The Editor's Notebook



1965 AFFILIATED CLUBS. In this issue is published a complete list of 1965 affiliated clubs within the Australian Clay Target Association. The names and addresses of respective secretaries are also listed alongside each club. In some instances names of these officials may not be correct or out-of-date. This is due entirely to clubs, or the officials themselves, failing in advising the Association of changes in appointments and management administrative officials. A reminder in this regard should be heeded by all clubs that it is essential to efficient conduct of the Association that names of all chief officials should be made known to the Association office within the shortest possible time after appointment.

NOMINATIONS FOR 1966 OFFICES IN A.C.T.A. All are advised that nominations for all offices in the Australian Clay Target Association will close at 5 p.m. on Friday, December 31, 1965. Nominations are required to be lodged with the Secretary, A.C.T.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.I. Late nominations cannot be entertained or included in the ballot. Nomination forms are available from the A.C.T.A. Secretary. All nominations must be lodged in accordance with Article 27 of the Association Constitution. For the information of all concerned, this Article is printed and reads: "Nominations for all offices in the Association and membership of the Executive Committee must be in writing, signed by the Secretary of the member club

or by a delegate member of an unincorporated club making the nomination, and must reach the Secretary of the Association on or before 31st December in each year prior to the Annual General Meeting."

Individual officials signing nomination forms are instructed that any nomination must have the official backing of the nominee's club and same must be not merely the result of collaboration between two or three individuals.

In connection with the reference in the Article to "delegate members", it is pointed out that under the Companies Act, under which the A.C.T.A. is registered as a "Limited Company", the Secretary of a "member" club may sign a nomination. By "member" club is meant a club which is a corporate body. In an unincorporated club, in which category the majority of clubs are classified, the "member delegate" is the signing authority. Clubs would do well to remember these facts, because a nomination cannot be accepted unless it is properly and correctly prepared.

DECEMBER ISSUE OF "NEWS". Due to the printing industry vacation, no publication of "News" will take place during the month of January. Instead the January and February issues will be combined as one, and the first edition in the New Year will appear on or about February 1. Copy for this issue will close at the A.C.T.A. office not later than January 5, 1966. It is expected that the

December issue will carry advertising for December and January and possibly the first week in February, and advertisers are requested to work their advertising schedules accordingly. Copy for the December issue will close at the A.C.T.A. office on November 1, with the December issue actually in the shooter's possession by December 1.

LATE COPY. The matter of reference to the late lodgement of advertising copy is developing into almost a hardy annual. Despite frequent reference to the matter, many clubs fail to heed the copy "dead-line" and the number "falling by the wayside" in this regard, instead of decreasing, we find is increasing. Take the September issue as an example. This turned out to be of record proportions and took considerable effort both by the printers and the A.C.T.A. staff to accomplish. Late copy was quite a feature. About 40 per cent. of the copy was actually late, or beyond the dead-line. The position was so acute that at least three club advertisers could not be included for the usual reason of "too late". One advertiser was two weeks overdue, and the crowning example of all was an advertisement received after the publication was printed and was about to be posted. An important point seemingly overlooked by those who apparently delight in lodging late copy is that they are losing additional publicity by not having an accompanying paragraph in the "Tips and Tails" section of the "News". Many have advised the office that they consider a brief write-up in "Tips and Tails" is of material benefit in drawing attention to the particular advertisement. Early lodging of copy is a great advantage, and clubs assisting in this way will always gain the advantage of additional narrative where this is possible.

1965 A.C.T.A. OFFICIAL REFEREE RESULTS. Published elsewhere in this issue are the results as issued by the examiner of the written section of the 1965 A.C.T.A. Official Referee examination results. It will be noted that only those who secured

a 90% or over allotment of points were classified as having passed. All those who have passed are requested to contact one of the Official Referee Examiners without delay and complete their practical test so that Official Referee Badges may be issued.

