
# The Editor's Notebook



**WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS, 1965.** The 1965 World Championships at Skeet and Olympic Trench clay pigeon shooting will be held at Santiago, Chile, under the supervision of the Chilean National Target Shooting Federation, commencing with practice from October 23 and concluding with the competition finals on November 7, 1965.

Actual practice over the Olympic style events will commence, as men-

tioned, on October 23 and conclude on October 28. The world title at this form of shooting will start on October 30, extending over October 31 and November 1 — at 100 targets per day, making up to a total of 300 targets for the title contest. The Skeet title will be decided over 200 targets in two fields with Laporte machines. Skeet practice will be available from October 23 to 28, and also on November 2 and 3. The championship will be shot on November 5, 6 and 7.



The Stage for the 1965 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS at Skeet and Olympic Trap Shooting. The location is at the "Club de Tiro al Vuelo Lo Curro", situated about 9 miles from Santiago, Chile.

Chilean shooters are striving to ensure that every contestant will be well satisfied with the excellent layouts prepared for the series, which will be at the Club de Tiro al Vuelo "Lo Curro", located nine miles or 14 kilometers from down-town Santiago. For the Olympic Trench Championship a maximum of six shooters per country will be accepted. For Skeet there is no limit to the number of shooters from each country. As far as can be understood, nominations for the Olympic title event is 20 U.S. dollars, and for the Skeet, 15 U.S. dollars. The weather in Santiago in the months of October and November is generally dry, with no moisture and very little temperature variation.

A picture of the picturesque lay-out for both Olympic and Skeet events are shown appended. The surroundings are reported to be particularly beautiful and one hundred per cent. correct from a technical viewpoint. In the picture as shown herewith it will be observed that a spacious clubhouse is available for contestants, complete with first-class restaurant and bar facilities.

Any shooter from Australia able to make the trip should be able to enjoy his chosen pastime to the fullest. Enquiries should be addressed to Federacion Nacional De Tiro Al Blanco, Casilla 9055, Santiago, Chile. Canadian Pacific Airlines Ltd. run a flight to Santiago through any of the North American gateways. The economy fare is £750/16/-.

**CANADA WINS 1965 INTERNATIONAL.** Cabled advice was received in mid-July indicating that Canada had won the 1965 International Match for the second occasion. Previously Canada won in 1960 before the increase of team numbers to 30 — in fact, the 1960 Canadian win was the last occasion that teams of less than 30 have represented each competing country. Canada's winning score was 8685/9000 points, which is 69 points below Australia's record - winning score recorded at Bankstown in 1962.

The cabled information reveals Canada as winner (as already mentioned) 8685, Australia (second) 8616,

New Zealand 8520, South Africa 8507, England 8377, Scotland 8132, Central Africa 7998, Ireland 7949, Wales 7923.

Canada did not field a team in 1964 and has also failed to field a team on some other occasions. Match conditions should suit Canadians very well, as practically all shooting done in Canada is shot under single-barrel conditions, on the same lines as U.S.A.

When full details of scores are received from London, same will be published in these columns.

Australian sportsmen extend warmest congratulations to our kinsmen in the Canadian Dominion, and also congratulations to those teams which finished behind Australia. It is always worth recalling the Olympic slogan of Baron de Coubertan, who declared, "The great thing is not to win, but to have taken part," and this would aptly apply to all teams competing in this now famous contest.





## "Tips and Tails"



Rex Miles, who has been Secretary of the Washington State Trapshooters' Association in U.S.A. since the Association was formed in 1934, in a recent letter, reckons it is time for him to quit. Miles mentions that he is his 78 plus and "it is time they should consider my age". For some years he was also Secretary of the Spokane Gun Club in Washington State, but his wife was not so happy about his frequent absences from home and he quit the Club job. Miles is an Hon. Vice-President of the A.C.T.A., and it is certain all shooters and well-wishers in Australia will extend to the veteran hopes for his long sojourn in retirement when it comes along. Miles is a great admirer of Australia and Australians and he forwarded details of his State shoot winners for 1965. These are published elsewhere. It will be noticed that there are some fairly healthy scores revealed. One name which most Australians will be familiar with is Arnold Riegger, who has apparently recovered from a very serious throat complaint. Riegger won the high-gun on all programme targets by breaking 678/700 from 27 yards. Not a bad effort for a man recently recovered from a most serious illness!

Occasionally, as one passes through the avenue of life, one hears of stories about birds of various types becoming drunk through getting "stuck into" brewery residue and the like. Many years ago in England, at Burton-on-Trent, a flight of drunken sparrows were picked up by "charitable" people. The birds are reported to have been described as quail and quietly "taken home, undressed, and put to bed in pastry lined with tender steak".

