

The Editor's Notebook



AUSTRALIA WINS 1963 INTER-NATIONAL MATCH. As announced briefly in "stop press" in the August issue, cabled advice has been received from London that Australia has again been successful in annexing first honours in the 1963 International Match. Australia has won for the last two successive years and was beaten by New Zealand by 13 birds in 1961. As is generally known, the contest is staged over 100 targets per man from 16 yards, double-barrel, points scoring 3 and 2. The 1963 winning Australian Team re-corded 8694 points out of a possible 9000 points, and the winning margin over New Zealand was 88 points. It is recalled that Australia's winning total in 1962 was the remarkable aggregate of 8764/9000 points, with the record winning margin of 143 points. Newton Thomas was again high-gun for Australia. Thomas

grassed the possible number of targets, but used two second barrels, one in his third round of 25 and one in his fourth round of 25. His total points were 298/300. Second highgun was A. C. Tie, who also stopped the possible, but had one point less on points aggregate. Others to shoot the full score of 100 straight were M. Burgess, W. Stevens, J. Cooper, and I. Nicholson.

Newton Thomas was also high-gun in 1962 with the excellent score of 299/300 points. Congratulations are extended to the Australian Team on its splendid win.

Of interest is the following table of winning teams since the inauguration of the International Match. Australia was accepted into the International field in 1939 and finished well back in the initial year. The details of winning teams are:

1964 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP AP-PLICATIONS. Clubs are reminded that applications for 1964 open championships (that is Commonwealth, State and District) should reach the A.C.T.A. Office, Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.1, on or before October 3, 1963. Applications received after that date cannot be included in the official list to be submitted to the Executive Committee for allocation. As a guide to Commonwealth Championships, it is advised that the Executive Committee last year (1962) adopted the following roster for "Commonwealth Championships" for 1964. This will mean that the 1964 Commonwealth Championships will be allocated to a club in the States indicated as follows:

From the foregoing roster it will be clearly understood that the Commonwealth Championships as outlined will be allocated only in the respective States mentioned. Clubs outside the States referred should not make application for particular Commonwealth Championships in States which are not as listed. In regard to general championship applications, clubs are informed that all that is required is merely an application stating they wish to be allocated a "State" title or a "District" title. In previous years some clubs submitted copious lists not a tenth of which had any chance of being allocated. Clubs concerned are requested to adhere to the foregoing instructions.

NOTICES OF MOTION. Clubs having Notices of Motion for submission to the Executive Committee in regard to alteration of the Articles of Association are advised that such Notices must be lodged with the A.C.T.A. Secretary on or before September 30, 1963, in accordance with Article 43 (d). Notices of Motion cannot be submitted to the Annual Meeting before same are first placed before the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee will then discuss same and decide whether same should be submitted to the next annual meeting.

AMATEUR RULES. Shooters who may have ideas of shooting at the Tokyo Games in 1964 are reminded of the Amateur Rules which have been adopted by the A.C.T.A. These read:

1. The principles of amateurism, laid down in the declaration of the I.O.C. at its congress in 1947, should be valid for the members of the International Shooting Union (with which the A.C.T.A. is affiliated).

2. Money prizes. Money prizes up to £2 or \$8 - or its equivalent - are considered as a compensation for costs. If there is a meeting covering several days, money prizes totalling £10 or \$40-or its equivalent-within the same week are also considered a compensation for costs without detailed specification from the competitors. Money prizes exceeding the above-mentioned sums should be given over to the club to which the competitor belongs. The competitor may receive from his club only a sum corresponding to his actual costs. which may include:

- (a) entrance fees,
- (b) ammunition.
- (c) travelling expenses and cost of living according to the rules of the International Amateur Athletic Federation.

These apply only to categories of shooting supervised by the U.I. de

- 3. As an amateur should not be considered:
 - (a) anyone who gives an exhibition in marksmanship and is paid for it.
 - (b) anyone who professionally makes test shooting of guns, or ammunition from the shoulder (an operator of a test shooting machine is not included),
 - (c) anyone who is a professional instructor in shooting.

To (b) and (c) categories do not belong a member of the armed forces, who acts as an instructor to recruits.

In judging the status as an amateur according to this article, the activities of the competitor during the last two years should be considered.

4. The competitor should fulfill the qualifications of amateurism laid down by the National Olympic Committee of his country.

N.B. The above definition to date from the publication of the Rules for the Olympic Games, 1948.

Australian Visit to New Zealand for 1963 N.Z. Championships

Report to Executive Committee by Manager, Australian Team.

It is indeed pleasing to record that members of the visiting Australian party received a very cordial and spontaneous welcome to New Zealand spontaneous welcome to New Zealand from New Zealanders generally and the shooting fraternity in particular. All Australians who were fortunate enough to be able to take part in the trip retain unforgettable memories of a very pleasant and happy excursion across the Tasman Sea.

Shooting. Shooting competitions were well organised at Hamilton, the venue of the New Zealand National Championships.

