

Most people co-operate, but a few persist in being late with their advertisements and copy. In future advertisements will either NOT appear or will be in the following edition if applicable.

Although the 1966 INTERNATIONAL MATCH — Australian Section was held at Bankstown (N.S.W.) on Wednesday, 16th March, the Great Britain teams will not compete until Friday, 15th July. Representative teams from England, Scotland, Ireland and Wales will then shoot their respective sections of the 1966 International. New Zealand will shoot their section on Wednesday, 30th March, whilst dates are not known for the Central Africa, South Africa and other contesting countries.

A.C.T.A. I refer again to your letter of 29th November, 1965, concerning the question of amending the Police Offences Act to permit registered Gun Clubs to carry on their sport on Sundays.

The necessary amendment, viz., the Police Offences (Amendment) Act, 1965, was assented to on 17th December, 1965. The amendment authorises the making of Orders by the Governor exempting certain persons or classes of persons from the provisions of section 19 of the Act which prohibit the use and carrying of firearms on Sundays.

I now have pleasure in informing you that His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make an Order exemptina members of Clay Target Trap Shooting Clubs which are members of or which include persons who are members of the Australian Clay Target Association from the provisions of the said section when travelling to, from or attending a shoot under the regulations of that Association. Notification of the making of the Order will be published in the Government Gazette on Friday, 4th March, 1966.





### OUT OF THE PAST

### - Twenty-five Years Ago -

### -Fifteen Years Ago ——



One person who can certainly vouch that Mount Gambier is an ideal spot to spend a rewarding holiday is 16year-old John Byrnes, of Bolivar, an outer suburb of Adelaide.

On Sunday, 30th January, John, who has been shooting for only six months, won a current model sedan car valued at over £1,300 at the Mount Gambier Gun Club three-day meeting, defeating experienced shooters from all States of Australia, New Zealand and New Guinea in the South Australian Handicap.

After five shooters had tied with 30 possibles, John went on to record a further 12 consecutive "birds" in the shoot-off and take the event.

The previous day, John had divided prize money in two events and, had he not won the car, would still have left the three-day meeting £27 ahead after paying for nomination fees and ammunition.

#### Not Confident

He said that it had never occurred to him he could win the car.

"I would have been quite happy to divide the money five ways at 30," he said.

However, under the rules of the meeting the event had to be shot to finality if requested by one of the finalists. In a secret ballot one of them did so—"and it certainly wasn't me," John said.

A remarkable feature of his win was that he had never won a shooting event outright before; not even a club event. Also, after his success the previous day he was shooting from 16 yards, a yard behind his usual handicap.

A member of the South Australian Gun Club, based in Adelaide, John developed his shooting at an early age, firing at tin cans with a slug gun on his parents' property.

#### Grandfather's Gun

The gun he uses at present actually belongs to his grandfather, and John hopes to get it for his 17th birthday at the end of this year.

## Gun Gossip

#### LJUTIC TRAP GUN-

From an American correspondent, I have received a magazine article giving particulars of a new trap gun, little known here, but which seems to have caused a stir among the topflight trapshooters over there. It is the production of a small gunsmith, working on his own account, named Ljutic, and pronounced Lootik. He is of Slovenian origin.

The gun, called the Ljutic Monogun, is a single-shot, drop-down gun with a kind of back-work body-action, ina kind of back-work body-action, incorporating a percussion system, not described, notable for a particularly short lock-time. The gun has an under-lever, and the sight-line is continued from behind the standing breech, right under the shooter's eye. There is a free-floating, ventilated rib along the full length of the 34" barrel. The gun, which is functional rather than beautiful in appearance, is stocked on conventional lines, and is free from any meretricious adornment.

#### Tight shooting

The features of the gun's performance that have brought it into promiance that have brought it into prominence are its alleged capacity to throw a 99 per cent. pattern into the 30" circle at 40 yards, and its freedom from any tendency to "drift out of true" when hot. In other words, it is claimed that the mean point of impact of the charge centre remains content in velotion to the line of constant in relation to the line of sight. This, by inference, is not so with ordinary guns.

