Any club desirous of conducting one or both of these events should make written application to the Secretary, A.C.T.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.I. A Townsville report indicates that the area has

had good rains recently and all swamps are now holding water, although good follow-up rain will be required to make the season a good one. Writing from Silkwood in North Queensland, J. Galletta says, "Keep up the good work, the 'News' is always looked forward to and is

certainly read from cover to cover by the whole family."

What style of shooting will be best for the average shooter? Answer to this question is dependent upon several factors. If the shooter has the type of temperament that does everything swiftly, a combination of pointing and snapping will work out well for him. However, this doesn't always hold true. Arnold Reigger, probably the greatest handicap shooter known of today (he is the well-known American trapshot who has often been referred to in these columns), is one of the fastest shooters in the States, yet he has a comparatively slow, very easy-going type of temperament. Each shooter should develop his own style, but before he becomes too set in his ways, it may be that the advice of a competent instructor or more experienced shooter may help him to decide what style of shooting will break the maximum number of targets for him. It could be said that "pointing" pays, to some shooters at least. The pointer — the shooter who gets on his target, "rides" it along and then pulls out in front to achieve his lead — will break most targets on a calm day when the flight path of the target is even, but he is apt to be thrown off by windy conditions when targets are ducking and climbing erratically. To a pointer the targets in the late afternoon, or in a lengthy tie shoot, in calm conditions, eventually look like "saucepans" and his type is then very hard to beat. Every type of shooting has its place. The snap shooter shines when weather conditions are adverse and targets jumping around. The snap shooter is apt to break them under all conditions — the only governing factor is how he is tuned up for a particular day and whether his timing and reflexes will stand up to the test. If they are working properly, then whether the conditions are windy or easy, he will break them.

"A 'Scope"

(Report by COLIN SHADBOLT)

The Nikko Rifle telescopes are not markedly different from the normal rifle sight. They are solid and well made and have been designed by someone who knows a lot more than the abstract fact that a 'scope sight on a rifle aids the shooting.

Little things, unimpressive in themselves, finally build up a composite picture that shows this line has had a fair bit of attention paid to it. I have had my part in producing this telescope, as it has been in the process of adaptation to the Australian market for almost a year.

From time to time I have looked at the new samples and ventured an opinion, but the actual design has been largely the business of the importer, Malcolm Fuller, and the Japanese firm that was handling the design. All I have done was to check the sample 'scopes and see that the quality was up to the standards that Mal Fuller was demanding of the manufacturer.

In view of the very low price of the 'scope, having due regard to others on the market of the same quality, I was surprised at the final pricing of the 'scope when it reached the retail market. The 'scope is certainly cheap, but this is due to Fuller's merchandising methods and not to any inferior work in the 'scope.

Fuller is not a babe from the sticks. He can handle a shotgun, as his clean-up in Commonwealth titles and the sashes in his office show. Now let's look at the Nikko rifle 'scope. Actually, there are two, although the only difference the public can see is the stamping on the ocular piece. One is the 4X, while the second is a 6X, with the same basic appearance as the 4X. I have only range tested the 6X, but the 4X has had a long trip to the Moree area and showed no signs of changing its zero, and this is a very fair criterion of the quality.

The 4X Nikko, she sat on the rack in an old utility, bounced about, and still put them where she was pointed.

This is as much as anyone can ask. I normally check the zero on a 'scope before starting serious shooting, and even with the best 'scopes we cannot assume that a very savage bashing about will not have affected the zero to some degree.

This may not be enough to show up at relatively short ranges, but when you draw trigger for a head shot, and miss, it can cause quite a bit of heart-burning and some very pointed remarks. Reticules at the moment are standardised on the medium cross-wire type, which is the most generally useful variety for ordinary work.

The 4X 'scope is 11.4 inches long, while the 6X is slightly shorter at 11.15 inches. This added length comes from a slightly longer ocular piece. The adjustments are mounted on a short enlargement fastened to the body piece with two Phillips screws. Its short length means that the 'scope can be easily mounted on virtually any type of rifle, since there is 1.7 inches of uncluttered inch tube ahead of the turret and almost 2.7 inches at the ocular piece.

The ocular piece is held locked when the telescope is focused by a short collar of half-inch length, which has an enlarged grooved ring to make locking up a simple and secure job. In an abnormal mounting job the forward section of this locking collar could be removed and give another three-tenths of added length to the rear section of the body.

The objective piece of dural, like the rest of the 'scope, is 1.5 inches in diameter and has a very short sunshade of 0.3 inches in length, which has concentric rings run into it to stop glare from the sides of the tube interfering with the view, and houses a coated lens of 32 mm. in both cases.

In the case of the four power this gives an exit pupil of virtually 8 mms., and since there does not appear to be any internal stop operating, the power is as claimed, being 4X, with a relative luminosity of 64.

