





The Editor's Notebook



THANKS TO I.C.I.A.N.Z. LTD. It is again desired to record deep appreciation and thanks to I.C.I.A.N.Z. Ltd. for that organisation's wonderful assistance and co-operation dur-ing the recent A.C.T.A. National Championships series. In some cases it is not known that the Company donates the shells and clay targets used by members of the Australian International Team. In addition the Company also donates the targets for the Champion of Champions Cup event. These donations have been long standing, and but for this cooperation, it would not be possible to run the shoot at the extremely low nomination charged for all events; furthermore, it should be quite obvious to all that but for the donations mentioned, the A.C.T.A. would certainly be struggling to make ends meet so far as the shoot is concerned. It should also be remembered that the Company annually donates the sum of £150 towards the cost of maintaining the annual Interstate Match at no cost to the competitors. This sum does not cover the full cost and the A.C.T.A. is called upon to supply some of the balance necessary. The Company also assists in many other ways, one of which is the supplying of sterling silver badges to main winners at the National series. It is felt that the occasion should not be allowed to pass without reference to the Company's generosity.

A.C.T.A. ANNUAL AND EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETINGS. The 29th annual meeting of affiliated club delegates was held at The Victoria

on March 7. The attendance was the largest in recent years, all States, with the exception of Western Australia, being represented.

The President, Mr. J. M. Tyquin, congratulated the 1964 Australian Team on its success in winning the 1964 International Match for the third occasion in succession. He also congratulated the Queensland Team on its success in the 1964 Interstate Teams' Match. The Chairman thanked LC.I.A.N.Z. Ltd. for the splendid support given throughout the year.

Appointment of Auditor. Messrs. K. D. Courtney & Son were appointed auditors to the Association for the ensuing year. The Secretary pointed out that Mr. Courtney Senr. had been the Association auditor for some 25 years or more.

Election of Office - bearers. The President, Mr. J. M. Tyquin, was re-elected unopposed. Mr. J. M. Wilson, a former President, who had nominated, withdrew. The elections for the various States resulted: Queensland: Mr. W. A. Gordon reelected unopposed. New Soutth Wales: An election took place in this State and the result was the re-election of the two retiring members, Messrs. D. B. Mott and Keith Oldfield. South Australia: Mr. R. Mules re-elected unopposed. Tasmania: Mr. Sperry Marshall re-elected unopposed. Western Australia: Mr. N. Wells reelected unopposed. Victoria: An election took place in Victoria, and this resulted in Messrs. E. T. Baldwin (Tatura) and C. F. Dennis (Mildura) being elected.

During a discussion it was recommended that the capital cities should have a permanent representative on the Executive Committee.

On the question of the conduct of Commonwealth Championships, some speakers said that these events should only go to the clubs with the best facilities for holding same, irrespective of location.

Alteration to Shooting Rules. Due to some misunderstanding in regard to Rule 73, it was decided to delete the present Rule No. 73 and replace with the following: "Rule 73 now to read, 'All ties, except walk-up, mixed birds and Deauville doubles, shall be shot off squad system, first miss-out. Shooters shall be squadded in the order in which they qualified. Shooters close up after each five targets per shooter and shall be re-squadded

at the commencement of each run over the trap or traps."

In the "Conditions" of Mixed Birds events, a misprint occurred in the March issue, and this should now read (concluding line prior to reference to tie shooting) "making a possible total of 25 points". (Previously this was printed as 20 points).

1966 National Championships and International. The 1966 National Championships and International Match will be shot on the grounds of the Royal Aero Gun Club at Bankstown Aerodrome, N.S.W. The actual dates have not yet been announced, but it seems probable the same dates will be as is usual, the Labor Day holiday week-end in Victoria. An announcement in this regard will be made later.





OUT OF THE PAST

Twenty-five Years Ago

Fred Burns won the 1940 Champion of Champions Cup, decided on the old Bentleigh grounds of the Nobel-Victorian Gun Club. Burns put up a record by winning the event in two successive years; he had previously won in 1939. His 1940 score was 49/50, missing only his 29th target.

The prize list, down to 10th position, which was the order of prize distribution in those days, was Burns 49/50, the late Vic. Fankhauser 66/70, D. B. O'Callaghan 64/69, "Texas" (C. Lancaster of Korumburra) 51/56,

the late Rus. Thomas 49/54, Athol Love 79/85, G. A. Purcell (Launceston, Tas.) 78/84, J. Bryant 60/66, G. Daniels 54/60, and W. R. Johns 53/60.

