

The Editor's Notebook



SEASONAL GREETINGS. The President and all officers of the A.C.T.A. extend Seasonal Greetings to all affiliated clubs and registered shooters throughout the Commonwealth and elsewhere, with the hope that future shooting will be fruitful and enjoyable.

NEW ZEALAND TOUR, 1963. Elsewhere in this issue is published the proposed itinerary for Australian shooters who may be visiting New Zealand for the New Zealand National Championships. It will be noted that the itinerary includes a substantial section for visitors to visit the main cities and other attractions, as well as including shoots at several centres, plus the National N.Z. Championships at Hamilton from April 3 to April 10. Those intending to make the trip are advised to contact Don Wright, of Wright's Tour, 32 Bridge Street, Sydney. Don Wright has the "know-how" of New Zealand trips and he will be pleased to arrange all details for intending visitors. Of interest to Australian sheetars in the fact that Australian shooters is the fact that Dan Mott, who so ably captained the Australian Team in 1961, has again been appointed Captain of the Aus-tralian Team for the 1963 Tour and shoot for the Glen Cup. It will be recalled that the Glen Cup is the symbol of Australia - New Zealand Team supremacy and the now annual contest between Australian and New Zealand teams creates great interest. Australia is the present holder, having successfully competed against

the last New Zealand Team at Bankstown in March, 1962. The 1963 Australian Team will be selected by the Team Captain and Manager on the grounds where the shoot will be held at Hamilton, N.Z.

1962 INTERSTATE TEAMS' MATCH RESULT. Victoria has won the "Great Britain & Ireland" Trophy for interstate team supremacy for the second successive year. On scores to count (best ten) Victoria registered the excellent score of 492/500 to win from South Australia 488/500, New South Wales 485/500, Tasmania 484/500, Western Australia 483/500 and Queenslan 481/500. Possible and Queenslan 481/500. Possible scores of 50 straight were recorded, for Victoria, by I. Porter, R. Wilson, A. Pearson, Newton Thomas; for South Australia by R. Mules, P. Winzen, D. Kimber and A. W. Forbes; Sperry Marshall was the lone top scorer with 50 straight for Tasmania; imilarly E. Brown, was the only similarly E. Brown was the only possible scorer for New South Wales. R. Holtfreter returned the only possible for Western Australia, whilst for Queensland John Raleigh figured as the only possible. The Victorian Team registered its score at East Burwood, scene of many International Team shoots in years gone by, and was favoured with good weather throughout the elimination and actual team shoot.

"NO BIRD". A shooter recently wrote the Association seeking a

ruling on an incident concerning a "no bird". It appears that shooter got a slow pull, the referee immediately called "No Bird"; however, the competitor fired at the target and broke it, the referee thereupon reversed his decision and called "kill". The referee was wrong. When he (the referee) called "no bird" the target ceased to exist as far as the competition was concerned, and once having called "no bird", the referee cannot change that decision. Rule No. 30 covers the point. The Rule reads, "After a referee declares a 'no target' it is thereafter no part of the competition, and is irrelevant to it."

A.C.T.A. NATIONAL CHAMPION-A.C.T.A. NATIONAL CHAMPION-SHIPS AND INTERNATIONAL MATCH 1963. The programme for the A.C.T.A. National Championships, Champion of Champions Cup and International for 1963 was framed at the recent Executive Committee meeting of the Association held in Sydney. The series in 1963 will be held at the South Coast Gun Club grounds at Southport, Queensland, and the programme has been extended from four to five days for the first time. The dates fixed are June 6 to June 11, 1963. Four automatic and electric traps will be in operation throughout the series. Some interesting changes, chiefly increased targets for the various events, have been made. Proceedings will open each day at 8.30 a.m. in order to ensure that all events are completed in reasonable daylight - it being well remembered by southern State shooters how quickly darkness gathers compared with the longer twilight in the south. The opening day will see the unusual change of the National Double-barrel Championship being shot as the first event of the series, and in conjunction with which will be shot the A.C.T.A. Intermediate Championship. The tar-gets for the National double-barrel title have been increased from 60 to 80 and competitors will face up to 10 targets per visit, with one target from each track. Nomination fee, notwithstanding the increased number of targets, remains at 60/-. The first 40 targets in the National Double-barrel Championship will be

