



The Editor's Notebook



SPORTSMAN OF THE YEAR. In New Zealand the annual trophy for the "Sportsman of the Year" for 1962 was awarded to a trapshooter for the first time. The honour is awarded by the Southland Amateur Sports Trust and the distinction went to none other than popular Jim McKenzie of Seaward Downs. McKenzie is very well known on this side of the Tasman and has frequently taken part in the A.C.T.A. National Champion-ships fixtures. At Southport a few years ago he won The Champion of Champions Cup, the blue-riband event of the A.C.T.A. series. He repeated this success in the same year in his home country of New Zealand. The official New Zealand magazine, "Gunshot", says, "The really important thing about this Sportsman of the Year award is that trapshooting is being officially recognised as a major sport. A few years ago hardly any non-shooter would have known what trapshooting implied. Today, thanks to the efforts of men like McKenzie and other leading shots, trapshooting has come into prominence. Publicity is a great stimulus to progress. As trapshooting feats become more and more widely known, as interest in the sport spreads, so it will be necessary to maintain existing high standards of marksmanship, sportsmanship and safety. Jim McKenzie and other top performers are setting a fine example in this regard."

The A.C.T.A. and all shooters attached to the Association congratulate McKenzie on bringing honour to the grand sport of trapshooting.

NO TARGET. So many enquiries have been received in recent months regarding the definition and requirements of a target which can be declared a "No target", that it has been decided to re-publish the nine official Rules pertaining to "No Target". The first of these Rules is Rule No. 30, which reads, "After a referee declares a 'no target' it is thereafter no part of the competition, and is irrelevant to it."

Rule No. 31. "'No Target' shall be declared when a trap is sprung at a material interval of time before or after the call of 'Pull'."

after the call of 'Pull'."

Rule No. 32. "'No Target' shall be declared when the trap is sprung without the call of 'Pull'."

without the call of 'Pull'."
Rule No. 33. "'No Target' shall be declared when, in single-target shooting, two targets are thrown at the same time."

Rule No. 34. "'No Target' shall be declared when the target is thrown at a widely different angle."

a widely different angle."
Rule No. 35. "'No Target' shall be declared when a competitor shoots out of turn, or from the wrong track."

Rule No. 36. "'No Target' shall be declared when two competitors, or when a competitor and a noncompetitor, shoot at the same target."

Rule No. 37. "'No Target' shall be declared when there is a misfire, in either barrel, caused by the competitor's gun, or a misfire of the cartridge, due to no neglect on the shooter's part."

Rule No. 38. "In the event of a misfire with the second barrel, the competitor must fire a live cartridge

in the general direction of the target, and is permitted to score with the second barrel only."

Rule No. 39. "'No Target' shall be declared (whether shot at or not) when a broken target is thrown."

ADJUSTMENT OF HANDICAP NOTICES. The new system recently adopted following the last meeting of the Executive Committee of notifying the shooter and his club of an amended handicap is now in full swing. As is usually the case when a new system is introduced, there are many queries which follow in its wake. One recently received asked if "the club secretary had to collect the cards and forward same to the Association for adjustment". The position is that immediately a handicapping amendment is made, the shooter concerned should forward his card without delay direct to the A.C.T.A. office for official adjustment. Secretaries are advised to retain their carbon copy of the notice of amendment to the various shooters; by doing this they can ensure that every shooter's handicap and card are up-to-date.

DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIPS -TROPHY AWARDS. A recent query to the A.C.T.A. asked what value in trophies was to be allotted for District Championships. The Executive Committee gave a lot of thought to the point, realising that many small clubs would have difficulty in keeping to a fixed amount for this type of open championship. The Rule reads, "In District Championships the value of trophies is left optional and at the discretion of the club conduct-ing the event." Clubs are informed that the foregoing ruling does not mean that low-value trophies are permitted in District title events. The Executive Committee took the view that if a club conducting a District title enjoyed the attendance of a good muster of shooters, then it should respond by arranging for an appropriate trophy value when the awards were handed out. Similarly if the attendance response was poor, the club would be permitted to adjust its trophy value accordingly.

THE DAMO TRAP - Operation and Installation. The Damo Trap has hit the sport of clay target shooting in Australia with a veritable "bang". The makers have received many enquiries regarding operation and installation of the Damo Trap. The information necessary on this score is published, together with photographic details of the new masterpiece in trap mechanism, in the current issue. The outline lays out in considerable detail the fullest information and those interested should retain the current issue for future reference. Traps already installed have required little or no adjustment. Pairs are thrown with the greatest consistency and accurate angles. Enquiries regarding the Damo Trap should be directed to the makers at Box 29, Carrington, N.S.W.

