


AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL CHAM-PIONSHIPS. The 1964 Australian National Championships series was conducted by the A.C.T.A. on the grounds of the South Australian Gun Club, situated in Undo Road (just off Port Wakefield Road) at Bolivar, some 15 miles from Adelaide, over the dates March 5 to March 10.

The series was an outstanding success. Many distinguished visitors attended, including a party of some 12 New Zealand shooters. Among this party was the New Zealand Gun Clubs' Association President, Mr. Tom Glenn, in whose honour the Tom Glenn Cup is shot for between teams representing Australia and New Zealand each year - bi-annually in each country. Weather throughout was excellent and except for a slight frontal wind occasionally, little fault could be found with the conditions.

The South Australian Gun Club officials vigorously co-operated with the A.C.T.A. officials, and a great measure of the success of the first essay of the National Championships in South Australia is undoubtedly due to the work of the S.A.G.C. committee.

Proceedings opened with the National Double - barrel Championship on the morning of March 5. Two hundred and thirty-six nominated in the big event and 56 in the Intermediate title, which was shot in conjunction. (Many of those eligible entered in both events.) Nine possibles were carded. After a spirited tie shoot, victory went to the bril-

liant Tasmanian shooter from Cressy, Jack Blake, who recorded 81/81 to out-stay a newcomer to major title competition in J. Vigar of Wilcannia (N.S.W.), 80/81. Peter Sheridan, the former Victorian now of Robe (S.A.), was third, 69/70. Then followed K. R. Heywood (Narromine, N.S.W.) 65/66, H. Baynes (Mananarie, S.A.) 56/57, D. Kimber (Paradise, S.A.) 56/57, D. Kimber (Paradise, S.A.) 56/57, J. 
The Australian International Team of 1964 did battle in good conditions when shooting resumed on Monday, March 9. As usual, the scores of the team are sealed and forwarded to London for comparison after the other competing teams have shot. The scores are opened during the International Tournament in England, and results are then cabled. It can be stated that the 1964 Australian Team performed very creditably.

Immediately the International Match was concluded, the 15th Grand Australian Handicap of £550 was shot. This event is staged at 50 targets from Association handicaps. Only three shooters were equal to possible scores. They were, H. C. Durbidge (Koroit, V.), former President of the Warmambool Club; Graham Bailey (Perth, W.A.), son of the late member of the Executive

Committee, the late Frank Bailey, and G. D. K. Findlay of Scone N.S.W. The three cut the first, second and third money, taking £123 each. The yardage prizes of £25 each were won: 12/13 yarder, W. Edwards (Q.), 48/50; 14 yarder, div. P. M. Jones (N.Z.), M. Taylor (Perth, W.A.), 44/50; 15 yarder, J. Piccoli (Boort, V.), 48/50; 16 yarder, div. A. Paddy (N.Z.), L. H. Kleinig (S.A.) and W. Rainbird (Tas.), 48/50; 17 yarder, div. R. Anderson (W.A.) and C. Scott (S.A.), 48/50; 18 yarder, D. Gray (Hobart, Tas.), 49/50; 19 yarder, D. Byrne (N.S.W.), 49/50; 20/21 yarder, div. John Doyle (V.), T. Catling (W.A.), 49/50; 22/24 yarder, J. Henwood (V.), 49/50, and 25/27 yarder, R. Mules (Richmond, S.A.), 47/50.

The highly successful shoot concluded on Tuesday, March 10, with the staging of the blue riband event of the series, the Champion of Champions Cup. This famous Cup was presented by the late Mr. Donald Mackintosh away back in 1936 as a stimulus to the sport of clay pigeon shooting (as it was then known), and it was appropriate that the first contest for the Champion of Champions Cup was won by the sportsman who is now proprietor of the late Mr. Mackintosh's business, H. G. (Horrie) James, who has long used the shooting name of "Duxbac". The following year he ran second to the late Lew Bertram, who, incidentally, recorded a break of 77 on the day, and there were many at that time who thought Bertram's break would take "some bettering".

