





The Editor's Notebook



SEASONAL GREETINGS. As the festive season approaches, the President and Executive Committee of the A.C.T.A. extend warm Seasonal Greetings for all registered shooters and affiliated clubs and also the hope that the 1964 shooting season will prove to be best ever experienced.

SEASONAL ADVICE. "Accidents will happen", is perhaps the most dangerous cliche ever originated. Everyone who shoots should resolve that they will not be so misguided as to consider the accident as an inevitable hazard of shooting sport.

It will be found that the failure of the gun or cartridges are very seldom the cause of accidents. Almost invariably the blame rests entirely on the man behind the gun; even though there is sometimes contributory negligence on the part of the victim, ultimately responsible is the man who fires the shot. Most know that lack of strict supervision and that lack of strict supervision and discipline in the early formative years is the chief cause of most shooting accidents. To those who were brought up in the older school, with observant parents and reliable instructors, safe gun - handling became second the second s nature. But the tyro of today, denied for the most part these opportunities, must to a great extent be his own teacher (if he is not a member of a gun club) of a subject in which he can afford to make no mistakes. Chiefly the young gunner has to remember at all times that the shotgun is a highly lethal weapon which should be pointed only at something

he wishes to destroy, be it a clay target or game in the field. If the young shooter will only do this, he will be more than half-way to becoming a safe shot. Most shooting accidents are the result of gross and accidents are the result of gross and inexcusable carelessness, caused often by forgetfulness and over-eagerness. To the experienced shooter it is almost impossible to understand how anyone can fail to know whether a gun is loaded or not, yet this is the frequent excuse when a tragedy hanners. There is only one safe way happens. There is only one safe way to determine whether a weapon is loaded, and that is to inspect the chambers — often. No one can fail to do this if he remembers the simple safety rules which are repeated on the eve of the holiday season. Chiefly these safety rules are, "Never pick up a gun without opening the breech; never hand to another or accept from him an 'unbroken' gun; never take a gun indoors without first having removed the cartridges; never forget to unload at the end of a shoot in the field or on the track."

With the holiday season coming up, shooters should remember the foregoing safety rules along with others which have been mentioned in this column from time to time.

A POINTS SCORING QUERY. Recently at a northern club an official referee had to give a decision which many thought was incorrect. The basis of the query was that a shooter shooting under double-barrel points scoring (3 and 2) (using an Eastern-made gun), had a misfire on his first

barrel. Without calling for the referee the shooter broke the target with his second barrel. The referee gave him two points. Many contended this was unfair to the shooter. But the point seemingly overlooked, apparently, by many is that the shooter should have not fired his second barrel. He should have raised his gun (still facing the trap) and called for referee inspection immediately his gun misfired on the first barrel as per Rule 42, which reads, "A competitor having a misfire or apparent misfire will, forthwith, call the referee for his decision, otherwise the referee shall declare it a lost target. The competitor must not turn round, must not open his gun, and must keep his gun pointing in the direction of the traps." It is reported that a somewhat similar incident took place in the same area, but not at the same club previously, when a shooter pulled his first trigger (he was using a hammer side-by-side gun) and a misfire occurred, the shooter then pulled his second trigger and missed the target; he thereupon claimed that he was entitled to his first barrel over again. It is pointed out that the shooter forfeited his right to another target when he pulled his second barrel—again the Rule should be remembered.

1964 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP ALLOCATION. Clubs and all interested are advised that the official 1964 Allocation for open champion-ships (Commonwealth, State and Dis-trict), as approved by the Executive Committee, appears in another section of this issue of "News". Club officials are reminded that the official allocation as published is final and no additional infimation will be posted to clubs. All are therefore requested to note and accept the printed allocation as correct.

