



## The Editor's Notebook



A.C.T.A. NATIONAL CHAMPION-SHIPS AND INTERNATIONAL MATCH, 1964. Advertising for the A.C.T.A. annual tournament, which includes the National Championships, Grand Australian Handicap, Champion of Champions Cup, International Match and other events has already appeared in the December issue of this publication. However, in view of the importance of the series, it would appear well that a review of the entire programme should be submitted to readers.

At the outset it is advised that trophy value for the series, which has been fixed for March 5 to March 10, 1964, at the South Australian Gun Club's grounds at Bolivar, S.A., has been increased by £150 over the stipulated trophy value awards of 1963. This will mean, of course, better value trophies for the placegetters in all events in which trophies are allotted. Another important innovation is that all major events will be shot at 50 targets each event. Double-rise at 25 pairs. This will also apply in all future series. Shooting will open at 9.0 a.m. each day, and four "Damo" electric traps will be installed to provide the ultimate in uniformity to all competitors.

Proceedings will start for the A.C.T.A. on Thursday, March 5, when the National Double-barrel Championship (50 targets from 16 yards) will be staged. This event will be shot at 25 targets per visit (two visits to the track). Another innovation introduced in the present series is the introduction of multiple targets. In the National double-barrel title shooters will shoot three sixes and one

seven on each visit. In the event of tie shoots, these will be decided squad system miss-out, as was done at the 1963 fixture at Southport (Q.). The winner will receive a trophy valued winner will receive a trophy valued at £45 (previously 35 guineas), second trophy valued £25, and third trophy valued at £20. Fourth place-getter will receive £15, after which £5 each will be awarded down to and including the state of the ing 15th place. In addition special awards of £5 each will be made to best 12/16, 17, 18, 19 and 20 yards and over shooters, not winning any other award. The best lady performer in the event will also receive £5 (providing she does not win any other award). £5 each will also be awarded to Interstate competitors (not winning any other award) from the States of Victoria, New South Wales, Queensland, Tasmania and Western Australia, providing there are three or more entrants from the States mentioned - not winning any other award. Optional sweepstakes of 10/overall and 10/- over each 25 targets will be conducted in conjunction. The sweepstakes will be allocated 60%, 30% and 10%, without any deduction whatsoever. Intending competitors are reminded that no entries will be accepted later than one hour after the appointed time of starting.

The A.C.T.A. Intermediate Championship will be shot in conjunction with the National double-barrel title and over the same number of targets. This event is restricted to shooters whose A.C.T.A. handicap does not exceed 16 yards on March 5, 1964. An optional sweepstake of 10/- will be held in connection with the event. The trophy for the winner will be

valued at £20 (previously £15), second £15 (trophy), third trophy valued at £10, whilst fourth will receive £5 and fifth £5. Two tie shoots will be held if required to decide the two events.

The National single-barrel title is listed for the second day, Friday, March 6, over the same number of targets and conditions (except for the fact that only one shell must be in the gun during the event) as for the National double-barrel title. Time permitting, a £100 Handicap will follow.

The third day has been set aside for the disposal of the Australia-New Zealand Trophy contest. This event will be under points scoring 3 and 2. Targets, prize list and other conditions remain the same as for the National Double and Single-barrel Championships. The National double-rise title will complete the programme for the day. This will be shot at 25 pairs (previously 20 pairs) and conditions and prize list will be identical with those of the earlier major events.

The fourth day, Monday, June 9 (which is Labour Day holiday in Victoria), will see the staging of the Eighteenth International Match for teams of 30 men aside, points scoring. The competing teams are expected to be England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales, New Zealand, South Africa, Central Africa, Canada and Australia. The coveted Mackintosh International Trophy will be held by the winning country until the next International match. The Australian Team will be automatically selected from the 30 highest aggregate scorers in the Australian National Double-barrel Championship, Australian National Single-barrel Championship and the Aus-tralia - New Zealand Trophy event. The first two events are (as already mentioned) "kills" to count, and the last-named event is under points scoring. The International Match will be shot over four traps, 25 targets per visit. This will be followed by the Fifteenth Grand Australia Handicap of £550, shot at 50 targets from A.C.T.A. handicaps. The winner will receive £150, second £100, third £50, and eight yardage awards of £25 each will be made for the best 12/13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20/21, 22/24 and 25/27 yarders not winning any other prize. The winner will receive a trophy valued at £50, second £20, third trophy value £15, fourth will receive £10, and fifth £5. The best 12/16 yarder not winning any other award will receive £5.