(restricted to shooters whose handicap does not exceed 18 yards on June 6). Nomination fee for the Intermediate title also remains the same as previously, i.e. 30/-. On the second day, Friday, June 7, the National Single-barrel Championship will be decided, also at the increased number of targets, 80 instead of 60. Nomination fee again remains the same as in the past, 60/-. This will be followed by a £100 Handicap. An interesting change has been made in connection with the optional sweep-stakes attached to both the National double-barrel and single-barrel titles. The sweepstakes in each event will comprise a 10/- overall, plus 10/-over each 40 targets of both events. This should allow for an increased number of shooters to obtain a division. The Australia - New Zealand match has been retained in the programme, and this will be decided on the third day at 40 targets from 16 yards, points scoring 3 and 2. The same sweepstake arrangement has been made as in the two first major named events except that the attached 10/- divisions will be made over each 20 targets. Nomination is 50/-. The Australian National Doublerise Championship will follow, shot under the same conditions and nomination as formerly. The Association annual meeting will be held on Sunday, June 9, at Southport. Queen's Birthday holiday, Monday, June 10, will see the staging of the 17th International Teams' Match. The Australian Team will be selected from the 30 highest scorers in the National double - barrel title, the National single-barrel title and the Australia-New Zealand Match. The selection method is identical with the process observed in 1962 and which proved so successful from Australia's viewpoint. The International Match, as is now well known, is shot at 100 targets per man from 16 yards, double-barrel, points scoring, 3 and 2. The 14th Grand Australian Handicap will follow. This will be shot at 40 targets from A.C.T.A. handicap marks, and the sum of £500 has been allocated to the event. This will be distributed, £150 to the winner, £100 second, £50 third, with eight yardage awards, each of £25, namely 12/13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19 and 20 vards

and over. Nomination remains at £5, with a 20/- optional sweepstake, which will be divided 60% (1), 30% (2) and 10% (3). The fifth and final day of the series will bring about the deciding of the annual Champion of Champions Cup, the blue-riband event of the tournament. The event has been increased to 80 targets (from 60) and will be shot from 20 yards, double - barrel, both barrels equal value, nomination 80/-. In the attached optional sweepstakes, there will be a 10/- overall, plus two of 10/- on each 40 targets. If time permits, a £100 Handicap will conclude the fixture.

Intending competitors are reminded that the referee's decision is final and protests will be accepted on ammunition only.

Full details of the entire programme in the advertising section of this issue.

Bauman's Gun Shop, of 128-130 Elizabeth Street, Brisbane (Ray Gehrman, manager) has generously donated a special high-gun trophy over the National Double-barrel Championship, Champion of Champions Cup, and Grand Australian Handicap of £500 during the series at Southport in June, 1963. This award, details of which will be announced later, will doubtless assist to increase and sustain interest over the five days of competition.

A.C.T.A. EXECUTIVE COMMIT-TEE. The A.C.T.A. Executive Committee held its regular October meeting this year in Sydney. All members were present with the exception of R. R. Moore, who was indisposed. Many items of interest to clubs and shooters were discussed and directions issued.

Amateur Rule. It was decided to adopt and include the Amateur Rule as previously included in the Association Rules.

Life Membership. The Association Patron and veteran trapshot, Frank R. Hockey of Melbourne, was appointed a Life - Member of the A.C.T.A. Mr. Hockey has long been a supporter of the Association both in donations in cash, and especially with assistance and advice in the

formative years of the A.C.T.A. His appointment was unanimously carried by the Committee.

Championship Applications. In the past many clubs have submitted lengthy lists of championships, Commonwealth, State and District, which they desired to apply for to be shot during the calendar year following. These lists have proved cumbersome, both to the club officials preparing same and to the Association staff in collating the events for Executive Committee review. In future all that will be necessary for the club officials to submit will be a letter or advice indicating that their particular club wishes to shoot, (a) a Commonwealth championship, if such is an entitlement under the roster as accepted and approved by the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee and published in the September 1962 issue of "News"; (b) State Championships desired or preferred: (c) District championships preferred or desired. This process will entirely do away with the submission of long and copious lists of championships, many of which were not acceptable.