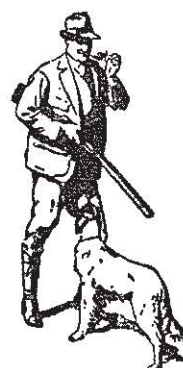

"Tips and Tails"

A new type of clay pigeon event has been introduced in England. It has been tried with great success at one or two of the larger clubs in England and has proved most popular. The idea is that three shooters at a time are given 50 cartridges between them with which they attempt to break as many as possible out of 45 successive clay pigeons. These are thrown from three traps set for double-rise. Agile shooting and quick decisions are the order of the day, for as many as six targets will be in the air at one time. From a novelty viewpoint this type of competition should have some attraction to Australian followers of the gun.

Secretary A. C. Cooper, of Lacedpede Bay Gun Club at Kingston in South Australia, has requested that shooters be notified through "News" that the Lacedpede Bay Club has gone into recess. The period has not been stated, but it hoped that the recession period will be of brief duration.

A lady shooter in England, Mrs. Sheila Breckon, shooting over the Olympic Trench type competition, recently shot a brilliant 25 straight to start off the day's performance. She finished with 90/100 for the day—a really meritorious performance for a woman shooter, in a competition by no means easy.

A shooter named Herb. Parsons, who was renowned for his trick-shooting ability for years in America,

is reported to have shot five clay targets tossed into the air together before one hit the ground. Jock Wilson, a one-time President of the A.C.T.A., saw this performed in U.S.A. when on a visit a few years back, but it is not known whether the shooter was Parsons or not.

Earl Caldwell, who was a Canadian representative shooting in the Olympic Games in Melbourne in 1956, is rarely recorded these days in American shooting literature. However, his name came up recently in the American "Trap and Field" magazine where in he was described as having represented Canada in International and Olympic Championships and had won his way back to 27 yards for the first time. His shooting must have improved greatly on his form in Australia, because he was by no means a 27 yarder in 1956. Frank Opsal, his partner and another Canadian representative at the Melbourne Olympic Games, is also recorded as only having missed one target in 100 in the 1965 Canadian Championship. Opsal's form in Melbourne was very poor. It is interesting to record some of the comments of the American "Trap and Field" on the Canadian Championship. One reference was rather amusing. It appears three shooters up near the leaders were recorded on the board with an "A" following their names—designating that they were Americans. Two shooters were speculating as to what the "A" meant. One mused, 'I think it means Alaska.' "Nope," replied the other, "it must mean alien." We were not aware that Americans thought of Canadians in terms of "aliens". The Canadian Championship of 1965 was held at Calgary for the first time since 1955. The attendance, surprisingly, was no greater than that experienced at the A.C.T.A. National Championships.

All over the United States and Canada, wives and children of shooters are reported to be assisting the management of clubs. The report states they carry out typing duties, cooking, running squad sheets, pull-

ing, posting scores, cleaning and even acting as shoot cashiers. Such assistance must surely be of great benefit to the clubs concerned and the reduction in shoot expenses would doubtless be enormous.

The following has been forwarded to the A.C.T.A. office and is reprinted without comment, "Since you cannot refrain from drinking, why not start a hotel in your own home, be the only customer, and you will not have to buy a licence. Give your wife £7/12/0 to buy 4 cartoons (this is apparently before budget announcements). There are 240 drinks at 1/- a glass. At the end of 7 days (when contents of carton have been devoured) your wife will have £4/8/0 to put in the bank and £7/12/0 to buy four more cartons of beer. If you live 20 years and continue to buy all your drinks from your wife, then die in your boots, your widow will have £4,567, enough to bring up the children, pay off the mortgage on the house, marry a decent man and forget she ever knew a specimen like you." (The arithmetic may be hard to follow, but the material is exactly as forwarded.)

An interesting sidelight on a happening in the life of the late Robert Churchill, the famed English gun-maker, is told in a book on his life named "The Other Mr. Churchill". It appears that Robert Churchill was required to travel on official business on the Continent just after "D-Day". Churchill was a tester of experimental powders for the perfection of tracer and incendiary bullets during the war. On his arrival on the Continent Churchill found he was ushered and waited upon in every direction. The final effort was full fighter cover for his aircraft when on an air trip.

After a lengthy period of recess the Hobart Gun Club in southern Tasmania has been able to purchase

a new ground. The club hopes to resume shooting by the end of October or just as soon as a new "Damo" trap can be installed.