NEW ZEALAND TOUR. The Australian Team tour of New Zealand is taking shape and quite a number of shooters have intimated their intention of crossing the Tasman to take part in both the pre-championships tour and also the National Championships series at Hamilton, N.Z. The New Zealand National Championships have been arranged to be shot on the Hamilton Gun Club's grounds from April 3 to April 10, 1963. Don Wright of 32 Bridge Street, Sydney, who is arranging the tour and visits to New Zealand centres and beauty spots, has requested that all intending to take part in the tour to contact him without delay in order to avoid the usual last-minute rush.

The following information on New Zealand cartridges, shot and prices is appended:

These are the present retail prices in New Zealand for 12 gauge shotgun cartridges used for clay targets as well as game shooting. These prices as mentioned are normal retail charges, but it is understood the Hamilton Club sell at a slightly redued price. In addition to the brands mentioned, there is a special cartridge named "Target" which is used for clay target shooters only, and retails at 15/- N.Z. per package.

The prices are in New Zealand currency and have to have 25% (1) added.

HANDICAP AND REGISTRATION CARDS. During recent weeks quite a number of shooters who had received previous notice of amendment of handicap and had also been requested to forward their cards for adjustment, have merely posted along their old 1962 cards. 1962 Cards are not now valid and same will not be returned to the senders. It is pointed out that 1963 registrations became due on January 1 and should be remitted by January 31, in accordance with Association regulations. When payment is made, the shooters referred to above will receive their current 1963 cards, carrying the correct handicap adjustment.

The following report, which appeared in an overseas paper on the Îtalian open shooting season, is of interest. The report states that the Italian season opened and closed within twenty-four hours. The report further states that almost a million Italians set off at dawn on the opening Sunday, shooting at practically anything that moved. Within a week eleven people had been killed and several hundred wounded as the frenzied gunners shot at each other as well as birds and beasts. By the time the second day arrived, it was, apparently, difficult for even an experienced shot with a first-class gun dog to find anything to shoot at, and by the end of the first week only a few shooters were left, shooting at sparrows. In face of what was described as such brutal and massive invasion of their lands, the farmers put down poisoned bait, which considerably thinned out the gun dogs. The situation has now become so serious and ludicrous that a campaign is about to be launched to change the shooting laws, which at present allow any Italian over 18 years of age to shoot at whatever he likes and where he liked!

The American "Trap & Field" Magazine, in a cover of the Grand American Handicap, mentions the following of interest to Australian shooters. The comment reads, "Malcolm Fuller, here for his fourth Grand from Australia, had his safety on when he called for his first bird. He lost two more in the first 15, then ran the last 85." The magazine also

An English report reveals that some good fishing was obtained at Carlingford, on the east coast of Ireland, during a competition fishing engagement a few months back. One hundred and sixty-five sea anglers took part and returned what is described as a fantastic catch. Their total catch weighed 11,715½ pounds, or about 5¼ tons! The winner was an angler named Bernard Doyle. The weather on the day was reported to be unfavourable, otherwise the fishermen would have returned a greatly increased quantity of fish. The venue of the competition, Carlingford, is a picturesque spot. On one side of the water the Cooley Mountains form a pleasant background, whilst on the other side the famous Mountains of Mourne gently slope down to the sea.

Popular Coff's Harbour veteran, E. C. (Ted) Wedgwood, advises that he has returned to the "Beautizone" area of the New South Wales northern coastline, which is the title given to that part of the northern coast by those who should know. Ted did not take long to get back into "harness" and drew a couple of cuts at a recent Coff's Harbour Club shoot. This popular sportsman, although handicapped physically, gets about the countryside with the alacrity of many men half his age. Ted still reckons "News" is his favourite monthly magazine.

A French report indicates that a "hunter" took the open season literally in a suburb of Nice on the French Riviera the day after the shooting season in the area officially opened. It appears that residents in the vicinity were rudely awakened about 5 a.m. by a racket of dogs barking, gunshots, and cries of frightened and dying fowls as the "hunter" proceeded on his rampage. As the sleepy neighbours opened their windows they observed a man shooting,

I.C.I.A.N.Z. Limited has recently developed a rabbit fumigation foam which exterminates all rabbits in a warren. Previously there was no practicable way of forcing a fumigant into the deep, blind leads of a complex warren, and therefore there was no guarantee of extermination. The new foam, impregnated with carbon monoxide from the exhaust gases of a petrol engine, is forced into the warrens or burrows. Experiments have been conducted for some time with the Victorian Department of Lands in conjunction with I.C.I.A.N.Z. Ltd. Warrens have been opened. following the experimental periods, and it has been found that the new foam, which is not harmful to humans or stock, has filled all blind leads to within inches of their extremities. The carbon monoxide in the foam suffocates the rabbits. The foam remains stable for two or three days. Any rabbits entering a treated burrow during this period would run into the foam and suffocation would follow. The method of fumigation consists of forcing foam into a burrow or warren, using special appara-tus which can be fitted to a tractor