DUTIES OF OFFICIAL REFER-EES. A shooter recently wrote to the A.C.T.A. asking if an official referee at a shoot, but not actually refereeing a squad, has any authority to remind a shooter that he is breaking rules, say, for example, not removing both shells before moving from No. 5 track to No. 1 track. Once a shooter has acquired Official Referee status.

he should do his utmost to ensure that the A.C.T.A. Rules are being observed at all times. It may be that discreet handling of breaches of the Rules should be paramount, but nevertheless it is an Official Referee's duty to notice breaches of the Rules. to bring such breaches under the notice of the Official Referee in charge of the shoot and, failing him, to bring the matter under the notice of the club management.

1963 INTERSTATE TEAMS' MATCH RESULT. The New South Wales has been successful in winning the 1963 Interstate Teams' Match with the remarkable score of 498/500 for ten men. As is well known, match conditions are 15 men a side from each State in the Commonwealth, each man shooting at 50 targets (double - barrel, both barrels equal value) from the International mark of 16 yards. Only the best ten scores are counted, remainder are counted out. No fewer than eight members of the winning team registered the full score of 50/50, the remaining two members shot 49/50. This is a record score and the team is to be congratulated on a magnificent performance. It is pointed out that three of those counted out also scored 49/50, but the two included in the "scores to count" had better finishes. Queensland was second 493/ 500, then Victoria 490/500, Tasmania 488/500, South Australia 487/500, and Western Australia 485/500.

The winning combination are reported to have shot in heavy conditions, with a slight drizzle prevailing. The winning team also shot over "Damo" traps.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEET-ING. The A.C.T.A. Executive Committee met in Melbourne over the dates October 31 and November 1, 1963. Many items of interest to clubs and shooters generally were discussed and directions issued.

Interstate Teams Match. Congratulations were extended to New South Wales on winning the annual Inter-state Teams' Match 1963 for the "Great Britain & Ireland" Trophy. Match conditions for this event are 50 targets per man from 16 yards.

double-barrel, teams of 15, with the best 10 scores to count. The New South Wales top ten registered the record score of 498/500 (scores to count). The winning team shot at Hawkesbury and gained the abnormally high score in misty rain conditions. Queensland was second 493/500, and Victoria third 490/500. Full scores are as published elsewhere in this issue.

Handicapping. The Executive Committee has confirmed that all shooters will be brought forward 1 yard on January 1, 1964 (and similarly each year in future). However, this concession will only become available on payment of the annual registration fee of 30/-. Shooters who fail to pay the 30/- within the regulation period for payment will not be eligible to come forward until their fee is paid and 1964 card issued.

The Official Handicapping Formula has been reviewed. The Committee has decided to dispense with all penalties for break runs as from 1/1/1964. This means that the section of the Formula which referred to handicaps for 50 and 75 or over breaks has been deleted and a shooter may register a break up to any number from any mark and not be penalised. However, the cash winnings section has been slightly altered in that a shooter winning £10 or more in one day becomes liable for penalty according to the Formula. In forward movement the same rules as previously apply, except that fuller details must be supplied regarding shooters who claim to come forward, in that in every instance where a claim for forward movement is made full details of past performances must be supplied to the A.C.T.A. office on the regulation handicap return form. Many clubs have developed the habit of merely writing in and claiming this will not be accepted in future. Similarly, when a handicap return is submitted in future it must reveal, in every case, the amount a shooter has won for the day. If this information is not supplied, the return will be sent back to the club for adjustment and re-submission. The revised Handicapping Formula is published elsewhere in this issue.

