

The Editor's Notebook



1963 INTERNATIONAL MATCH. The 1963 International Match (Australian section) will be shot during the forthcoming National Championships series from June 6 to June 11, 1963. Advice has been received that the home country teams will shoot at Dublin, Ireland, on June 21. Conditions of the International will

Conditions of the International will be the same as in 1962. As advertised in the current issue of "News", it will be noted that the Australian Team will shoot on June 10. Immediately following the conclusion of the Australian team shoot at Southport, Q., information will be cabled to Dublin so that all scores can be compared and the winning team known.

**INCREASE IN PRIZE MONEY** -GRAND AUSTRALIAN HANDICAP. It has been decided to increase the prize money attached to the 14th Grand Australian Handicap to be decided at Southport, Queensland, on the fourth day of the Australian National Championships fixtures, June 10, 1963. An Executive Committee member drew attention to the fact that he considered the back-mark shooters were insufficiently catered for in the big Handicap, insofar as the previous conditions indicated that an award of £25 would be made to shooters "20 yds. and beyond". After due consideration, it has now been decided to increase the event by another £50, and, in addition to the yardage awards already advertised up to 20 yards, the following awards have

been added: Instead of finishing at 20 yards, the yardages will now read "20/21 yards  $\pm 25$ , 22/24 yards  $\pm 25$ , and 25/27 yards  $\pm 25$ ". By the means indicated, it ensures that every yardage shooter has really something to shoot for. It might be mentioned here that the nomination fee has not been increased, and this still remains at the moderate figure of  $\pm 5$ .

HANDICAPPING FORMULA. Many club officials have apparently not read or assimilated the direction issued by the Executive Committee following its last meeting in Sydney. The direction reads:

"Club Presidents and Secretaries are instructed that during any shoot, the management must immediately re-handicap each and every shooter who, for any of the reasons prescribed in the A.C.T.A. Handicapping Formula, qualifies for backward movement off his handicap.

Such adjustments are to strictly comply with the Formula.

No shooter is to be permitted to compete in another event should he refuse to accept his new mark. Handicap cards and relevant details concerning these 'on the spot' adjustments are to be forwarded, within two days, to the Official Handicapper for ratification.

Should the shooter ignore his latest handicap, irrespective of mark shown in 'News', he is to be penalised a further yard, if he shoots inside his latest handicap. No individual is permitted to alter or adjust a shooter's handicap card, other than the A.C.T.A. Official Handicapper."

The foregoing is quite self - explanatory, but in some instances is not being carried out. Only a week or two ago some cards reached the A.C.T.A. office bearing adjustments signed by the Secretary of the respective shooters' club. These adjustments were not accepted and the cards were returned to the club, with a request that the signature and handicap shown be removed forthwith. It is most important that cards should be signed and scrutinised in the A.C.T.A. office. It is impossible to keep control and correct tabulation unless this is observed.

Local club handicappers should also remember that once a shooter has been handicapped on gaining a 50 break, he is not re-handicapped on subsequent 50 breaks. However, this ruling does not apply where 75 breaks are concerned.

LATE LODGMENT OF COPY. There is a prevailing habit, which has developed more so in the past few months, of lodging copy with the A.C.T.A. office for inclusion in "News" several days after dead-line. Most of the fault in this regard comes from clubs nearest the A.C.T.A. headquarters. It seems that the further the club is away from headquarters, the more certain is the copy to be early. Of much moment in this regard, is the fact that copy which has been lodged early is ensured of a reasonable write-up in "Tips and Tails" section. Late copy is dealt with as efficiently as possible, but with as enciently as possible, but earlier lodgment would greatly assist the limited A.C.T.A. staff to cope with dead-line date with the mini-mum of inconvenience. Clubs, particularly those close to the Association headquarters, are requested to please note this paragraph and act accordingly.

USE OF SHOOTING NAMES. It has long been a practice of the A.C.T.A. not to accept shooting names or nom-de-plumes. In recent months the practice of putting down a shooter's nickname on returns has become somewhat prevalent. Only last month a certain popular nickname was referred on three different returns from three different States. Obviously such action makes for inefficiency and the handicapping problem becomes very real under these circumstances. Club officials are notified that nicknames will not be accepted on result sheets or handicap returns. Where nicknames continue to be shown, same will be deleted before being forwarded to the printer. The only shooting names permitted now are those few who were registered prior to 1939.

#### ADDENDUM.

In the listed names of "Nominations for A.C.T.A. Executive Committee" the name of Mr. K. S. Soames was inadvertently omitted from those listed in the "New South Wales" section. His name should have been included, along with Mr. F. R. Hudson's, as "not coming up for election in 1963". Mr. Soames was elected for a two-year period at Bankstown, N.S.W., in 1962.



