



## The Editor's Notebook



**AUSTRALIA WINS 1962 INTERNATIONAL MATCH.** Following the great score recorded by the Australian Team in the 1962 International Match at Bankstown, N.S.W., in March last, information has been received from the International Committee that Australia duly won easily. The victory was not unexpected by A.C.T.A. officials. The score of 8764/9000 points must surely be a record for a 30-men team. New Zealand was second, 153 points in arrears, with an aggregate of 8621 points. Then followed, South Africa 8572, England 8107, Scotland 7754, Ireland 7663, Wales 7578, with Central Africa whipping in with 7168. The Australian Team scores were published in the July issue of this publication (page 6). Newton Thomas was the Australian high-gun with 299/300 points, one point ahead of Keith Soames Senr. and Sperry Marshall, each of whom carded 298/300 points. Heartiest congratulations are extended to members of the Australian Team on a really great win.

**A.C.T.A. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING.** Affiliated clubs are advised that the next meeting of the Executive Committee of the A.C.T.A. will be held in Sydney, extending over Thursday, Thursday night and Friday, October 4 and 5, 1962. All are reminded that items to be included on the Agenda of the meeting are required to be lodged with the Secretary, A.C.T.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.I., not later than Monday, September 17, 1962.

**1963 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP APPLICATIONS.** Affiliated clubs are reminded that all applications for permission to conduct open championships, i.e. Commonwealth, State and District, are required to be lodged with the Secretary, A.C.T.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.I., not later than September 10, 1962. Applications will be collated at the Association office, listed, and placed before the Executive Committee of the Association at its October meeting, which will be held in Sydney early in that month. Clubs making application are advised to submit applications on separate sheet to ordinary A.C.T.A. correspondence, so that the application will receive individual attention and not possibly become buried in a mass of other matter. Whilst September 10 should be noted at the closing date for applications, any applications prior to that date would be welcomed. It is much more convenient for staff requirements if applications can be listed prior to closing date. Clubs applying are also requested not to make a "general cover" application—in other words, make an application for "all championships". This has been done before and has led to considerable difficulty when lists are being collated, for the simple reason that the A.C.T.A. staff cannot list "all championships" for any one club, and the general result is that frequently a club specially desiring a championship may not even have its name listed against the particular

event, and the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee has no chance of considering the relativity of the event and the club wishing to apply.

**CORRECT ADDRESS OF A.C.T.A.** The Post-Master General's Department has made an official complaint to the A.C.T.A. regarding incorrect addresses on letters intended for the A.C.T.A. In fact, the Department sent an Officer to A.C.T.A. headquarters to investigate what could be done about improving the accuracy of addresses on A.C.T.A. intended correspondence. Only recently—actually three times in one week—the A.C.T.A. received letters from the Head Office of the P.M.G. in Sydney, the office of the Taxation Department in Brisbane and others from Adelaide and Brisbane again. It appears that the worst offenders are in Queensland. Sportsmen in the Pineapple State seem to overlook that their mail should be addressed to the A.C.T.A. at Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.I. (Victoria) and not to the A.C.T.A. in Brisbane. The present situation is by no means unique or unusual—wrongly addressed matter intended for the A.C.T.A. in Melbourne has been incorrectly addressed for years, but in recent months the position seems to have become acute. In most instances the wrongly addressed mail has contained registration fees. In fact, the one from the Queensland Taxation Office contained £3 in postal notes which a northern club had apparently incorrectly addressed. The Post-Master General's Department has urgently requested that a paragraph be inserted in the August issue of "News" so that all interested may observe that the Department considers the position serious. Whilst on the question of correctly addressing A.C.T.A. mail, clubs are reminded that many letters and packets come to the A.C.T.A. office carrying insufficient postage. This means that the A.C.T.A. is under considerable additional expense for surcharges. Co-operation in ensuring that all mail matter addressed to the A.C.T.A. carries correct postage charges would be appreciated.