1964 A.C.T.A. National Championpionships and International Match. The Committee has decided to change

the date of the A.C.T.A. National Championships and International Match from the previously published April date to the dates, March 5 to March 10, 1964. The Committee took into account the nearness of the Easter vacation and also the New Zealand Championships in reviewing the previous date and agreed that it would be more satisfactory to conduct the series on the date normally set for the tournament when it is shot in the southern States, i.e. to include the Victorian Labour Day holiday, which is usually early in March. The arranged dates will mean that the 1964 annual meeting will be held on Sunday, March 8. Fuller details regarding the meeting will be published in the February edition. The shoot programme is as advertised. In connection with the National Championships series it is advised that T.A.A. (Trans-Australia Airlines) have been appointed booking agents for all accommodation arrangements. Nearly 400 beds have been provisionally booked by T.A.A., and those desirous of securing suitable good-class accommodation are advised to book immediately. In the advertising section of this issue appears a special advertisement by T.A.A. outlining the hotels and motels available all top - class accommodation. It should be carefully noted that intending visitors to Adelaide are requested to submit their accommodational requests to Miss Dorothy Dowling, Travel Adviser, Trans-Australia Airlines, 144 North Terrace, Adelaide, S.A., not later than January 31, 1964. It is absolutely necessary to make January 31 the dead-line because of the special occasion, due to the visit to Adelaide of the Queen Mother and also the world-renowned Festival of Arts. The Queen Mother will be in Adelaide during the period of the National Championships and the Festival of Arts will be in progress also throughout the period of the big shooting contests. Those wishing to make use of the T.A.A. Travel Advisory Service, both regarding accommodation and flight booking, should use the perforated appli-cation page in the advertising section.

Armourer's Tent at National Championships. South Australian Sportsgoods Distributors have been appointed official Ground Gunsmith and Armourer's Tent supervisors during the National Championships. The appointment is an exclusive one and no other gunsmith is permitted to operate on the ground during the holding of the tournament.

Life Registered Shooters. Some months ago the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee instructed that all life registered shooters would be required to pay £1 for "News" annually. All those concerned were informed of this direction and many responded. However, quite a number failed to remit the amount stated, and it is advised that these have now been struck off the mailing list of "News" as from the current issue.

New Rules. The following A.C.T.A. Shooting Rules have been amended, and those interested should accept the new Rules as appended as official:

Rule 73 should now read, "Wherever squad system of shooting shall apply, squads of 5 or 6 shooters, No. 1 shooter in each squad shall always start the shooting. The club, at its discretion, may require shooters to change starting lanes on each trap as follows: No. 1 shooter shall commence from No. 1 Lane on Trap No. 1, No. 2 Lane on Trap No. 2, No. 3 Lane on Trap No. 3, and so forth over all the traps, preserving the continuity of lane changing on each visit to the traps. This shall apply in double-rise also."

Rule 74 should now read, "All ties shall be shot off squad system first miss-out. The club, at its discretion, may require the shoot-off to be run over the same number of traps and in the same manner in which the event was shot. Shooters shall be squadded in the same order of priority in which they qualified. Shooters are to be re-squadded at the start of each run over the traps. This Rule shall apply in double-rise also."

New Rule, Rule No. 101. "Clubs running the event have the right to

New Rule, Rule No. 101. "Clubs running the event have the right to divide the number of targets by the number of traps available, shooting 6, 7 or 8 targets per visit per trap. The club, at its discretion, may require lane changing as per Rule No. 73. Illustration: 15 targets, two traps, one visit. No. 1 shooter shoots 8 targets on trap No. 1, finishing on Lane 3. No. 1 shooter then starts on No. 4 Lane on Trap No. 2, and shoots 7 targets, finishing on Lane No. 5.

Illustration No. 2: 30 targets, 5 traps, 6 targets per trap per visit. Clubs must preserve equality by lane changing between traps as per Rule No. 74."

Car Badges. The special car badge issue has proved a great success. Many repeat orders have been received. These will be executed as soon as fresh supplies are available. The badges are sold by the A.C.T.A. at 25/- each, including postage and bolts and screws for affixing to cars.

NOMINATIONS FOR OFFICES IN ASSOCIATION. Clubs are again reminded that nominations for all offices in the Association close at 5 p.m. on Tuesday, December 31, 1963, for the 1964 year. Nominations can only be lodged in accordance with Article 27, as outlined in the November issue of "News".

INTERMEDIATE CHAMPION-SHIPS. In future (as from 1/1/64) all Intermediate championships will be restricted to shooters whose handicap does not exceed 16 yards, instead of including all those whose handicap did not exceed 18 yards. All State Intermediate Deauville Doubles championships will be shot from 18 yards as from 1/1/64.

