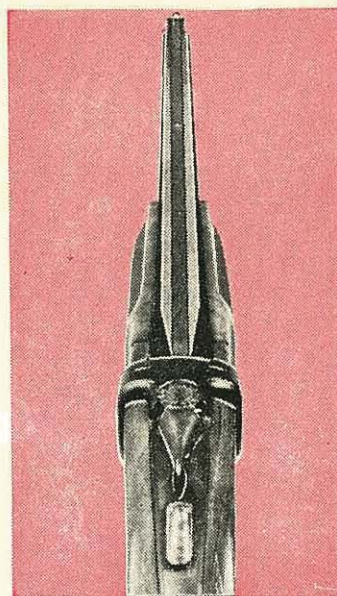

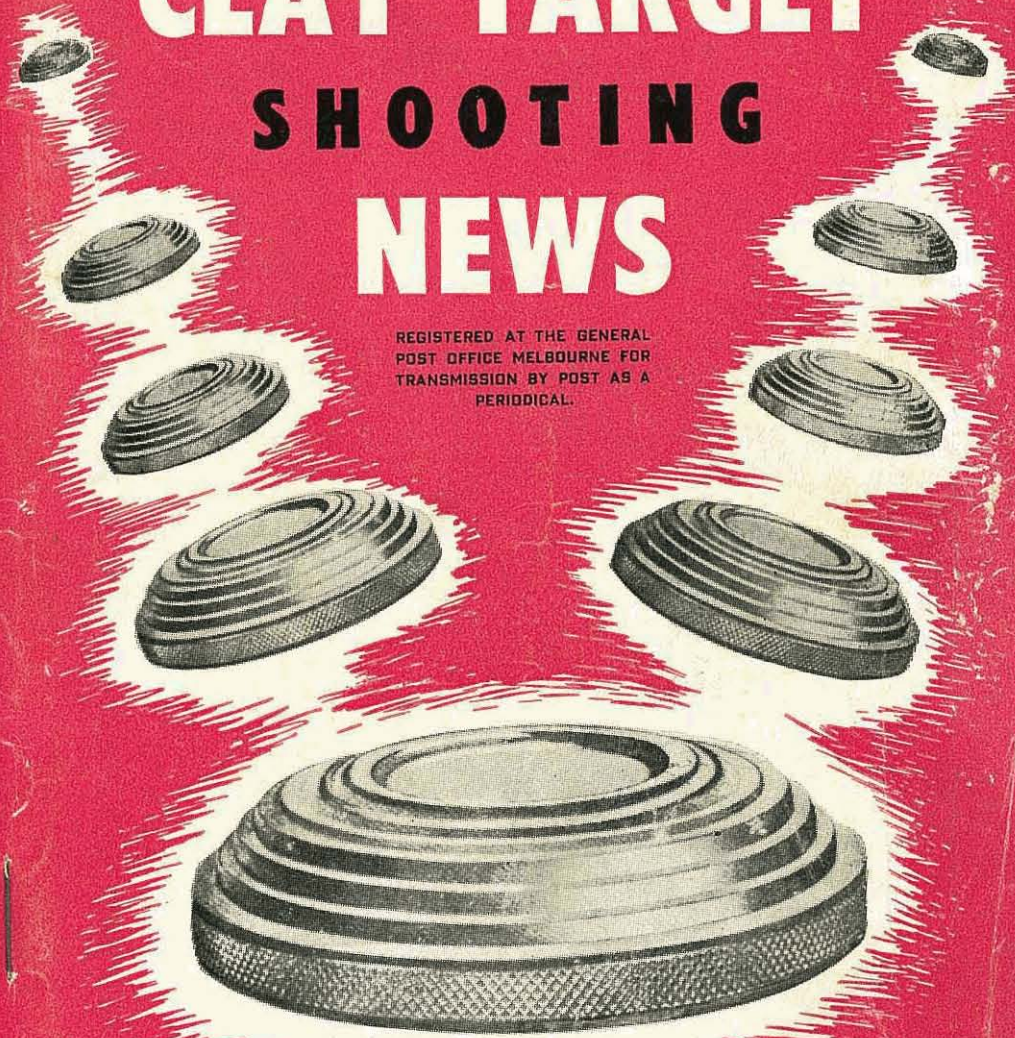

A.C.T.A. Annual and Executive Committee Meetings.

The 30th Annual Meeting of affiliated club delegates was held at the Royal Aero Club, Bankstown, N.S.W., on March 13.

Attendance in numbers was as for 1965, with all States, excepting Western Australia, being represented.

The President, Mr. J. M. Tyquin, requested silence be observed for the recent passing of Vic. Executive Member C. F. Dennis of Mildura.

