



The Editor's Notebook



A.C.T.A. CAR BADGES. The decision by the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee to institute a car badge has met with an encouraging response and already many orders have been recorded. Some opinions expressed when orders lodged, "Pleased to learn the Committee has decided to procure car badges. I would like to procure car badges. I would like to place an order for six," "Am all in favour, big advantage to recognise other A.C.T.A. shooters when travelling interstate," "Am sure the decision will be popularly received and that you will have no trouble in receiving sufficient orders to make the venture worth while," "A good idea," "What a great idea this is. Many of letting shooters from other way of letting shooters from other way of letting shooters from other towns and States know us while travelling or holidaying, and I am sure this badge will do the trick,"
"I would like to obtain two car badges, one for front and one for rear when available," "This, I think, is a wonderful idea and should create a great deal of interest." In addition to the shooter mentioned above who ordered six badges, another has already ordered five, others four. Another club ordered 15, another 12, and so on. Delivery was expected to start about the end of September. Delivery will be arranged in sequence as orders are received, hence it is advisable for those intending to secure a car badge to lodge their orders with the A.C.T.A. Secretary (Box 2038 S., G.P.O., Melbourne, C.1) with the minimum of delay. Cost is 25/- per badge, including postage, and also includes nuts and bolts for attachment. The

badge is an attractive design with an all-round diameter of 3".

A USEFUL HINT FROM OVER-SEAS. Frequently the tasks of referees, writers, and statistical personnel can be something of an ordeal when they have to be accomplished in scorching sunshine. Very often these personnel have to cope with their many duties in the full glare of a never-relaxing sun. That women can be inventive in such circumstances is clearly demonstrated in the photo appended hereto. The occasion of the photo was at an International Clay Pigeon Shoot. The picture shows how one can become the possessor of an ideal and costfree sun hat (provided no riflemen object to their targets being used in such fashion) — all that is needed is a rifleman's target, suitably cut out and then stuck together again with possibly adhesive tape so as to form a most satisfactory sun deflector. The model is doubtless unique, but it would seem to serve its purpose very well.



SAFETY RULES. A reader not long ago wrote to the Association stating that little reference was made from time to time on the question of safety rules. The observance of safety rules is a fundamental law of the Association, and every club official, referee, and individual shooter should make it his business to ensure that adequate safety rules are being observed at all shoots. Just as a reminder, the following should be closely adhered to: Never carry a loaded gun except in the field on a gameshooting expedition. Even when unloaded, never point a gun in the direction of anybody—always assume that the gun is loaded—it is always the "unloaded" gun that brings about fatal accidents. Never take your gun into a house, car, boat or shed, without first checking that it is empty, also never leave a gun anywhere if there is the slightest chance of it being knocked over. Always unload when crossing a style, getting over a gate or fence, jumping a ditch or squeezing through a hedge.

Always remember that safety is more important than marksmanship and there is no excuse whatever for anyone not being a safe shot. Gun sport has many facets, but for your own peace of mind and the safety of yourself and everyone else, your first concern should be to become an absolutely safe shot -- its other attractions will automatically follow.

A.C.T.A. OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS. Clubs are again reminded that applications for Commonwealth, State and District Championships to be decided during the calendar year 1964 should be lodged with the A.C.T.A. Secretary not later than October 3. After that date applications are collated and presented to the Executive Committee for official allocation. During December the official championship allocation is published in "News" for all interested to note.

Whilst on this point it has come to the notice of the Association that a few clubs apparently have misunderstood the Executive Committee's direction, in that all open championships (Commonwealth, State and District) have first to be allocated to the respective clubs, and then the club to whom a particular title is

allotted is required to apply to the A.C.T.A. for approval of the date on which it is intended to conduct any such event. Providing the date is "all clear" there is little likelihood of a date being refused, but it should be remembered that the A.C.T.A. is out to assist clubs in arranging dates. and if a selected date is unappropriate, an alternative date should be suggested and applied for.

Many clubs have omitted to carry out this direction in connection with the "District" titles. The same procedure applies to district events as to Commonwealth and State.

OFFICIAL REFEREE EXAMINA-TION. Candidates who took part in the written section of the recent official referee examination are informed that, due to the fact that so many applied to be included, it has not been possible to check through the examination papers in time for results to be announced in the current issue of this publication. All are informed that results wll appear in the November edition of "News", together with examiner's comments. Previously it was instructed that all who were successful in the written or theory section of the examination were required to undergo their practical tests on or before December 31, 1963. After due consideration and the fact of the month's delay in publishing the theory results, it has now been decided to extend the period for undergoing the practical tests until January 31, 1964. This will enable many to arrange for their practical test during the many holiday shoots which usually take place during January.