James), who originated the famed Champion of Champions Cup away back in 1937.

Intending competitors are again reminded to arrange their accommodational bookings with the minimum of delay, chiefly for the reason that during the period of the shoot H.M. The Queen Mother will be in Adelaide and the famous Festival of Arts will be in progress — both these momentous events are likely to attract an unusually large number of visitors to the South Australian capital

BREAK BADGES. Some clubs are apparently still uncertain as to whether they can claim break recognition when a shooter has taken part in a double-rise contest or similar novelty events. All are informed that breaks are only recognised when compiled under double and single-barrel conditions. If a shooter takes part in any other type of competition his break ends immediately he does so.

## EXTRACTS FROM THE WRITINGS OF THE LATE W. P. GROSVENOR

(As written to A.C.T.A. Secretary in mid-1940's)

Mention of shooting happenings. How easy it is to remember the little things that please one. In reverse, one is prone to forget such an instance as when, thanks to an attack of "flinching", I missed the whole ten targets in an event. I lost my temper and nearly smashed the gun over the club railings as I left the line. Childish indeed, but better men than I have done the like - that is as far as missing goes.

When a team is picked for Olympic shooting, points to remember are, ensure that your men are well picked. Then allow them to practise at full blast. Remember well my advice as to mixing squads so as to get them accustomed to shooting with various individuals, many with varying styles. It is most heartening to have a pai on each side of you when on the shooting line and generally worth a couple of birds in a hundred, but "you ain't goin' to have this when you are in Olympic competition". This fact cannot be rammed home hard enough. No doubt it is all very obvious and so possibly redundant, but I still emphasise the point.

I think I am the only Englishman who has had much real experience of standing shoulder to shoulder with real 96% men, by which I mean the average taken over at least 1,000

birds, shot at with one barrel only and with 14 ozs. of shot. Indeed, many of these men have averaged not far short of 98% over several thousand targets, such as Troeh, Arie and Wright in the 1920 Olympic U.S.A. team and the rest of them were not far short of this wonderful average.

I remember once, shooting on the New York Athletic ground and on a very difficult day. Next to me in my squad was a real clay target shooter, and in spite of my being one who was quite a consistent shot, all I could do was to hammer out an 85/100 in the morning and 86/100 in the afternoon - and think myself lucky I hadn't done worse. A slowish shot like myself (by American standards) was getting birds that were soaring, dipping, jumping like demented butter-flies in a gale, but at the speed he was shooting them, the devastating effects of the wind hadn't time to take effect.

One phobia that I have is snakes. I just hate them. The second time I went to the U.S.A. I wandered about a part one day that I afterwards learned had quite a lot of rattlers about, but not knowing and not seeing any, I really wasn't worried.


With the approach of the opening of the Victorian duck season a reminder or two would seem appropriate. One of the commonest faults with tyro shooters, and many others, is to move too soon in preparation for a shot. It is well to remember, however much that duck may circle round before they decide to settle, they will finally drop in against the wind, and that is the moment to take them - so not until then should a move be made. It usually pays to let the first birds settle, whether on land or water. This has the added advantage of providing the chance to overcome any excitement at their first appearance. The placing of artificial decoys need some thought, otherwise their value may be largely wasted. Sheltered water is necessary, for in rough water these decoys can rock and look unnatural and in consequence do more harm than good. If the decoys can be placed upwind of the shooter's position, about 30 yards in front is best distance, but if placed downwind, 20 yards is quite far enough. In this type of shooting the majority of shots usually do not prove very difficult, but it so happens that one is placed to intercept ducks on their flight lines the shooting could be very much the reverse to easy. Duck in full flight, and perhaps coming downwind in the half-light of dawn or dusk, can prove a severe test for the best of shots.