OBITUARY

Just prior to going to press, information was received from Perth, W.A., of the passing of well-known sportsman and champion trapshot, Mr. Spencer Colliver. Mr. Colliver was president of the Perth Gun Club and his able administration will be a great loss to that club and trapshooting in W.A., generally.

He was a most travelled shooter having competed all over W.A. and at many centres in England and abroad. Sincere sympathy is extended to his relatives,

at 7.30 p.m., a 10 birder will commence proceedings, and the fixture will conclude with the shooting of a £140 Handicap at 20 targets. Other events will be included, time permitting. Scientists abroad have discovered that storks can catch fish they cannot see! Two American wood-storks were blindfolded. Electronic instruments were used to time the motions of their beaks and their time of response after touching a fish - this was found to be one fortieth of a second. It was disclosed that the birds were able to catch fish just as fast whether blindfolded or not.

A Townsville report indicates that the duck season in that area, which has just concluded, did not quite live up to expectations. Most shooters got a few, but the majority feel that the actual outing, particularly when the shoot is over, is the real enjoyment. Conditions are reported to be somewhat dry in the Townsville area and some rain would be welcomed, although not much rain is expected at this time of year.

Rabbits were in the news as long as 80 years ago, according to a report published at that period in London. The report states, "The news that

Echuca Gun Club Australian rabbits have been selling at 1/- each in Leadenhall Market has caused an immense number of them to be sent in to the Victorian Agricultural Department for shipment to England. In a few weeks the Department received over 40,000 rabbits for export, but only half of this number have been shipped, the remainder not being considered good enough for the London market."

> Among the rules and regulations issued to shooters taking part in the Grand American Handicap are mentioned some interesting points which could well apply to Australian shooting and Australian shooters. One important instruction reads, "Shooter's responsibility — take your handicap card to the handicapper immediately upon arrival. If you do not have a card, make sure to have one issued to you. Do not attempt to make entries before doing so." "Change of handicap of any shooter may be made at any time before or during the Grand American Tourna-ment." "Should a shooter win or tie

in a class handicap of 200 targets it shall be his duty to report to the handicapper and have his mark changed." A final important instruction is that "No entrance money will be refunded unless shoot is cancelled." The foregoing could have application in Australian shooting competition.

The Queensland club of Kelly's Creek mourns the passing of one of its oldest and respected members in Mr. E. R. (Roley) Peters. Mr. Peters was a one-time President of the club, and although he left the district some years ago, he retained his club membership and Association registration as well as maintaining a keen interest in the sport. The Kelly's Creek will sadly miss his occasional visits to club shoots. The club has decided to perpetuate his memory by introducing the E. R. Peters Memorial Cup, to be shot for annually in connection with the club's single-barrel championship.

Croydon & District Clay Target Club, which shoots on the North Croydon Recreation Reserve, just off the Maroondah Highway in Victoria (north of Melbourne), advertises details of its programmes from December 4 to Saturday, December 21. The Yarra Valley Night Walk-up title is scheduled for Wednesday night, December 4, and this will be followed on Saturday, December 7, with the similar Double-rise Sparrow title. On Wednesday, December 11, the Victorian Night Intermediate S.B. Sparrow title is listed. The following Wednesday night, December 18, the Yarra Valley Night Mixed Birds Championship will be decided. The club's Christmas Shoot has been arranged for Saturday, December 21, when a 20-target double-barrel handicap will be held. Coff's Harbour Gun Club on the New South Wales North Coast will celebrate the grand opening of its new ground with a two-day shoot extending over December 27 and December 28. The new grounds are