The 1964 Champion of Champions Cup had all the atmosphere of past contests and just on 150 shooters lodged nominations, including the defending champion of champions, Norman Milliken, who is President of the Hay Gun Club. Shot at the regulation 50 targets from 20 yards, the event was a genuine test of ability and skill. Six of the best marksmen in the competition carded possibles, namely, Tim Catling (Katanning, W.A.), K. Sim (Griffith, N.S.W.), F. R. Hudson (Sydney, N.S.W.), H. Constable (Pilliga, N.S.W.) and Jack Headon of Hay. Under the A.C.T.A. tie shoot rules of "first miss-out", the first to drop



out was Constable, who took sixth place, 53/54; Sim took fifth placing, 55/56. Catling followed on the 71st round, gaining fourth placing, 70/71. Hudson, Burgess and Headon then shot on to the 83rd round before Hudson failed and gained third position. Another ten rounds were required before the winner emerged in Jack Headon of Hay, 93/93. Burgess, the runner-up, scored 92/93.

The bi-annual Inter-Dominion contest for the Tom Glenn Cup was a spirited contest. Teams are six men from each Dominion shooting at 20 targets per man from 16 yards, double - barrel, both barrels equal value. The Australian Team comprised Warren Charlton, Doug. Smith, K. R. Heyward, G. T. Wakefield, M. Burgess and Fred Reade. The New Zealanders were R. Brown, J. R. Thompson, W. Pritt, J. R. Russek, E. Jones and H. C. Walker. The New Zealanders, shooting first, dropped two targets over the first ten rounds, whilst the Australians also dropped two. Commencing the second round of 20 targets, the teams were level. On the 16th round one New Zealander failed to cover his target and had the dreaded miss recorded against his name. This left the Australians in the position of having to get the lot to win, which they accomplished amidst great excitement, running out victors 118/120 to New Zealand 116/120. Australia now holds the Glenn Cup and will defend it in 1965 at whatever venue the N.Z.G.C.A. decide to hold the contest.

The New Zealand party was entertained by the A.C.T.A. at a special luncheon during the shoot. The barbecue dinner arranged for the Saturday night (March 7) was substantially initiated to further entertain the New Zealand visitors.

So ended one of the biggest and best shoots ever spensored by the A.C.T.A. The shooting was well organised and the choot staff, under the expert marshalling of Harry Cox, performed magnificently.





It would not seem to be unreasonable to individualise when extending thanks and appreciation and mention the sterling work and efficient organising of the South Australian Gun Club, led by its able shoot committee, comprising Bob Mules (President), Lew Truman, Rolo Treloar, Cal. Hollow and Stan Ridge (Secretary). Special thanks is extended to those mentioned.

To all who assisted in any work, the A.C.T.A. wishes to express most grateful appreciation and thanks.

Very special mention is made of the wonderful support given to the A.C.T.A. by I.C.I.A.N.Z. Ltd. The Company has long supported the A.C.T.A. and has thereby enabled the shoot to be run at such a reasonable cost. Cost of entries is the lowest anywhere in the world, and only by the continued support given by I.C.I.A.N.Z. Ltd. can this happy position be maintained. The Company provides all the clay targets free of charge for the long-standing blue riband event, the Champion of Champions Cup, and also provides free of charge the cartridges and shells used by the Australian Team in every International Match. These donations run into a very handsome sum each year and shooters gain the substantial benefit by being provided with cheap entry fees for major A.C.T.A.

28th ANNUAL MEETING. The 28th Annual General Meeting of member delegates and representatives was held at Tower House, Beaumont, South Australia, on Sunday, March 8, 1964.

Election of Office-bearers. PRESI-DENT, Mr. J. M. Tyquin, was reelected unopposed as President of the A.C.T.A. for the current year. Mr. W. E. H. Rainbird was re-elected unopposed for a further term of two years for the State of Tasmania. Only in the States of Victoria and New South Wales were elections required — that is where nominations exceeded the number of positions. In the State of New South Wales the two retiring members, Messrs. K. S. Soames and F. R. Hudson, were reelected for a further term of two years. Four nominations were received. In Victoria four nominations were also received, and Messrs. A. Pedersen and H. T. Smith were elected for the statutory two-year period. For the remaining States all the retiring members were unopposed and were, therefore, declared reelected. They were: Queensland, Messrs. R. H. Moyse and L. S. R. Stewart; Western Australia, N. Wells, and South Australia, R. Mules.

Election of Auditor. Messrs. K. D. Courtney & Son were re-elected auditors to the A.C.T.A. for a further period of 12 months.

General. A request was made that Broken Hill be allowed to be considered as part of South Australia was deferred for consideration by the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee later gave long consideration to this proposal, but finally resolved that it would be impossible to interfere with State boundaries.