St. George Gun Club in south-western Queensland will conduct an all-day shoot on the local grounds on Saturday, November 13. Shooting will start at 10 a.m. Main events on a big programme are the Balonne Double-barrel Championship and the Southern Queensland single - barrel title. 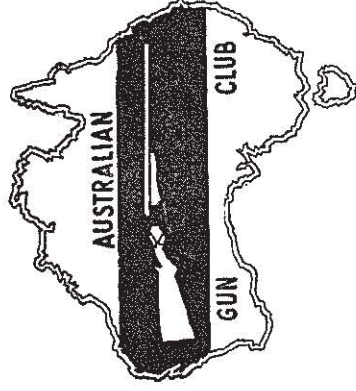

OUT OF THE PAST

Twenty-five Years Ago

Notwithstanding that the Second World War had been in progress some 13 months, trapshooting was still very much an active sport in the Melbourne area in October/November, 1940.

The late Tom Saville, reported as a rapidly improving shooter, won the main event at the Nobel Club's Ladies' Day shoot.

J. R. (Bob Meehan), then described as a 16-year-old trapshot, upset a brilliant field of recognised champions when he won the Nobel Single-barrel Championship at Bentleigh. Meehan won outright, with "Duxbac" (H. G. James) in the runner-up

position, with Jack Bryant and Peter Garrone equal third. Athol Love, then a member of the Metropolitan Fire Brigade, won his second successive title when he took the Coburg Club's tower championship. The late Ted Parow was second, and the late Bert Anquetil third.

In November 1940 Jack Bryant failed by 11 on the Camberwell grounds in an attempt to exceed the then Australian record break of 78 straight. In a shoot at Fishermen's Bend, Port Melbourne, the sum of £50 was raised to assist the funds of Blamey House—a rendezvous of servicemen on leave in Melbourne.

Fifteen Years Ago

In November 1950 the then Miss Barbara Biggs, daughter of E. G. Biggs, a former member of the Executive Committee, shot 18 straight to win a 10 birder in good-class company. Those placed behind her were "Doncaster" (Jim Bienvenu) and A. H. Brenk.

The Shepparton Clay Target Club was officially opened about this time and a £50 Handicap was won by N. Jordon from R. Thorne and J. R.

Broughton (Alexandra). The club has since been changed in name to the Shepparton Gun Club. Jack Headland, a former member of the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee, was in good form at a Coburg Club shoot, winning the club's single-barrel championship with the only possible in the event and out-pointing such renowned marksmen as C. Mudford (the former Olympian) and Ray Hering in the placings.

Ten Years Ago

Werribee Gun Club had its official opening about this period in 1955. Tom Powell, who was then Secretary of the new club, is now its President. Jock Wilson, then the A.C.T.A. President, performed the opening ceremony and it is reported that he broke the initial target.

Club President at Deniliquin, N.S.W., Gary Daly, won the New South Wales Walk-up Championship decided on the local grounds. In what was claimed to be a record, E. G.

Biggs and A. H. Brenk shot 215/215 pairs to win the Riverina Deauville Doubles Championship. Runners-up were E. V. Cox - J. Headon (both of Hay), 214/215. It is further reported that it required 3,200 clay targets to finalise the event. Some shooting!

The club sparrow championship at Mount Barker in South Australia went to Clem Appleton, 18/20, from R. Mules, 17/20, and J. Guerin. Shooters found the small targets very elusive.