Pleased to receive a note from London recently from Wing Commander Roy Ayre, who is well known on Victorian tracks and also in the Sydney and Newcastle areas. He forwarded a cutting from an English publication (under date of 5/11/63) which he considers "should confuse the local amateurs and conservators simultaneously". To attain the highest degree of skill of which one is capable needs endless practice at moving targets, and that is exactly what clay target shooting provides. However, lack of opportunity rather than lack of keenness is sometimes the limiting factor ness is sometimes the imiting factor of many who take up shooting. Clay target shooting will always bridge the gap when insufficient game is available in the field. Any argument that clay shooting is decelerating as a prelude to game shooting is fallacious. Any practice at moving targets is valuable. Not all game that is shot is accelerating. Some birds, such as duck, coming in to feed or to roost, have the brakes on and are, therefore, decelerating.

## **OUT OF THE PAST**

### Twenty Five Years Ago

Clay pigeon shooting (or clay target shooting, as it is now known) was booming late in 1938 and early

Of interest at that period was an announcement by the Cunnamulla Gun Club regarding its "first championship meeting". Club Secretary was then W. A. Scheiwe, and G. H. Bignell was club President.

Des. O'Callaghan (whose picture appears in another section of this issue) was under notice and was then described as a "first-year shooter", when he won a 15-guinea canteen of cutlery. Later in 1939/40 O'Callaghan joined the Armed Forces and rose to the rank of Staff Colonel, engaging in saverel years of active services. in several years of active service abroad.

The Launceston shooter (now a member of the Executive Committee) Bill Rainbird gained a resounding victory in the Seymour Club's Centenary Championship. More than 40 shooters competed in this event. Rainbird also won the special White Horse Trophy for the best break of the day. The reports of the day state that "Rainbird had a great fight to save his final bird. The disc swept to the left like a meteor and, aided by a following wind, kept flat. Rainbird led it like a flash and, amid great applause, just clipped a piece from the outside saucer before it dropped beyond range". (Some description!)

The Dandenong Returned Soldiers' Gun Club, which burst on to the shooting scene and then folded up fairly quickly, held its opening shoot about this period. "Duxbac" (H. G. James), George Daniels of Narre Warren, Reg Oakley and others not now seen on the shooting tracks, were among the winners.

### Fifteen Years Ago

The Eltham Club, on the outskirts of Melbourne, is another organization which only enjoyed a fleeting period of activity. The club opened at its then splendidly appointed grounds at Research in January, 1949. Main event winner on opening day was E. A. Borley from Bill Scott and A. H. Brenk. Ben Taylor, the club Secretary, won the front - marker award.

Fred Burns won the Victorian Skeet Championship, decided on the grounds of the Coburg Club. Burns scored 18/21, under the skeet conditions then prevailing.

C. S. Bromfield won the Mackintosh Cup at a Camberwell fixture, shooting the possible, defeating the late Lionel Byrne and E. G. Biggs. Bromfield does not shoot today.

### Ten Years Ago

At Holbrook, N.S.W., just beyond Albury, the Holbrook District Double-Aftery, the Holorook District Double-barrel Championship was won by the Mangoplah shooter, Les Stoll, who recorded the only 20/20. An outbreak of bushfire in the Holbrook district seriously interrupted the programme. About 20 shooters took off the fire area and did not return until the blaze was well under control. As a result the day's programme was not completed. However, the committee reported a "satisfactory day".

JANUARY - FEBRUARY, 1964

At Surat in Queensland the Ambulance President's Trophy attracted a good muster of shooters, and the winner turned up in K. Davidson, who outstayed Tom Hegarty in a spirited tie shoot which went to the 90th round. Hegarty is now a resident of the Brewarrina district, N.S.W.

The Rainbow Club in the Victorian Wimmera reported its most successful shoot on New Year's Day, 1954, (Continued on page 76)

### OBITUARY

- Mr. J. O. (Ollie) COX -

Profound regret is expressed at the sudden passing in Sydney on Saturday, January 11, 1964, of Mr. J. O. (Ollie) Cox, President and founder of the Mangoplah Gun Club in the southern Riverina area of New South Wales.