J. Bryant, who had recorded an unfinished break of 58 from the previous Saturday, went on to lower the then record break of 77 by the late Lew Bertram. Bryant got to 78 when spontaneous applause broke out among the spectators—so much so that Bryant's concentration was upset and he missed his 79th release.

Fifteen Years Ago

Jack McCraith of Essendon, who competed in the recent National Championships at East Burwood (for 1965), won the Champion of Champions Cup on the East Burwood grounds in 1950. McCraith's form was described at the time as being consistent throughout — he dropped one target and finished with a score of 59/60. NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Australian National Championships series, conducted by the A.C.T.A. at the East Burwood shooting grounds, proved to be an unqualified success. The attendance was larger than expected and the standard of shooting, except in the Australian Team, was of very high standard. Weather conditions throughout the series varied more than usual, particularly during the Team shoot, but despite the vagaries of the weather, scores generally were very high.


Proceedings opened on Thursday, March 4, with the National Doublebarrel Championship, at 50 targets from 16 yards. The entry received was in keeping with the numbers in recent years. Actually 226 complete nominations were received for the National double-barrel title, and 32 entries were received for the Intermediate Championship only, which was shot in conjunction. The record entry for this event was received in 1952 when 253 nominated. Some advices have indicated that the 1965 nomination for the National D.B. title was a record, but such is not the case. Probably the best shooting of the whole series took place in the tie shoot of this event. Twenty shooters carded possibles. Although, under the usual miss-out conditions, the field dwindled fairly quickly, there were still six left when shooting was called off for the day owing to failing light. When the tie resumed the following morning D. Anderson (Hay, N.S.W.), John Doyle (Mildura), F. R. Hudson (Sydney), A. Hamilton (Dandenong), K. R. Heywood (Narromine, N.S.W.), and Brian Mark (Sebastopol) faced up to the traps. Anderson missed his first bird on resumption, and retired. Hudson followed 12 rounds later, and Heywood four rounds later again. Mark dropped out at the 233rd round. Doyle and Hamilton then settled in Doyle and Hamilton then settled in to a spectacular effort, Hamilton ultimately gaining the title 270/270. Doyle was runner-up 269/270, Mark 238/234, Anderson 225/226, Heywood 110/111, Hudson 110/111, then followed K. Samus Samu 105/106 W. lowed, K. Soames Senr. 105/106, W.

Coulson (Huntly, V.) 83/84, Doug. Smith (Charleville, Q.) 78/79, the former Olympian, C. G. Mudford (V.) was next, 73/74, then R. the tie shoot Warren Charlton really showed his class and maintained an unbroken sequence to score 324/324 points and take the winning honours. Brian Mark was runner-up, 323/324 points, then F. J. Finnigan (V.) 152/ 153, Gary Daly (President of the Deniliquin Club), Bruce Hill (N.S.W.), Paul Marshall (Tas.), Tim Catling (W.A.), Newton Thomas (V.), each 149/150. 
So concluded a very successful fixture, unfortunately not favoured by the type of weather usually expected at this period of the year in Melbourne.

Dear Bill,

Following our successful International Shoot in Melbourne, several shooters have spoken to me regarding our lack of progress with the amenities and ground facilities for the International Shoots.

It is not fair to expect a club to outlay a lot of capital on grounds for the International Shoot, which at present comes to them once in four years, and they do not necessarily own the ground.

If it is decided that something should be done to improve our ground standards, then the Association, through the shooters, could perhaps create a fund over five or six years by a contribution from each shooter of £1 per year towards a specified Ground Fund Account.

Over five years this would give us not less than £20,000, which could be allocated to help clubs which hold the International — to finance the purchase of land, or to supply amenities which shooters could use at this annual event in the various States.

I should be glad if this suggestion can be published in the "News", and I would like to hear shooters' views.

If it be thought a good idea, a start could be implemented in 1966.

While I know that, according to Rule No. 76, "An Official Referee attending any shoot under A.C.T.A. Rules shall have authority to adjust any trap immediately should it not be throwing regulation targets," surely a little common decency and sportsmanship should have been shown and any complaint lodged with the President of the club?

The resulting discussion prior to the presiding Referee leaving the tracks in disgust, was sufficient to cause one shooter to miss his target. As a result of this incident, a measuring stick was produced and the trap was found to be throwing regulation targets.

I do feel that our few good Referees should not be put in a position where they can be sniped at by any loud-mouthed individual who happens to be wearing a Referee badge, and would like to receive some ruling from you, Sir, or comments from any other shooters.