It would seem that Australia can possibly show our American friends a point or two when it comes to big shoots. Writing in the American magazine "Trap & Field", January 1963 issue, the prominent trapshot Vic. Reinders, in his column, refers to the practice of calling for shooters to take their place in their respective squads. Reinders says that announcement should be kept to a bare minimum. He continues, "I remember the comments of Jack Wilson (obviously the former President of the A.C.T.A., Jock Wilson), the first Australian who came to the Grand about 10 or 15 years ago. He said, 'Why do you call them? They know the squads they are in and what squads are made up.' When asking what they did in Australia about shooters who were late for their squads, we found that the practice was to throw the targets for such shooters, and if they weren't on the line to break them, they were called lost. So if a shooter came after his squadmates had already shot four targets each, he would find four zeroes neatly racked up after his name." Although shooters are threatened with having birds pulled against them, it is very seldom necessary for such drastic action. Apparently Australia leads the field in this procedure.

Barcaldine Gun Club (Queensland) will stage its annual two-day shoot in 1963 on Saturday, July 13, and Sunday, July 14. Three traps will be operating, two of which will be the new Damo Electric Traps. A Calcutta will be sold on the grounds on completion of shooting on Saturday, July 13, following which a banquet will be held. 

Dear Sir, I would like to say how much I enjoy the Clay Target News, and how much an edition such as the News means to our sport. The full interstate coverage sponsors a na-tional fellowship seldom experienced in any other sport.

There are a couple of points that have often been discussed in the magazine, and also amongst club members, that I should like to comment on. These are problems which vitally affect the future of the sport. They are as follows:

- (a) Sunday shooting.
- (b) Abolishment of all tax on cartridges and firearms used in the sport of Clay Target Shooting.

In the first instance, in these days of extending trading hours it is becoming impossible for certain members to devote their Saturdays to the sport and support of their clubs. I, and many others, regard it as imperative that the issue on Sunday shooting be pressed to the utmost to save the wastage of keen shooters and club members, who are finding it increasingly hard to attend on Saturdays.

In the second instance, it is time the Federal Government realised the valuable asset it has in the firearm valuable asset it has in the hrearm training of citizens in the sport. In the event of hostilities, Australia has an unofficial army of expert shots at her disposal, at no cost to the tax-payer. To encourage this extra-military training, the Federal Gov-ernment should be obliged to forego all tax on equipment and ampunition all tax on equipment and ammunition used in this type of sport.

It is up to us, the members, the clubs, and the Association, to raise our voices as responsible citizens and have these things corrected.

# OUT OF THE PAST

### **Twenty Five Years Ago**

Early in 1938 the papers of the day referred to a win by "popular Scottish sportsman, J. M. (Jock) Wilson". It appears Wilson (a former President of the A.C.T.A.) journeyed to Barellan in New South Wales (about 35 miles from Narrandera) and took part, along with several other Victorian and Tasmanian shooters, in the premier title event of New South Wales, the double-barrel title. State titles were shot from 20 yards in those days and at 20 targets. E. E. Albert of Moombooldool. Les. Tibb and Wilson finished the scheduled 20 rounds with scores of 18/20. (Wilson missed his final target.) Shooting on to decide the tie, Wilson stopped the full round of five targets, four with his first barrel. Tibb missed his third release, Wilson Albert and Tibb tied again for the placings. Ultimately the position of runner-up went to Albert 32/35 to Tubb's 31/35. H. G. James ("Duxbac") refereed the contest.

During the same year the St. George Club put on a special "Wandevers' Trophy" as a tribute to Les. Tibb and W. R. Bloomfield, who travelled by car from Melbourne to St. George to take part in the club's shoot. Car travelling in those days was not as simple as it is today, and their journey was a hazardous one.

The now extinct Field Shooters' Club at East Oakleigh (V.) announced that its then Secretary, the late T. K. Summers, had been granted six months' leave of absence to take over an hotel at Echuca. Summers died not long afterwards. Incident-ally the membership fee of the club was announced as being raised from 2/6 to 5/-!

The Blackburn Club (now amalgamated with the Nobel Club to form the Australian Club) is reported to have held its first shoot for the season. A shooter named A. McNay, at his first visit to the traps, won the special driven event.

### **Fifteen Years Ago**

Fred Burns won the 1948 Victorian premier title under double - barrel conditions in 1948. Burns was the conditions in 1948. Burns was the only competitor to stop the full complement of 25 straight. Runner-up was E. G. Biggs, 24/25. After a tie shoot for third placing, Des. B. O'Callaghan gained the place, 28/30, from W. R. Johns, F. E. Brown and J. A. McCraith.

Jack McCraith gained the high-gun honours of the 1948 International Match with 98/100; H. R. Donelly was next, 97/100, and E. G. Biggs third, 94/100.

H. R. Donelly won the Champion of Champions Cup of 1948 with the excellent score of 49/50, missing only his 41st target. Jack McCraith was second, 48/50, and W. R. Johns third, 47/50. G. H. Bell (Young, N.S.W.) followed, after a tie shoot, with 67/ 71, from Jim Smith, then of Towns-ville O 66/71 ville, Q., 66/71.