Of interest were the number of sweepstakes which were freely arranged throughout the programme, which commenced on Wednesday, April 3rd. The sweepstake arrange-ment was unusual from an Australian viewpoint. For instance, on the opening day three such events were conducted. The first was at 15 targets for a 20/- nomination, plus a further 5/for targets. Similarly, a sweepstake at 20 targets which followed involved a nomination fee of £2, plus a further 7/- for targets. Another sweepstake concluded the programme and nomination for this was £3, plus 10/for targets. The dividends from the
above-mentioned sweepstakes were cut 50%, 25%, 15%, 10%. Usually a large number of shooters gained possible scores and the ultimate dividend to each successful competitor was small.

tor was small.

J. McKenzie of Seaward Downs in the South Island won the New Zealand National Skeet Championship. McKenzie is well known on the Australian side of the Tasman. He won the Champion of Champions Cup at Southport some years ago.

The big event of the New Zealand programme was the New Zealand Single-rise Championship—the Australian equivalent would be the National Double-barrel Championship. The event was shot at 50 tar-

ship. The event was shot at 50 tar-

gets from 18 yards and drew the splendid entry of 251. Nomination splendid entry of 251. Nomination for the event was 20/-, plus a compulsory sweepstake of 20/-, plus an additional 17/6 for targets. Cost of cartridges was, of course, additional. The event was won by W. J. Pritt of Ohakune, who defeated 10 others in the tie shoot after all 11 had recorded possibles. Of particular interest in connection with this event terest in connection with this event (from an Australian viewpoint) was the way in which the tie shoot was disposed of. The system used for the tie shoot was "squad system and miss-out". This worked very effect-ively. The 11 finalists faced up to the trap in the same order in which they were listed in the competition. The shoot-off took approximately 22 minutes to complete. No members of the Australian party gained a possible and were, therefore, excluded from the shoot-off.

The New Zealand International Team is selected in a somewhat similar manner to the method used in Australia, in that contenders for a place in team are required to shoot through two qualifying events, each of 30 targets from 16 yards, points scoring. Two notable absentees from the 1963 New Zealand International Team were J. McKenzie and C. Hartley. The latter had been high-gun in 1962 — both failed to qualify.

New Zealand v. Australia - the Tom Glenn Cup. After a spirited contest the New Zealand Team of six men emerged victors in this now established bi-annual inter-Dominion contest. New Zealand returned a score of 118/120 to Australia's 115/ 120. The Australian Team was selected from the six top scorers in the New Zealand Single-rise Championship. been residing in Australia for over 12 months and had returned to New Zealand for a brief holiday), W. Abbott (Werribee, V.) 47, J. McLean (Moree, N.S.W.) 46, F. R. Hudson (St. Ives, N.S.W.) 46, and the Australian captain, D. B. Mott, 45. Mott and R. Hogarth (Southport, Q.) tied over the scheduled course of the match, Mott winning a tie shoot under miss-out conditions. The Australian Team was given the honour of shooting first, and shot moderately well without showing any worthwhile approach to regular Australian Team were scored by Messrs. F. R. Hudson, I. Willoughby and W. Abbott. Then followed L. S. R. Stewart 19, D. B. Mott 18, and J. McLean 18. The New Zealand G.C.A. kindly presented a high-gun award for the Australian Team. In a tie shoot which went 33 rounds, F. R. Hudson gained the honours from W. Abbott. Willoughby dropped out on the first round. With one exception, the New Zealand Team shot brilliantly. Five shot possibles and one 18/20.

New Zealand Annual Meeting. Several members of the visiting Australian contingent accepted the general invitation to "sit-in" at the New Zealand Gun Clubs' Association annual meeting. The N.Z. President, Mr. Tom Glenn, extended cordial welcome to the visitors.

OBSERVATIONS

Tie Shoots. As the Executive Committee has already approved of tie shoots during the forthcoming National Championships at Southport being shot "squad system and missout", little reference is necessary here. However, it is pointed out that the system is universally accepted throughout New Zealand and it does much to assist administration in that long-drawn tie shoots are a rarity.

Refereeing. The generally used system of raising the right hand and calling at the same time for a first-barrel "kill", similarly two hands for a second-barrel "kill" and both hands waved in "wash-out" movement for a miss is interesting, but not altogether accepted. Except in qualifying events for the International Team and the shooting of the International Team, points scoring does not appear

to be in use in New Zealand, hence the use of hand signals does not seem to apply. Refereeing generally was of a high standard.

Handicapping. The Australian system of handicapping for open events appears to be much more satisfactory than the involved procedure adopted in handicapping of New Zealand shooters. It seems that the New Zealand system is based wholly on the amount of money won, less cost of entries. It would seem unlikely that the New Zealand system would ever be acceptable to Australia. The New Zealand system doubtless is suitable to a small country, but in the wide expanse of Australia the system would be unworkable.

Cleaning Shooting Ground. Immediately after an event is concluded a small ground working staff approach each shooting track and quickly gather up all discarded shells and other refuse. This practice tends to keep the grounds looking in first-class condition throughout the week of shooting and could be very well adopted in Australia.

Hospitality.

The generous hospitality meted out to the Australian visitors was quite a pleasant feature of the Australian visit. From the official administration down, every individual in any way connected with the tournament was out to assist and co-operate. The members of the Australian party were issued with complimentary luncheon tickets and given a special table waited upon by most efficient helpers.