DOUBLE-RISE CONDITIONS. All clubs and shooters are officially notified that double-rise scoring conditions have been changed to operate as from June 1, 1964. As from that date shooting in all double-rise events (not Deauville doubles) will be scored 1 and 1 and the usual 0 for a miss. Previously double - rise scoring was recorded as a "kill" only if both targets were broken. In future each break will score, so that (as an example) in a 10 birder under doublerise conditions a shooter with a full score will record 20/20, or if he breaks all but one complete pair, 19/20.

DELETION FROM RULES. The word "English" has been deleted from Rule No. 46 and in future any No. 6 size shot will be approved by the A.C.T.A. providing the package is clearly marked by the manufacturers.

Classified Gun Advertisements. In future any shooter wishing to exchange or sell a gun may make use of the A.C.T.A. "News" on a lineage basis. The cost of this will be 5/- per line.

No. 8 Shot. At future National Championships and International shoots a limited supply of cartridges carrying No. 8 size shot will be available to competitors. The supply will be limited to 10% of the full order complement.

Executive Committee Meeting, All are informed that the next meeting of the Executive Committee of the A.C.T.A. will be held in Melbourne over the dates October 8 and October 9, 1964. Applications for the inclusion of items on the Agenda of that meeting will be accepted up to the first mail on September 14.

Handicapping Formula. The following amendments have been made to the Handicapping Formula - under the section "Cash - Trophy wins" and "Divisions" the words "Off Handicap Marks" is to be added.

In the General section, the part

which refers to handicap cards will now read, "Handicap cards shall be collected immediately by the Secretary of the club concerned and all relevant details, etc." This clause refers mainly to the fact that when adjusting an on-the-spot handicap the club Secretary is required to collect the shooter's handicap card and forward, together with all other relevant details, to the A.C.T.A. office for ratification within two days.

"Clubless Shooters". It has come to the notice of the Executive Committee that some shooters have been registering direct with the A.C.T.A. whilst not belonging to an affiliated club or belonging previously to a club which had become defunct. This procedure is against regulations and will not be permitted in future. In cases where there is any doubt in this regard, the shooters concerned will be requested to state their home club.



The importance of concentration in shooting is frequently emphasised.

A shooter must make himself concentrate on breaking one target at a time and refuse to permit or allow any outside conditions to cost him targets. Any veteran shooter will bear out this statement. When a shooter really makes a conscious effort to concentrate, his scores will rise sharply. Obviously no shooter can concentrate on breaking a lot of targets unless the first concentrates on breaking "one" target — or one target at a time. A shooter must put all distractions from his mind and devote all awareness to the immediate task ahead of breaking "one" target - if he does this, the rest come easy. It is never too early to begin to concentrate on breaking targets as they are thrown - one at a time. Some shooters have been known to become distressed by the public address system installed on many grounds, or have a fixation against one of the shoot staff. Whilst the public address system contributes something to the efficiency of a shoot, it cannot be said that such a contrivance adds to the peace and tranquility of shooters on the firing point. The shoot staff is essential to the running of a shoot and competitors have to realise the absolute necessity of what sometimes gives the image of a hazard.

### EXTRACTS FROM THE WRITINGS OF THE LATE W. P. GROSVENOR

#### (As written to A.C.T.A. Secretary in mid-1940's)

Have had trouble with my eyes in recent months. My left eye has now become definitely the MASTER EYE and accounts for the wretched "misses" I suffer from. I try my hand in the field or at covert shooting. The biggest, fattest, longest and wonderful cock pheasant you ever saw roared up at my feet the other day and I missed it clean. One of those sitters that if you miss, you talk about it for months afterwards.

A thought emerges from my mind which I do not think I have drawn attention to. Probably known by most, but possibly not by all, so a few might benefit.

The "hind foot"-I mean the "rear foot" - should have its heel raised well, as it is much easier to pivot and so swing easier: the lead on quartering targets is obtained so much easier that, in effect, it would appear they require less lead than when one tries to swing past the target with both feet firmly on the ground. The fore-going is perhaps a crude illustration, but it is still a fact and a vital one to success. I can almost hear you say "Kid's stuff", but there will be some complete novices reading your columns with avidity, or so we hope. Another point. The shooter should less, had some truth in it.

always have the elbow WELL UP when going after quartering birds, by which I mean the nearer elbow to the direction of the swing. This minimises the tendency to swing the gun in an arc and flattens it out. So many birds thrown at a full angle shot to the shooter are missed by shooting UNDER the bird.