spacious and are situated 10 miles north of Coff's Harbour on the Pacific Highway. The club has installed a new Damo electric trap, plus its original automatic trap. The Association President (John M. Tyquin) is expected to attend and officially open the new grounds. The programme for the opening day will be a 10 birder, two 20 birders and the Northern Rivers S.B. title. The final day will provide a similar programme, with the Northern Rivers D.B. title included. The Hav Club in the New South Wales Riverina district will celebrate its Golden Jubilee in 1964. As this is a special occasion, the club intends staging its biggest ever Easter carnival. The series will commence on Easter Saturday, March 28, and conclude on Easter Monday, March 30. The club's three new "Damo" automatic traps will be in operation, and all three have been illuminated for night shooting. The opening day daylight hours will see the staging of the Hay District Golden Jubilee D.B. Championship and a £100 Handicap. At night on the same date the £500 Golden Jubilee Night Handicap will be staged, plus the N.S.W. State Night D.B. title. The winner of the handicap will receive £300, and yardage awards have been arranged for 12/13, 14 and all single yardage back to 24, then 25/27 yards, and each group will be awarded £15 prize money. On Easter Monday, commencing at 9.0 a.m., the Golden Jubilee Easter Gift at 30 targets will be decided. The winner will receive a "Falcon" car, and yardage awards similar to the handicap mentioned above have been included; a total of £325 has been allotted to the yardage section. CASH TROPHY WINS

A win of £10 to £50 or equivalent trophy value in one day 1 yard back.

A win of between £51 and £150 or equivalent trophy value in one day,
2 yards back.

A win in a Handicap of £151 or more or equivalent trophy value in one day 3 yards back.

DIVISIONS

A shooter who obtains three cuts (divisions) to value of £10 or more in one day in sweepstakes or handicaps of ten birds or more on any one programme with a minimum of 10 shooters in each event ... back 1 yard.

(Divisions in "attached" sweep-

stakes not considered.)

INWARD MOVEMENT.

Shooters who compete and shoot right through three full programmes and receive no trophy or cuts may be recommended, by club secretaries only, for inward movement, if proof can be provided that the shooter or shooters are over-handicapped. Recommendations from affiliated club secretaries must be accompanied by fullest details on the official Handicap Return form. Club secretaries cannot recommend inward movement of more than one (1) yard on each recommendation, unless shooter has suffered some physical disability. Recommendations from individuals

Recommendations from individuals or personal requests will not be entertained — by order of the Execu-

tive Committee.

GENERAL.

A shooter winning a Championship from a mark behind his Association Handicap automatically moves back to the mark from which the Championship was won.

Only the Association Handicapper has authority to amend shooters'

Handicap Cards. Cards should be posted direct to the Association for handicap amendment immediately such amendment is recommended (or notification appears in "News"), together with Handicap Return form, clearly outlining the reason for the amendment of Handicap.

Club managements have the right to re-handicap any obviously under-handicapped shooter immediately, providing the Association is notified within two days and the reason given on a Handicap Return form. If these details are not completed, such handicap movement cannot be ratified.

Clubs when registering a shooter for the first time must clearly indicate whether the shooter is a complete novice gun handler, or has had field or other experience, before a 12-yard mark can be approved. Failure to provide this information will result in the shooter being placed on 16 yards.

Once a 12-yard shooter secures a trophy or division, he is no longer regarded as a novice gun handler, and is moved to 13 yards forthwith. For a subsequent win or division, immediate movement to 14, 15 and 16 yards.

Once a shooter has attained the handicap of 16 yards he cannot be moved in front of that mark except during annual re-adjustment.

The management of a club must immediately re-handicap each and every shooter who, for any of the reasons prescribed in the A.C.T.A. Handicapping Formula, qualifies for backward movement of his handicap. Such adjustments are to strictly comply with the Formula. No shooter is to be permitted to compete in another event should he refuse to accept his new mark. Handicap cards and all relevant details concerning on-the-spot adjustments are to be forwarded, within two (2) days, to the Official Handicapper at the A.C.T.A. office for ratification.

Club managements will NOT alter a shooter's card.