OUT OF THE PAST

Twenty Five Years Ago

to be re-formed after a recess of many years, was in the news in 1938 when the club's championship was shot for the first time on the Currie shooting grounds, King Island. A party of Melbourne enthusiasts chartered a plane. The report does not indicate the winner's name.

Ltd., well-known Melbourne gunsmiths and sports dealers) was well in the public eye by his brilliant success in the big Anniversary clay pigeon shoot at Pagewood (Sydney) in composition with the 150th April in connection with the 150th Annireserved the connection with the 150th Anniversary celebrations on the founding of the city of Sydney. The big match was one of the first ever to be staged at 100 targets, and it attracted a field from all parts of the Commonwealth and a few from New Zealand. "Duxhae" was the fourth gheater in the bac" was the fourth shooter in the first squad, and to everyone's surprise he dropped his fourth target. He again missed on the 22nd round and also lost his 56th and 79th targets. However, shooting well within himself, he held on to run out winner 95/100 from Luke Hughes (Sydney)

King Island Club, which is about and Ted Holmes (Warialda, N.S.W.) and Ted Holmes (Warialda, N.S.W.) each with 91/100. "Calrossie" (J. W. Sutherland), who was never renowned as a top-ranking clay pigeon shooter, was a good fourth, 89/100. Then followed A. W. Hall (Melbourne) 86, "Harrison" (the late Reg Ilett) 86, the late Bob Ferris, then a resident of Kyneton (V.) 86, W. E. H. Rainbird (Launceston, Tas.) 84, J. W. Raleigh (Morven, Q.) 83. Raleigh won the similar skeet championship, shot the following day, with pionship, shot the following day, with what was in those days a particularly good score of 49/50. It is of interest to record that a special down-the-line handicap was shot in conjunction with the championship, and this was tied by Mal. Fuller (then recorded as 13-year-old schoolboy), A. Waters (Roseville), A. E. Poxon (Launceston), F. Holland (N.S.W.) and J. Bryant (Blackburn, V.). Waters won the shoot-off. The report states, "Young Fuller won the £5 prize for the best junior, and altogether for the meeting won over £20. Fuller has a most accomplished style, and with a little more experience will go far in the sport." (True words, if ever reporting could be so classified.)

Fifteen Years Ago

On the Coburg grounds Fred Burns won the Victorian Tower Champion-ship of 1948. A 20 birder on the same programme went to Alf Poxon of Launceston (Tas.), 25/25, after a brief tie shoot with the Dandenong shooter, Frank Brown.

In a Deauville Doubles contest at Camberwell Vic Fraser, who then used the shooting name of "Gippsland", and Association Patron, Frank Hockey, were the winning pair.

Bill Bloomfield of Sandringham, who does not shoot these days, won the overall aggregate at a fixture conducted by the Australian Gun Club at East Burwood.

Fred Burns, who was shooting particularly well at this period, won the Commonwealth Single - barrel Championship for 1948; he won from Bert Haynes, Bill Bloomfield and the late Vic Fankhauser.

Ten Years Ago

I had the misfortune to break my leg two months ago and will not be able to take part in active sport for some months yet. I still go to as many shoots as I can manage.

You might remember me, I used to shoot at the old Nobel's Club before the war; I think it was in 1936 or 37. I once had a very good day there and won the President's trophy. and the same day won a trophy for the lady, and I think it was Mrs. McCullough. There were no big breaks in those days with the old plus trap. I remember Jim Lowe shooting a 50 break; not sure if it was the first, but it was considered outstanding at the time and got headlines in the "Age" and "Argus" newspapers. I shot second to a chap named Fick in the Duke of Gloucester Trophy with 17/18, against a big number of shooters. Clare Lancaster and myself used to drive 80 miles from Korumburra nearly every shoot at Nobel's.

There were some good old shooters of those days, still active at the traps, I have not seen mentioned in "Out of the Past": George Stanlake, down Wonthaggi way, Bill Twyerould, Clare Lancaster, who used the shooting name of "Texas", are at Wilcania in N.S.W.; also "Drongo", Theo Norman (Colac), helped the sport for many years.

I hope this does not bore you too much and also finds you in the best of health.







OBITUARY

Mr. FRANK BAILEY

As announced briefly in the last issue of this publication, we intimate with deepest regret the passing of Mr. Frank Bailey of Perth, Western Australia, which took place on the Perth Club's shooting ground on Sunday, July 7.

Mr. Bailey was a popular sportsman who was highly regarded both for his sporting prowess and resounding good qualities. He was a current Vice - President of the Perth Club after being President of the club in 1959/60. He served for a period as the Western Australian representative on the Executive Committee of the A.C.T.A.

Despite a bad heart condition which kept him inactive for varying periods in recent years, he was an indefatigable worker for the club and the interests of clay target shooting generally. Just prior to his passing Mr. Bailey had assisted in and supervised the installation of the Perth Club's latest acquisition-two "Damo" electric traps. He had the honour of breaking the first target released from the new traps. 


