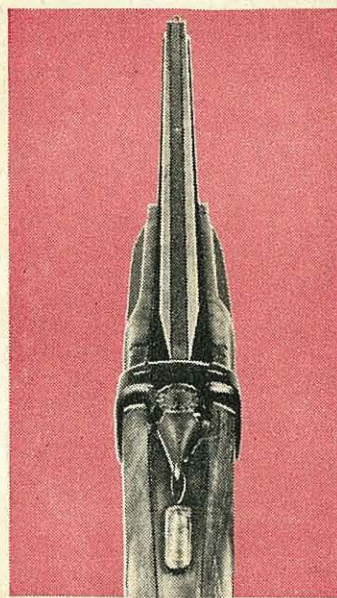

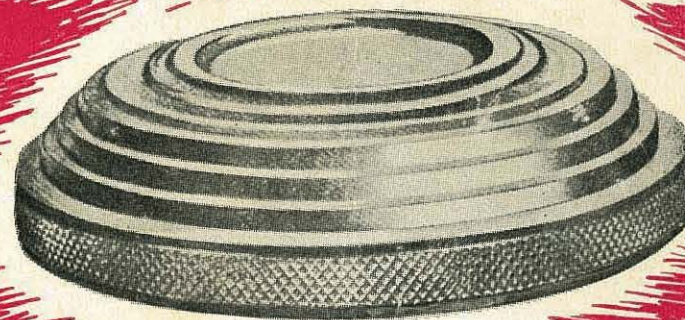



The Editor's Notebook



National Championships and International Match

As explained within the advertising section, the 1966 National Championships series and the 20th International Match will be held from March 12 to March 16 at the shooting grounds of the Royal Aero Club of N.S.W. — the home of the Royal Aero Gun Society. The International Match is always one of the highlights of the series. One of the main reasons for this is that if a shooter is shooting well enough, he gains a place in the 30-man team to represent Australia for the Mackintosh Trophy — there is no selection committee — the shooter shoots his way into the team.

The International Tournament in England for 1966 will be held on Friday, 15th July, in Warwick, Warwickshire, and in accordance with the International Council's decisions the conditions for the next five years will be unchanged except that the 25th highest scores only in each team will count for the competition, the teams to consist of 30 shooters each, as previously. To be known as a mem-

ber of the Australian Team produces a very proud feeling — the hallmark of shooting ability.

The National Series will commence with the Champion of Champions Cup. This event is the original basis of the A.C.T.A. national programme and was first held in 1937 — the winner being the former Association Chairman, H. G. (Duxbac) James. On the same day the Australian National Double Rise Championship will be conducted.

On the second day the Australian National Double-barrel Championship and the A.C.T.A. Intermediate Championship (shot in conjunction). The National Double-barrel title counts for the aggregate for a place in the Australian Team, together with the National Single-barrel and Australia-New Zealand trophy. As already explained, the top 30 scorers in these events automatically gain a place in the Australian Team.

On the third day will be the Australian National Single-barrel Championship.

The fourth day, the six top scorers in the Australia-New Zealand Championship will comprise the Australian Team for the Australia-New Zealand Teams' Match.

The fifth day will commence with the Twentieth International Teams' Match (as previously explained), followed by the Seventeenth Grand Australian Handicap of \$550 and, if time permits, a \$200 Double-barrel Handicap will be held.

Shooting will commence daily Saturday, 12th, through to Tuesday, 15th March, at 9.00 a.m. On the fifth and final day, shooting will commence at 10.00 a.m. No entries will be accepted later than one hour after the stated daily starting time.

The Thirtieth Annual Meeting of representatives of corporate clubs and delegates of unincorporated clubs of the A.C.T.A. will be held in the Club Rooms of the Royal Aero Club, Bankstown, N.S.W., on Sunday, March 13, 1966, commencing at 8 p.m.

Club Secretaries Please Note:—

1. Shooter D. S. McGuinness of Benalla (Vic.) has been suspended from the A.C.T.A., and during the period of such suspension he is not entitled to the facilities or privileges accorded by any A.C.T.A. member club.