OUT OF THE PAST Twenty Five Years Ago

this period 25 years ago regarding the "cruelty of shooting clay birds". Such was the ignorance of a large proportion of the population that many were not aware that a "clay bird" was not actually a bird at all, but a small sphere of clay material which was spun into the air and shot at. In fact, the writer recalls one radio personality of the day stating, in reply to a written question, that "a clay bird is a bird obtained in the bush and then tied to a post and shot at".

Shooting at Griffith (N.S.W.), Mervvn Webb of Leeton won the 1938

A controversy was raging about Riverina Double-barrel Championship. He defeated the now veteran shooter. E. E. Albert of Barellan, for the title after both had grassed the full complement of 20 straight.

> At the old Victorian Clay Target Club at East Bentleigh "Duxbac" (H. G. James) won the I.C.I. trophy for the year, out-staying P. Hoffman and Perc. Dennis. The late Harry Gullifer won a five birder on the 17th round after 12 possibles had been recorded. In a teams match on the same ground, Korumburra defeated the Victorian C.T.C. by two targets. There is now no club at Korumburra.

Fifteen Years Ago

The Riverina title of 1948 was won by "Pampas" (Bert Haynes) of Northcote. The event was the main attraction on the opening day of the now defunct Jerilderie Gun Club in the Southern Riverina. Strangely, the event, although run under the direction of the Jerilderie Club, was actually held at Finley, many miles distant. Apparently some local arrangement was made which had official approval for the change of venue. Frank Brown of Dandenong

defeated a record field in the Australian Club's main event at East Burwood — he defeated no less than 99 others!

The Commonwealth Skeet Championship of 1938 was won by Fred Burns 25/31. The event was shot by the Footscray Club.

At Camberwell E. Brenk won a main event 60/60 points from "Stevo" 57/60 points. F. E. Brown was third, 28/30 points.

Ten Years Ago

Black was prominent in a local shoot, winning three events and being placed in others.

The Kyabram Club in northern Victoria (now defunct) had its opening day late in 1953. Arthur Crow, a one-time member of the Committee of the Australian Gun Club, was Secretary at Kyabram. Jock Wilson, the former A.C.T.A. President, performed the official opening ceremony, and, with due acumen, grassed the first official target released. Bill Carrington won the 1953 Championship of the Charters Towers Club (Qld.) after a spirited tie shoot which extended over three additional rounds of five when the winner and W. a tie shoot with four other pairs.

At Collarenebri (N.S.W.) K. R. Hughes (now of St. George) engaged in a long shoot-off before being separated.

> At Coff's Harbour in New South Wales, gun club members staged an attack on a "fox camp" a few miles from the town. Local farmers supplied the ammunition, and it was estimated that fox casualties amounted to at least 1.500 dead and wounded.

> A special handicap event at Holbrook (N.S.W.) was won by the Yerong Creek shooter, R. Condon.

> The Deauville Doubles Championship of the Narromine Club (N.S.W.) in 1953 was won by the Tullibigeal shooters, D. Sim and W. Cross, after

I was amazed to read in the November issue of "News" — (quote) — "Official Referees frequently declining to assist in the refereeing duties at clubs where they attend shoots" (end

There's no doubt in my mind that there must be reasons operating at this particular club why this should

I can only state that I personally have attended shoots between Cairns and Melbourne over the years and am yet to ever hear or see such a state of affairs in operation - even

I also feel certain that I could nominate lots of clubs and hundreds of shooters who would back my statement to the limit.

At the clubs I have visited, the reverse appears to apply and in most cases there is an "overdose" of volunteers willing to act, at the merest request.

It is embarrassing at times when two, three and sometimes four offer their services, all at once.

Maybe we could hear the other side of this story as to what are the factors contributing to this very unusual state of affairs at this particular club.

Let's be fair to all concerned! My personal opinion is simply this: not only official referees, but all honorary officials - yes, the paid ones, too are doing a good job generally to help a well-organised, healthy sport, and an instance such as this is a truly isolated case, with some obvious reason justifying it.