"Tips and Tails"

EXTRACTS FROM THE WRITINGS OF THE LATE W. P. GROSVENOR

For the interest of Australian shooters it has been decided to reproduce extracts from some of the letters written by the late W. P. Grosvenor of Hickling, Norwich, Norfolk (England) to the A.C.T.A. Secretary back in the mid-forties. The late author of these letters was for many years official coach to the English International and Olympic Teams. Unfortunately several of Mr. Grosvenor's letters have been mislaid, but those that are available will be set out for the interest of Australian shooting sportsmen.

Almost 20 years ago Mr. Grosvenor penned the following to the A.C.T.A. Secretary:

"This letter comes to you as a sort of covering letter of explanation of the disjointed efforts of the past. I do trust that somewhere amongst it all you will be able to pick out a few bits of useful dope. I remember when at Antwerp in 1920 I was at a gathering of mixed shooters one evening and I was, in quite good fun, being ragged or having my leg pulled by some of those present. For a lark one of our own team joined in and took sides against me over some little assertion of mine—it rather got my

wool, as it was good-naturedly intended to do. They were all English speaking. Finally I said, 'Look here, my friends, when you have been in sport for another hundred years you will be seeing it from the viewpoint as we do now.' There was silence for a few moments, as it has registered heavily, and in their hearts those who were teasing me knew it to be true. These Olympic Games were at one time thought to be the means of bringing various races more into line with each other and promote interpretared friendship but believe me national friendship, but, believe me, it has done, and will always do, the reverse. We the British race see sport as a game and play it as such. We do our best to win, but the actual winning and the hoisting of our flag to mark our having won some event or other is much more of just being an incident, than it is to some of the other nations competing. The kick we get out of playing games is the playing thereof, the winning is in a way incidental, and as long as we have done our best, that is all there is to it - it is distinctly not a matter of life and death. Naturally we like to win in our turn, and are always trying to do so, but if we lose, well, we

have had a go and enjoyed it, too. I know it is not necessary to labour the point with an Australian, New Zealander, Canadian or any of our other Dominion peoples. I trust the airing of these views will not be mis-understood. I am not claiming them as mine alone, but as the natural way we, the English-speaking race, regard sport.

Up to the present I have found that the Canadians are the only people who have the same power of concentration as the Americans - a gift - without which no trap shooter gift — without which no trap shooter can hope to reach the absolute top of his sport. The essence of the whole thing is, the target you have to pulverise, forget all that has gone before, that is past and done with, and it is the next target, and that alone, that has to be dealt with and the string of those yet to come to complete the contest, at the present and insistent time, just do not enter

To the real experts, the breaking of a target into a few pieces is little better than an absolute miss, as it means that the bulk of the charge was misdirected — nothing satisfies him but an absolute pulverisation of the target and leaving in the air just a puff of dust like a smoke cloud. Anything less than this tells him that he has either gone somewhere near missing or that he has lost his timing.

This 'time' or 'timing' is the crux of the whole thing. A good shot will, or should, keep on breaking his targets at about 35 yards from where he stands, but until he quickens up and gets to smashing them at 31 or

32 yards, he will never reach the rank of the real experts. To the really fast man, a three-quarter choke (65% pattern) is the ideal; indeed, there are a few gifted 'speed merchants' to are a few gifted 'speed merchants' to whom a half-choke (60% pattern) would suit best. In two-barrel shooting, the right barrel (side-by-side gun), as I say, should be not more than a three-quarter choke, but the left barrel the fullest choke one can get, and it is possible to have a barrel bored and adjusted to give anything from 72 to 75%.

These thoughts are for those who desire to reach ton rank— a most

desire to reach top rank — a most laudable target to aim at, of course.

My guns have what may be considered the standard drop of stock, 1½" by 2", and my wife's guns are the same. But there are some experts who favour a 14 drop.

These days under-and-over guns seem to be very popular, but, personally, I do not like them, as they generally throw rather high, and if the targets are being thrown low, as one finds in Olympic contests, it is somewhat difficult to avoid overshooting now and again. This, however, is a personal opinion, and who am I to pit my experience of long ago against the modern men?

I would still engage to take the average team of good shots and coach the men to improve at least 5% in a few lessons, too. This said 5% just makes the difference between a good team and a REAL GOOD TEAM.