**A.C.T.A. CHAMPIONSHIP CONDITIONS.** All clubs granted permission by the A.C.T.A. to conduct open championships (Commonwealth, State and District) should, if uncertain of the conditions governing these events, apply to the A.C.T.A. office for direction. The full Championship Conditions were last published in the July 1961 edition of "News". Any club making application will be posted a copy of Championship Conditions Brochure free of charge. Recently a club shooting a district championship under double-barrel conditions (outside Victoria) made its own conditions and, further, the number of targets for the event was 10 targets in excess of the regulations—no information was available as to the charge for nomination, but doubtless this was also in excess. Clubs are informed that the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee lays down conditions for all championships, and these are expected to be obeyed by clubs granted the honour of conducting the various open title matches. Clubs failing to observe the Executive Committee's directions risk the possibility of not being granted open championships in future years.

**HANDICAP RETURNS.** Recently a club wrote to the A.C.T.A. stating that it did not know what a handicap return was. The club, a comparatively new formation, was anxious to ensure that it was carrying out all A.C.T.A. directions. Handicap returns are essential to satisfactory handicapping and all clubs should carry out this most important feature of A.C.T.A. co-operation. Handicap returns should be completed following every shoot held by the clubs and the name and performance of every shooter taking part should be listed.

**PUBLICATION OF FULL REGISTRATION LIST.** Publication of the full list of current registered shooters, as at June 30, 1962, is as published elsewhere in this issue. In such a large and comprehensive list it is a most difficult matter not to be able to avoid "E. & O." But every care has been taken to ensure that all financial shooters are included.

An innovation used for the first time this month is that of an asterisk following the name of every financial Official Referee. The inclusion of the asterisk following the referee's name will save the possible inconvenience of having to turn to another section of the publication to check on the bonafides of a referee. It will also

save the official list from becoming clogged with unfinancial individuals who, once having passed the test in previous years, have dropped out and in some instances their names have still been shown as Official Referees. An Official Referee must pay his annual fees the same as the ordinary shooter.

## OUT OF THE PAST Ten Years Ago

At the Perth Club (W.A.) in August 1952 the Club Intermediate Championship was won by J. Conlan, 22/25, after a shoot-off with Wal. Sharp, 21/25. Geoff. Bailey, 16/20, was third.

At a meeting late in July 1952 the Clara Creek Club shot no less than 14 events for the day's programme.

At Coburg in August 1952 W. Wager won the Club Double-rise Championship, 10/12 pairs, from Jack Bryant, 12/15, and Max Brown (Croydon), 11/15 pairs. At Camberwell, J. T. McArthur won a 10 birder which went to the 43rd round before a decision was reached. McArthur aggregated 43/43 to win from L. Doyle (Alexandra), 42/43, and G. H. Stainton, 23/24.

Cairns Club (not at present operating) shot the North Queensland Single-barrel Championship in 1952. The event was won outright by Doug. Nasser of Atherton, 18/20, from Reg Winn (Home Hill) and Jock Izatt (Cairns), 16/20.

The Rainbow Club Championship (V.) in 1952 went to J. Wishart, 15/15, from A. Hinneberg, 19/20. Sir Charles Gairdiner, Governor of Western Australia, attended the Geraldton Club's big fixture in mid-1952. The report of the day states that "shooters were spurred to greater concentration and effort in the presence of the Governor". Main winners on the day were Kevin Shephard, D. Grant, K. Gamble and S. Gratte.

Warren Club (N.S.W.) shot the Lwr. Macquarie Double-barrel Championship under perfect shooting con-


ditions. L. Wilson was the winner. Ron Back of Narromine ran up 52 straight the same day.



vember 18 (starting at 9.30 a.m.), the big event will be the Southern Hemisphere D.B. Championship. This event was granted to the Perth Club in recognition of its big effort in connection with the Empire Games, and it should prove of premier importance to all trapshooters. The event, which has not been shot for some years, will be shot at 50 targets D.B. from 18 yards. Trophies in this title event will be allotted down to 10th place. Many regrets are expressed at the passing of Supply Lieut. Eddie Rogers, R.A.N., who passed on at Canberra, A.C.T., on Saturday, June 23. Rogers, who was only 43, had suffered from thrombosis, so it is understood. Rogers commenced shooting with the Footscray Club many years ago, and although a rare visitor to a gun club in recent years, he was always interested in the welfare of the sport of clay target shooting. Rogers served for some years after the war in Japan and was later stationed at Manus Island as a member of the R.A.N. administration there. On many occasions Rogers wrote to the Association telling of his shooting experiences at the various stations where he was posted. Rogers was buried with full naval honours at Canberra on June 26. 