Twenty Five Years Ago

Victorian duck shooters and dealers in weapons and material for field shooting were aghast when the then Victorian Chief Secretary, the late W. Bailey, announced that there would be no open season for wild duck during 1938. The reason for the decision was stated to be due to the abnormally dry season and the small amount of breeding that extensive investigation had revealed. The newspapers of day stated that "never in Victoria's legislative history had such a drastic step been taken. In an endeavour to preserve the wild-duck species, the open season has been progressively reduced from several months to about six weeks and limit months to about six weeks and limit bags imposed". One newspaper went on, "Victoria has thousands of acres adjoining watercourses and swampy country reserved as sanctuaries. These are not reported dry to any marked extent. If breeding has deteriorated, much of the blame is laid at the door of the supervising department itself. Many years the

poacher and out-of-season shooter has held almost uninterrupted play on many of the Murray tributaries and areas in the southern Riverina of New South Wales. The Department's decision will probably be marked an emphatic measure of protest. Meetings will be held, gun and cartridge traders are deeply concerned at the turn of events."



DAMO TRAPS

OPERATION AND INSTALLATION MANUAL.

TO REMOVE TRAP FROM CRATE.

Place crate on the floor right side up.
Remove top (lid) of crate.
Remove sides of crate.
Unbolt trap from crate (4 bolts).

INSTALLATION.

The trap, once removed from crate, should be bolted into a suitable trap house. As a guide, attached is a sketch of the all-steel DAMO Trap House, with the electric Auto. DAMO Trap installed.

The trap should rest on two beams, which can be of either angle iron $3 \times 3 \times \frac{4}{10}$ or hardwood beams 4×4 . If trap house base is of concrete, four bolts should be provided in the concrete, also recessed channel must be made in the concrete to take the trap base, as shown on the above sketch.

All bearers or concrete base must be 6" lower than that used for the snipe trap.

After bolting down, connect electric power and remote push-button control. All is now in readiness for operation.

OPERATION.

- 1. Make sure all switches are in the "off" position and the trap has been fired. Plate should always be in the uncocked SAFE position whenever the trap is not in use.
- 2. By sitting to the left and slightly behind the trap, switch on main motor master switch (located on the right-hand side of base). This cocks the trap.
- 3. Switch on and off oscillation motor switch (located on the left-hand side of the base) until the trap is in the straight-ahead position.
- 4. WARNING. Before making any height or spring-tension adjustments, or leaving trap house, always make sure master switches are off, and trap has been fired by means of the manual handle provided. Trap should at all times be in the uncocked safe position when not in use.

A good safety rule: NEVER FIRE TRAP while two persons are in the trap house.

- 5. Move finger to position marked "S" on finger carrier bar, place clay on plate.
- 6. Fire trap, adjust height 9' high at 10 yards from trap. Move finger up or down carrier bar until targets are thrown straight over height measuring bar.
- 7. Centralise angles by switching on and off oscillation motor until hard left angle is reached. Throw a target and check for correct angle. Repeat for right-hand angle. IMPORTANT: move finger slightly up or down carrier bar to give perfect equal angles; angles will be 10 yards wider when trap is oscillating.
- 8. VARIATION OF ANGLES. The oscillation motor has a plate fitted having 4 holes drilled and tapped in it; these holes are marked DR, 1, 2, 3; by moving connector arm and knurled pin into hole No. 2, correct 45° angles will be thrown. Should there be adverse winds and the angles are a little too wide, then shift to hole No. 1. Visa versa if angles are too narrow; shift to hole No. 3. Hole No. DR is for double rise only.
- 9. Check distance 45-55 yards from trap; if throwing short, increase spring tension by turning spider at the front of trap, clockwise. If throwing too far, turn spider anticlockwise.

IMPORTANT. Always make adjustments in the sequence shown for best result.

DOUBLE RISE.

1. All switches off. Trap fired and in safe uncocked position.

Turn spider on front of trap 4-5 full turns clockwise to increase spring tension.


- 2. Adjust elevation up, by turning height adjusting wheel 4-5 turns.
- 3. Place oscillation connector arm and knurled pin into hole No. DR on oscillation motor, move finger to D position on finger carrier bar.
- 4. Bring trap to the straightahead position, by switching on and off oscillation motor.