In duck shooting it is always most helpful to be able to see the bird, however much the muzzle of the gun has covered it up.

By the way, it might interest some of your readers to know that both Bill Ellicott, the old I.C.I. professional shot (and a wonderful one, too), and Alec Maunder, who was his chief rival, always used hammer guns. Ellicott only shot in the later years of his life, but Alec Maunder used to shoot with a hammer gun that belonged to the famous American jockey, Tod Sloan. Maunder thought so much of it that he would sooner have lost his left eye than this same gun. They were low hammers and so not any great aid to getting the target in the centre of the rib. Have wondered if it was thought by them that the old idea of the sweetness of a hammer lock, over the hammer-

## NEW BARRELS

(By CHARLES FAIRLEY in "The Shooting Times")

Fitting new barrels is a longer, and more complicated process than sleeving-more complicated because everything is done in reverse. A good thing is done in reverse. A good portion of the jointing of new guns is done by shaping the action to fit the barrels. When jointing new barrels into an old gun, only the barrels can be filed, and this is done until they fit the action. Even if the gunsmith contemplated altering the action of an old gun, ninety-nine out of a hundred (English) actions are so glass hard it is impossible to scratch the surface scratch the surface.

It therefore follows that any variation from the normal found in the old barrels must be copied in the new pair if the action is to function correctly.

First task of the gunsmith is to check the size and weight of the old barrels, also the chamber length and boring of each barrel, so that an exact copy can be made. Gun barrel tubes vary considerably in outside diameter and wall thickness, and range from lightweight to pigeon tubes.

When the original barrels are not available for matching, it is just one more complication to the experienced more complication to the experienced gunsmith who can usually calculate the weight required. But having no pattern makes quite a difference to the action-filer, however, who could use the old jointing lump as a guide when roughing up the new one, before the final fitting. In some in-stances where unusual guns are con-cerned, the loss of the original barrels can cause endless trouble.

It is usual to keep to the old cham-ber lengths, or less, for the actions are elderly, if not downright old, and to step up the charge at this point is risky. Fatigue is likely to show up now if the metal is subjected to undue strain.

The selected tubes are handed to the barrel-filer, who plays a key part the barrel-filer, who plays a key part in the sequence of operations. By carefully brazing the dovetailed tubes together he makes sure that the completed pair of barrels are of sufficient width at the breech ends to cover the face of the action, allowing for smoothing and polishing. The action should never overlap the bar-rels when finished! rels when finished!


If, when an action overlaps the barrels, the striking is close in, hit-ting the inside edges of the caps, the barrel-filer has brought the tubes too near together. But if the striking is central, the tubes selected were too small in their O.D.

The machinist, too, is always glad to have the old barrels to set up his cutters. Usual practice is to place the original barrels on the jig, using plugs in the muzzle ends and breech ends. Cutters are set to cut a little wider than the pattern when roughing out the jointing lump, and in the same way the cut is left a shade higher on the flats.

Not all jointing lumps are dead in line with the axis of the barrel, so the jig can be adjusted, by swinging the muzzles to the left or to the right, so that the cutters will reproduce any deviation exactly on the new barrels.

Another important operation is sinking the well for the cartridge extractor(s) and drilling the large guide hole. When the gun being refitted is a self-ejector the accuracy of the guide hole is vital. While a few thou. to left or right can be overcome, a hole sunk too far beneath the action may cause the ejector cam to slip the extractors, a serious fault to correct.



The action-filer fitting in the new barrels, copies as nearly as possible the outline of the old lump, before letting the new one into the action slots. Without a pattern the same result is obtained by measuring the action slots and scribing the outline on the lump.

To reduce the lump too much at the start makes for a sloppy fit at the end, and to force it in too tightly is to risk fracturing the action. There is no "give" in an old, hardened, action body, so a considerable amount of time is spent on easing the lump in.

At the same time care has to be taken with the striking centres, and the overall coverage of the breech ends. In other words, no metal must be removed until the effect on the finished joint is considered. It is quite surprising what can be done, by filing one spot and leaving another, to pitch an action to the left or to the right.

Assuming that the barrels were joined properly, when the strikers are brought over exactly in the centres of the barrels, the outsides will be just slightly proud of the action all round. But the gunsmith can take nothing for granted, and has continually to check as he goes along.

After a re-barrelled gun has been Proved, the barrels are browned and the final connections made. The owner now has the equivalent of a new gun.