Shall not write this again, as I think it conveys my meaning O.K., speed, SPEED, SPEED, SPEED,

OUT OF THE PAST

Twenty Five Years Ago

The idea of holding the annual International Match was in the embryo stages at this period twenty-five years ago. Australia had approached the English shooting authorities to be allowed to take part in an "International Post" contest against England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales. A note received from the English

Secretary about this time indicated that "it has been impossible to arrange a 'post' five-country International for this year—1938". However, it was agreed that Australia shoot a match under International conditions and despatch details and results to England. This was done, and apparently the results impressed

the overseas authorities, and Australia was admitted to the International circle a year later.

The Camberwell Club (V.) is reported to have conducted its second meeting. Winners at this fixture were the late A. P. Cooke ("Crom"), the later Harry Gulliver (who passed on in July, 1963), Harry Kothe, H. J. Osborne and the later E. B. Turner. The last-named was the inaugural President of the now defunct Melbourne Clay Target Club.

Several names still prominent in club activities at Sale in eastern Gippsland (V.) were mentioned in the results of a Sale Club shoot. These were the present Secretary, now in the veteran class, Len Robinson; Lou

Bourbaud, the present President and one-time member of the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee; H. Hare, C. Jones, L. Elston, W. McInnes, A. O. Rayner and W. Fischer.

At the Nobel Club at West Footscray, a teams match, Victoria v. Tasmania, was staged. A number of Tasmanians who had competed at the big Pagewood (Sydney) fixture the previous week stopped off to attend the Nobel fixture. The teams were five men a side, and the result was a tie. W. Rainbird and "Duxbac", who captained the opposing teams, were the only ones to record possibles over the original course of the contest. In the shoot-off Victoria proved too strong and won 18/25 to Tasmania's 16/25.

Fifteen Years Ago

At a shoot at Deniliquin, N.S.W., the Victorian shooter, "Dubbs" (the late Vic. Fankhauser) was the outstanding performer, winning the Riverina Single-barrel Championship 19/20 from "Duxbac" (H. G. James) 22/25 and Leo Ridge (Deniliquin) 20/25. The former A.C.T.A. President, John Houston, of Hay, won a 15 birder with the only possible, winning clearly from Mervyn Webb of Leeton (N.S.W.); "Duxbac", Ron Gow of Griffith, and the late Tom Connor of Coburg, each carded 14/15.

The Western District of Victoria Single-barrel Championship, at Colac (V.), was won by the late Cliff Bound 19/20. It was his first championship win.

Fred Skate won a major event at the Australian Gun Club at East Burwood, shooting 17/17. Shooting from the tower at Coburg Club, J. M. Tyquin, now President of the A.C.T.A., but then of Hobart, won the tower contest 27/30 from Fred Burns 26/30, and Frank Brown 25/30. The 14-yarder trophy in this event went to Darcy Watson, now President of the Hamilton Gun Club in western Victoria.

Ten Years Ago

T. A. Cherry, one-time Secretary of the Alexandra Club (V.) won the club's 1953 single-barrel championship from Fred Skate and Jim McArthur. Cherry, who was a most efficient secretary, later dropped out of the sport when transferred to another area in his work with the Department of Education.

Gordon Bailey, former treasurer of the South Coast Club (Q.) returned the only possible in an event for which he had entered "for practice only" and, of course, could not gain any attached prizes. Bailey, a bank manager at Southport, was later transferred to the Brisbane area in his official duties.

The 1953 club single-barrel championship of the Royal Aero Club at Bankstown went to the veteran Luke P. Hughes, 22/25.

At Gammain (N.S.W.) the local club staged a handicap event, the two main prizes of which was cut by the Narrandera shooters, K. Powell and J. Scott.

The Herbert River D.B. Championship went to C. Archer, with the Burdekin Club Secretary, Len Ashworth, in second placing.

Keilor Club conducted the Keilor Plains D.B. title, and this was won by A. C. Tie, with the only possible, from Merv. Landers.

At Mount Barker in South Australia the local club's single-barrel title was won by A. W. (Jim) Forbes with a possible score. Forbes is well known on Victorian shooting tracks. Spencer Colliver won the Western Australian State Walk-up Championship shot on the Perth Club grounds in 1953. His brother Harold was runner-up, with Ron Fisher third.

Harold Colliver won the W.A. State Mixed Birds from T. Blakely and Eddie Metcalf.