# A BIRD'S DAY IS ALWAYS BUSY

(By ROY KINGHORN)

Whether a bird flies by night or day, it has a busy time, and has to work hard to keep alive.

Take, for example, any bird you may know. Its hours of sleep at night are regulated by the length of the night, and not by choice. It does not sleep in.

As soon as the daylight spreads over the land, a diurnal bird is awakened, and after a few stretches and yawns it sets about its daily rounds.

These go more or less smoothly along, or we can say they are regulated so that the bird's job is finished at dusk, and it then sets about its preparations for the night.

Its daily routine is regulated, it is not always to a set programme.

It is not a uniform routine common to all birds, but varies a little as the search for food and the finding of it permits.

During the day, there may be periods of rest and naps, even sleep. This, too, is dependent on the length of the night, such as the long winter night as against the shorter one of the summer.

But, as a general rule, birds must have short rests during the day, possibly because for them no night is without some disturbance.

For instance, we often hear a wagtail calling at night, sometimes "going up the river" after midnight.

The only reason for this is that it has been disturbed by some enemy, or some prowler after other animals, and the poor wagtail has been forced from its resting place, and has taken flight for safety.


The normal position for a sleeping bird is with its head turned over its

back, and its beak tucked into the feathers near the base of the wing.

The question often has been asked: How does a bird sleep like this, and on one leg, too, without falling off its perch?

It is a fact that all perching birds have the feet so developed that when they sit on a perch the tendons contract automatically and close the toes on the perch.

They cannot open unless the bird first crouches, as if to take off, and this releases the grasp.

It is obvious that a bird must eat almost continuously by day, because its activity demands a continuous supply of fuel in the form of food.

Knowing this, some people may wonder how a bird lasts through the night, especially a long and cold winter night, without food.

This is controlled entirely by what is known as metabolism.

Briefly, this is a chemical process within the body which controls the rate of energy expended when the bird is at rest.

At night the metabolism of the resting bird is low and the internal temperature of the bird falls, too.

This means that a bird with a day temperature of about 108 deg. may have one as low as 68 deg. at night, and its whole physical make-up is slowed down considerably.

This lowered temperature enables the bird to withstand the rigors of a very cold night without distress.

Zoologists have said that this type of sleep is natural, but not a simple sleep.

In fact, it is a kind of lethargic state and reaches its height in those animals that hibernate.

Although the temperature of the bird is so lowered during the night, the return to normal is almost immediate on awakening.

This means that the bird soon feels very hungry, and whether it feels like it or not, it has to move about in search of a meal.

Food is not always easily found.

If the bird is insectivorous, the insects may still be feeling the cold, and there may not be so many about.

On the other hand, there may have been an influx of migrating birds, or flocks of nomads, and so the search for food is a serious matter.

Taking it all round, under normal weather conditions the bird moves along in its routine tracks, and still finds plenty of time during the day to have a nap or two.

And it must preen its feathers, smear oil if necessary from the oil gland, or, if it be a heron, it may use its natural talc powder from its living powder box.

Many birds bathe, and for those that do it is essential that time off must be taken for this.

Bathing is generally in the form of a good shaking of the feathers in water, but, as we know, some birds take what we call a sand or dust bath, and that is just as important to them as water is to others.

Sparrows might be mentioned as the best known dust bathers.

Where food is in plenty, some species of birds remain as permanent residents, feeding, nesting and rearing the young year after year.

This is not so with nomadic species, which continue to move around the country as nature demands.

That is not to say that nomads are ever on the move, but they remain only a few months in one area, particularly to breed, and when the young are ready to start a journey, off they go.

This is not complete migration, such as from one continent to another, but a regular circuit within a country.

Often nomads leave a district where food is plentiful, and after a few weeks find themselves in a drought-stricken area where food is at a minimum.

If they do not get out quickly, there may be great numbers of casualties.

A bird's day is not always an easy one.