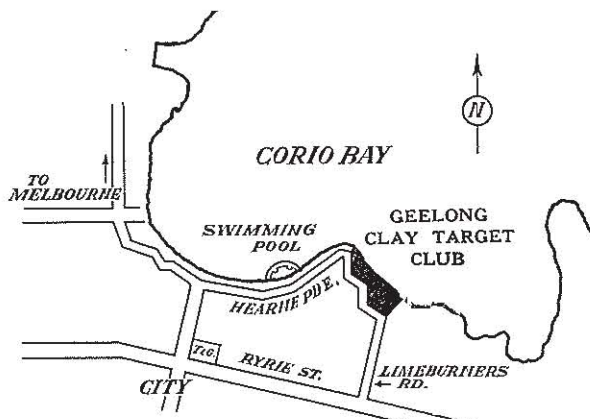

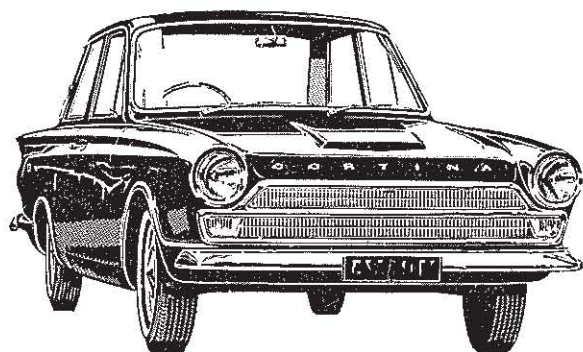

16-YEAR-OLD WINS 1965 GRAND AMERICAN HANDICAP

(From REX MILES)

Dan Pautler Jnr., a high-school junior from Alden, N.Y., captured the Grand American Handicap in the premier event of the 66th trapshoot tournament.

The 16-year-old Pautler shattered 99 of 100 targets from 20 yards in out-shooting a record field of 3,031 marksmen.

The youth, in his second year of trapshooting, missed his 87th bird in the near-perfect round.

His victory also earned him the junior crown and he became the first youngster to win both the preliminary and Grand American handicap junior titles.

William Sinnitz of Allentown, Pa., lost a bid to overtake the leader when he missed his 100th target and finished with 98 from 20½ yards.

Pautler, who earned about \$1,800 by winning the preliminary junior with a 98, added an estimated \$9,000 with his triumph to become the tournament's top money-winner of all time.

His combined 197 score for the two days represents the best handicap shooting at a Grand tournament.

It was the third time that a junior had copped the big event. Rufus King of Wichita Falls, Tex., won the Grand in 1930, and Nick Egan of New York City scored in 1954.

W. E. Duggan of Delphos, Ohio, last year's Grand winner, turned in a 91 from 22 yards.

Henry Schedit of Cincinnati, who won the preliminary with a 99, posted a 91 in the Grand from 22 yards.

In the women's division there was a five-way tie. Jane Dickson of Gilby, N.D., Nancy Krebs of Ripon, Wis., Opal Rowland of Garden City, Kan., Margaret M. Zawoski of South Bend, Ind., and Nadine Ljutic of Yakima, Wash., all registered 94's.

Jack Lenham of Dallas, Tex., broke 95 from 23 yards to take professional laurels. Marcus Huff, 14, of Minot, N.D., scored 97 from 22 yards in the sub-junior division, and Earl C. Thompson of Peoria, Ill., walked off with the veterans' crown by breaking 93 from 24 yards.

Gun Gossip

(By GOUGH THOMAS in "Shooting Times")

I never cease to marvel at the powers of co-ordination we possess, and the speed at which they work, particularly in certain kinds of shooting. The process involved is indeed staggering to contemplate.

A bird, coming within range, causes the eyes to transmit nerve impulses to the brain, where they are translated into what we call "sight". The two images are there collated for any evidence of range they may yield through binocular vision. Failing that (as with a bird seen well out, and against a background of blank sky), memory data, derived from the conscious intelligence, are brought in... the bird is recognised; its size is known from experience; its distance is therefore inferred from the size of the image thrown on the retina; and so, too, is its speed from the observed angular velocity. All these data having been assembled, an assessment is made of the action necessary to bring off a successful shot. *Note well that this assessment may or may not rise to the level of consciousness.* At this stage, some higher faculty must be referred to for a decision as to whether or not the action shall be taken. If the go-ahead is given, appropriate instructions are passed to the motor part of the brain, which, by flashing nerve impulses to the muscles concerned, brings about the movements necessary to ensure an effective shot.

The picture of photo-chemical changes in the eye being translated into nerve impulses; of these nerve impulses generating little electric storms at their points of impact in the brain; of echoes of these storms flashing in all directions over the network of association fibres and waking others in appropriate parts of the cerebral cortex; of all this activity being, as it were, brought together and referred somewhere for a decision, and of the further intricate processes necessary to ensure that the last muscle fibre concerned shall

receive its proper orders—all at lightning speed—is, as I say, staggering. It would be more so, I have no doubt, if the story could be more fully and correctly told.