Referee Examiners. The following additional Official Referee Examiners were appointed: Western Australia, Messrs. R. M. Holtfreter and N. Wells; North Queensland, W. Frazer; New South Wales, L. F. Bird.

1964 Association Shoot and International. Following an application by the South Australian Gun Club in Adelaide, it was decided to conduct the A.C.T.A. National Championships and International series in 1964 on the grounds of the S.A. Gun Club at Bolivar, S.A. The actual date of the series has not yet been fixed.

Skeet Tie Shoot Rules. The Rules for the governing of tie shoots in Skeet were fixed as follows: "a half round of Skeet, taking alternative singles from Stations 1 to 7, shoot high trap from No. 8, and a pair each from Stations 2 and 6."

Championship Trophy Allocation. Concern was expressed by the Committee at several reports received regarding clubs granted open championships allocating poor trophies for these major events. It was decided to point out to clubs the importance of providing full value trophies and to indicate that "clubs allocating poor value trophies for championship shoots could be refused championships in future years".

Handicapping. The Committee decided that the following instruction was to be promulgated forthwith, "Club Presidents and Secretaries are instructed that during any shoot, the management must immediately rehandicap each and every shooter who, for any of the reasons prescribed in the A.C.T.A. Handicapping Formula, qualifies for backward movement of his handicap. Such adjustments are to strictly comply with the Formula. No shooter is to be permitted to compete in another event should he refuse to accept his new mark. Handicap cards and all relevant details concerning on - the - spot adjustments are to be forwarded, within two days, to the official handicapper for ratification. Club managements will not alter a shooter's card. Should the shooter ignore his latest handicap, irrespective of mark shown in 'News' he will be penalised a further vard if he shoots inside his latest handicap." The foregoing is self-explanatory and simply means that club managements must re-handicap a shooter immediately he comes in for penalty under the Handicapping Formula; if the shooter does not accept the situation, he is to be penalised a further yard, and all relevant information and shooter's card to be forwarded immediately to the A.C.T.A. office for review and rati-

As from mid - November, every shooter whose handicap has been altered or adjusted will receive official notification from the A.C.T.A. Similarly the shooter's club will also be notified.

50 Break. - Handicapping. The Executive Committee has decided on the following resolution in connection with the one yard penalty for a 50 break: "That as from December 1 the one yard penalty for a 50 break (after the first) shot from handicap mark be deleted from the Handicapping Formula." The resolution, in other words, means that there will be no penalty for a 50 break - after the first 50 - after December 1, where a break has been obtained off the shooter's handicap mark.

Life Registered Shooters-"News".

that as from the commencement of the 1963 year (January 1) that life-registered shooters would be requested to pay £1 per year for their copies of "News". It was pointed out that many shooters whose names appear on the life-registration list actually paid their fees before the introduction of "News" in 1947 and were, therefore, obtaining a privilege which was not contemplated at the time of their registration.

Handicap Return Forms. Considerable concern was expressed by the Committee over the fact that a few clubs were not complying with the Association regulations in the submission of Handicap Return Forms. The Committee instructed that clubs should remember it was of the greatest importance that fullest cooperation should be given by submitting handicap return forms. The Committee further pointed out that it was also of great importance to ensure that shooters entitled to come forward had such recommendations. with performances, listed on handicap return forms and forwarded to the Association for review.

Referees for Association National Championships and International. Official referees desirous of being appointed referees for the period of the 1963 A.C.T.A. National Championships and International series at Southport in June are requested to advise the resident Southport member of the Executive Committee, Mr. W. A. Gordon, Bauer Street, Southport, Qld. Payment for referee services will be on the basis of £5 per day and supply own meals. Referees will not be called upon to act other than during daylight hours. No payment for travelling expenses can be granted.

Live-bird Shooting. Reports from certain areas indicate that some shooters have been engaged in livebird shooting out of traps. The Executive Committee unanimously passed the following resolution, i.e., "That shooters are reminded that live-bird shooting is illegal. Any registered shooter convicted of livebird shooting will be de-registered by the A.C.T.A."

Referee Examinations. In future official Referee Examinations will be The Executive Committee instructed held annually. The date fixed for closing of nominations by candidates is August 1, with all examinations to be completed and papers returnable by August 31 each year. Future examinations will be on the same principal as previous examinations.