Joe Hiestand, the famous American trapshot and commentator, reports in American Trap & Field, "To be a top-class shooter you must be a good judge of the angles and height that targets are thrown, so I suggest you study targets as other shooters fire down the line and say, 'Where would I point the gun at each bird?' With a gun that fits you and the ability to eliminate most human error (poor sight alignment, eye high on the rib, raising the head before shot is finished, moving the stock away from the face) you should start breaking more targets. By all means, try and relax and shoot with confidence. A plan to continually check these points while you shoot is concentration. Use discipline to develop your concentration. I have been asked many times, 'What length of barrel should my gun have?' I suggest not less than 28 inches for pump guns and not less than 32 inches for solid breech guns. If I were to buy a new gun and could get it, I would buy a 34-inch barrel. They can be more accurately pointed. What do I consider is the greatest fault of shooters? This applies to the best. We all try to shoot the target too quickly. Use slightly more time and be ready for the target when you call pull. I remember two shooters, both of whom were slow but deadly accurate, and were the shooters to beat in the 30's; both were fine doubles shots and were still slow. You do not have to be real fast to break good singles or doubles scores. Success at trapshooting is the ability to get the shot in the right place, whether it be really fast or slow. I am a firm believer that you have to develop your own talents whether it be from a young age or middle age. We all could be better shots if we worked harder to develop our shooting ability."

A new club is likely to be formed at Bollon in south-western Queensland. Max Ham, who was formerly Secretary at Menindee in New South Wales, is the organiser. The club will start off with an automatic trap, and it is intended to shoot once each month. Ham, whose address is "Yen-

don", Dirranbandi, Qld., took up a grazing block near Bollon, and his enthusiasm has resulted in the proposed new formation. The new club hopes to be functioning within three to four months. Many years ago, just prior to the 1939-45 war, there was an active club at Bollon, but it did revive following the war years.

A new club has been formed at Morwell in the Victorian Gippsland district. There is an enthusiastic band of supporters already behind the club, and its success seems assured. 



Dear Bill,

Many shooters wonder what kind of scores we put up when we shoot in New Zealand.

I enclose a list of the shooters, and their scores, who shot in all events this year. There were some others who only shot in one or two events which I have not included.

Generally all shooters are down a little on their average performance

here, which I can't account for. Everything was perfect in New Zealand, including the hospitality, but the New Zealand shooters had the edge on us all the time except in the Single-barrel event, and in the Tom Glenn Cup, which could have gone any way.

We all enjoyed ourselves, and I feel sure there will be just as many Australian shooters at the New Zealand Championships next year as were this year.

## OUT OF THE PAST

### Twenty-five Years Ago.

A Ladies' Clay Pigeon Gun Club was formed in Melbourne about this period in 1940. The club decided to hold regular fixtures on the old Victorian Club's Bentleigh grounds. However, few fixtures eventuated. Officials of the club were: President, Mrs. J. M. Coffey; Vice-Presidents, Mrs. Mattingley and Mrs. Fuzzard; Secretary, Mrs. Peacock; Treasurer, Mrs. Stirling. The first shoot was actually held on August 10, 1940. No results were announced.

H. Waight, then of Elwood (V.)

won the Commonwealth Skeet Championship of 1940, shot on the Coburg Club's grounds at North Coburg. Waight, who is still a registered shooter, returned a score of 17/20. G. Freeman of Seymour was runner-up to Waight and held a winning lead to the doubles section, but is reported to have "misunderstood the rules and lost his advantage".

The Riverina Championship of 1940 was shot at Griffith, N.S.W., and was won by Charlie Hamilton of Boorowa, N.S.W., 20/20, from J. Semmler of Barellan, N.S.W., 19/20, whilst Jack Bryant (Melbourne) and Don Muir (Griffith) tied for third placing.

### Fifteen Years Ago.

W. R. Johns of Melbourne, won the Victorian Mixed Birds Championship at Sale in East Gippsland (V.) with a score of 19/20, which at that time was equal to the record winning total. Len Schipalius was runner-up, 18/20, with Sale President (and still President), Lou Bourbaud, and C. Ferguson (Queensland) equal third. It is recalled that Bourbaud has been President of the Sale Club for almost 30 years, and is still going strong,

despite a recent illness. The Sale Secretary, Len J. Robinson, who has been Secretary for a similar period, cut a £20 Handicap, 20/20, with J. Martin of Yarram. Bourbaud was at one time a member of the Executive Committee of the A.C.T.A.

The late Lionel Byrne won the Metropolitan Double-rise Championship at the Camberwell grounds with a score of 8/12 pairs. Byrne was later seriously injured when knocked down by a car and did not recover.

### Ten Years Ago.

The present Werribee Club affiliated with the A.C.T.A. late in 1955. The club has since developed into one of the foremost clubs within the confines of the greater Melbourne metropolitan area. Tom Powell, who is now President of the club, was the inaugural Secretary. The old Werribee Gun Club, or at least the pre-war club, used to shoot on the Werribee Racecourse. The pre-war club had just got under way and shooting regularly when the stringencies of war regulations came into force and the club was forced to close down. For those who remember this club, and its actual location on the racecourse, it would probably not be hard to find the old tracks or the remains

of same.

Most of the Western Queensland clubs combined about this period to conduct a major shoot on the Charleville grounds. Many of the long-distance travellers were unable to attend because of muddy and bad roads and the attendance generally was disappointing. The South-western Queensland single-barrel title was won by R. Heinemann with the excellent score of 35 single-barrels straight, winning from Clive Evans and Joe Raleigh. The latter is now a resident of the Coff's Harbour district in N.S.W.

John Houston, the former A.C.T.A. President, won the Hay Club's skeet championship, 18/20, from Jack Headon (who is Hay President at the moment), 17/20.