2. Another Victorian shooter has been warned after attempting to shoot pistol fashion.

Sets of forms have been mailed to all club secretaries. With the co-operation of all secretaries in using this procedure, internal office work will be accelerated to the mutual benefit of all concerned. (Replacement forms will be mailed with replies.) A questionnaire is included — it is intended that the "News" will list all clubs and their regular shooting dates.

Handicapping — Attention is drawn to the handicapping formula: "Individual or personal requests will NOT be entertained — by order of the Executive Committee."

Many women trapshooters probably have the same hidden desire as Charlotte Baker of Ashland, Kan., did — to "do" the dirty dishes by using them as clay targets instead of slaving over the sticky, gooey plates, cups and saucers for hours after dinner. Mrs. Baker's husband, Robert, bought her an inexpensive set of dishes on her birthday and asked that she use them at dinner that night. After dinner he gathered up the dirty dishes, corralled the family, located Charlotte's shotgun and loaded the dishes, Charlotte, her gun and the family into the car. In the open countryside Mrs. Baker got her wish

— the family tossed the dishes in the air while she shot at them. (They each got a turn at some which were not completely broken by Charlotte.) When Mrs. Baker returned home from shopping the next day she found a new automatic dish-washer in her kitchen.

"One of these days somebody is going to hit a live bird flying around our trap field." This was a comment often made by members of the North Macomb S.C. at Washington, Mich. On June 13 it came true. Richard Pellegrin qualified for the title of "Two-Bird Dick" when he got a blue-bird and a clay pigeon with one shot from station No. 5. The club had a special trophy made with a clay target and a blue-bird mounted on top, which it presented to Pellegrin. The trophy is now displayed in the clubhouse.

J. C. (Dick) Morrison of Morristown, Tennessee, U.S.A., became the fourth man in A.T.A. history to break 100 from the 27-yard line. His record was entered in the books during the last race of the three-day Fall Festival trapshoot at the Knoxville (Tenn.) Gun Club. In an earlier handicap race the same day, Oct. 2, 1965, Dick broke 89. Club President Dwight Brown reports that "the barrier and the field around the traps have been sowed and the grass is now about two feet tall and a light brown. This makes the targets hard to see coming out of the house." Previous such 100-straight shooters from 27 yards were Dan Orlich at the Mile-Hi shoot at Denver, followed just 11 days later on July 19, 1964, by Lt.-Col. E. S. Throckmorton at Cortez Club, Colorado, and George Snellenberger in 1965.

(Mr. C. F. Whitla, Headmaster, Benalla Technical School (Vic.), himself a registered A.C.T.A. shooter, commenced teaching his pupils gun handling and safety procedures in 1954. The spirit and capacity of his efforts is obvious.

Information from any other similar youth training groups for gun handling and trap shooting would be welcomed by A.C.T.A. "News".)

The Australian Team of 30 men for the International Match will comprise the 30 highest aggregate scorers in the Australia-New Zealand Championship, Australian National S.B. and D.B. Championships, 1966, who are Australian citizens of at least 12 months standing. In the event of any selected shooter being unable to take his place in the team, his place will be filled by another shooter agreed upon by the Executive Committee.

CONDITIONS:

100 birds per member from 16 yards, five track shooting system, in four stages of 25 each over four traps. Automatic angle traps, double-barrel, points scoring 3 and 2, cartridges loaded with not more than 1½ oz. of shot, No. 6 size, or smaller. The 25 highest scores only in each team will count for the competition.

Highest scorer in the Australian Team will hold the special International High-Gun Cup, valued at \$150 (presented by J. M. Bauman, Esq., of Brisbane) for 12 months (or until the next International Match) and will be awarded a special trophy valued at \$10, and the International High-Gun Sash and I.C.I. Sterling Silver Commemoration Badge. Second and third High Guns will also receive trophies valued at \$10 each. In the event of ties, to be shot off in batches of ten clay targets until finality.

Every member of the Australian Team will receive the special "International 1966" Badge.

Seventeenth Grand Australian Handicap of \$550

50 CLAY TARGETS from Association Handicaps.

DOUBLE-BARREL — Both barrels equal value.

To be shot Squad System, one target from each track, 25 clay targets each visit, shooting three sixes and a seven at each visit. Tie shoots, Squad System miss-out.