Mr. Tyquin then recorded the long and good service by Mr. W. McCullough as A.C.T.A. Secretary in welding the clubs together, and thanked him for his services and foresight in establishing the "News".

The Australian Team was congratulated for its performance in becoming second in the 1965 International Teams Shoot.

1965 Interstate Teams Match — N.S.W. 493/500 won from Victoria 488/500.

Sunday shooting is now permitted by registered A.C.T.A. shooters at affiliated clubs in N.S.W.

Appointment of Auditor — Messrs. K. D. Courtney & Son relinquished their connection with the Association on the retirement of Mr. W. McCullough. Messrs. R. W. Fox and C. A. Gregory of Moorabbin (Vic.) were appointed as Auditors.

Election of Office-bearers:—

The President — Mr. J. M. Tyquin was re-elected unopposed.

The elections for the various States resulted:—

Queensland — Mr. R. H. Moyse and Mr. L. S. R. Stewart both re-elected unopposed 1966/1967 years.

New South Wales — An election took place — Mr. A. E. Cregan (Guyra) and Mr. K. S. Soames were elected for 1966/1967 years.

Victoria — An election took place — Mr. A. Pedersen and Mr. H. Smith were re-elected for 1966/1967 years. Executive Committee later, from delegate nominations, appointed Mr. Gordon H. Hall (Geelong) to the Executive Committee for the year 1966 in the place of deceased Committee Member C. F. Dennis.

South Australia — Mr. R. C. Mules was re-elected unopposed.

Western Australia — Mr. N. Wells was re-elected unopposed.

Tasmania — Mr. W. E. H. Rainbird was re-elected unopposed.

A.C.T.A. Secretary appreciated meeting shooters from New Guinea, New Zealand and all States of the Commonwealth at the National Shoots, Bankstown, N.S.W.

The attention of all shooters is drawn to the last paragraph of Guyra (N.S.W.) March 26 shoot report in this issue regarding handicapping.

INTER-SERVICE TRAP SHOOT

The Inter-Services Trap Shoot for the I.C.I.A.N.Z. Shield was held on Wednesday, March 30, at the R.A.A.F. Base, Point Cook, Victoria. Visibility was excellent — wind, cool south-westerly.

The I.C.I. Shield was originally donated in 1963 for annual competition between officers of the three services — this was amended to include all ranks in 1958.

About 1965 this shield was won with scores of 65 to 70/90, thence with the formation of the Army Gun Club at Bandianna and Puckapunyal (Vic.), the Navy at Flinders (Vic.) and the R.A.A.F. at Point Cook (Vic.), competition became keener, with scores rising to 80 or 82/90.

In 1960 the R.A.A.F. at Point Cook shot a record 86/90, which was repeated by the Army at Bandianna in 1962 and the Navy at Puckapunyal in 1965.

On Wednesday, March 31, 1966, the Army and Navy both shot 88/90, and in the shoot-off, Navy 117/120 defeated Army 116/120, so the R.A.N. retains the I.C.I. Shield for the third year in succession, whilst the R.A.A.F. still equalled the previous record of 86/90 in third place.

The 1966 Australian National Championships

The 1966 Australian National Championships were probably one of the most successful programmes held for some considerable time. Record fields participated in all major events. Although wet under-foot, but with very little winds, the standard of shooting was excellent.

Mr. M. Burgess of Cobar defeated a hot field to take out the coveted Champion of Champions Cup.

The National Double-barrel title was won by the little-known V. Ryan from Shepparton, who shot brilliantly to win from Kevin Heywood and Don Scowcroft.

The Intermediate Championship shot in conjunction was won by T. Holmes (N.S.W.), who only took one bird to win this coveted award.

The well-known Victorian shooter Don Glover emerged from the field with the only possible in the National Single-barrel title. This was Don's first National title.

The National Double Rise title, which was held over from the first day, was won on Monday by the 1965 holder, Warren Charlton, who shot brilliantly to record 48/50.

The Australian-New Zealand Championship saw another first National title winner in Fred Hudson of Sydney, taking only one bird in the shoot-off to defeat the National Single-barrel winner, Don Glover.

John Raleigh, the brilliant Queensland shooter, took the Inter. High Gun Trophy from Kevin Heywood and Maurice Quirk (both of N.S.W.) after the three had tied with an equal score of 299/300.

The Australian Team, comprising the six top shooters from the Australian-New Zealand Championship, defeated the New Zealand team 117/120 to 115/120. Teams consisted of:

Bevan Begg was High Gun for the New Zealand team.

The Grand Australian Handicap saw the New Zealand front-marker D. Frewin win from Darrel Gates of Menindie with a score of 140/140 to 139/140.