A Practical Point

The point of practical interest to all shooters in this complex process is undoubtedly the one I have italicised above—the fact that the assessment of the action necessary for a successful shot can take place at or below conscious level. It seems that in this, as in other matters, the subconscious has the more expert capacity. So, on the days when we are shooting at our best, we concentrate exclusively on the bird: we swing and pull, and down comes the game. The faster the shooting, the better, if the conscious mind is thereby prevented from butting in and spoiling everything. But when it is given an opportunity of exerting its inhibiting influence—when we start calculating forward allowances and wondering whether we have got the right kind of rib, or whether we are holding too high or too low—then we aim and poke and the bird goes on. I am always anxious in this column to avoid any appearance of giving instruction in the art of shooting—an art I have never mastered to my own satisfaction; but I am nevertheless quite sure that if foot-work, timing and gun mounting are mastered, the less the conscious mind has to do with shooting, the better.

Forward Allowances

Forward allowances are certainly necessary with crossing birds, as I showed here a year ago, and if they had to be made consciously every time, the point raised would come up very forcibly. A correspondent exposes the impracticability of measuring a specific number of feet and inches in front of a bird with nothing behind it but a background of sky.

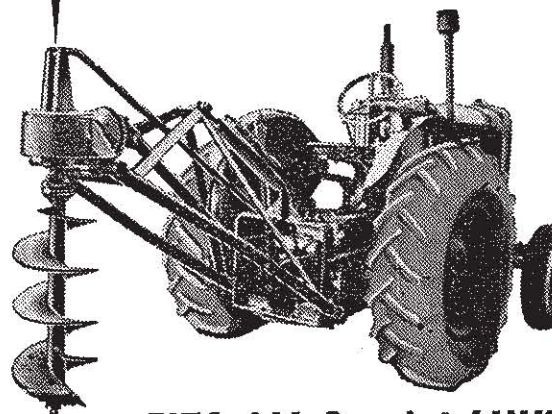

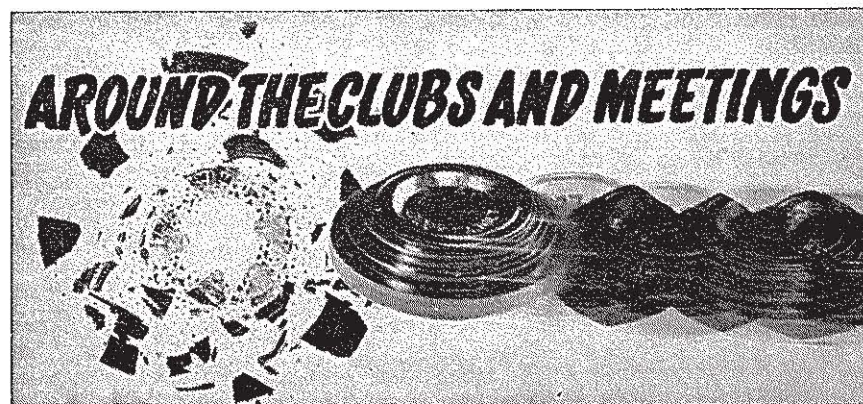

But the subconscious mind, working on memory data of the size of a known bird, and of past experience of shooting, can certainly measure off the required allowance with sufficient precision. The only exception is possibly when the bird has to be taken at a range outside common experience, and then I believe the conscious mind can help by prompting an extra forward urge of the gun. I am encouraged in this belief by eminent game shots who have referred to the need for this extra urge when dealing with distant birds; also by its efficacy in

my own case — when I remember to apply it. It would explain too, the fact that although, as I have said before, I am quite unconscious of the lead I give crossing birds when I am shooting well, there is an exception in the case of birds shot at extreme range, when, if asked, I could say with some precision just what lead I had given. But I am only immediately conscious of this lead in terms of a point in relation to the bird, and certainly not as a distance expressible in feet and inches; though, knowing the size of the bird, I could translate it roughly into such terms. But this is a *post hoc* interpretation: men learned to judge distances, both consciously and subconsciously, long before feet and inches were invented.