The \$550 allotted to the event will be distributed as follows: First \$150, Second \$100, Third \$50, with ten yardage awards each of \$55, namely 12/13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20/21, 22/24 and 25/27 yds. The actual winner of the event will also receive a Special Grand Australian Handicap Sash and the special I.C.I. Sterling Silver Commemoration Badge.

CARTRIDGES. — Special cartridges will be available to competitors only, at current rates. Only these cartridges may be used. This rule will apply in all events except Handicaps. All competitors' cartridges will be subject to examination by Association officials at any time.

PROTESTS. — In the event of any protests on ammunition only, \$2 accompanying each protest, which must be in writing and written in ink, must be lodged with the Referee during or at the conclusion of the visit concerned.

Competitors are requested to check their score before leaving the track at end of each visit. The Executive Committee's decision shall be final.

REFRESHMENTS. — Refreshments and luncheon will be available throughout each day.

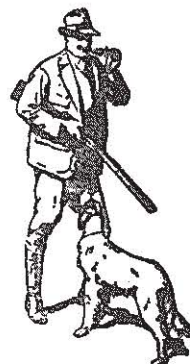

OUT OF THE PAST

Twenty-five Years Ago

"Calrossie" (Jack Sutherland) of Ormond, Victoria, achieved the mecca of all trapshots winning his 100th championship in March, 1941. At that time his record was unequalled in Australian trapshooting records. In commemoration of his success, "Calrossie" was presented by the Melbourne Gun Club with a pair of life-size silver-plated pigeons. The trophy still adorns his living-room today.

Shooting for the first time over traps, the late L. E. Tewksbury won two front-marker trophies on the one day at a Nobel meeting. Later Tewksbury developed into a first-class shot at all targets.

A. W. Hall, now of Berriwillock, won the Victorian Double-rise Championship at the Blackburn grounds. G. L. Bragg, now of Bethanga, who rarely competes these days, divided a handicap event with the late Albert Rickards of Echuca and Dick Wight-

man (a former Chairman of the A.C.T.A.) on the same enclosure. Bragg later won a double-rise event outright.

Athol Love, who gained high-gun in the first International Match, shooting in the Victorian Tower Championship on the Coburg grounds, won the event outright with the only possible. Love was then a fireman attached to Eastern Hill Station, Melbourne. He has since retired from trapshooting.

Horrie Donnelly won the Champion of Champions Cup of 1941, defeating the previous dual holder of the title, Fred Burns. The pair tied over the 50 rounds of the event, Donnelly running out winner on the 60th round, 52/60 to Burns 51/60. A Launceston-Bentleigh combination won the Australian Teams' Championship. The team comprised Jack Tyquin, the late Ted Egan, the late Lew Bertram and Jim Stoddart.

Fifteen Years Ago

Four shared the lead after the first day's shooting in the 1951 Champion of Champions Cup when the event was held at the East Burwood shooting grounds. They were: M. Gibson (Hay, N.S.W.), Nev. Bassett (Roma, Qld.), E. G. Biggs (Burwood) and the late Lionel Byrne (Vermont, Vic.). The field at this stage had shot 20 rounds and the four mentioned held clean scores. A big swag of shooters followed, each with 19/20—this bunch included "Calrossie". Over the final rounds of the contest Nev. Bassett (Qld.) and E. G. Biggs tied over the scheduled 60 rounds of the event. Each had scored the maximum. The

tie shoot went only ten rounds. Biggs missed his 65th release, and Bassett, who had been shooting brilliantly, apparently took things too easily and also missed his 65th. Bassett then seemed uneasy and again failed on his final release, the 70th, leaving Biggs the winner, 69/70. Newton Thomas gained third place after a tie shoot with Bill Wager. Thomas registered 76/77 and Wager 75/77. A feature of the shooting in the 1951 Champion of Champions Cup was the performance of young Harry Roberts, then 15 years of age, who returned 56/60 and gained himself a place in the International Team of that year.

Alexandra (S.A.)—A small gathering of shooters, including Bob Carseth from United States and Ed Smith of Alice Springs. Jeff Kimber, taking part in his third shoot, put up a

remarkable performance in breaking his first 30 targets with his first barrel; also Cedric Scott, Bruce Mut-ton and Ray Kimber getting 30/30.