Charlie Hartley of New Zealand maintained excellent form over the Champion of Champions, National Double-barrel Championship, National Single-barrel Championship and Grand Australian Handicap to record 196/200 to take out the beautiful Browning U. & O. "D" grade donated by Gollin & Co. on behalf of the makers, Fabrique Nationale of Belgium. He was closely followed by Mal Fuller (N.S.W.) 195/200 and Doug. Smith (Qld.) 193/200. Such a gun over the same events will be the High Gun trophy at all future A.C.T.A. National Championships.

The High Gun trophy for the Australian-New Zealand Championship was donated by Fuller Firearms and won by Fred Hudson (N.S.W.)

The 17th Grand Australian Handicap (special trophy donated by Mick Smith Sports Store of Sydney) was won by New Zealand shooter D. H. Frewin.

Shooters came from all States, plus New Zealand and New Guinea, for the five days to renew shooting friendships at the National titles. New Zealand shooters shot two yards behind their New Zealand handicaps.

It is recorded that much of the success of the 1966 A.C.T.A. National shoots was due to the untiring efforts and maximum co-operation, both before and during the programme, by I.C.I.A.N.Z. staff from all States. The A.C.T.A. appreciates this continued assistance year by year.

Results of the Twentieth International Teams Match are withheld until after the International Tournament, which will be held on Friday, July 15, in Warwick, Warwickshire, England. Any A.C.T.A. registered shooters visiting the U.K. at this time are invited to attend this programme and may obtain further details from the Secretary, A.C.T.A., Box 2038 S, Melbourne.

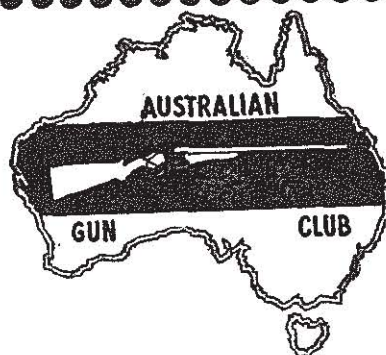

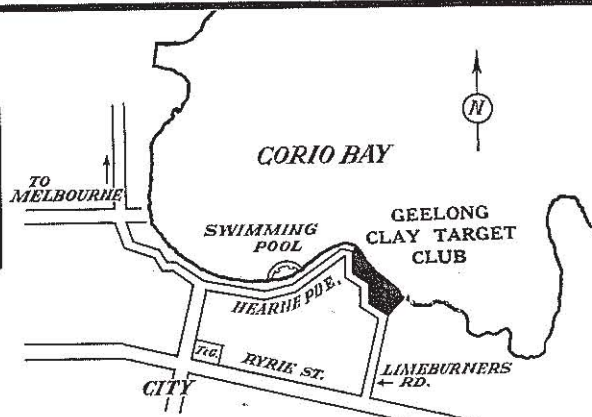

OUT OF THE PAST

Twenty-five Years Ago

"Duxbac" (Horace G. James), now the proprietor of the old-established gun firm of Donald Mackintosh Pty. Ltd., in Latrobe Street, Melbourne, and one-time Chairman of the original Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association, is reported in May, 1941, as having won his 53rd championship. This was gained in a shoot on the old Blackburn grounds (V.) in the Victorian Single-barrel Championship. "Duxbac" ran up the splendid total under single-barrel conditions of 23/25. J. R. (Bobby) Meehan, then a 17-year-old local shooter, was runner-up. Fred Burns and Meehan had each recorded 21/25 (not bad for a 17-year-old), then Burns retired in favour of Meehan, who took second placing. In winning, "Duxbac" missed his 18th and final birds. Then followed G. Biggs 20/25, Bill Bloomfield, Geoff Mason, W. R. Johns 19/25, D. Watson, J. Bryant, the late Harry Ball 18/25.

George Walker of Essendon, who is still seen shooting occasionally on Melbourne tracks, won a single-barrel event at the same fixture, 10/11, after a tie shoot. The Nobel Club's mixed birds title of 1941 was won outright by Bill Bloomfield from A. W. Hall and the late Harry Ball. The late Laurie Tewksbury won an event on the same programme, as did the late J. R. Schutt. The redoubtable W. R. Johns was under notice on the same programme with a miss-out success on the 8th round. Bill Bloomfield's name crops up repeatedly in the news about this period in 1941. He won the Commonwealth Walk-up Championship outright with a score of 19/25. Eric Ball of Colac, who is seldom seen on the tracks these days, was runner-up, 25/35. The late Bill Reid of Seymour and the late Jack Cattanaich are bracketed with others in a minor-event success.

Fifteen Years Ago

About this period in 1951 the Camberwell Club was active in sponsoring minor events. Hugh Phillips of Black Rock, who is a rare visitor to the tracks now, was prominent with several successes on the ground. The late F. Cronk won a front-marker trophy on this programme. VALE DAMIAN DONCON

The funeral of 14-year-old Damian Doncon, who died following a motor-car accident on the Hume Highway near Euroa on Saturday, November 27, left Wesley Church, Shepparton, for cemetery on Wednesday, December 2, 1965.