I would take some convincing that this is a common occurrence at clubs. and if we establish this fact, I would suggest that the club concerned might investigate their private affairs, in their own interests.

I cannot resist challenging statements such as these when I feel they are the exception rather than the rule. Good shooting,

Dear Mr. McCullough,

I was much interested in your two writings re Mr. W. P. Grosvenor and Mr. Fred Rimble, the inventor of the choke; both these gentlemen I know very well. I shot against Mr. W. P. Grosvenor at several of the London gun clubs; he was a fairly good shot, but his wife was far better; she held the British Championship on several occasions. I remember Mr. Grosvenor remarking to me during a break how he loved the clay target shooting and he would like to shoot all the time but he added, "I just can't afford it." He, like a lot more of us, was not over-burdened with this world's

Now, re Mr. Fred Rimble, he, I do believe, was the real inventor of the choke. I met him on many occasions during my Hollywood career at the various gun clubs. He did not shoot. as he was an old man then, well into his 70's, and he died, I believe, in 1924. He was in his early days a punt gunner; he used to shoot duck and geese for the market, using a 4-bore punt gun on the vast American lakes. He was also in his day a topnotch shot at pigeons and clays - ĥe told us very often, at the different gun clubs, how he really was the first man to introduce the choke. He thought out the idea of constricting the last two inches of his gun barrel, and he sent a couple of guns to Greener to see if they could be tightened at the muzzle — thus giving Greener's the idea of the choke as we know it today.

I know there has, and always will be, a lot of controversy re the choke, but myself I firmly believe that Fred Rimble of Los Angeles (Calif.) was the man that really brought the choke into being.

EXTRACTS FROM THE WRITINGS OF THE LATE W. P. GROSVENOR

(As written to A.C.T.A. Secretary many years ago)

What is known as coot shoots are very popular here on the Norfolk Broads. Some 600 acres of sheet water is covered and the coot may number from 2,000 to 3,000. Practically every gunner has some 200 cartridges with him, and loading and firing at top speed, it sounds like a battlefield. The bag generally amounts (that is the pick-ups) to anything from 900 to 1,400. If you were to ask each shooter just how many he claimed to have shot and then added the scores up it would appear that the bag should be 50% more than it really comes to. In the press and excitement it is not easy to be sure that every bird thought to have been dropped really had been. Coot shooting is not easy. I have seen men with great reputations come utterly unstuck and on several occasions give up shooting themselves and watch the others.

Getting back to clay target shooting, I have found that there are certain days when the targets look as big as a house, and then you shoot tophole. Come another day and you shoot badly (for you), and I think this is when one's brain is sluggish. Have noticed this time and again with my own shooting at targets.

What a lovely gun a 20 bore is in the hands of an expert shot. There used to be a saying here, "Only a good shot or a damned fool shoots with a 20 bore gun." Well, I've tried to shoot one a good many times, but

I am not of that calibre of a gunner to justify my doing so. Only on very few occasions have I been successful.

Talking of friends long since passed on, I remember one individual who had a most weird and amazing trick. When telling of some shot he had pulled off and he considered worthy of mention, he always used to illustrate it as though he was shooting with a bow and arrow. He would hold out a stiff arm and draw back his right hand right up to his cheek and hold his fingers in the correct way of holding and loosing off an arrow. This was purely an instinctive movement and without doubt (in my mind) to have been something handed down to him from a generation long vanished. Incidentally, when describing the shot he generally said, "I loosed off at it"; it was really quite weird.

My wife's gun is a Bradall of Belfast - the "Purdey" of Ireland, as he was called. If you can draw invidious comparisons between Damascus and steel barrels, I think that the former "whip" a shade more than the latter and are inclined to throw the charge a trifle lower. As against this, I think the "ring" of the explosion of a cartridge in Damascus barrels is far less sharp than in steel, or, anyway, I used to think that I detected it. Not such a great point, some would say, but is quite an asset when one may fire up to 250 shells at a big meeting, and that is, if at all subject to headache.