These features would, of course, make a special appeal to those shooters whose adoption of the Ljutic gun have provided it with its chief publicity—men who regularly shoot from the 27-yard handicap mark, such as G. Barnhart, who, I believe, made the top score at the 1964 Grand American tournament, and who claims an average singles score of 99.28 per cent. against registered targets during 1963. Another Ljutic shooter is D.

Orlich, who has broken 100 straight from the 27-yard mark, and no less than 1,300 from 16 yards — claimed to be a record. Orlich was number two at the Grand American last year.

Men such as these constitute an "elite" market in trapshooting gear, and must obviously have the best, wherever it is to be found. Their adoption of the Ljutic gun adds much point to the question as to what are its secrets.

### No mystery

Ljutic himself is reported as being insistent that there is no mystery about it. "There is no secret choke." he says; but he attaches the highest he says; but he attaches the highest importance to the perfection of the gun's machining, in the shaping of the bore, and more particularly in the uniform thickness of the barrel wall. If, indeed, the gun has any unique quality, it is probably in this last detail that it is to be found. Ljutic alleges that in ordinary guns, barrel

wall thickness frequently varies by as much as 8/1000 of an inch, whereas he sets himself a limit of 2/1000. In short, bearing in mind that the ventilated rib is a free-floater, it can be said that the Ljutic barrel is symmetrical about its axis, which would certainly enable it to expand and contract without warping out of true, as it heats and cools in the course of shooting.

As for the substance of the barrel, Ljutic makes no secret of the fact that his barrels start in life as solid-drawn steel tubing, as made for aircraft. Not an auspicious beginning, one would say, since solid-drawn tubes, according to my understanding, have long since been frowned on as a cheap expedient in the gun trade. But Ljutic attaches great importance to being able to start off with close tolerances on the outside and inside diameters, and, presumably, on the permitted eccentricity. He also sets a high value on the internal structure of solid-drawn steel, and claims a stiffer barrel in consequence.

### Theory and experiment

If any ordinary trap-shooting gun—single, over-and-under or pump—had its barrel/s and appurtenant metalwork heated to a uniform degree throughout, there would be no distortion of the barrel axis. But if there were some rigid attachment which did not participate in the general heating, such as a non-floating rib, or a magazine, or the second barrel of an o/u gun—or even if the opposite sides of a single barrel were heated unequally—it would undergo a bending. This last is what would happen in the course of shooting, if an otherwise unencumbered barrel were thinner-walled on one side than on the other.

It is easy to observe this distortion experimentally. Stretch a horizontal cord across an open window, and arrange a gun barrel on rests, pointing at the cord. With a little adjustment, and selection of viewpoint, it will be found that the reflection of the cord in the bore can be made to

It will be convenient to fix this viewpoint by means of a rough peepsight. Now, if a night-light or candle or little spirit lamp be applied to the underside of the barrel, the two converging lines inside the bore will reveal an immediate distortion by becoming bowed. I need hardly say that no source of heat, in any way likely to melt the soft solder of a double gun rib, should be left for long in contact with the barrel — the effect is striking enough without that.

### Speculation

Ljutic guns are not only costly at \$1,500—they are scarce. The output is of necessity limited to what can be produced by Ljutic himself, or at least, by personal craftsmanship. The output is currently stated to be 25 guns a year, and the waiting list to be very long. In these circumstances, if I were a front-rank trap-shooter,

I think I should be inclined to experiment. I should, perhaps, take a fully choked, 32" barrelled, Greener, Martini-action gun, and re-stock it with a one-piece stock, giving a free-floating barrel and the kind of fore-end I fancied. I should have it fitted with a floating, ventilated rib on longitudinal vees; and I should have the barrel hand-filed externally, as might be necessary to ensure uniformity of wall, to at least the 2/1000" tolerance laid down by Mr. Ljutic. I should get a skilled barrel regulator to elongate the cones or otherwise work up the pattern density to the highest value; and I should have the trigger of this fast-acting lock adjusted to my liking.

Should I then have a gun superlatively capable of "holding its pattern" and a passable imitation of the Ljutic Monogun? I do not know, but I might.