Damian was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Norman George Doncon of St. Georges Road, Shepparton. Several hundred mourners followed the cortege and fellow students of Shepparton Technical School formed a guard of honour on the route to the cemetery.

Damian was loved and respected by all who knew him. He excelled in all things undertaken, particularly as a student, sportsman and gentleman. In this mid-year exams he gained top marks out of one hundred and ninety students, and was determined to continue his studies until an engineering degree had been attained.

His reputation as a clay bird shot was borne out by the fact that a great proportion of the one hundred and seventy-five wreaths, which filled a separate vehicle, were from gun clubs

and shooting fraternity throughout the country.

As recently as last Melbourne Cup Day, at the Metropolitan Gun Club's "Melbourne Grand Prix", he shot 99 clay birds to run second ahead of over 100 shooters.

About two years ago he won a gun at Puckapunyal. At this time he was twelve years of age.

To even the most casual acquaintance it was apparent that Damian's most admirable characteristics were due to the intimate relationship that existed between his family, and particularly his father and himself.

His father taught him to water-ski at the age of five and accompanied him to his first of an unbroken series of duck openings at six.

A great deal of his prowess as a shooter could be directly attributed to the coaching given him by Horrie James and Shepparton exponent Jim Hickford.

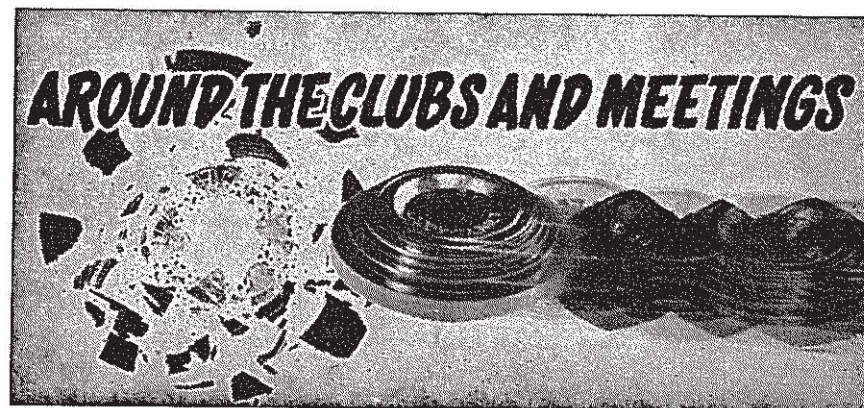
At the time of the tragic accident he was, as usual, with his family on the way to a shoot.

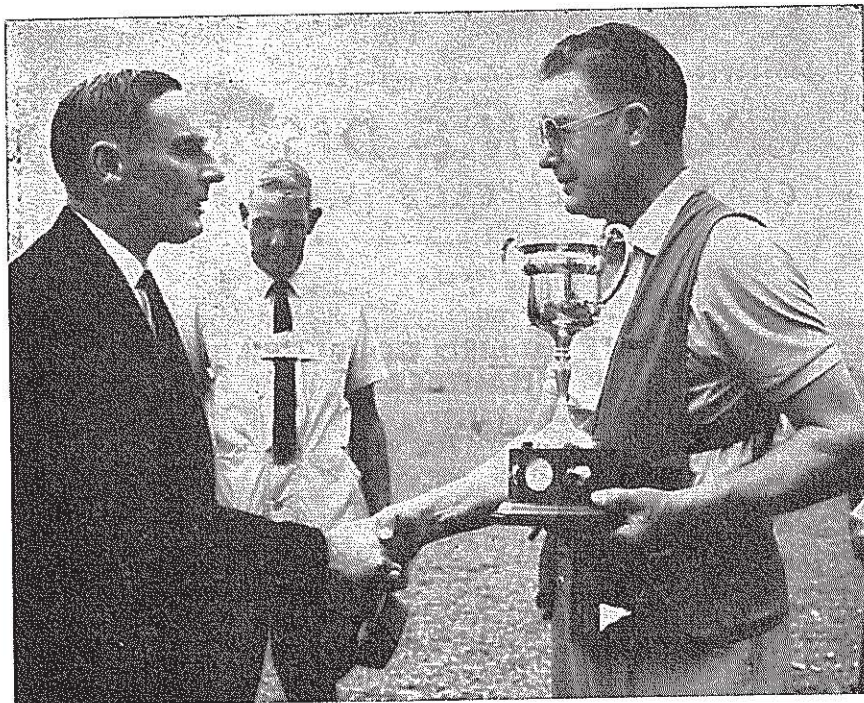