Well - known metropolitan (Melbourne) trapshot Jock Stevens was high-gun in teams' match, Coburg v. Australian Clubs, at East Burwood. Stevens, who is reported "to have been showing steady progress", dropped his final target, although it was heavily dusted.



MEN BEHIND THE GUNS

W. W. GREENER (1834-1921) By Richard Arnold ("Shooting Times", Eng.)

The word "Greener" is practically synonymous with "sporting gun", and not without justification, for the name holds an honoured place in the story of gun-making. W. W. Greener was born in 1834 at Newcastle-on-Tyne, the son of William Greener, the famous gunsmith, formerly of Newcastle and later of Birmingham.

It is commonly supposed that the greatest handicap anyone can have is to have a famous father, but this does not seem to have operated in the case of the Greener family. In 1861 W. W. Greener visited the Exhibition at Paris and, as a result of what he saw, concentrated his work on the development of the breech-loading gun. W. Greener, his father, in spite of his very important contributions to the gun industry, was very much on the side of the muzzle-loaders and refused to recognise any advantages in the new-fangled breech-loader over the earlier arm.

In 1864 W. W. Greener produced an under-lever pin-fire half-cocker sporting gun, his first patent. He soon became famous as invention and improvement followed each other in constant flow from his fertile mind.

In 1871 he wrote "The Modern Breech Loader", which was followed ten years later by the magnificent "The Gun and its Development", and a smaller work in 1888, "Modern Shotguns".

Greener and Choke

Just exactly what was Greener's greatest contribution to the sporting gun is hard to define. Some insist that the introduction of his treble wedge-fast cross bolt was the most important; others suggest that his introduction of choke boring takes this place. The introduction of the choke, so common today, has aroused acrimonious discussion throughout the sporting world. It is claimed that the Americans introduced it, Fred Kimble being given the credit. Others suggest that Pape, of Newcastle-on-Tyne, was the inventor. Other authorities are of the opinion that early Continental gunsmiths originated the practice. But let us quote Greener's own words on the subject:

"What the breech-loader has done to increase the rapidity of firing, the choke-bore has done to increase the range and efficiency of the weapon," he wrote in January, 1888. "Many countries have laid claim to the invention of choke-boring; it is still a vexed question; and whether the honour belongs to the Americans, to Pape of Newcastle, to the French or to the Spanish gun-makers of mediaeval times, all the author wishes to say is that, so far as he is concerned, the invention is his own. The form of choke produced, and which has been generally accepted, and the method of producing it, are both of his invention, and for it he is not indebted to the Americans, to other gun-makers, nor to books ancient or modern."

In 1873 Greener introduced the treble wedge-fast gun, and this was recognised immediately to be a great improvement on the flimsy snapaction breech-loaders. The treble wedge-fast cross bolt form of breech-fastening is today known as the Greener cross bolt, and this term is used throughout the world, in all countries, to denote this mechanism.

Hammerless guns received Greener's attention, as also ejectors. He was untiring in his testing and double testing of all his products, and his "Facile Princeps" hammerless guns soon became famous.

Unfortunately, Mr. W. W. Greener suffered from defective eyesight, a great handicap to the gun-maker, as can readily be appreciated, but he never let his handicap interfere in

any way with his work.

Aged 86, W. W. Greener died at Erdington in 1921, leaving a son, Charles Edward Greener (who was chairman of the Guardians of the Birmingham Proof House from 1938 to 1945), and two grandsons, Humphrey Greener and Leyton Greener, to carry on that fine tradition, started by his father, who founded the firm in 1829. Today, Greeners carry on that fine tradition, catering for all shooting men, making fine arms ranging from the Martini Action G.P. single-barrel shotgun, with its detachable choke, to the finest quality sporting arms.

Surely your Executive Committee is not serious in proposing to move all shooters in a yard on their handicaps at the end of the year, as stated in the August "News".

Coming at a time when complaints of under-handicapping can be heard when any group of enthusiasts get together, the whole suggestion is ludicrous.

Is the committee so blind that they cannot see what will happen to the group comprising 90% of registered shooters, namely those on 18 yards and less, when the 19 yarders move into Intermediate Championships, particularly when there are already too many "playing possum" on 18 yards and taking more than their fair share of this type of event?

Analysing your Executive Committee, with the one exception, all are back markers, some well back, so could it possibly be that from their exalted plane, they are out of touch with the rank and file?

For the good of the sport, drop this proposal and substitute instead a penalty of a yard for winning an Intermediate Championship regardless of the mark from which it is