Championship Badges. Applications for championship badges for events won prior to 1960 will not be accepted in future.

Rules. The Committee instructed that Shooting Rules Nos. 52, 53, 79 and 100 be printed in the first available issue of "News" and that clubs and shooters be requested to study and strictly observe same.

Rule No. 52.

"A competitor shall not use a gun whose bore is LARGER than a twelve gauge."

Rule No. 53.

"A competitor shall not use a load of shot greater than one and

one-quarter ounce weight struck measure, nor may a larger size of shot than No. 6 be used."

Rule No. 79.

"Concrete blocks and measuring sticks for measuring height of targets are required to be standard equipment for all clubs. A peg at least 2 feet high is required to be placed dead centre in front of trap at 50 yards, as an aid to determining distance targets are being thrown."

Rule No. 100.

"Standard Shell for Championships. Shells used in all open championships (Commonwealth, State and District) are required to be restricted to 12 oz. of shot, struck measure, or its equivalent. Shells marked by the manufacturer as complying with this regulation are approved."

Programme details are at present being finalised; however, I can tell you that the general outline of the programme will be:-

Thursday, 4th April — The 1963 New Zealand Double Rise Clay Target Championship, 15 pairs off 16 yds. Entry 20/-, plus compulsory sweepstake of 20/-, plus 10/- for targets — followed by two-pound singlerise sweepstakes over 20 targets.

Friday, 5th April — The 1963 New Zealand Skeet Championship of two rounds each of 25 targets. The entry fee shall be 20/-, with a compulsory sweepstake of 20/-, plus targets 10/-. AUSTRALIAN CLAY TARGET SHOOTING NEWS

Twenty Five Years Ago

How times have changed since 1937! On Melbourne Cup Day in 1937 the Blackburn Club conducted what was termed as a "big" holiday programme. One of the main features of the day was a "£5 Handicap over the club's new automatic trap". This surely must have rocked the finances to guarantee such an amount in those days.

Shooting at the Nobel Club at West Footscray, F. G. Tricks, now a leading municipal official with the City of Sandringham (V.), defeated former A.C.T.A. President, Jock Wilson, 18/18 to 17/18 in the main event of the day.

President of the day, George Hemley, entertained members of the Coburg Club and presented all trophies. The "new automatic trap is reported to have worked satisfactorily". The late Tom Connor, the Nobel Club puller at that time, was prominent among the trophy winners at the Coburg fixture.

In Adelaide, clay pigeon shooting was a comparatively new sport 25 years ago. Paul Lawson, son of the Secretary of the Adelaide Club, won the S.A. Championship on the Gawle. Belt grounds. Lawson later shot in U.S.A., but is now living in Adelaide.

Fifteen Years Ago

Inspector Harry Mills, then a Police Sergeant attached to South Richmond (V.), shot a break of 36 straight at a Blackburn fixture.

Stuart Johnson, then a college student, who is a son of Aubrey Johnson, a long-time Vice-President of the Australian Club, on a school vacation, shot brilliantly and won a rear-markers' event at the Camberwell Club. Johnson, although still very interested in the sport, rarely

appears on a shooting ground these days.

Actress Evie Hayes, who is well known to radio and television viewers in most parts of the Commonwealth, competed in a fixture at Coburg, partnering her husband Will Mahoney. Miss Hayes, when time permitted for practice, was quite a capable shot and very capably held to the title role she played in the "Annie Get Your Gun" musical comedy a few years later.

Ten Years Ago

The first Interstate Teams' Match for "The Great Britain & Ireland Trophy" was staged in 1952. Victory went to the New South Wales team. The standard of shooting, or at least of scoring, was not as high as it is now. The winning team compiled the moderate winning score of 478/500. H. L. McMaster and Newton Thomas (who was then resident in New South Wales) were the only possible scorers

with 50 straight each. Tasmania was runner-up 473/500, Victoria third 463/500, then followed, Queensland 461/500, Western Australia 452/500 and South Australia 444/500. In addition to McMaster and Thomas, the only other unbroken scorers were, T. Cannon (Tas.), E. G. Biggs (Victoria), Jim Smith (Queensland), and P. H. Lawson (South Australia).