Mr. Cox, in keeping with his renowned interest in all types of sport, was in Sydney attending the Third Cricket Test Match against South Africa at the Sydney Cricket Ground, when he collapsed in the street. As he was apparently carrying little identification matter with him, it was well into the night before positive identification could be established, and it was into the early hours of the following morning before information finally reached his relatives in Mangoplah.

The sport of clay target shooting has lost a bulwark in Ollie Cox and one whose replacement would appear to be an impossibility.

From his earliest connection with the sport Ollie Cox's name hecame identified with clay target shooting in all its phases. He was for many years a member of the Executive Committee and frequently drove or flew down from his station property at Mangoplah, just outside Wagga, to attend Executive Committee meetingsalways at his own expense. His wise counsel was of great value to the Association, particularly in the formative years of the organization and the difficult immediate post-war years and to shooters generally.

It is of interest to recall that it was Ollie Cox (nearly 20 years ago), at an Executive Committee meeting, who moved that the Association institute the production of a "bulletin" — which has since grown into the considerably sought after publication that "News" is today.

The memory of Ollie Cox can never be obliterated from the minds of those who were privileged to have known him. Some years ago, at a shoot at Griffith (N.S.W.), a party of Mangoplah shooters were in attendance, having flown over by chartered plane from Wagga. As the party was hurrying off by car in the gradually failing light to pick up their plane, a noted shooter of the day remarked, "There goes one of the greatest sportsmen I have known," and this statement surely summed up the character of the late Ollie Cox. His wide sporting activities included a considerable interest in horse racing, both as an administrator and owner of several good horses. One successful onslaught he made in Melbourne some years ago was with a horse named Taranta Ra — this gelding won two races against good-class company at Flemington. He was for many years President of the N.S.W. Southern District Racing Association.

The funeral took place at Wagga on Wednesday, January 15, and was very largely attended. The A.C.T.A. was officially represented by Executive Committee member, Mr. Keith Oldfield of Cootamundra, N.S.W.

Sincerest sympathy and regret is extended by all connected with the A.C.T.A. to his widow, son John ("Johnno") and daughter Meg.

Dear Bill.

As you know, during the past four years I have made many representations to the N.S.W. Government and the Police Department in an effort to alter the Police Offences Act 1901 in regard to Sunday shooting.

Over the past six months I have had four interviews and discussions with the Chief Secretary (Mr. Kelly). At my last interview he agreed to alter the Act along the lines submitted by me and stated that he would instruct his staff to prepare legislation to this effect; he further stated that the legislation should be brought down in the February or April sitting of Parliament.

We are very near our objective, and now is the time for all members of the A.C.T.A. in N.S.W. who are interested in the future welfare of their sport to approach their local

Member of Parliament. I feel quite confident that, should enough members do this, then the Act will be altered to allow us to participate legally in our sport. Any shooters who know their local Member of Parliament personally should discuss the matter with him; if not, then write to him and he will submit it to his party leader and thence to the Chief Secretary.

The following is a copy of the Police Offences Act 1901 and the

suggested amendment:-

Section 19.:

Whoever-

is found engaged in shooting at any pigeon match, or for pleasure, sport, or profit, of any kind whatever on Sunday; or,

is found carrying firmearms on

Sunday, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

Provided that-

(a) nothing in this section shall be deemed to extend to travellers bona fide carrying firearms for the protection of the lives and property of themselves or their employers on the public roads, or to constables and other persons carrying firearms for

lawful purposes;
(b) no person shall be prosecuted for an offence under this section unless the prosecution is commenced within ten days after the offence is committed.

Proposed Amendment:-

(c) nothing in this section shall be deemed to extend to registered members of the Australian Clay Target Association who are travelling to, from, or attending a clay target shoot held under the regulations of the abovenamed Australian Clay Target Association.

Some members may wish to alter the proposed amendment in some manner; the above is purely my own personal ideas and may require further alterations.

I would stress that this only applies to clay target shooting and not general bush shooting; Mr. Kelly is very

Being not used to our new guns, to the strange shooting conditions and the other "hokuspokus", we didn't do too well. But we made new friends, had plenty of fun and took part—that's the main thing.