5. Cock trap by switching on main motor (right-hand side switch).



Close-up of the new Damo Electric Trap.




Showing the evenly released target from the new Damo Electric Trap.

either up or down until both targets are thrown the same height. At this stage forget angles, just concentrate on the targets being the same height.

30

The further up the rail that the finger is moved, the higher will the right-hand target go, and visa versa; the further down the finger is placed,

the lower will the right-hand target be. It is quite easy to remember if you say to yourself,

Finger up, right-hand target up. Finger down, right-hand target down.

- 6. The whole secret of perfect double rise is in the finger adjustment. Don't wait for a big shoot and then try and learn how and where the finger should be. Experiment when you first get your trap. Place the finger in various positions and see what happens. Become completely familiar with all adjustments so that you can do them automatically. Sometimes a movement of the finger of only & of an inch will make the difference. The trap can throw perfect pairs; it is up to you to make it do so.
- 7. Once both targets are thrown at the same height, next job is to centre the angles. This is done by switching on and off the oscillation motor, just moving the trap 1" at a time until the angles are perfect. Never say near enough. You can have them perfect, so why not? It is again up to you.
- 8. Once height and angles have been adjusted, check distance, and if targets are not going far enough or too far, wind spider on front of trap until you get the result you require.
- 9. In double rise, oscillation motor is left switched off. It will hold whatever position it is left in.

IMPORTANT. Always make adjustments in the sequence shown for best results.

TRAINING NOVICE SHOOTERS.

Slack off main spring tension so that targets travel only 40 yards. Bring trap to straight-ahead position by switching on and off oscillation motor. Leave oscillation motor switched off; trap will then hold this position.

As the novice progresses, any required angle can be given to him, simply by switching off the oscillation motor at the desired angle. This special feature of the DAMO is invaluable for both novices and shooters who require practice to master a particular bird.

Extra fast hard-angled birds for practice can be thrown simply by making the adjustments described herein.

TRIPLE RISE. As a novelty event and also something to really sharpen your shooting reflexes, try a triple rise. The DAMO trap will throw a perfect triple rise, two clays and one sparrow, by placing clay, sparrow, clay on the plate and increasing main spring tension to accommodate the extra load. The clays go out as in double rise, while the sparrow goes straight out. Shooting can be depended in Doubling can be done as in Deauville Doubles, or one shooter using an auto. with three cartridges. A most interesting experience.

LUBRICATION.

- 1. There are fitted on the trap two grease nipples, located in the middle of the trap on the right-hand side. They lubricate the ratchets and require two plunges from the grease gun once every 8 hours.
- 2. ELECTRIC MOTORS AND GEAR-BOXES require attention once every 12 months. No other lubrication is necessary. All other working parts are self-lubricated.

MAINTENANCE.

- 1. Clean S.S. throwing plate before every shoot. Rub off bitumen adhesion with a litte emery cloth.
- 2. Check rubber rail for straightness; wear will show after approximately 25,000 targets have been thrown. True up the rubber by attaching a length of emery paper to a piece of board about 12" long, and rub off high spots on the rubber rail. Rubber rail should be straight.
- 3. To replace main spring, remove spring tension spider on the front of the trap by turning it anti-clockwise until it is right out. Unscrew lock nut on spring crank, unscrew bolt attaching spring eye to crank. Reverse this procedure for installing a new spring.

WARNING. When installing new spring it is most important to tighten bolt in spring eye, and then slack it off one full turn, then tighten lock nut. These bolts must leave sufficient clearance for spring eye to work on the crank.

4. All bolts are tapped into their respective parts, and are then fitted with lock nuts. It is necessary after removing lock nuts to unscrew bolts. Never try to drive them out.

Check occasionally to see that all lock nuts are tight.

Clearance adjustments are made by screwing bolts down until parts will just move freely, and then tighten lock nut.

5. FINGER. The fibre on this unit will, after prolonged usage, show signs of wear. Clean it up occasionally with a file. Despite signs of wear, this fibre will carry on giving good, trouble-free service for a long time.

Get to know your trap.

Learn to make all adjustments quickly.

Never allow mediocre birds to be thrown.



SPECIAL FEATURES.

The "DAMO" is the only Electric Auto. Trap in the world that can be operated by hand in the event of a power failure. To cock the Trap you simply pull the Plate around to the cocked position. The Trap is then fired by means of the manual handle. To angle the Trap you disconnect the Trap from the Oscillation Motor by removing the Knurled Connector Pin. Once this pin is removed, the Trap can be angled quite freely by hand and will throw targets in the direction the trap is pointing.






Mr. G. BIGNELL.