The maker's claim for the exit pupil is 7.75 mms. and, should this be correct, then the luminosity would be 60. In either case this is adequate for all normal work and should make the telescope well suited for permanent use on any rifle which is used late in the evening or early morning.

The field of view is about the 29 ft. mark, and this, with the relatively large exit pupil, should fit the 'scope for use in timbered country, but not heavy brush, as a 'roo would move across the field in a single hop at 50 yards.

Summary — A pair of reasonably priced 'scopes, of sound design and optics, which will suit the Australian shooter who is eager to buy a serviceable and compact telescope.

However, our conditions being what they are, the 4X is the most generally useful power and the four should suit the needs of any shooter wanting a 'scope for a range of conditions, with a good clear field of view and an eye-relief of a full three inches.

This eye-relief is desirable, as it is very easy to get belted with a rifle of reasonably heavy recoil if a quick shot is taken and the rifle is relatively light.

The 6X sells at the same price as the 4X, and as such represents a new approach completely. Accordingly, I have been over it with peculiar care since I suspected a very fuzzy picture, but the scene through the telescope is very reasonable and, furthermore, the picture is reasonably sharp even at 20 yards. I do not suggest this 'scope for the .22,

as the 4X is the correct power, or I should say the maximum power that can be used successfully on a .22 rifle of rimfire type. I would include the .22 Winchester Magnum in this group.

The place of this small and compact 6X is on the Single-shot .218 Bee rifles, which are intended for precision work on small targets and have the range and accuracy to give a fox a very nasty poke at 200 yards. I think the .222 does better with a 4X, as it often doubles for a pig rifle, and so a larger field of view is very useful, as well as the larger exit pupil which makes aiming faster.

The field of view is 22-23 feet, and this is adequate for this power, being about a foot or two bigger than most American 'scopes of this power. The power was checked with care, since the lenses are not over-large, and the

exit pupil measured out at a full 6 mm., give or take a fraction.

I make the power to be a true 5.4X, which is a little less than claimed, but not far enough off to cause undue comment, as very few telescopes are correctly labelled, especially the so-called variables. The 'scope has a luminosity of 36, and this would fit it for most shooting, except under the abnormal conditions which I mention for the 4X.

Under the circumstances this makes the 6X a very good buy if the rifle has the power to carry it. It would be a very sensible choice for a small precision single-shot outfit. It is in keeping with the outline and size of the light rifle and with sufficient power and a good field of view to make it most suitable for the taking of rabbit, fox and similar pests, including dingoes and wild dogs. It has too high a power to be held steadily off-hand, and where the rifle is intended for off-hand work, then this is the province of the 4X.

By and large these are two telescopes which it will pay the shooter

to look at with care if he does not propose to buy a Continental 'scope, as they represent very good value for the money. The optics are reasonably good, the adjustments are covered with flat, metal-lined, strong caps, and the flat black dials are plainly marked and graduated, and when the pointer says up, it means the strike of the bullet, and anybody used to ordinary aperture sights would not find themselves in grief with the adjustments going the wrong way.

The dial plates can be set to the individual zero of the rifle by slackening the centre screws and turning the dial around so the zero mark matches the mark on the body of the turret.

I feel the quality offered in these 'scopes fully vindicates Fuller Firearms' approach to the marketing problem, and by their elimination of the wholesaler, for whom the need has largely disappeared in the present market, they will make it possible for many of us to enjoy a standard of equipment that was previously out of our reach.


OUT OF THE PAST





SHOOTING FROM No. 5 TRACK

Well-known American professional, Dick Miller, in a bright article in American "Trap and Field", hands out some advice to those who have difficulty in shooting their targets from No. 5 track, particularly the acute right swinger. Miller advises that extreme right-angle targets for beginners. He instances his own experience. In one of his early Grand American Handicap efforts he had shot all targets from tracks one to four, but had fallen away in his scoring from No. 5, shooting only two from this track out of about 20 releases. Miller, in his own words, explains "how he licked post five". He states that he pointed his left foot (being a right-shoulder shooter)

at the spot where the most extreme right-angle target would fly, then holding the muzzle of the gun about three feet to the left of the trap-house, he was able to "lobber" the elusive target most of the time. He considers any shooter can do likewise.

Continuing, Miller explains that no amount of shooting advice, no matter from what source, can be expected to change scores significantly overnight. A shooter must practice his technique before it will bear fruit, and shooters uncertain of this should experiment in practice events.

Mentioning doubles (double-rise), Miller explains that the shooter can hurt his chances of success in picking up the right-angle target if the body is angled towards the traphouse. Leaning towards the traphouse tends to place the shooter off balance for the second target and the shooter must "shove" the gun at the right-hand target instead of swinging on to the target. Miller states that most American shooters accept the left-hand as a straight-away, then swing right. He advises to position yourself to swing right, and little trouble should be experienced.


